

Uncovering Kingston's new playground

Kingston Park is set to open this Friday evening, with events scheduled all weekend for everyone to enjoy.

"No matter your age or your ability, Kingston Park is going to be a huge amount of fun for everyone," Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Dean Winter said. "We have tried to build Tasmania's best playground."

"Now it's time for local families to come give us the verdict. "This is a three-week opening, in order to spread the love and so everyone can enjoy the park in a COVID-friendly way."

"Events will be held across the school holidays so everyone can enjoy it safely." Kingston Park is one part of a larger plan to transform central Kingston into a rich and vibrant area.

"The playground combines contemporary play ideas and integrates them into a beautiful Tasmanian environment, in the heart of Kingston," Cr Winter commented.

"Whether you love the thrill of the flying foxes or prefer to build dams in the water play zone, there are so many different areas to get you excited and playing."

"This park promises to be one of the best, if not the best in Tasmania."

"There's a climbing rope forest with a sky fort for anyone who appreciates a vertical challenge, as well as the beautiful musical sensory garden and a spinning zone with accessible equipment and slides."

"The park's designers, Playstreet, have done a great job at incorporating nature into the play space."

"The stunning landscaping, which will grow with our kids, holds impressive native plantings which aim to mimic wild spaces and provide habitat for critters, so it's not just a park for people."

Playstreet worked with four artists to design the specific pieces for the play zones.

The overall concept motifs were designed by Tasmanian Aboriginal artist, Allan Mansell, whose flora and fauna art pieces represent the sculptural works throughout the park.

Tasmanian sculptor, Roland Gabatel's large wooden chain sawed animals, such as skinks and a caterpillar, are scattered throughout the park.

Agency of Sculpture's, Ben Gilbert, has designed the central large sea urchin made from stainless steel which can be climbed into and all over.

Gerhard Maus's bones of a Thylacine are buried beneath the sand.

"They are there to inspire our curiosity and excite a thrill as you uncover the bones of an extinct marsupial," said Cr Winter.

"Ben Gilbert's water play design is spectacular, aiming to get children working together and making dams with cleverly designed magnetic parts and versatile levy gates."

"This is a park that you can get wet and muddy in."

"It encourages children and their families to use their imaginations and play with nature and its right in the heart of Kingston."

"There are tables and chairs, many barbeque areas and well thought out shading sails which ensure plenty of areas for people to escape from the

sun when it's about."

"Kingston Park will provide wonderful family fun and attract visitors from all around Tasmania."

"I congratulate Specialised Landscaping Services and the many artists and staff who have made this possible," Cr Winter said.

Vaccination phase 1B begins in Tasmania

Phase 1B of the vaccination rollout began on March 19, and with 180,000 Tasmanians in the cohort, the public have been asked to be patient.

"Please be patient and wait for a clinic close to you to be announced as being ready to provide vaccinations," said Tasmania's Minister for Health, Sarah Courtney MP.

"This roll-out will take many months and will be a partnership between the State Government and GPs for Phase 1A and 1B, with community pharmacists also playing a role in Phase 2."

"Phase 1B is for the following people: people aged 70 plus years, remaining health care workers, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander adults, adults with underlying

medical conditions and critical and high-risk workers."

Kingborough residents have been advised to refer to Tasmanian Government COVID-19 vaccination roll-out information, after the Federal Government released incorrect details on participating GP clinics on its National Service Finder System, launched on March 17.

A medical centre in Kingston was incorrectly stated, both on the Federal Government website and in The Mercury, to be providing an immunisation service.

According to the medical centre, the details were published without their consent.

A clarification was later issued by Tasmania's Minister

for Health, Sarah Courtney MP.

"When a GP practice or State Clinic is ready to take bookings, you will know either through your GP or through Tasmanian Government communications," Minister Courtney stated.

"Unfortunately, incorrect information about participating GP clinics has been released today which has led to unnecessary frustration for both patients and our GPs."

"I have been assured the confusion is being addressed, with clarity being provided to GP practices that they may choose to limit vaccinations to only their existing patients, if they wish."

