Winter frozen out of pre-selection

Omission of Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Dean Winter as a Labor candidate for Franklin in the upcoming State Government elections has generated extensive discussion among politicians and community members.

Tasmania Labor Party Leader Rebecca White announced the candidates

for the Labor Party on March 29.

"I am proud to be standing with a group of candidates that truly reflect the

communities we strive to serve," Ms White said.

Former Tasmanian Premiers Lara Giddings, Paul Lennon and David Bartlett have been vocal in their criticism of the decision made by Labor Party administrators to exclude Mayor Winter from the ticket

Between four available candidates, Mayor Winter received close to 50 per cent of the vote at the time of his election as mayor, proving his popularity with Franklin and Clark voters who reside in the Kingborough municipality. The Kingborough Chronicle asked Mayor Winter about being confronted with the decision to leave a major role in local government for a potential

"It was an opportunity that came up quickly; when the election was called I had about 24 hours to decide," Mayor Winter commented.

"Having people like Paul Lennon, Lara Giddings and David Bartlett encouraging

ne to run certainly added to my decision to nominate, but it was tough. Liberal campaign spokesperson Michael Ferguson said the intervention of

the former politicians highlights Labor's left-right split.

Mayor Winter said that his political views weren't so polarised and that he

had not yet received feedback on the selection process

"There's a broad range of views in the Labor Party," said Mayor Winter.

"My views on most things could probably be described as 'moderate Labor'. "I don't enjoy internal party politics and I am glad it's all over."

Mr Ferguson also referenced claims of "fraud" and "corruption" made by a former Member for Franklin, Ross Butler, during an ABC radio interview on March 30, which suggested one candidate had been persuaded to block Mayor Winter

[Mr Butler] also suggested that Franklin Labor candidate Fabiano Cangelosi had originally been planning to nominate for the Clark electorate, but had been "persuaded" to run for Franklin," stated Mr Ferguson.

Despite the controversy, Mayor Winter said he is looking forward to making further positive contributions to Kingborough, although he stated that it was still too early to decide about the next Kingborough Council elections

"Being mayor is the best job I've ever had, which made turning up to work on Monday morning, even after a pretty brutal loss, relatively easy," stated

'The decision on whether to contest will be based on the sort of feedback I hear from the community and whether I think I have anything more to contribute.

"I think it's really important the mayor has a vision and energy to lead the organisation, and that's the main test for whether I put my hand up." Nominations for the state election officially close on Wednesday, April 7. Early voting for both State and Legislative Council elections commences on



Bruny Island ferry named *Parrabah*

The newest Bruny Island ferry has been named Parrabah, which translates to whale.

Consultation with the South East Tasmanian Aboriginal Corporation (SETAC) was undertaken to reach the meaningful name, intended to show respect for the local indigenous community.

The announcement came as the vessel began sea trials in Hobart, prior to commencing passenger services in late April. It is the second ever purpose-built ferry for SeaLink and was manufactured in Tasmania.

The additional ferry is expected to increase the speed and efficiency of the Bruny Island services, allowing for greater capacity to service the local community and the recovering tourism industry.

SETAC's annual report 2018-19 tells of The Parrabah - Whale Story.

"There was once a mother and baby whale coming up the Channel near Bruny Island," the story goes. "A giant shark was chasing them.

"A sea eagle was telling the mother whale where to go so they could get away from the shark.

"They came up past Nine Pin Point. "There is a big rock arch there.

"We believe it was formed by the whales jumping through to escape the shark.

"As the mother whale was coming up the channel, she

was using her tail to flick the sand at the shark, trying to scare it away.

"This formed many of the beaches down there.

"As they were escaping from the shark past Bruny Island the baby swam too close to the island and chipped off the small island called the Iron Pot." Uncle Rodney Dillon provides an explanation of the story.

"This is a traditional Tasmanian Aboriginal story and

has been passed down through my family," notes Uncle Rodney Dillon. "It explains how the land down the Channel and near

Bruny Island was formed. "This story also teaches us to never give up."



Safe hands through school years

Kingborough who are diagnosed with Tuberous Sclerosis Complex (TSC) will, for the first time, have access to accurate, up-to-date digital information resources, to ensure children with this devastating disease will be 'in safe hands' during their schooling years.

On Monday, March 29, a special school assembly was held at Blackmans Bay Primary School in honour of Caleb Chalk, who attends the school and lives with TSC. Both Caleb and his big sister Jemima spoke eloquent-

ly about their TSC journey and their mother Miriam shared how much these resources will help families living with TSC.

