

Hope riding on congestion busting plan

Development applications for the State Government's Firthside and Huntingfield park and ride projects were approved at the Kingborough Council meeting held on May 3.

Deputy Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Jo Westwood said the \$6.75 million park and ride facilities were part of the Hobart City Deal project, developed to alleviate traffic congestion for those travelling to and from Hobart and Kingston.

"The Hobart City Deal is a formal partnership between the State, Federal and Local Governments, established to support greater Hobart with a reliable, sustainable and cost-effective transport system," Deputy Mayor Westwood said.

"Everyone who travels to and from Hobart during peak hour knows how frustrating it is being caught in the traffic.

"A huge number of Kingborough residents travel outside of Kingston for work and this congestion is only set to get worse as our population grows."

Deputy Mayor Westwood referred to ABS data when speaking about the projected growth of Kingborough and the impact of this on commuters.

"Kingborough's estimated population is set to grow to approximately 44,000 by 2041, up from 37,734 in 2018," commented Deputy Mayor Westwood.

"These park and rides will give Kingborough commuters a chance to travel to and from town with the convenience free parking for their cars and bikes.

"The park and ride site at Huntingfield will cater for 174 car spaces, including three disability spots.

"Huntingfield park and ride will have a parkiteer, which is a bike storage facility, catering for 23 bikes with toilet facility next door.

"Firthside park and ride site will have 44 car parking spaces, including three accessible spaces for people with a disability.

"Firthside will have spaces for 26 bicycles in a five by seven-meter parkiteer.

"Both sites will be landscaped and contain a number of trees including native and introduced species."

Deputy Mayor Westwood said the two park and ride locations would make travel by bus easier and more appealing to commuters.

Accompanied by a commitment from the State Government to trial increased bus services throughout the Kingborough and Channel areas over the next five years, it is expected that more residents will be able to take advantage of bus services, easing congestion on the Southern Outlet and other problem areas through the region.

preservation sales pitch, is the affordable housing, as Mr
Whayman asks in his letter.

Tasmanian State definition of 'affordable housing' and

ground did cost.

Draft Budget rates and charges increases

Dear Editor,
Kingborough Council is currently in the process of final-
ising its budget for the 2021/22 financial year, which is

available for public comment until May 14.

Council will consider the Draft Budget at its scheduled
meeting on June 7.

Kingborough Ratepayers Association Inc (KRAI) has concerns
over the budgeted overall rates increase of 7.26 per cent,
including the stormwater, garbage and recycling charges.

In particular, KRAI disputes the proposal to increase the
General Rates payable by 5.96 per cent.

General Rates are set by council in various land use cat-
egories that are not yet separately categorized in the budg-
et papers, but overall comprise the 5.96 per cent estimate.

This financial year, council had budgeted for a 2.8 per
cent increase in the General Rate, in accordance with its
Long-term Financial Plan.

Due to COVID-19, council remitted the planned rise.

In a recent public statement, Mayor Winter advised that
council intended to recover the remitted General Rate
charge by doubling up on the 2.8 per cent figure in the
coming financial year.

In the Draft Budget, the figure is in fact slightly higher
than that, at 5.96 per cent.

An initial version of these calculations was discussed with
council staff on April 19 and accuracy was not disputed.

Each financial year, council includes in its rates estimate
a one percent rates revenue increase to be derived from
new building and subdivisional activity.

This results in Supplementary Valuations provided by the
Valuer-General that add to the rating base.

During 2020/21, and for many years previously, this fig-
ure has proved to be inadequate and not accounted for in
the budget process.

As forecast for 2020/21, the General Rates Revenue has
increased by 2.68 per cent where only one per cent was
budgeted for following the pandemic remission.

KRAI has made a submission to council, pointing out the
unwarranted extent of the General Rates increase regard-
ing the forecast unbudgeted increases in the rates rev-
enue during 2020/21.

If council is to comply with its Long-term Financial Plan,
KRAI is of the opinion that for 2021/22, the General Rates
increase should be four per cent and not 5.96 per cent as
shown in the budget papers.

