## Safe speed for schools

Radar speed trailers were rolled out and parked roadside at Illawarra Primary School and St Aloysius Catholic College's Blackmans Bay campus, on February 9.

Four digital radar speed signs will be shared between 16 schools in the Kingborough municipality during school terms, alerting motorists to their vehicle speed as they pass by.

The Safe Speeds for Schools project is an initiative of Kingborough Council's Kingborough Community Safety Committee and was funded by a grant from Tasmania's Road Safety Advisory Council.

The project aims to increase driver awareness of the need to slow down around school zones.

The signs also increase driver awareness of vulnerable road users in school zones, particularly young children on road crossings, riding bikes and scooters. Tasmanian road rules specify a speed limit of 40 kilometres per hour when

passing a school zone sign on official school days, during the times noted on the sign.

The 40km/h speed limit applies until the vehicle passes an end school zone sign or another speed limit sign.

Official school days are typically Monday to Friday during school terms. The school zone sign does not apply on school holidays, weekends and public holidays.

Deputy Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Jo Westwood chairs the Kingborough Community Safety Committee.

Deputy Mayor Westwood said it was a timely reminder for motorists at the start of the 2021 school year.

"School zones can be chaotic, particularly at peak drop-off and pickup times," Deputy Mayor Westwood remarked.

## Ratepayers raise governance issues

A report prepared by the Kingborough Ratepayers Association Inc (KRAI) and submitted to Kingborough Council notes that "self-regulation" is supporting "inferior workplace behaviour and actions" within the council, meanwhile "councillors are prevented whistle blowing about operational matters by legislative restriction".

The submission states there are insufficient oversight mechanisms to guarantee accountability within council's administration.

The June 2020 document, titled *Oversight, Governance and Accountability: KRAI Submission to Kingborough Council's Audit Panel*, has been viewed by the *Kingborough Chronicle*.

KRAI, a ratepayer advocacy group formed in 2017, has been focused on governance issues with respect to Kingborough Council.

"The purpose of this submission is to highlight oversight gaps at Kingborough Council that current mechanisms appear unable to resolve," KRAI's document states.

"It demonstrates insufficient self-regulation exists to ensure best practice oversight and good corporate governance and accountability."

KRAI president John McDonald OAM, a retired lawyer, spoke with the *Kingborough Chronicle* on February 11, following a workshop presentation to Kingborough Councillors on February 10.

Mr McDonald said KRAI had been approached by "quite a number" of ratepayer members in the Kingborough municipality with complaints about council administrative processes.

The association selected 10 cases and obtained documentary evidence and statutory declarations from the ratepayers.

The cases formed the basis of KRAI's submission document and its recommendations.

However, the Audit Panel refused to deal with the submission.

"It started with compliance," said Mr McDonald.

"Members were universally unhappy with council's compliance practices not being satisfactorily addressed.

"So we wrote a report with 19 recommendations.

"We looked at the *Local Government Act*.

"There was provision for an audit panel.

"We put the report to the audit panel.

"The audit panel wouldn't deal with it, as they said they don't take external submissions but that's not in the legislation."

Mr McDonald said the *Local Government Act* is "skewed in favour of management".

"It's the General Manager and only the General Manager who is entitled to take action against staff," said Mr McDonald.

"Councillors need to know if something happens, what was done by the General Manager to fix it and what is being done in policies and procedures to make sure it doesn't happen again.

"There's no complaints register."

Mr McDonald said transparency and clear parameters that guide decision-making are needed.

KRAI Secretary Tricia Ramsay said the group went to the trouble of preparing the 37-page document due to the considerable financial and emotional stress placed on a number of local ratepayers by Kingborough Council's administration.

"The issues themselves have caused enormous financial and emotional impacts on these people," Ms Ramsay said.

"We didn't do this lightly.

"It has caused considerable stress for some people.

"They've been stressed out, sometimes for years.

# BreastScreen's pink bus is back

A reminder for Kingborough mums, daughters, girlfriends, sisters, wives, aunts and grandmothers that the BreastScreen Tasmania pink bus is parked outside the Kingston Community Health Centre until March 5.

A breast screening mammogram is an x-ray of the breast and is the best way to detect cancer early, increasing a woman's chance of survival from the disease.

The accredited screening service is open for bookings Monday to Friday between 8:30am and 5pm.

A doctor's referral is not needed.