"The In Safe Hands digital resources can really help families understand what conversations to have with their school to ensure their child gets the best support and education they can," Ms Chalk explained.

"I look forward to sharing these resources with Caleb's school and the wider community.'

Every week in Australia a baby is born with TSC and there are over 2500 people living with the condition across the nation.

TSC is a rare and complex genetic condition, which can have a range of harmful effects and can affect every organ in the body.

It commonly causes tumours to grow in a baby's brain and heart and later in life can spread to their kidneys,

TSC frequently causes difficult to control epilepsy, learning difficulties and intellectual disabilities, autism, mental health challenges and disfiguring facial growths. Every person with TSC is at risk of developing lifethreatening conditions such as fast growing inoperable brain tumours.

As it is a rare disease, not all teachers and educators know how to best support a child with TSC during their

Thanks to funding support from TSC families across Australia, the Disabled Children's Foundation and the Universal Charitable Fund, Tuberous Sclerosis Australia (TSA) has developed the 'In Safe Hands' educational resources, to inform and support educators and families with a child experiencing TSC

Blackmans Bay Primary School Principal Della Wells said the resources have expanded their knowledge.

"As a principal who has been supporting a child with TSC in our school, we greatly appreciate the development of this excellent resource," Ms Wells remarked.

"We've been working closely with Caleb and his parents to stay informed about TSC, however after reading the In Safe Hands resource there is so much more we

Anzac Day again affected by COVID

Last year, residents across Kingborough gathered at the end of their driveways to light up the dawn for Anzac Day, collectively honouring fallen soldiers, after COVID-19 restrictions caused many of the traditional ceremonies to be cancelled.

This year, Kingborough will again see changes to local Anzac Day services due to social distancing and COVID-Safe policies.

Bruny Island RSL Sub Branch, Taroona Ex Services Club and Kingston Beach RSL Sub Branch will all be holding modified services to accommodate restrictions on gathering numbers and social distancing requirements.

"Bruny RSL will be conducting a Dawn Service at the memorial at Alonnah at 0600 hours, followed by egg

and bacon rolls for breakfast, as we cannot have a sit-down meal due to COVID restrictions," said Trevor Adams on behalf of the Bruny Island RSL Sub Branch.

The Taroona Ex Services Club will be holding their dawn service and march.

"The day commences with our traditional march starting at 5:30am from the entrance of Taroona Park, next to the Taroona Community Garden, led by two WW2 jeeps, and finishes at our memorial," said Chris Harris on behalf of the club.

"The service starts at 6am and concludes at approximately 6.30am, immediately after this a hot breakfast will be served followed by a small presentation ceremony

"Due to COVID restrictions only 70 people are allowed in the hall at one time, however breakfast will be served inside and out of the hall.

"All are welcome to attend but please observe social distancing and if entering the hall, either sign the register or use your COVID phone app," Mr Harris said.

President of the Kingston Beach RSL Sub Branch Mel Cooper said the Sub Branch will be holding a short march and dawn service.

"There will be a dawn service, which is open to all, and a short march which will just be for veterans and ex-service personnel," said Mr Cooper.

"We also want to remind everyone about COVID-Safe restrictions and social distancing."

Channel RSL Sub Branch have cancelled their services entirely.

"Due to the restrictions of public social distancing currently in place, Channel RSL Sub Branch and our community partners regret we are unable to run either a dawn service and public breakfast at Woodbridge School or the 11am service, public morning tea and children's sports at Snug Park Oval on Anzac Day 2021," reported Dick Goodwin from the Channel RSL Sub Branch.

"The Sub Branch encourages the community to commemorate Anzac Day by participating in a Light-Up the Dawn vigilance at their property gates, driveways and balconies.

"We remain hopeful of resuming our traditional Anzac Day services in 2022."

For April, the talk will focus on old currencies and the value they had at the time.



The land was gifted to Catholic Care Tasmania (CCT) last year by the Tasmanian Congregation of Presentation Sisters (Sisters) who had owned it since 1929, ensuring the Sisters' legacy of providing support for homelessness continues.

During its time, the three-hectare property, idyllically set on a hill looking over the Tasmanian coastline, has been a place for prayer and reflection for approximately 65,000 visitors over the years.

The subdivision will consist of a mix of privately-owned and social housing two-bedroom dwellings, including designs catering for older people and those with disability.

