



Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Dean Winter joined the Kettering Walkers for their anniversary walk on Friday, April 30, while campaigning for the State Government election. Mayor Winter has now resumed his mayoral duties until the confirmation of the election results by the Tasmanian Electoral Commission, which will see him move to State Government as a Member for Franklin. Forecast for mayoral election

Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Dean Winter returned to his role after a leave of absence in order to campaign for the State Government election held on Saturday, May 1 and has been tentatively endorsed as one of the five Members for Franklin.

Once the Tasmanian Electoral Commission (TEC) has confirmed the preliminary results, a by-election will be held by Kingborough Council to fill the vacant mayoral role.

Deputy Mayor Jo Westwood will be stepping back into the role of Acting Mayor, until the by-election can be held, determining who will replace Mayor Winter.

"Dean has worked tirelessly for our community and will leave very large shoes for an incoming mayor to fill," stated Deputy Mayor Westwood.

Deputy Mayor Westwood also confirmed she will not be running for mayor in the by-election.

"I'm in the midst of raising a young family and that is my priority for now," Deputy Mayor Westwood commented.

"I will continue to serve the community

as Deputy Mayor, a job I love with all my heart."

Kingborough Council's Environment, Development and Community Director Dr Katrena Stephenson, who is also the former CEO of the Local Government Association of Tasmania (LGAT), clarified the relevant points of the *Local Government Act 1993* which will guide the by-election for a new mayor.

"Under Schedule 5, 3(1) makes it clear that from the day someone commences holding office in any other Parliament in Australia, their office of councillor is automatically vacated," said Dr Stephenson.

"This creates a casual vacancy.

"Under section 308(4) a casual vacancy of mayor requires a by-election, and under this scenario also a by-election for the subsequent vacant councillor seat 308(6).

"To be elected as mayor, a candidate must also be separately elected as councillor.

"308(7) makes it clear that the term of office from the by-election is just to the next general local government elections, currently scheduled for October 2022," continued Dr Stephenson.

"Anyone eligible to vote in Kingborough Council elections is eligible to run as mayor/councillor in the by-election (section 254).

"This means, it does not have to be someone who is currently on council or indeed who has ever been a councillor.

"Division 8(308) provided for the Electoral Commissioner to determine (in consultation with the General Manager) the day on which notice of election is to be given, the nomination period and closure of the electoral rolls.

"If a current councillor was to stand for mayor and be elected, the councillor vacancy would be filled from the same by-election process.

"In relation to timing, it may be complicated by the tail end of the State Election process but generally the TEC acts as quickly as possible.

"The last mayoral by-election (Glamorgan Spring Bay) took about seven weeks from resignation to declaration of election results."

Dr Stephenson also clarified that while the by-election process is resolved, council meetings and council operations remain unaltered.

Winter springs ahead at polls

Kingborough residents cast their votes in the State Government election on Saturday, May 1, allowing Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Dean Winter to claim a seat in the State Parliament.

Although Mayor Winter was a late addition to the Labor ballot for Franklin, he proved popular enough to pull ahead of all bar two other candidates.

Mayor Winter will now return to his mayoral duties until he is officially sworn in as a Member of Parliament.

Although the final results of the election were not yet confirmed, at the time of printing 84 per cent of votes had been counted.

The Liberal Party have claimed 12 parliamentary seats, the Labor Party eight seats and the Greens two seats.

Thirteen seats are required to govern in majority and incumbent Premier of Tasmania, Peter Gutwein declared it was "extremely likely" the Liberals would govern in majority during his victory speech late on Saturday night.

"While obviously there is still some counting to be done, it would be an absolute honour and a privilege to be given that opportunity by the Tasmanian people," Premier Gutwein remarked.

"We will govern for all Tasmanians regardless of who you are, regardless of where you live, regardless of your circumstance or background.

"Once the count is completed, we will get straight back to work and ensure that together we secure Tasmania's future."

In Franklin, the Liberals have claimed two seats, won by incumbent MPs Jacqui Petrusma (21.2 per cent) and Nic Street (8.4 per cent).

Labor has also claimed two seats, through Dean Winter (11.6 per cent) and incumbent MP David O'Byrne (10.9 per cent).

Incumbent Greens MP Rosalie Woodruff (14.7 per cent) was also re-elected.

Following the five elected officials were Liberal candidate and Huon Valley Mayor Bec Enders (4.8 per cent), Liberal candidate Dean Young (4.6 per cent) and incumbent Labor MP Alison Standen (4.5 per cent) who was not able to reclaim her seat.

Clark still had two seats in question at the time of printing.

Liberal MP Elise Archer (14.9 per cent), incumbent Greens leader Cassy O'Connor (14.6 per cent) and Labor MP Ella Haddad (12.7 per cent) all reclaimed their seats.

There are four possible candidates for the remaining two seats including independent candidate and Mayor of Glenorchy City Kristy Johnston (11.4 per cent) and former Liberal Party member and Speaker of the House Sue Hickey (10.1 per cent), who is also running independently.