"We will continue to provide regular updates and information

on how to get vaccinated, when it's your turn."

"There will be plenty of time to get vaccinated, at either your GP or at a State Government clinic," Minister Courtney advised.

"Please don't be worried if you don't have a usual GP."

"The State Government will ensure that there will be opportunities in your local community and we will give you plenty of time to book."

"Booking arrangements for these clinics will be communicated soon."

Phases 2A and 2B are to begin later in the year. Further details can be found at www.coronavirus.tas.gov.au

New child and family centre in Kingston

Plans are underway for development of a Child and Family Learning Centre (CFLC) in Kingston to provide families with young children, from birth to age five, with access to health and wellbeing support services.

The Kingston CFLC is one of three new centres to be built in Tasmania, funded through an additional \$7 million in the 2020-21 State Budget.

Minister for Education and Training, Jeremy Rockliff MP announced on March 13 that architects are being

sought to design the new centre.

"The design of each of the new centres will be informed by a local enabling group, comprising local community representatives, service providers and educators," wrote Minister Rockliff.

"The local enabling groups will determine the facilities and services each CFLC will offer, tailored to the specific needs of the individual communities."

A community meeting is to be held at the Kingston

Primary School library on April 21, from 9.30am to 11.30am, with free child minding available.

The Department of Education is also organising a tour to CFLC's at Chigwell and Bridgewater on March 30, for locals interested in how the centres operate.

The bus is departing from Kingston Primary School at 9.30am and returning at 1.30pm.


Five Bob open day

Local women honoured

Two locals have been inducted onto the Tasmanian Honour Roll of Women 2021.

Lorraine Walker and Edna Pennicott OAM were among 18 of Tasmania's inductees this year.

Through charity work, Edna Pennicott has touched the lives of thousands of people.

Edna understands what it is like to fall on hard times.

At the age of 12, Edna's mother died, and Edna was placed in an orphanage and separated from her siblings.

In 2019, Edna received the Tasmanian Volunteering Awards Lifetime Achievement Award.

The Award recognised Edna as a full-time community volunteer who has dedicated herself to charity and community service for the past 40 years.

Her volunteering includes assisting the Kingborough Cricket Club for 25 years, the Kingborough Tigers Football Club for 45 years, Jireh House, Mara House, Annie Kenney, Kingston Beach RSL, Kingston High School, Kingston Primary School, Bethlehem

Community Centre Africa, Walk4Brain Cancer Tasmania and Kingston St Vincent de Paul Society Loui's Van.

In 2013, Edna established Kingborough Helping Hands (KHH) to provide an organisational structure for the work she had been doing for decades.

Living most of her life in the Huon Valley, Lorraine Walker worked alongside family in the apple industry, prior to establishing a women's clothing businesses and providing tourist information for visitors to the Huon Valley.

Lorraine has received numerous accolades for her community work in the Huon and Kingborough areas over three decades.

Lorraine's volunteering, fundraising and business contributions have included work for Retarded Citizens Welfare Association, the National Board of Charities, Southern Outlet Action Committee, Kingston Neighbourhood House and Rotary.

In 1989, Lorraine joined Lifeline Hobart establishing upmarket retail outlets in Hobart and Kingston, securing

an income stream for Lifeline's counselling services.

Lorraine also coordinated Lifeline's annual door knock appeal.

Lorraine was a charter member of the Rotary Club of Huon Valley, founding member of Hobart City Central and a Past President of the Rotary Club of D'Entrecasteaux Channel of which she is currently a member.

Member for Franklin, the Honourable Jacqui Petrusma MP and Senator for Tasmania, Eric Abetz congratulated the pair.

"The Honour Roll preserves the stories of women and women's organisations, ensuring their achievements are not forgotten, and to inspire future generations," said Ms Petrusma.

"It includes women from all walks of life, including community service, humanitarian pursuits, business, science and technology, the arts, sports, education, medicine and the environment."

