# **Cable car bypasses Kingborough Council**

Kingborough Council has revealed the people of the municipality have not been consulted regarding the controversial, private cable car and associated infrastructure development proposal on a section of

kunanyi/Mount Wellington visible from properties across the region.
The Kingborough Chronicle wrote to Kingborough Council and councillors on May 26, in response to a media release from Tasmania's Minister for Infrastructure and Transport Michael Ferguson MP, who welcomed news that the development had moved forward in the application process being undertaken by Hobart City Council.

Hobart City Council opened the public notification period for the planning application on May 24.

However, Cr Flora Fox said the Kingborough municipality is a part-owner of Mt Wellington and therefore Kingborough Council should be involved in assessment and decision-making.

"Five councils, Hobart, Glenorchy, Derwent Valley, Huon Valley and Kingborough, are part land owners of parts of Mt Wellington, including the peak where our boundaries intersect," noted Cr Fox.

"The Mt Wellington Trust was formed in the 1990's to manage Mt

Wellington Park as a reserve. "I understand that this did not remove our ownership or boundaries and

therefore our Planning Schemes should allow all of the five councils to have an input to this development application.

"Kingborough residents enjoy magnificent daily views of the mountain, from Blackmans Bay and Kingston, to the Channel and Bruny Island.

"Our mountain has a mystical significance to most people living here, including members of the aboriginal community."

# **Blackmans Bay strays**

Kingborough Council has advised of its intention to declare the Coffee Creek, Algona and Huntingfield Reserves as prohibited areas for cats as defined in Section 19 of the Cat Management Act 2009. In a media release on May 20, Cr Paula Wriedt said

that the community could make submissions in writing

Cr Wriedt thanked the community in Blackmans Bay for their work with the Kingborough Council in cat management in the area.

Cr Wriedt said the community highlighted back in 2019 that there were several stray cats in and around the northern end of Blackmans Bay Beach, Blowhole Reserve and Mary Knoll Reserve.

"This is an important area for wildlife, including Little penguins, Swift parrots and bandicoots," Cr Wriedt said. "These are protected species and are especially vul-

nerable to predation by cats. "The response from the community was very positive

with them helping with sightings and trappings on their

Blackmans Bay community member, Mark Thorp helped with the cat trapping program in the area.

"It was such a pleasure doing the 4am and 6am cat trap checks and discovering cats in them, knowing there were possible wildlife lives saved that day," said Mr Thorp. Cr Wriedt said since the start of the program 23 stray

and feral cats have been trapped on private properties and along the beachfront, while two domestic cats were taken to the Ten Lives Centre. "With the removal of these cats, many of the local

native species will have a chance of survival," said Cr Council offers people assistance with trapping stray

cats on private property, rehoming of unwanted cats and cheap desexing of domestic cats. The community can make submissions in writing

regarding the proposal to make Coffee Creek, Algona and Huntingfield Reserves prohibited areas for cats, by emailing kc@kingborough.tas.gov.au or by writing to the Kingborough Council prior to June 22.

# Vaccination push follows outbreak

Tasmanians have been urged to vaccinate against COVID-19 following another outbreak of cases in Victoria last week.

On May 26, Premier of Tasmania, Peter Gutwein MP said more than 101,000 Tasmanians had received their first dose of the vaccine.

The figure represents more than 23 per cent of the state's population aged 16 and over. "There are now 23 active cases of COVID-19 in

Victoria, with 15 linked to the current outbreak, with Victorian authorities continuing to assess the situation," said Premier Gutwein. On May 27, Premier Gutwein updated the community on

the outbreak in Victoria and announced border restrictions which came into effect at 2pm the same day. Those who arrived before 2pm were allowed into

Tasmania as long as they had not been at any of the previously declared high-risk areas.

"The health and safety of Tasmanians remains our number one priority as we continue to respond to the coronavirus pandemic." declared Premier Gutwein

"In response to the escalating situation in Victoria, Tasmania's Public Health Service has declared all of Victoria a high-risk area from 2pm today. "This means you now cannot travel to Tasmania if you

have spent time in Victoria in the previous 14 days, unless you are approved as an Essential Traveller by the Deputy State Controller. "Current Tas e-Travel passes have been cancelled and anyone wanting to enter will need to reapply

through the G2G system. "I know this will be inconvenient and upsetting for many but the safety of all Tasmanians must come first, and as we have done from the start, we make no apologies for going hard to lessen the risk of an outbreak occurring in

Tasmanian residents can apply for Essential Traveller status but will be required to quarantine on arrival for 14 days, either at a suitable home premises or in government-designated accommodation at their own cost.

