Final sailing for long-serving ferry

The MV Mirambeena will officially retire from the Bruny Island ferry service today, Tuesday, May 25, after 30 years of ferrying both locals and visitors

The Tasmanian Electoral Commission (TEC) announced on May 19 that a local government byelection is to be held for one councillor and the position of mayor at Kingborough Council, due to the election of Dean Winter to State Parliament.

The TEC expect a greater number of postal votes will be hand delivered to council offices later in the polling period,

due to changes to Australia Post delivery services.

To allow sufficient time for these to be delivered to the Returning Officers, the Commissioner has set a new, later time for close of polls as 2pm on Tuesday, July 20. The by-election will be conducted by postal ballot and run on the following timetable.

Regional recovery committees

COVID-19 has had a significant impact on the Kingborough community, including on social and economic wellbeing.

The State Government is implementing immediate and short-term relief and recovery measures and initiatives to support the state's longer-term recovery from the pandemic.

Coordinating and supporting state-level recovery measures is important, but enabling regional recovery, through community-led, placed-based approaches that respond to the needs within each area of the state is also crucial to ensure the best outcomes for the Tasmanian people, businesses and communities.

Regional Recovery Committees (RRC) are being established in Tasmania's south, north and north-west to support Tasmania's recovery from COVID-19 in all communities across the state.

The committees will play an important role in identifying the medium and long-term recovery needs within each region, as well as enabling locally-led, placebased recovery activities.

The committees will initially be appointed for two years, to identify the specific impacts of COVID-19 in each region, each region's priorities for recovery, recommend government-led recovery activities, and enable community-led recovery activities and support the government in the ongoing response to and recovery from COVID-19.

RRC members will all be based in the relevant region and will include nine members, the mayor of one predominantly rural or regional local council in the RRC region, the mayor of one predominantly urban local council in the RRC region, two community members living in the RRC region, one young person (18-24 years) living in the RRC region, one State Government representative, one Commonwealth representative, one business or business sector organisation and one social services sector organisation.

Storytime from space

Kingston Library was one of many organisations across Tasmania that celebrated National Simultaneous Storytime (NSS) on Wednesday, May 19.

NSS is a fun, free and vibrant event that encourages families to read with their children, as the same book is read at the same time, by hundreds of thousands of readers across the country.

ALIA, Scholastic, the Australian Space Agency and the Office of the Chief Scientist banded together to bring children across Australia an intergalactic experience this year. Dr Shannon Walker, a real astronaut located on the International Space Station (ISS), read the book Give me some Space!, written and illustrated by Philip Bunting.

Dr Walker is a NASA astronaut who has spent more than 200 days in space.

She is currently serving as a mission specialist for the SpaceX Crew-1 mission, which travelled to the ISS on the spacecraft, Resilience, on November 15, 2020.

Closer to home, Tasmanian astronomer Dr Martin George credits his inspiration for becoming an astronomer to books, reading and storytelling

"My upbringing included plenty of time with books," said Dr George.

"I became addicted to reading.

"I still have many of the astronomy books from my childhood and I remember the inspiration they gave me to pursue a career in astronomy.

"One of my favourite activities as a child was being taken by my father to the State Library of Tasmania in Hobart, and I recall being fascinated by the storytelling taking place there.

Last year, more than 1,297,000 participants at more than 14,469 locations joined the fun.

Kingston Library hosted 101 children and 20 adults for this year's event, including visitors from Possums Early Learning Centre and Taroona Primary School.

The team did some warm up songs, then the children listened to Dr Walker read *Give me some Space!* from the ISS. Afterward the team also read Zelda's Big Adventure by Marie Alafaci and included a theatre style performance by library staff which was greatly enjoyed by their guests.

New vessels increase capacity

Two faster, more reliable Tasmanian-built vessels, the Parrabah and the Nairana, have replaced the Mirambeena and are now serving the route.

When announcing the vessel's retirement, Minister for Infrastructure and Transport, Michael Ferguson MP said the replacements were designed to improve operations.

"The combined use of the new vessels will provide passengers with a much more reliable, efficient and comfortable service and landside infrastructure upgrade works which are well underway and will maximise their operation," remarked Minister Ferguson.

"Combined, the two new vessels are capable of faster turnaround times and an overall greater crossing capacity.

"A 20-minute rotational timetable allows the two new vessels to carry up to 90 to 108 vehicles an hour, compared to 82 vehicles an hour utilising the Mirambeena and the Moongalba on half hourly services.

