Future vision for streetscape

Sometimes small changes can make a big impact, as the new dining laneway and large colourful mural in the main street of Kingston demonstrates.

Acting Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Jo Westwood said the mural is a step in aligning the existing CBD with Kingborough Council's vision for the

"The mural, lighting and paving of the laneway really brightens the streetscape and is in line with council's vision to encourage alfresco dining in the Kingston CBD," remarked Acting Mayor Westwood

The laneway features greenery, seating areas and lights hung over the top, creating a pleasant atmosphere to dine and socialise.

Restaurant owner, Young Kim said his new Korean food restaurant next to the laneway has been very busy since opening recently, proving the popularity of the newest dining area in central Kingston.

The laneway was a result of the Kingborough Council's Planning team

working with the building owner to incorporate a minor amendment to the planning permit.

"Originally the laneway was going to be left as a driveway, so this is a much better outcome for everyone," said Acting Mayor Westwood.

"It provides options for people to dine outside in fine weather and brings some colour and life to the streetscape.' The mural is by Tasmanian artist Jamin, who is well known for his

contemporary street art. "This fits really well with council's plans to transform Kingston's main street from a grey highway into something that is attractive for our

residents and visitors," Acting Mayor Westwood continued. "Later in the year the council will be consulting with the community on new designs for the Channel Highway streetscape.

"This mural is a great start and shows how a collaborative approach to planning can change our experiences for the better."

Winter support boost for NILS

An additional \$150,000 in funding has been supplied to the No Interest Loan Scheme (NILS) to help finance its Energy Saver Loan and Subsidy scheme which low-income Kingborough residents can access this winter.

Aurora Energy supplied the boost to the program, which funds 50 per cent of the cost to purchase new energy efficient heat pumps, with a minimum 2.5-star rating, up to a maximum purchase price of \$3000

New washing machines, fridges and freezers, with a minimum three-star energy

rating, are able to receive a subsidy of \$300 taken off the purchase price. Continued on page 3

Channel Court parking area signage

Dear Editor.

I am concerned about misleading signage in the Channel Court parking area.

While signs outside the underground parking area proclaim this to be a three-hour zone, poorly signed restricted parking areas inside the carpark indicate otherwise.

Closer inspection of signs at the carpark entrance reveal, in miniscule font, the words 'or unless otherwise indicated' stuck on, under the words 'fines apply' and 'seven days'. After falling foul of this misleading signage, I contested

a parking ticket, expressing my concerns to the council. The actual 15-minute parking sign I parked next to was obscured by a drainpipe.

I provided photos of this to the council, to no avail. Rather than simply fixing the signage, council elected to pursue the matter in court, including seeking costs.

One wonders how many others have been caught out and been met with similar litigious intimidation tactics? Council also sent a brochure implying my vehicle would be impounded and/or my licence suspended if I didn't

I interpreted the signage to mean the entire carpark was a three-hour parking zone.

In fact, the space where I parked had until very recently been a three-hour area.

I enquired regarding accessing, via Freedom of Information (FOI), details of when the signs had been amended and how many people had complained.

The information costs \$41, which is exactly the cost of

At which point I conceded I may as well pay the fine. However, as council had referred the matter to a private legal firm, I was told I would need to contact the firm.

In retrospect, I probably just should have conceded I was fighting a losing battle.

I'm annoyed at council's heavy handed and litigious approach.

Presumably they collect a lot of money from parking fines and if anyone challenges them, they're required to pay the council's legal costs.

A matter which should be trivial has become wasteful and very stressful.

It makes me wonder how many others have been subject to the same shoddy treatment.

Contact tracing is mandatory

Businesses that are currently non-compliant with Tasmania's mandatory contact tracing system regulations have been reminded of their legal obligations by the Premier of Tasmania, Peter Gutwein MP, on June 1.

The reminder came following a ballooning COVID-19 outbreak in Victoria.