Tasmania," Premier Gutwein stated.

Anyone who has been in Victoria since Thursday, May 6, is advised to monitor their health and keep checking the

# Premier silent on cable car donors

Kingborough Council have advised that the Mount Wellington Cableway Company met with council in September 2018, however there does not appear to have been any follow up or proper consultation with council or councillors since.

"The Kingborough Council is not aware of any consultation that has specifically been done with the community of Kingborough in regards to the cable car proposal," said the council spokesperson.

Cr Fox said councillors individually met two of the proponent's consultants in 2018.

"Councillor Richard Atkinson and I met with [the proponent's consultants] upstairs in council one evening and were shown the concept plans," Cr Fox said.

"We both raised our objections and concerns about the physical and environmental impact on the reserve, especially on the summit where many beautiful and iconic natural rock formations were proposed to be removed or built over.

"Our concerns were treated with disdain and arro-

Cr Fox recalled media reports in 2018 stating the majority of residents in southern Tasmania were opposed to the cable car, but that further north, out of sight of Mt Wellington, the majority were in favour.

Premier of Tasmania, Peter Gutwein MP, has refused to answer questions regarding political donations received from private interests involved in the Mt Wellington cable car proposal.

In a media release on May 19, Tasmania's Minister for Infrastructure and Transport, Michael Ferguson MP, said the State Government always strongly supported the proposal.

"The Tasmanian Liberal Government has always strongly supported the proposal for a Mt Wellington cable car and we welcome the news that it has taken another step forward." said Minister Ferguson.

"This project has the potential to bring significant investment to the state and create new jobs, both during construction and once operational."

Minister Ferguson stopped short of providing any details or evidence used to justify the decision.

The Kingborough Chronicle wrote to Premier Gutwein and Minister Ferguson on May 19 and 20, raising the following questions:

"What is the actual job number the Minister is referring to post-construction phase?

"How many property owners in (a) Kingborough and (b) Hobart and surrounds, did the Tasmanian govern-

"Please identify the potential social/cultural, environmental and economic losses.

"Please identify the private interests that stand to benefit.

"Have any private interests associated with the pro-

"Have any private interests associated with the proposed development made political donations to the Liberal party or its members in the last 10 years?

"If so please provide details, including the amount of money received."

Neither Premier Gutwein nor Minister Ferguson answered the questions.

"While we are supportive of the cable car, it's not actually a government project," the Premier's office stated. "We won't be responding further. "All of your questions should be directed to the proponent."

The Kingborough Chronicle replied, noting political donations is a matter for the Premier and Minister Ferguson, as it goes to the heart of government transparency, integrity and accountability and is not a question that can be outsourced to a private project proponent.

Premier Gutwein's office responded, referring the *Kingborough Chronicle* to the Liberal Party State Director, Stuart Smith.

"Political donations are a matter for the Liberal Party, not the State Government.

"Please contact the Liberal Party State Director Stuart Smith." However, when approached by the *Kingborough Chronicle* on May 20, Liberal Party of Australia (Tasmanian Division) Secretariat Stuart Smith did not supply the requested information.

"All donations to the Liberal Party are disclosed in accordance with the law to the Australian Electoral Commission," stated Mr Smith.

The State Government has previously facilitated the cable car project, introducing legislation in 2017, enabling the Mount Wellington Cableway Company Pty Ltd to access public land within kunanyi/Mount Wellington for the purposes of the development project.

Following the introduction of the *Cable Car* (*kunanyi/Mount Wellington*) Facilitation Act 2017, Premier Gutwein, as the State Minister for Growth, signed authorities on February 11 and March 22, 2019 for the private company to access Wellington Park.

The Kingborough Chronicle sought comments from various elected representatives of the local community at Local, State and Federal Government level and from the local Indigenous community.

Member for Clark, Cassy O'Connor MP responded on May 19 that the community had been treated "with contempt" from the outset of the proposed development.