There will also be increased charges for garbage collec-
tion (10.32 per cent) and stormwater (4.26 per cent) with
many ratepayers still experiencing adverse financial cir-
cumstances after last year.

KRAI has long argued that council should be able to
operate within the constraints of CPI, as do household,
business and other entities within the community.

Council's adopted Long-Term Financial Plan basis of 2.8 per
cent far exceeds current economic indicators for inflation.

KRAI's submission did not address this anomaly, which is
considered a separate issue.

KRAI simply asserts that the 2021/22 budget figures are
in excess of its stated Long-term Financial Plan projec-
tions by a considerable amount.

The budgeted increase in rates as it stands is likely to
cause considerable disquiet.

Kingston Beach fun run returns

The annual Kingston Beach Fun Run and walk is back, after a COVID break in 2020.

The five-kilometre event is to be held on Sunday, May 23, commencing at 9am from the Kingborough Sports Centre.

The scenic course follows the Whitewater Creek trail onto Beach Road, finishing at Kingston Beach.

Kingston Beach residents Daniel and Ruby Smee have been regular participants for 17 years.

Daniel won the inaugural event in 2003 when it commenced from the old Kingston High School site.

Two years later Daniel ran alongside daughter Ruby in her first attempt at the age of five.

Fast forward 15 years and Ruby has become one of the finest female distance runners in Australia.

Ruby Smee has achieved national selection in cross country and track events and in 2019 she accepted an athletics scholarship at the University of San Francisco.

Ruby returned to Tasmania last year, due to the coronavirus outbreak, and has continued her studies on-line while training via correspondence with her US-based coach.

Ruby has had an outstanding track season, setting three new Tasmanian U/20 records and finishing ninth in the Australian 5000 metre championships, which was her first open competition against a star-studded field of Olympic representatives.

Ruby Smee was the first Tasmanian female across the finish line in the 2021 Run the Bridge race in March and aims to defeat her father, Daniel, for the first time in the Kingston Beach run, having narrowly missed out in 2019.

Daniel has also shown good form recently, setting new Tasmanian Masters records over 1500 metre and 3000 metre events recently.

There many prizes on offer, including a gift voucher from Pennicott Cruises and two mountain bikes for kids, donated by Rotarian Jill Sward.

All proceeds from the fun run are used to assist local community youth projects.

With a cap on entries, participants are encouraged to register early to avoid missing out.

It's harvest time at Chester's Patch community garden in Margate.

"We've had a wonderful season this year," remarked Klasina.

"Last season was a trial, getting to know the land.

"We've been using organic manure and experimenting with a no-dig technique.

"We'll be selling what we've made from what we've grown."

The stall will be selling chutneys, pickles, seeds and fresh vegetables.

Klasina acknowledged the traditional owners of the land and expressed gratitude for the use of the property, located in the paddock behind the Brookfield Shed.

"I'd like to acknowledge the traditional landowners and thank Peter and Helen Lindsay for letting us use the land," said Klasina.

"We're proud to be carrying on their tradition of caring for the land."

Klasina said the garden is financially supported by the Margate Christian Church.

"We grow vegetables for community meals at Brookfield Shed," said Klasina.

"We supported people through COVID who were having issues and were vulnerable."

Klasina said Chester's Patch is increasing in area and ready for more people to take up an allotment.

"In the garden we have four allotments plus the community allotment," said Klasina.

"Some of our people are in rentals, another woman lives in a unit and we know of people living in cars in the Channel."

Chester's Patch harvest festival, afternoon tea and stall will be held from 2:30pm to 4pm on Saturday, May 15, at the Brookfield Shed, Margate.

Championing development in balance with our environment

Elected to Kingborough Council in 1988, I have helped provide a long-term vision for Kingborough, championing development in balance with our environment.

For the last 33 years I have chaired many committees including council's Environment and Planning Committee as well as the Finance and Community Services Committees.

I contribute my experience as a member of council's Audit Panel.

I chaired council's Access Committee, Cycling South Inc. for two decades and established Kingborough Landcare Advisory Committee Inc. and I have been a Company Director for 34 years.