"As we are seeing in Victoria, it only takes one positive case of COVID-19 in the community for it to spread quickly, especially with new strains continuing to emerge around the globe," Premier Gutwein said.

"Being able to quickly identify places and people at risk is crucial to community safety, and will allow us to act quickly and get on top of any future outbreaks.

Premier Gutwein said 17,500 premises and events have registered for a Check in TAS QR code.

"Tasmanians have already done a great job of getting

on board," remarked Premier Gutwein.

"However, we know there are businesses that have not yet registered and we need to ensure that all businesses are complying with the regulations.

"Business Tasmania is currently reaching out to businesses who have not registered.

"If anyone is unsure of their obligations or how to comply, we ask they please get in contact with Business Tasmania. 'Tasmanians are also encouraged to be proactive

about checking in at establishments. "Please be patient if it takes a little longer for staff to

ensure everyone is checked in." Phone, email and face to face support is available

Vaccine rollout leaves disabled people behind

People with intellectual disability, including those who live in group homes, are being left behind by the vaccine rollout warned Inclusion Australia CEO Catherine McAlpine in a media release on June 2.

Ms McAlpine said Federal Parliament Senate Estimates on June 1 revealed fewer than two per cent of people with disability living in group homes had been fully vaccinated.

"This is unacceptable," said Ms McAlpine.

"Inclusion Australia and our state member organisations, have been increasingly hearing from people with intellectual disability and their families, that they are feeling forgotten and ignored in the vaccine rollout

"People with intellectual disability were promised access to COVID vaccines in the first stage of the rollout, but that hasn't happened, leaving them exposed to any potential outbreak.

"People with intellectual disability who live in group homes are part of Phase 1A of the vaccine rollout due to their heightened risk of COVID," noted Ms McAlpine. "There are over 20,000 people with disability living in

group homes and most are people with intellectual disability. "We need urgent measures now right across

Australia to get the vaccination rollout on track for people with intellectual disability and their families."

Energy subsidy to assist low-income residents

In the last 18 months alone, the NILS program has provided no interest loans for Tasmanians to buy 478 fridges, 431 washing machines, 216 heat pumps and 66 freezers.

NILS CEO John Hooper said acquiring the products through NILS ended up costing much less than the retail price, which would be out of the reach for most low-income Tasmanians without the local support.

"This scheme enables financially vulnerable Tasmanians to save on energy and get a muchneeded energy efficient appliance," Mr Hooper said. "We know by talking to clients that they are incred-

ibly grateful for the subsidy scheme and the support

of those who make it possible, like Aurora.

"Every dollar of subsidy provided by Aurora has saved each family \$5 if they had turned to rent-tobuy companies as the alternative."

The increase brings Aurora Energy's commitment to close to \$2.5M in funding to the program since first partnering with NILS in 2015.

Aurora Chief Operating Officer Kane Ingham said the extra funding would provide greater opportunity for concession customers to improve their energy efficiency and power bill affordability, which is even more important as the cooler months approach.

"We've been a long-time supporter of NILS because we know inefficient energy usage is a key driver of high energy bills," Mr Ingham said.

Representations open on cable car

With the kunanyi/Mount Wellington cable car Development Application currently being advertised by Hobart City Council, more voices are expressing their opinion on the project.

According to Federal Independent Member for Clark, Andrew Wilkie MP, the process has been "deeply flawed" and it's understandable members of the public "smell a rat" on the cable car process.

Mr Wilkie's comments regarding the controversial project follow concerns raised by Kingborough Councillor Flora Fox and State Member for Clark, Cassy O'Connor MP, reported in last week's Kingborough Chronicle.

In correspondence with the Kingborough Chronicle on June 1, Andrew Wilkie MP said both the proponent of the kunanyi/Mt Wellington cable car and the State Government still have "a mountain to climb" to earn a social licence for the project.