BreastScreen Tasmania can provide a free breast screening mammogram for women:

- over the age of 40 years
- with no breast symptoms, such as a lump, pain or nipple discharge
- who have not had a mammogram in the past 12 months.

Women who do not meet these requirements are asked to speak to their doctor about the best option for their needs.

Women between the ages of 50 and 74 years are particularly encouraged to participate in the screening program.

The BreastScreen Tasmania clinic also operates weekdays at Argyle Street in Hobart, from 8:30am to 5pm and offers early morning screenings, from 7:40am by appointment.

# COMMENT COLUMN

with Member for Nelson,  
the Honourable Meg Webb MLC

**As we start this new year of 2021, many of us have a sense that life has mostly returned to normal.**

The kids have returned to school, our borders are mostly open to the rest of the country, there's plenty of toilet paper on the supermarket shelves and the small inconveniences of hand sanitising and check-in apps are becoming second nature.

We can go about our daily lives without too much COVID anxiety or bother.

But not everyone is sharing the same sense of relief that normal life has returned.

And for many people, a return to 'normal' means again having to face insurmountable challenges.

Of the 20,000 Tasmanians who lost their jobs in early 2020 due to COVID-19, one in four are still out of work, and many of those who have returned to work are not back to full hours and pre-COVID income.

Almost all of the 37,000 small businesses in the state were affected by the COVID shutdown and ongoing restrictions during 2020.

For some, it resulted in a fortunate boom in business, but for many others it caused months of stress, planning and struggle to survive and continue trading.

There continue to be many Tasmanian business owners who are trying to make up lost ground and return to a viable income.

The stress and disruption caused by COVID-19 made difficulties faced by many people worse.

It eroded mental and physical health, triggered and amplified addictions, fuelled family violence and highlighted vulnerabilities in our communities.

In 2020, in the urgency of the pandemic, we pulled out all the stops to make sure that no one was left behind.

We knew that for the whole community to stay safe and get through it, we needed to help each person be safe and supported.

We took some extraordinary steps and invested in supporting people in ways that were not thought pos-

sible before COVID-19 struck.

Now, in 2021, with that urgency abated and the extraordinary supports being wound back, we need to be mindful that there are people around us, family members, friends, neighbours, customers and colleagues who continue to be hard hit by the effects of the pandemic crisis, but find that the support they need is no longer available.

Some will soon be returning to an unliveably low rate of jobseeker payments, others will have jobkeeper payments withdrawn.

With protections removed, some tenants will find themselves at risk of homelessness when their rents are hiked up or their leases not renewed.

In Tasmania, before the pandemic, we didn't have enough homelessness services, or family violence services, or alcohol and drug services, or mental health services.

People languished on waiting lists or gave up seeking help.

Now, with an increase in those needing support as a result of the pandemic, even more Tasmanians will be turned away every day from services they desperately need.

Returning to normal is not enough.

We need to do much better than returning to normal if we are to see our community become healthier and more whole from the pandemic recovery.

We need to continue and extend our additional investment and target it better to those who most need support.

Our experience of rising to the challenge of COVID-19 has shown us that we can do extraordinary things when necessary.

We can act swiftly and compassionately to meet the needs of everyone in our community.

That is the spirit that we need to carry forward as our focus this year.

# Tasmanian brand launched on Amazon

**Tasmania has become the first state in Australia to launch a dedicated Tasmanian Brand Store on Amazon.com.au to showcase Tasmania's high-quality products to buyers around the country.**

The brand store was built in partnership with Podean Marketplace Marketing, a global company with headquarters in New York.

Announcing the launch on February 11, Minister for Trade, the Honourable Jeremy Rockliff MP said the state government would continue to explore other eCommerce marketplaces.

"This will provide a way for local producers to expand their businesses and sales on the mainland, and enable more Tasmanian companies to enter the online retail world," Minister Rockliff said.

"Tasmania produces goods that the rest of the world wants and we have a plan to grow exports to \$15 billion by 2050."

The Tasmanian government plans to release its 2021 Tasmanian Trade Strategy Annual Action Plan in February. Any Kingborough businesses interested in joining the

The *Kingborough Chronicle* requested further information from Minister Rockliff on February 11 regarding the selection criteria or guidelines for businesses on how to become selected for, or join, the Tasmanian Brand Store.

A spokesperson from the Department of State Growth replied to say that each application will be assessed on merit.

