## Clean Up Howden Day

Sixteen volunteers went to work cleaning up Howden on Sunday, March 7, as part of Clean Up Australia Day around the nation.

'We had our annual Howden clean-up day today and had a great turnout of volunteers," said Howden Progress Association's President, Leslie Frost.

"We cleaned up all of Howden, Brightwater and

Wingara roadsides and foreshore, Peter Murrell Reserve entrances and car parks.'

The group also covered an area along Tinderbox Road, Alanwood Road, Draper Road and Isabel Road.

Jessica Court and Olearia Drive were also cleaned. Twelve rubbish bags were filled with small pieces of litter. Other items found included tyres, a very old fibreglass dinghy, bricks, iron and timber pieces.

"We sorted all the rubbish from the recyclables," said Ms Frost.

"I have loaded six bags of recyclables into my trailer to go to the tip.

A Kingborough Council truck collected the remaining rubbish for disposal after the productive day.

## **Greater south** included in travel tickets

Southern Tasmanians were set to miss out on the 800,000 half-price airline tickets the federal government made available as part of a support package for the tourism industry, with Hobart not included in the initial announcement.

The original announcement on Thursday, March 11 only benefitted northern Tasmania, with airports in Launceston, Devonport and Burnie among the 13 chosen destinations across Australia in the \$1.2 billion package.

Hobart has now been included after Tasmanian Premier Peter Gutwein wrote to Prime Minister Scott Morrison on Friday, March 12.

"I personally contacted and then wrote to the Prime Minister last week requesting urgent consideration be given to the inclusion of Hobart under the scheme, and we join the tourism industry in welcoming this fantastic news," said Premier Gutwein.

"With Hobart, Launceston, Devonport and Burnie now all included in this initiative, it will bring even more travellers to Tasmania and encourage them to visit all parts of our state, spreading the economic benefit more widely and supporting jobs in all our regions.

Before Hobart was included, federal opposition leader Anthony Albanese MP said on March 11 that the government's chosen destinations were based on "the electoral map", noting two marginal seats in northern Tasmania were receiving economic

Speaking on ABC radio on March 11, Federal Minister for Finance, Senator Simon Birmingham said the 13 regions chosen were based on their reliance for their economy and employment on tourism.

"We've started with those regions where the data shows that they are most dependent in terms of regional employment on the tourism industry and where there are particular examples in relation to their dependence on international visitation or tourists and the like," said Minister Birmingham.

"So it has very much been a data driven process to work through the regions looking at tourism impacts, employment impact in those regions, and making sure that in those economies, communities who have such high local dependence on the tourism industry that we are supporting, getting more people there.

Destination Southern Tasmania CEO Alex Heroys said Hobart is classed as "regional" in a multitude of federal programs.

Mr Heroys said he was hopeful the federal government would add Hobart to its program after Darwin and Adelaide were added on March 11.

Premier Peter Gutwein was thrilled Hobart was added to the of regions benefitting from the package.

"The half-price flights will bring more travellers keen to spend in our hotels, restaurants and cafes, and tourism experiences," said Premier Gutwein.

"This initiative will complement what the Tasmanian Government has already done to support the industry, with around \$27.5 million in additional spend estimated to have been generated by our Make Yourself At Home travel voucher program, along with grant programs and tax relief.



## #Choose to challenge on International Women's Day

In celebration of International Women's Day 2021, the Kingborough Chronicle invited three Kingborough women, including the Aboriginal Heritage Council, Deputy Chair, Sarah Wilcox, Deputy Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Jo Westwood and the founder and President of Kingborough Helping Hands, Edna Pennicott OAM, to share their stories and insights with readers.

The three women were guest speakers at an International Women's Day event organised by Kingborough Council, held at the West Winds Community Centre on Tuesday, March 9.

#### Sarah Wilcox

Choose to challenge.

This is the theme for International Women's Day 2021 and we are certainly seeing some challenges for many women right now.