"Capacity will also increase when the vessels run on shuttle during times of high demand.

"I know that for many locals and shackies, the "Mirra" has been a part of island life, helping to move generations of Bruny families to and from the island.

"So it is sad to see her retire."

Over its service life the Mirambeena has made an estimated 230,000 crossings between Kettering and the island, carrying more than six million vehicles during this time.

The MV Bowen remains available for back-up for the new vessels if required, in order to meet current operational, turn-around and scheduling requirements of the service.

The Mirambeena will be berthed at Prince of Wales Bay while the Department of State Growth plans disposal options for the decommissioned vessel.

DECLARATION OF PROHIBITED AREA FOR CATS

Coffee Creek, Algona and **Huntingfield Reserves**

Kingborough Getting vaccinated against COVID

A message from Dr Shannon Melody, Specialist **Medical Advisor, Tasmanian Vaccination Emergency Operations Centre.**

COVID-19 vaccinations are a big step towards protecting the lives of millions of people around the globe and reducing the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.

On a global scale, COVID-19 has already claimed the lives of over 3.3 million people. All Tasmanians need to have accurate information to

help them make an informed decision about getting a COVID-19 vaccine.

Below are answers to Tasmania's most frequently asked questions.

Why should I get vaccinated?

Vaccination is an important way for people to protect themselves, their family and their community against

Vaccination protects against COVID-related illness and will offer peace of mind of by providing another layer of protection to loved ones and people nearby

High levels of vaccination against COVID-19 is a key tool in fighting the pandemic.

If most of the adult population gets vaccinated, this will reduce the health, social and economic impacts of the pandemic.

Every dose of vaccine makes a difference.

Which COVID-19 vaccines are available in Tasmania and how do they work?

There are currently two COVID-19 vaccines available in Australia: the Pfizer vaccine and the AstraZeneca vaccine. Both vaccines require two doses.

For the Pfizer vaccine, people will receive two vaccinations approximately three weeks apart.

For the AstraZeneca vaccine, people will receive two vaccinations approximately 12 weeks apart.

Both vaccines are highly effective at reducing the severity of COVID-19.

Both vaccines work by training the immune system to recognise and respond to the virus that causes COVID-19.

What about vaccine side effects and the blood clotting issue?

Over a billion doses of COVID-19 vaccine have been delivered globally to date.

The COVID-19 vaccinations available in Australia have been approved by an expert regulatory body, the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA).

Once approved, the TGA and the Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation (ATAGI) monitor data within Australia and from around the world to ensure that the vaccines remain safe.

All vaccines can have side effects and the COVID-19 vaccines are no different.

After vaccination some people experience no side effects at all and some experience mild side effects.

Serious side effects are very rare.

Common side effects of vaccination may include redness at the vaccine site, a sore arm, muscle aches and fatigue. Some people may also experience a mild fever or

headache. These symptoms usually start within 24 hours of vaccination and last for one to two days.

These symptoms are not of concern unless severe or

Those experiencing worrying side effects should contact their GP.

A rare but serious side effect called thrombosis with thrombocytopaenia syndrome (TTS) has been associated with the AstraZeneca vaccine.

TTS occurs when there are blood clots (thrombosis) and low platelets (thrombocytopaenia).

This syndrome generally occurs between four and 20 days after the first dose of the vaccine.

Global data suggests that while the overall incidence of TTS is low, it is higher in those under 50 years of age. This newly described syndrome is different from more

common clots, such as deep vein thrombosis. These more common blood clots can occur in around 50 Australians every day separate to vaccination and are not related to the rare TTS clotting disorder.

TTS has not been seen after the Pfizer vaccine.

As a result, the Pfizer vaccine is the preferred vaccine for people under 50 years of age.

For those who have already received their first dose of AstraZeneca without complication, there is no reason to delay or miss the second dose (even if under 50).

Both doses of the vaccine are required to be protected against COVID-19.

Anyone with any concerns about getting vaccinated, speak with their usual health care provider.

Which vaccine should I get?

Pfizer is preferred over the AstraZeneca vaccine for adults under the age of 50.

In people aged 50 years and over, AstraZeneca is recommended.

The benefits of vaccination far outweigh the risk of the rare but serious blood clotting complication for people in this age group.

This is because the risk of serious outcomes from COVID-19 infection increases with age.

Decisions about which vaccine to administer are based on the best medical evidence available.

For particular concerns about individual circumstances or conditions, please speak to a doctor or health care provider.