"To enable as many of Tasmania's quality businesses as possible to be involved in the Tasmanian Brand Store on Amazon.com.au, and especially to assist small to medium operators, we have set minimum criteria of being a Tasmanian business who is eligible to sell their products on Amazon Australia," explained the spokesperson.

"Each expression of interest will be assessed for inclusion on its merits once these initial criteria are met.

"We currently have another 15 businesses either ready to come on board or looking to join and we anticipate more expressions of interest to come in now that the Tasmanian Brand Store on Amazon.com.au is open."

# A heart-felt message

**Although Tasmania has once again scored poorly in heart health, according to the Heart Foundation's new Heart Maps data release, Kingborough is performing better than average.**

While the national average is 65.5 deaths per 100,000 people, in Tasmania the rate is 75.3, the second-highest in the country after the Northern Territory.

In Kingborough, this rate drops to 51.2 deaths per 100,000 people and the hospital admissions rate is also significantly better with 31.9 admissions per 100,000 people compared to the national average of 43.5.

Obesity is a key risk factor for coronary heart disease. Tasmania tops the national list in the prevalence of obesity at one in three, but this is significantly lower in Kingborough at 26 per cent.

Heart Foundation Tas CEO Graeme Lynch AM said Tasmania ranks near the top in fatalities and hospitalisations from heart problems and the state has recorded an

increase in the rate of hospitalisations for coronary heart disease since 2012.

"Tasmanians' risk factors for developing heart problems are among the highest in the country," Mr Lynch said.

"We top the chart in obesity, we have the second-highest smoking rate and we're third poorest when it comes to physical inactivity and high blood pressure.

"Quit smoking, watch your alcohol intake and diet and try to engage in at least 30 minutes of physical activity a day.

"If you're 45 or over, or from age 30 if you're Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander, talk to your GP about having a Heart Health Check."

# Upcoming JobSeeker cuts unjust

**At the end of March, Australians could be facing the end of the Coronavirus Supplement, signalling a return to a JobSeeker rate of about \$40 a day from the current \$51 a day.**

CEO of the Brotherhood of St. Laurence (BSL) Conny Lenneberg says going backwards will send hundreds of thousands of people deeper into poverty.

BSL, along with the Australian Council of Social Services (ACOSS) and other organisations, are standing together in calling for a permanent and adequate rate increase to JobSeeker, Youth Allowance and other income supports to ensure recipients stay above the poverty line.

"We cannot go back to where we were pre-COVID," said Ms Lenneberg.

"A rate of \$40 a day does not allow people to cover basic expenses, now more than ever.

"We've seen the positive impact of an increased rate during the pandemic.

"People who used to skip on either breakfast or lunch have finally been able to eat healthily, visit the dentist, turn on the heating or buy a jumper to keep warm during the winter.

"Cutting the rate again will force people to make

extremely difficult choices around where they spend their money.

"People shouldn't be forced to choose between a meal and staying warm in a country as rich as Australia.

"Everybody deserves a fair and just life, a life with dignity."

The initial introduction of the Supplement in response to the pandemic meant Jobseeker recipients received nearly double the old Newstart Allowance payment.

"It was a move that effectively recognised that the original rate of \$40 was simply too low to live on, but it has been repeatedly cut since," said Ms Lenneberg.

"With the pandemic's effects still lingering, this is not a time to move backwards.

"It is devastating to think of how many children will now again go to bed hungry and start the school year without the things they need as a consequence of this decision."

The proposed reductions come alongside data that paints a bleak picture of the employment prospects in Australia.

While the labour market has shown a slow but steady improvement, overall unemployment remains much higher than pre-COVID-19 levels, sitting at 6.6 per cent

in December according to ABS data, well above the six per cent benchmark that the government holds for enacting austerity policies.

The latest December 2020 ABS data shows that there are about 222,000 more unemployed people compared to before the pandemic in December 2019.

"Falling out of work shouldn't mean falling into poverty," said Ms Lenneberg.

"All of us need the assurance of knowing there is a fair social security safety net there to catch us when we fall on hard times.

"It's time to raise the rate for good.

"Politicians need to hear from us and their local constituents about the negative effects of the government's decision."

BSL is calling for the base rate of JobSeeker to be permanently raised, to ensure that recipients do not return to below-poverty levels again.

"Your voice matters," concluded Ms Lenneberg.