The development and management of the site will be through CCT and CentaCare Evolve Housing (CEH), in accordance with the wishes of the Sisters.

Construction of the homes will include work by St Joseph Affordable Homes (SJAH), which is the newly established Catholic construction social enterprise.

Construction is forecast to begin in May 2021 with practical completion set for July 2022.

In house politics

In support of the Maryknoll subdivision ceremonv. Minister for Building and Construction, Elise Archer MP, attended the launch.

"It was a pleasure to be able to attend the official launch of another extensive and much needed development to assist those experiencing homelessness and housing stress in southern Tasmania," Minister Archer said.

"Our government announced late last year the Community Housing Growth Program, providing \$100 million capital funding from the Rebuilding Tasmania Infrastructure Investment COVID-19 Response Fund, to continue increasing and improving access to good quality social housing for vulnerable Tasmanians.

"We remain on track to deliver up to 1,500 new social housing dwellings by June 2023, with some significantly progressed with design work complete and approved development applications in place," added Ms Archer.

"New projects like this will not only provide housing for those in need, but will also stimulate our economy and create jobs, with \$570 million in total economic activity already in place across the state and more to come."

Shadow Housing Minister Alison Standen responded to Ms Archer's statements at the launch by claiming Tasmanians are right to be deeply cynical about the State Government's response to the housing and homelessness crisis.

Ms Standen said it was all very well for the State

Government and Housing Minister Roger Jaensch to claim new housing projects were underway, but the truth was in the facts about the appalling state of public housing and lack of actual delivery.

"The fact is almost 3,600 families are on the housing waiting list," Ms Standen said.

"The fact is this is a 65 per cent increase on the waiting list the State Government inherited seven years ago.

"The fact is the latest report on Government Services shows of those 3,600 families, 2,454 are in the greatest need.

"The fact is the minimum average waiting time for the most urgent cases on that list is 64 weeks, one year and three months.

Ms Standen claimed the wait time has increased from 20 weeks in the last seven years, with overcrowding at 4.7 per cent for public housing, higher than the national average of 3.9 per cent and overcrowding in community housing increased to 6.9 per cent compared to 3.3 per cent last year.

"The fact is Tasmanians are sleeping in tents, in cars, in desperate, sometimes dangerous and truly sad conditions, relying on the kindness of family and friends to couch-surf and Mr Jaensch and Premier Gutwein are content to turn the other way and do nothing of any substance to address this awful situation," declared Ms Standen

Hot spots up testing

An additional COVID-19 clinic testing clinic was stood up in Kingston on March 31 to help accommodate increased testing numbers after the declaration of hotspots across Brisbane and Byron Bay.

Tasmania was on track to perform a record number of tests on March 30, with more than 1400 tests expected to be carried out.

State Health Commander Kathrine Morgan-Wicks thanked everyone for their patience and apologised for delays.

"I want to assure everyone who needs to get a COVID-19 test that they will be tested, and they should remain isolated until that occurs," said Ms Morgan-Wicks.

"I can assure people that our testing staff and our hotline staff are doing everything they can to ensure everyone who requires a test gets one as quickly as possible."

Extra staff were deployed to the Public Health Hotline, which stayed open late on both March 30 and 31 to enable more people to book a test.

Director of Public Health Dr Mark Veitch declared further premises as high-risk in both Queensland and

New South Wales on March 30, following the confirmation of further COVID-19 cases related to outbreaks in those states

A list of high-risk premises can be found at https://coronavirus.tas.gov.au/travellers-and-visitors/coming-to-tasmania/travel-alert.

This list is being updated regularly and should be

monitored by those who have recently travelled, or been in contact with returned travellers.

Anyone who has visited any of the premises declared

as high-risk premises in Greater Brisbane, South-East Queensland or Byron Bay in NSW, will be required to quarantine for 14 days at suitable premises. Recent arrivals from both Queensland and NSW will

receive SMS messages asking people to check the list of high-risk premises and to contact the Public Health Hotline on 1800 671 738 if they were at any of the premises at the specific times listed.

Anyone who has any symptoms, even mild, should contact the Public Health Hotline on 1800 671 738 to arrange a test.



FROM 1 MAY 2021

Many businesses and organisations will be required to use the free Check in TAS app to collect contact information about everyone who spends time at their premises or event.

This means that Tasmanians and visitors will also be legally required to check-in through the app when they visit these premises from 1 May.