"I am open-minded about development in Tasmania but only if it meets strict social, environmental and economic criteria, and is assessed in a transparent process that can be trusted," Mr Wilkie said.

"But not only is the Mt Wellington cable car proposal deeply flawed, the State Government has a track record of being tricky in the way it has tried to facilitate the project.

"Indeed, Tasmanian state governments have form when it comes to doing deals with big business at the expense of Tasmania's community and our unique environment."

Mr Wilkie said weak political donation laws and lack of transparency had escalated public alarm.

"The community's alarm at the cable car proposal is all the more heightened by the State Government's entrenched lack of transparency as well as Tasmania continuing to have the worst political donation laws in the country.

"In this environment it is entirely understandable that many members of the public smell a rat and are yet to be persuaded that all is well."

The Kingborough Chronicle asked former Mayor of Kingborough and newly elected State Member for Franklin, Dean Winter MP, if he agreed there should be transparency regarding private interests and political donations associated with the proposal.

Mr Winter responded that law reforms proposed by Labor in the Electoral Amendment (Electoral Expenditure and Political donations) Bill 2020 were not debated prior to the State election being called in 2021.

"Labor tabled legislation in Parliament which would require the disclosure of all political donations over \$1000 within 30 days," remarked Mr Winter.

"Sadly, Peter Gutwein called an election before it could be debated.

"The Bill was tabled last year.

"It was hoped it would be debated in 2021."

The Kingborough Chronicle asked Mr Winter if he could identify any donations received by the Labor party, Labor MPs and candidates in the last 10 years from private interests in the cable car proposal.

"I can only speak for myself," responded Mr Winter.

"I have never received a donation from the company." The Kingborough Chronicle has asked Mr Winter to identify a person who can answer the question on behalf of the Labor party in order to follow up.

Mr Winter has previously stated his move from council to State Parliament was motivated by the Tasmanian Government's failure to adequately respond to concerns of the Kingborough municipality.

The Kingborough Chronicle asked Mr Winter on June 2 if he would be representing locals concerned about the proposal in his new role in Parliament.

Mr Winter responded that he would encourage Kingborough residents with strong views to make a submission through Hobart City Council's assessment process.

"The Development Application is being advertised right now," Mr Winter said.

"I would encourage any Kingborough resident with a strong view to have their say through that process.

"It is open to anyone; whether you live in South Hobart or on Bruny Island, representations will be assessed on the merits of their arguments."



Disrupting drug trading

Tasmanian Crime Stoppers Week was launched on May 31, with a strong focus on illicit drugs, their entry points into the community and the role of residents in fighting this serious crime.

According to Tasmania Police, border closures related to the COVID-19 pandemic significantly disrupted the importation of drugs into the state last year.

While some drugs are manufactured in Tasmania in crude settings, most are imported via sea, air, and mail. Intelligence provided by the community through Crime Stoppers is a powerful weapon for police.

Crime Stoppers Tasmania Chair, David Daniels OAM encouraged the community to help police.

"Tasmania Police regularly conduct operations targeting airports, seaports and the mail system, and last year a number of investigations resulted in the seizing of significant amounts of methamphetamine (or ICE), with a street value of several million dollars, removing over 15,000 street deals from vulnerable Tasmanians," Mr Daniels said.

"We are a conduit between Tasmania Police and the community, while maintaining the anonymity of those who provide information.

"Tasmanians can assist in combatting drug-related and other crimes by telling us what they know anonymously. "Drug dealers are often hiding in plain sight in our

communities and can be masters of blending in. "People often feel powerless to act or think some-


one else will do something. "In the meantime, drugs are harming our loved ones

and cause other crimes. "We have seen a marked increase in anonymous reports from the wider community.

"In the past three years, there has been a 27 per cent increase in reports, with an 18 per cent increase in reports specifically about drug-related activity.

"If Tasmanians see or hear something that doesn't seem right, we encourage them to speak up, but stay secret by anonymously reporting what they know through our website or by phoning the Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000," Mr Daniels concluded.