Liberal candidate Simon Behrakis (5.8 per cent) and incumbent Labor turned independent and now Liberal candidate Madeline Ogilvie (6.3 per cent) are also in contention.

In Bass, Premier Peter Gutwein stormed back into his seat with 48.4 per cent of the vote, with two of the remaining four seats still in question.

In Lyons, Labor leader Rebecca White (23.2 per cent) has regained her seat, along with three of the incumbent Liberal MPs.

With only one seat remaining, it is a close race between seven candidates who are separated by 1.3 per cent.

Many out of division, pre-poll and postal votes are still to be counted which may affect the final tally, however at the time of printing all information is correct.

Flu shot should not be forgotten

Kingborough residents are reminded to consider booking the annual influenza vaccination in the coming weeks to help reduce the threat of a rebound influenza season this winter. A nationwide survey commissioned by Sanofi Pasteur reveals that one-in-four Australians feel they do not need vaccination against influenza this year due to increased hand hygiene and social distancing measures. The survey results indicate up to five million Australian adults may not seek vaccination against influenza in 2021. University of Melbourne's clinical and public health specialist Professor Terry Nolan stressed this is not the

year to be complacent about influenza. "Influenza vaccination is particularly important this season, with low infection rates last year meaning there is a potential for lower than typical herd protection," said Professor Nolan. Lockdowns, strict social distancing and hygiene measures contributed to a record low number of notified influenza cases in 2020. However, with an easing of these restrictions, "it would be fair to expect more influenza cases this year," he said. "In fact, we have seen something of a yoyo-effect in influenza cases in Australia in recent years, with rela-

tively low rates one year (such as 2016 and 2018) followed by high rates the next (2017 and 2019). "It's logical that with fewer people infected last year, there is less herd protection going forward. "So, it's possible that the recent pattern could continue, and we may see a rebound flu season in 2021. "We cannot forget that influenza infection can be life-threatening." "The simple message is that unless you are booked in to receive a COVID-19 vaccine in the next 14 days, you can see a doctor or pharmacist for influenza vaccination," said Professor Nolan.

Wastewater tests for COVID-19 begin

Blackmans Bay is among the sites being monitored as part of the wastewater surveillance testing for fragments of COVID-19 in the state's sewer systems. Under the testing program, 12 sewage treatment plants will be sampled weekly and 10 will be sampled monthly. The sampled sites cover areas which include entry points to the state and major population centres. The initial six-month program will see samples sent to South Australia for testing, while Tasmania develops an in-state testing capability. The project will enlist the support of TasWater for sample collection and dispatch as part of its existing

sampling regime. Deputy Director of Public Health, Dr Julie Graham said if detection of harmless virus fragments occurred it did not necessarily mean there are active cases of COVID-19 in Tasmania. "Wastewater testing does not distinguish between viral material from someone who is currently infectious and someone who has recovered from their illness and continues to shed the virus," Dr Graham explained. "In the event of a positive reading the advice remains the same. "If you have symptoms get tested. "It is important that we all remain alert and continue

to practice good COVID safe behaviours. "Participation in this national program will mean we are better equipped to respond to a case or an outbreak in the community and appropriately allocate resources where they are required." The Tasmanian program is part of an Australia-wide scheme known as the Collaboration on Sewage Surveillance Project which is being led by Water Research Australia. Results will be published weekly on the Tasmanian Coronavirus website. For more information about the wastewater testing project go to <https://coronavirus.tas.gov.au/wastewater>

ANZAC Day dawn at Tarroona 2021

A fine morning greeted 250-300 people gathered at the Tarroona War Memorial, as the first light arrived on ANZAC Day, April 25.

The service, organised by Tarroona Ex-Services Club secretary Chris Horris, began with the arrival of a procession of ex-service personnel, musicians, flag bearers, Tarroona Scouts and other community members, who'd commenced marching in the dark before dawn.

Dr Canning also served as a Tarroona Ex-Services Club president and life member.

Curious people in the depths of Kingston Beach history

Kingston Beach local Lee Weller has been deep diving into the history of Kingston Beach and his research quests have uncovered some strange answers, curious people and surprising connections.

Mr Weller is sharing his discovery gems in a talk hosted by the Browns River History Group on May 10.

The talk is titled *The shaping of Kingston Beach: 1823 to 1923*.

Browns River History Group president Rosie Severs said the talk is the result of a significant research effort by Mr Weller spanning many years and will be of interest to all

who live nearby, swim or walk at Kingston Beach.

"Lee's talk, called *The shaping of Kingston Beach: 1823 to 1923*, has been the result of much research into the Kingston Beach area," said Ms Severs.

"The Wellers have been living at Kingston Beach since 1974.

"When Lee started to look into the early history, he discovered strange answers, curious people and surprising connections.