I have served as local government representative on Tasmanian Government committees, including Youth Homelessness, the Coastal Policy Review Panel, Kingborough/Huon Health Forum chair and as a NRM South Board member.

Kingborough's population has doubled while I have been a councillor, growing from a small rural community to a largely urban municipality where everyone wants to live.

Many Tasmanian councils are also experiencing growth, bringing pressure on infrastructure and services. Schools, shopping centers, sporting groups are thriving. Community expectations and council responsibilities

change with the impact of growth.

I have had to accept, and sometimes initiate, local government legislation changes, including abolition of Wards, a new local government act in 1993, new planning schemes and procedures and electoral reforms.

Reform has brought positive outcomes, but risks have accompanied the changes to the local government sector.

Reform has threatened many systems and activities. Challenges have included loss of control of capital and revenue from water and sewage, and reduced control over planning.

Future amalgamations loom on the horizon. Tasmania needs a state-wide strategic plan to guide future growth.

Together with careful stewardship over the last three decades, councillors, council staff and the community have helped to maintain a beautiful Kingborough where generations of families live, work and play and where interstate and overseas migrants are welcomed.

We have embraced development in balance with protecting and enhancing our environmental assets. Council, with the support of the newly elected Tasmanian Government, must provide strategies for infrastructure and services to manage growth and maintain our natural assets of beaches, rivers and vegetation for future generations.

Many Tasmanians have spent the last few weeks rolling up their sleeves ready for the COVID-19 vaccine.

But I have spoken to far too many people in our community who are still anxiously waiting for their vaccine.

Tasmanians will recall that the Prime Minister, Scott Morrison, promised four million Australians would be vaccinated by the end of March this year.

In late February, the Prime Minister promised that all aged care residents across the nation, as well as the front-line workers who care for them, would be vaccinated within six weeks.

These promises have been broken and the vaccine rollout is a shambles.

I have had calls from community members who have had to wait up to five weeks for an appointment, or worse, they

are being turned away because there are no vaccinations.

There are also reports of people going to their appointment only then to be told that they are unable to get the vaccine due to issues with the delivery of the vaccine to GPs.

Sadly, Scott Morrison was too slow in securing vaccines for Australians.

It was not until September last year that Mr Morrison secured our first contract, the AstraZeneca vaccine.

This is despite Scott Morrison declaring Australia was at "the front of the queue".

I would encourage anyone with concerns over the vaccine to contact their GP or medical health specialist to discuss these concerns and seek medical advice.

The sooner we all get vaccinated, the safer we will all be and the sooner we can reopen our economy and businesses can continue to recover and create jobs.

Under the program, each federal electorate is provided with \$67,700 to fund small projects.

Ms Collins will be assisted by a Franklin Community Consultation Committee in determining which projects will be asked to apply for the 2021/22 program.

Committee members are yet to be confirmed, however, Ms Collin's office advised the *Kingborough Chronicle* on May 5 that in previous years the committee has comprised four members, with members to be

chosen from across the Franklin electorate.

"This grant will be a great opportunity for local community organisations and clubs to assist with improving energy efficiency and productivity," said Ms Collins.

"This will be vital for organisations to be able to save money on their energy bills."

Interested organisations are encouraged to contact Ms Collins, to request an expression of interest form and a copy of the program's guidelines.

Expressions of interest will be accepted up until 8pm Sunday, June 20.







The gene must be inherited from both parents for the condition to present, however most people are unaware they are carriers.

Lung failure is the major cause of death for those with CF. "Each year the event has grown and families at

Willson racks up go-kart class wins

An excellent performance saw him set a class-winning time, faster than his performance in the same event in October 2020.

Willson thanked his sponsors, his family and friends for their continued support of his racing career.

Next on Willson's Go Kart racing calendar is the Southern Tasmanian Kart Club's club titles, in which Willson is currently placed third.

In June, Willson is scheduled to compete at Baskerville Raceway in the Mini Car Club's club race day, in which he finished in first place and set a new class record in 2020.