This year, International Women's Day is encouraging us to choose to challenge and to call out gender bias and inequality.

It encourages us to seek out and celebrate women's

It says that together, we can help create an inclusive world and from that challenge comes change.

So that is what I am choosing to do.

I come from a very-long line of the most incredible women who deserve to be celebrated and honoured. Women who survived ice ages.

Women who cared for country.

Women who shared stories over 2000 generations.

Women who survived invasion.

Women who were taken from their lands and forced

to learn a strange language from far away men.

Women who had to practice their culture in secret. Women who had their children taken away.

Women who endured, and who continue to endure racism. My ancestral grandmother nimmeranna, was one of these women.

She was removed from her country along with a few others. They were promised they would be returned home, but this promise was broken.

Every day I acknowledge and pay my respects to their strength and resilience.

There are so many amazing and strong women in our community today, who are leading the way in developing and teaching language, who are reconnecting us to country and who are continuing and sharing cultural practices.

They are also continuing to fight for our rights and for the protection of our country, heritage and culture.

However, we are still massively underrepresented and our unique knowledge ignored.

Decisions are made about us and the future of our cultural landscapes with no meaningful consultation or understanding of what it might mean for us.

I often hear people say Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders shouldn't have a voice and they dismiss us as a minority, without giving any recognition to how and why that happened.

The Aboriginal voice of this country is over 65,000

It was the first human voice on this land.

It deserves to be heard with open minds and hearts. Diversity isn't just a buzz word.

Studies show that having diverse voices within the leadership of organisations have clear economic advantage. Different perspectives lead to more in-depth discus-

sions and therefore greater outcomes for all people in our communities.

They encourage honesty and inspire trust.

This in turn leads to happier and more productive employees and improved public confidence.

I am fortunate that I have so many women around me, Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal women, who inspire me, support me, value me and hear me.

I hope that we can all use our voices to challenge bias and inequality whenever we hear or see it.

To use our voice to share truths with compassion and respect, and to listen how we want to be heard.

We can improve, and we can do it together. nayri nina-tu - thank you.

## Wet wipes no no

Kingborough Council and TasWater are urging residents to be mindful of the 'three Ps', after wet wipes and tree roots obstructed a sewer main and caused a 'no swim advisory' for the southern section of Kingston Beach last week.

Early on Tuesday, March 9, Kingborough Council's stormwater investigation officer located a sewer spill at James Avenue, Kingston Beach.

TasWater was notified and arrived soon after to resolve the issue.

The spill had already contaminated the stormwater system, leading to precautionary warning signs advising against swimming being erected at the southern end of Kingston Beach.

Council tested the water immediately, which returned a 'fail' result 24 hours later.

A water testing result returned on Thursday, March 11 returned a healthy result for the south end of the beach. Council staff then removed the advisory signs.

In May last year, a similar event occurred when an accumulation of wet wipes, known as a 'wet wipe berg', caused a spill and resulted in a beach 'no swim advisory'. Kingborough Mayor, Dean Winter, said it was a disappointing end to the summer testing season.

"The incident shows that a relatively minor incident can have a big impact on water quality," Cr Winter said.

"We have had a great summer in terms of water quality, with all of our beaches open for the entire summer period.

"To lose the Kingston Beach Pontoon to large swells and then have to close the southern part of the beach because of water quality issues was really disappointing." For those unfamiliar with the term, the 'three Ps' are poo, pee and toilet paper.

Flushing anything other than the 'three Ps' may result in sewage network blockages or an overflow in the home.

TasWater Operations Manager Service Delivery Neal Synott urged the community to avoid flushing wet wipes or other non-paper material down the toilet.

TasWater advises that no matter what is stated on the packet, wet wipes do not break down like toilet paper does. For further information visit taswater.com.au/Community---Environment/Don-t-Flush-This


## Blackmans Bay Scouts' open day