"Come along to find out more and maybe get a different view of Kingston Beach," encouraged Ms Severs.

Browns River History Group's *The shaping of Kingston Beach: 1823 to 1923* talk will be held at Kingston Library Learning Centre, the old Kingston primary school building at 8 Hutchins Street, in Block A Room A1, from 3pm to 4 pm, on Monday, May 10.

Garden Island Creek landcare

On Saturday, April 17 a group of around 30 community members met to officially create a new Landcare group, Friends of Garden Island Creek.

A committee of 10 was elected and the group's objective is to work together to improve and protect the lands, waterways, and beaches of Garden Island Creek.

The first issue the group plans to address is access to the beach at Garden Island Sands.

This problem for local residents and visitors alike is what initially brought the group together, following the removal of a boat ramp by the Tasmanian Parks and Wildlife Service (PWS) that had provided beach access for decades.

Without the boat ramp, an approximately one metre unstable, rocky drop onto the beach has been created, making it impossible for many members of the community to safely step down onto the beach.

The newly formed Landcare group is planning to lobby and work with State and local governments to provide access to the beach for the community.

Other community projects the group are interested in undertaking in the future include erosion mitigation along Garden Island Sands beach and creek, providing habitat to swift parrot and devil populations, feral cat control and eradication, cultural burning and provision of walking tracks.

Landcare Tasmania has more than 250 member groups across the state.

Joeys go digital with robotics coding

Scouting groups of all ages in the Kingborough Council region have an opportunity to experiment with robots and coding with the team from Kingborough Robotics.

The Blackmans Bay Joeys aged six to eight, led by Lee Cowen, took the program one step further, and have used the robotics activities for a skills badge requirement.

The Joeys had two sessions at the Kingston Library with a floor robot called Bee-Bot.

The Joeys learned how to program Bee-Bot with directions and used mapping coordinates.

“The program provided the Joeys with an opportunity to explore the world of robotics,” said Lee.

“It was well organised and aptly suited to the children’s level of understanding and abilities.

“The children were totally engaged in the activities and satisfied some of the requirements of a badge they are working towards.”

Robots are a fantastic tool to engage children in activities that require step-by-step instructions, which are the building blocks for learning to code.

The Kingborough Robotics team have been running a variety of workshops throughout the year, based at the Kingston Library and also visiting many centres in the community, including early learning, community houses and outside school hours care.

The team is made up of a teachers and library staff with a keen interest in digital technology.

They aim to provide a fun, educational experience ensuring that each child succeeds.

After overwhelming interest from families in coding and robotics, the Kingston Library applied for and received a

Tasmania Community Fund grant to establish Kingborough Robotics.

While the outreach program will conclude on June 30, a Robotics Library has been developed for community groups.

This will provide access to the equipment on a loan basis giving children more opportunities to stay up to date with new technology.

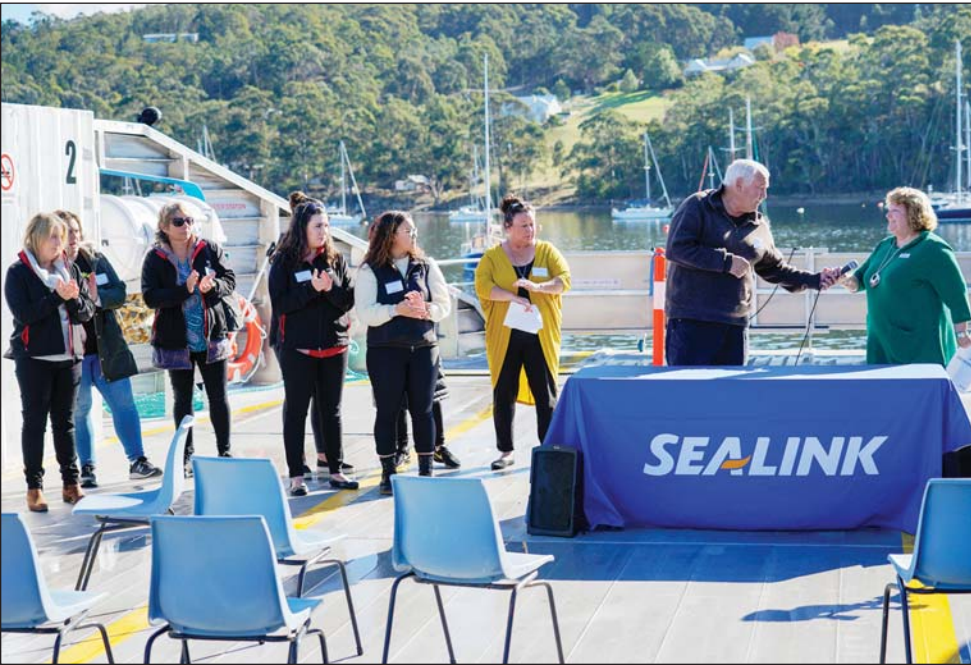