Ms Lenneberg encouraged people to contact their local MP about sustainable rates of JobSeeker.

The BSL is a social justice organisation working to prevent and alleviate poverty across Australia.

# COVID vaccination roll-out

**Kingborough residential aged care, disability care residents and workers are to be among the priority recipients of the COVID-19 vaccine when it arrives in Tasmania.**

The first batch of the Pfizer/BioNTech vaccine is expected to arrive in the state in the last week of February.

The Therapeutic Goods Administration announced provisional approval of the Pfizer/BioNTech vaccine on January 15.

Announcing details of the rollout on February 5, Premier for Tasmania, the Honourable Peter Gutwein MP said the Tasmanian Vaccination Emergency Operations Centre is working closely with the Federal Government.

"The vaccine is free, safe and available to everyone," stated Premier Gutwein.

"Tasmania will receive 2340 doses a week for the first three weeks.

"This will then double to 4680 doses a week from the fourth week as we start to deliver the second

dose through March.

"This allocation will be split 50/50 between Tasmania's priority population, to be delivered by the Tasmanian Government, and residential aged care and disability care residents and workers, to be rolled out by the Commonwealth Government.

"There will be a gradual start to the rollout, as Pfizer stock will be limited over the first few weeks but it will pick up significantly near the end of March as Tasmania starts to receive batches of the AstraZeneca vaccine for delivery to the wider population," Premier Gutwein said.

"The Pfizer vaccine will be provided to priority groups first.

"These will be:

- quarantine and border workers
- hotel quarantine staff
- frontline at-risk healthcare workers, including key ambulance staff
- hospital emergency department and ICU staff
- COVID-19 testing staff.

"People in these priority groups will be contacted directly before the first batch arrives to arrange their two appointments, at least 21 days apart for the two doses, that will be required to give them the best protection.

"The priority groups will receive both their doses at Pfizer hubs, which will be at Tasmania's three major hospitals.

"At the same time, the Australian Government will start its program to vaccinate residential aged care and disability care staff and residents on site in Tasmania.

"The first doses will be delivered at the Royal Hobart Hospital and through the Australian Government's program in residential aged care facilities.

"We plan to have fully vaccinated Tasmania's priority populations by early April.

"We want as many Tasmanians as possible to get vaccinated.

"The vaccine is not a silver bullet and it is critical that we all continue to be COVID safe," emphasised Premier Gutwein.

inhabitants in 1921.

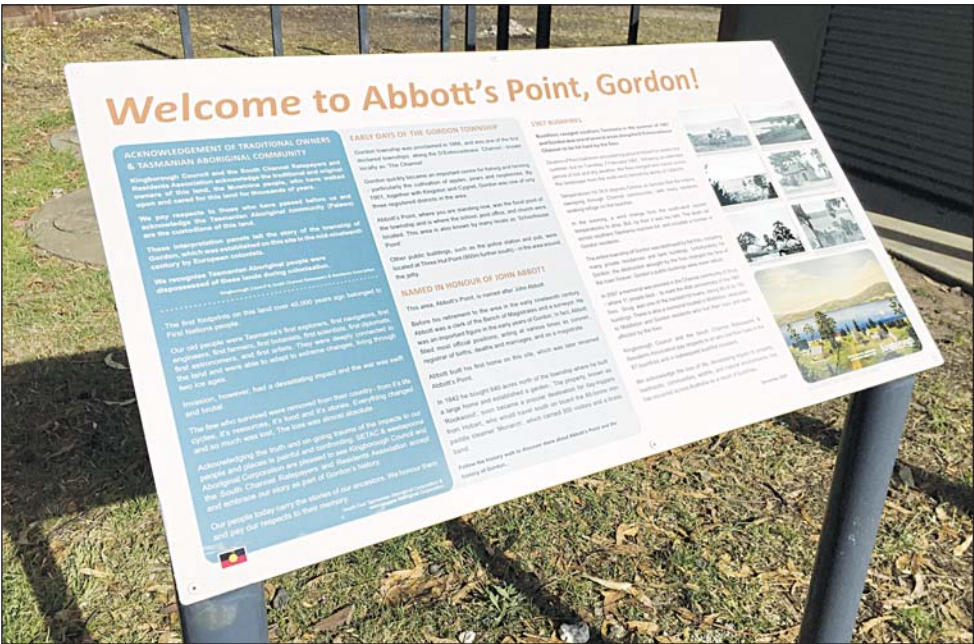
He concluded with a description of the devastating impact the 1967 bushfires had on Gordon and the town's inhabitants.