State mandates tracing via private phones only

The Tasmanian Government has mandated tracing of people’s movements in the state via the Check in TAS app.

May 1 is the deadline for compliance, according to a statement released by Minister for Health, the Honourable Sarah Courtney MP on March 18.

All businesses, community groups and event operators are required to comply, including hospitality businesses, places of worship, cinemas, galleries, tourist premises, concert venues, amusement parks, auction houses, hair dresses, beauty treatment premises, spas, swimming pools and others.

Each person, including everyone in a group, and employees/operators, are required to be recorded on entry to the premises by scanning the Check in TAS QR code.

Minister Courtney said from May 1 the Check in TAS app will be the only system used for collecting contact tracing information in Tasmania.

“Businesses, community groups and event operators currently required to collect contact tracing information

under the existing Public Health direction, who haven’t already registered for Check in TAS, need to register and then ensure their patrons can easily use the Check in TAS QR code at their premises, ahead of the May 1 deadline for compliance,” said Minister Courtney.

“I ask every Tasmanian to download the Check in TAS app to your mobile phone so you are ready to use it.

“Check in TAS is the easiest and safest way for Public Health to collect accurate, reliable and accessible contact tracing information that can be used to help protect Tasmanian communities from COVID.

“There will be public advertising to support this change, and the Department of State Growth will work to educate and support businesses and organisations as we make this change, including one-on-one assistance for businesses, and close engagement with regional chambers of commerce and other peak bodies, as well as enterprise centres.”

Stray cat shack opens on Bruny

Native wildlife on Bruny Island are set to benefit from a new cat management facility at Alonnah, officially opened on Monday, March 15.

Feral, stray and roaming pet cats are among the top threats to Australia's native wildlife.

The Bruny Island Cat Management Facility, also known as the Cat Shack, is a partnership between Kingborough Council and Ten Lives Cat Centre, and Bruny Farming will be involved in trapping and transporting stray cats and providing staff to assist at the facility.

The facility aims to reduce the impact of cats on north Bruny Island's Eastern Quoll population by assisting in the management of stray and feral cats, providing on-island cat desexing and enabling residents to bring stray cats in to be assessed, cared for, and where possible, rehomed.

The Priority Actions for Eastern Quolls on North Bruny Island project aims to both remove feral and stray cats and manage impacts of domestic cats on north Bruny Island.

Supported by NRM South via the Federal Government's Environment Restoration Fund, the Eastern Quoll action project is a partnership between Kingborough Council, Biosecurity Tasmania, Bruny Farming, weetaipoona Aboriginal Corporation and the Ten Lives Cat Centre.

Representatives from Kingborough Council, Ten Lives Cat Centre, NRM South and the Tasmanian Government met at Alonnah for the official opening of the facility on March 15.

Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Dean Winter welcomed

the opening of the Cat Shack.

"The Bruny Island Cat facility will play an integral role in stray cat management on the island," Cr Winter said.

"It also provides an opportunity for everyone to find out more about what is being done to manage pet, stray and feral cats on the island."

Kingborough Council's Cat Management Officer Kaylene Allan said unowned cats on Bruny, including dense populations around some townships, pose a major threat to the island's wildlife, tourism and livestock.

"In the past, community members were faced with a four-hour round trip to take any of these cats to the Ten Lives Cat Centre in New Town," said Ms Allan.

"The Cat Shack will help solve this problem.

"The facility will act as a 'shop front' for the project, serving as a space where community can bring stray and trapped feral cats.

"The centre will also offer incentives such as on-island desexing, containment and rehoming services."

Ten Lives Manager Noel Hunt said the Bruny Island Cat Management Facility will help manage stray and feral cats, and support on-island cat desexing and cat safety.

"Partnerships are vital to the delivery and success of cat management activity, particularly in regional and rural areas," Mr Hunt said.

"The partnership between Kingborough Council and Ten Lives specifically for this community facility is a pivotal part of the broader project on Bruny Island.

"The project is research-based, which will allow us to take our learnings from Bruny Island to the rest of Tasmania."