Check in TAS is available to download from the Google Play Store and Apple App Store. If you don't have a smartphone or are unable to use one, others in your group can check-in for you or staff at the premises will be able to check you in manually.



Pregnancy and infant loss remembered

resolved to officially recognise October 15 as Pregnancy and Infant Loss Remembrance Day.

The resolution marks the culmination of a campaign by bereaved parents which commenced over ten years ago, providing national recognition to a day already recognised by New South Wales, Western Australia, Victoria and Tasmania, and in more than twenty countries around the world.

Federal Senator Catryna Bilyk, who co-sponsored the motion in the Senate, said the decision to observe pregnancy and infant loss on October 15 every year was vital to raising awareness.

"Observing Pregnancy and Infant Loss Remembrance Day signals to families impacted by the tragedies of miscarriage, stillbirth and neonatal death that they are not alone in their grief," Senator Bilyk remarked.

"As the mother of a stillborn baby, I understand how devastating this experience is and how important the observance of this day is to families affected by it."

Senator Bilyk also said that observing the day helps raise awareness of pregnancy and infant loss as a public health issue

"Tragically, every day in Australia, six babies are lost to

stillbirth, two to neonatal death and 280 to miscarriage," Senator Bilyk said.

"Australia's rate of stillbirth is 35 percent higher than the countries with the lowest rates and has not changed in 20 years.

"By commemorating Pregnancy and Infant Loss Remembrance Day, we are not only honouring babies who have died and acknowledging the grief and loss of their families, we are also recognising the work that is yet to be done to prevent infant loss in Australia.'

Senator Bilyk recently participated in a Senate inquiry on stillbirth research and education and said it was clear from the evidence given to the inquiry that there are steps parents, the community and public authorities can take to minimise the risks and reduce the rates of stillbirth.

"I am hoping the recommendations from the inquiry and the observance of the remembrance day can become strong catalysts for change in driving down Australia's unacceptably high rates of infant death,' Senator Bilyk stated.

Young people shaping their future

Kingborough youth aged between 15 and 19 are encouraged to have their say on important issues through the Mission Australia Youth Survey 2021.

In 2021, as the health and economic impacts of COVID-19 become clear, the survey will give youth a platform to express their aspirations, issues and concerns

The Youth Survey 2020 was completed by more than 25,800 young people aged between 15 and 19 years, including 739 young people in Tasmania.

Tasmania's youth nominated the environment, equity and discrimination, and mental health as the most important issues facing Australia today, with over four in ten naming the environment most important.

The top three issues of personal concern for young people from Tasmania were coping with stress, mental health and school or study problems.

Close to half of respondents from Tasmania indicated they were extremely or very concerned about coping with stress. Mission Australia's State Director Mychelle Curran said the survey is invaluable for collecting current information about the views of young Australians.

"I am so thrilled that Mission Australia's Youth Survey is celebrating its 20th year of providing a unique platform for young people in Tasmania and across Australia to share their thoughts and experiences at a time when so much change is occurring," said Ms Curran.

"It's frequently referred to by organisations and governments, informs policies and gives an insight to families and individuals hoping to develop an understanding of what young people are thinking and experiencing.

"It provides a meaningful opportunity for young people to have a say in how their future is shaped.

This year's survey questions will again focus on young people's housing situation, disability and experiences of discrimination, along with new questions to better understand the impact of COVID-19 and stress management.

According to Mission Australia, young people in Tasmania are particularly impacted by housing affordability with rents across the state on the rise due to a range of factors including people relocating from the mainland in the face of the pandemic and an increase in working remotely.

In some parts of regional Tasmania rents have increased by 30 percent since 2016.

"We hope that during a time when so many young people across the state are dealing with unique challenges and changes caused by the pandemic, that they will take the opportunity to reflect and share their thoughts on that experience," Ms Curran said.

Bus building history in Kingston

Mr Wise was one of the first employees of the Ansair Kingston bus bodybuilding factory in early 1987 and remained there until the doors closed in 1995, when Ansett Transport Industries sold Ansair.

More than 260 buses were built at the factory during the period for use service throughout Tasmania.

The Metropolitan Transport Trust began using the name Metro during this period.

Metro Tasmania Pty Ltd, a state-owned company, was established in 1998.

Local Senator Eric Abetz recalls the factory and commended Mr Wise for recording details of the time.

"I can recommend it as an enjoyable read full of important historical facts and photographs," said Senator Abetz.