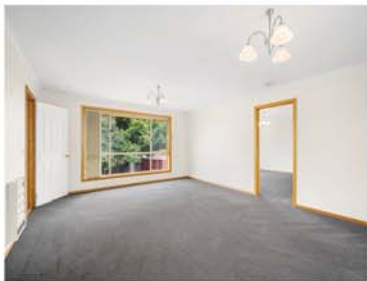

# Flourish despite diabetes

**Since the onset of COVID-19, Heather Kennett, Registered Nurse and Credentialed Diabetes Educator has noticed that people have found it even more challenging when managing their diabetes.**

Ms Kennett reports that statistics have shown that the number of people having their routine blood tests has gone down dramatically.

"The problem with this is that if we don't monitor our progress we can't see when things are going out of control and the complications of diabetes can be potentially devastating," Ms Kennett clarified.

Ms Kennett's passion for preventative health involves the physical, mental and social aspects of health which she believes is paramount to achieving positive wellbeing.

The upcoming Let's Flourish eight-week program aims at promoting a friendly, encouraging environment where participants can share experiences and support each other.

The program will also include a walk around the Kingston Beach oval as well as input from guest speakers such as a podiatrist, exercise physiologist, dietitian, pharmacist, dentist, psychologist, audiologist and ophthalmologist.

Anyone can attend the group sessions however, referral to the group program from a GP provides a rebate for the sessions under the Medicare scheme.

Individual appointments for initial assessment are competed prior to the group commencing.

Medical history, medications, body weight and measurements, diabetes control and current activity level are assessed and recorded.

Ms Kennett reports that small changes and group commitment can make such a significant positive impact on people's health outcomes.

Groups will be commencing in March and will be held on alternate Friday mornings from 10-12pm at Kingston Beach in the Kingborough Women's Club rooms behind the Kingston Beach Community Hall.

Groups will be limited to six to eight participants to keep each group interactive and personal.

# Rewarding communication

**Tracey Graney has been a speech pathologist for 17 years, helping people with communication disorders, including understanding what others say, speaking, reading and writing.**

Tracey also works with people who have difficulty swallowing, a condition known as dysphagia and provides her service from Kingston Beach Health Centre, alongside other health professionals such as podiatrists, clinical psychologists, chiropractors and many others.

A typical day for Tracey may involve:

- A therapy appointment working with someone who has had a stroke to the language areas of their brain, making it difficult for them to find the words they want to say
- Developing a picture-based communication system for someone who is unable to talk
- A meal time visit to assess someone with a swallowing difficulty
- Writing a report to help fund assistive technology that will talk for someone who is unable to speak
- Arranging an x-ray of someone's swallowing to

find out exactly why they are coughing when drinking water

- Talking to the partner of someone who has Parkinson's to help them use strategies to increase the volume of their voice in conversation.

Tracey works with adults and gained most of her experience whilst working with people with neurological conditions, diseases or trauma to the brain, for example stroke, Huntington's disease or Parkinson's disease.

Tracey spoke about what makes her job so rewarding.

"Definitely the people I work with," Tracey said.

"Everyone is different and will prioritise different things in their treatment.

"I love helping clients achieve goals that make a difference to their everyday lives.

"I also enjoy helping people to understand why they have particular communication or swallowing disorders and, depending on the cause, to help them get better or to manage the difficulties they are having."

For people who are impacted by speaking difficulties, Tracey recommends setting small goals and getting family and friends involved.

"Connection is important," Tracey added.

"Take time to do things with loved ones that don't involve words, like going for a walk or listening to music together."

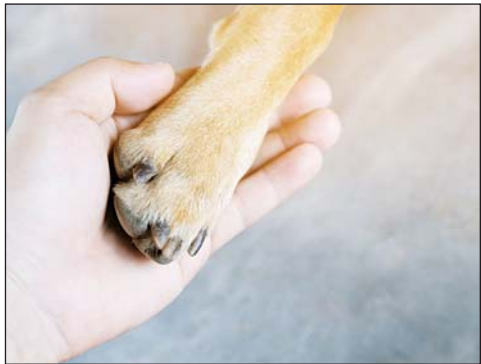