Ms O'Connor said the Tasmanian Government has sustained an overt facilitation of the proposal.

"kunanyi is not only a public treasure, it's a place of deep and timeless cultural significance to the palawa pakana people," said Ms O'Connor.

"The clearing of bushland and alpine vegetation will be significant.

"This project, like the dozens of others for developments in protected areas, has been shrouded in secrecy. "The community won't give up.

"I urge every community member who loves Hobart's treasured mountain and wants it to remain in public hands to write to Hobart City Councillors when submissions open.

"Just as we rallied in our thousands at her foothills, we will ensure council understands there is no place for this destructive proposal, or the privatisation of the pinnacle on kunanvi."

Planning application documents are available for viewing at the City of Hobart's customer service centre, 16 Elizabeth Street, Hobart and online via the council's webpage.

Members of the public can make representations for or against the cable car project during the public notification period, which ends on June 22, for consideration by Hobart City Council during their assessment of the application.

# More than 1400 families hit with soaring child care fees

New data released by the Federal Department of Education shows families in the Kingborough region have been hit with soaring child care fees.

The data shows over the previous 12 months, local child care fees across Kingborough increased by 5.7 per cent, well above the national increase of 2.4 per cent.

This increase in fees substantially outstripped inflation for the same period of 0.9 per cent, which the Child Care Subsidy is pegged to, meaning local families are now paying more out-of-pocket for child care.

The new data shows that nationwide, child care fees have soared by 37.2 per cent since the election of the Federal Liberal Government in 2013.

On average, child care fees are \$4446 more per year than when the Liberals came into office.

The evidence is clear, the government's child care system is broken and Australian families are paying

Only Federal Labor has a real plan to tackle skyrocketing out-of-pocket child care costs and keep them down for good.

If elected, a Labor Government will cut child care fees and put more money into the pockets of working families straight away, by:

• Scrapping the \$10,560 child care subsidy cap which often sees women losing money from an extra day's work;

- Lifting the maximum child care subsidy rate to 90 per cent: and
- Increasing child care subsidy rates and taper them for every family earning less than \$530,000.

Labor's plan will make child care more affordable for 97 per cent of families in the system, four times as many as the Federal Government's plan.

Only Labor will keep out-of-pocket costs down for families, by tasking the ACCC to design a price regulation mechanism to shed light on costs and fees and drive them down for good.

By contrast, the Federal Government has no plan to keep a lid on soaring child care fees.

If elected, Labor will also task the Productivity Commission to conduct a comprehensive review of the sector, with the aim of implementing a universal 90 per cent subsidy for all families.

The Federal Government's child care system has failed local families in the Kingborough region.

It has failed to keep a lid on out-of-pocket costs and it has failed to support working parents, particularly women, to work full time or increase their hours.







# Kingborough Chronicle Sport Lightwood Park gamechanger

"On behalf of the club, I would like to thank the State Government for their support committed during the recent election campaign and through the Levelling the Playing Field program, as well as the Kingborough Council for their contribution.

"Following a tender process, we're delighted to announce local company Maveric Builders will build Stage 1 of the project, which is expected to be completed by late November.'

Mr Downes said local business Clennett's Mitre 10 had also signed on as naming rights sponsors of Lightwood Park.

"As a proud member of the local community, KLUFC is actively working with the local business community to attain and develop long term partnerships in conjunction with the investment," Mr Downes said.

"We're thrilled to announce we have partnered with well-known and much respected local business Clennett's Mitre10 who will be the new naming rights sponsor of Clennett's Lightwood Park.'

Mr Downes said the club were seeking a further \$3 million funding from the Federal Government to complete Stage 4 of the project.

'The additional funding from the Federal Government will not only allow for the total completion of the new

building but will also allow for further improvements around the main ground including an improved playing surface, new lights to 500 lux standard and improved security and fencing," Mr Downes added.

Football Tasmania CEO Matt Bulkeley said the improvements would greatly enhance the likelihood of Lightwood Park being selected as a Base Training Camp for the upcoming 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup.

"With world-class facilities for Australian rules and cricket just across the road at the Twin Ovals, it's wonderful that football will soon be able to follow suit in the Kingborough region, giving Lightwood Park the very best chance of being selected to host World Cup content." Mr Bulkelev said.