Locally endangered candlebark planted

Planting of a locally endangered tree species Eucalyptus rubida, commonly known as candlebark, has been completed at Tramway Hill Reserve in Margate, according to a media release from Kingborough Council on June 1.

Council stated the planting effort aimed to help the species and improve habitat for wildlife.

A recent study commissioned by council found the Eucalyptus rubida species was considered to be endangered in the Kingborough area.

Although candlebark trees are not threatened in any other part of the state, based on its restricted geographic range, small population size, severe fragmentation and inferred population decline, it met the criteria in Kingborough.

Acting Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Jo Westwood said

historic land clearing of the species preferred habitat, had led to a decline in local populations.

"Tramway Hill Reserve in Margate was chosen as a preferred site due to the naturally occurring population of candlebark trees," Acting Mayor Westwood said.

"The council's Natural Areas and Biodiversity team hopes to plant more trees in the future in other remaining candlebark strongholds at Leslie Vale and Harts Hill." Seeds collected as part of the study have been kept at the Tasmanian Seed Conservation Centre at the Royal Tasmanian Botanic Gardens for council to use in revegetation projects.

The planting was part of an offset project under the Kingborough Environmental Fund.

Improving The Basics

Kingborough based program, The Basics, which focuses on critical early years development has recently been awarded a B4 Early Years grant to further the program's efforts to educate Kingborough families.

Principal of Margate Primary School, Kate Slater and Margate Primary School teacher Maree Thompson won a Hardie Fellowship to the US in 2018 to research the Achievement Gap Initiative at Harvard University.

The Basics is an evidenced driven early years initiative which is based on the science that 80 per cent of brain development occurs within the first three years of life and promotes the five principles which research has shown make the most difference during this critical period of development.

The five principles of The Basics are: Maximize Love, Manage Stress; Talk, Sing and Point; Count, Group and Compare; Explore through Movement and Play; and Read and Discuss Stories.

Maximise Love, Manage Stress

Babies and toddlers need loving, safe and predictable elationships.

Responding with smiles, words and touch to help them see, hear and feel loved will help them develop a sense of security and self- control.

Talk, Sing and Point

Babies learn language from the moment they are born and even before.

Making eye contact, using a loving tone of voice and talking with babies or toddlers during daily jobs can help develop language skills.

Pointing as we talk lets them know what is being spo-

Going back and forth, responding to facial expressions, coos, babbling and eventually words lets children develop conversational skills.

Count, Group and Compare

Children's brains are wired to learn about numbers, patterns, sizes, shapes and comparisons.

Talking about numbers, shapes and patterns that can be seen while going about everyday jobs like shopping, cooking, gardening, etc can encourage the development of these skills.

Explore through Movement and Play

Children learn about the world through movement and play. Babies are like scientists who love making new discoveries about their surroundings.

Encourage curiosity by drawing their attention to what is around them and watch to see what interests them in order to join in with them in playful exploration.

Babies might explore by grasping or banging something; a toddler might explore by walking or climbing.

Read and Discuss Stories

Babies enjoy reading too.

Reading aloud, talking about pictures and telling stories are some of the most important ways to prepare children for school.

Reading and talking about stories while making connections to a child's life helps build language skills and sparks imagination.

"We are trying to promote the messages and the idea that all of community can make a positive difference to a child's development in the way we interact and have conversations wherever we are," said Basics Coordinator and teacher Maree Thompson.

"We don't need expensive toys and so much learning occurs as we go about our everyday lives.


"The science is clear about the types of lived experiences that boost brain development and learning.

"Babies and toddlers thrive on interactions that are loving, stimulating, follow a child's interests or gaze and go back and forth."

A steering committee made up of a wide range of Kingborough community members has been assembled for the initiative, which was launched by Governor of Tasmania, Her Excellency, Professor, the Honourable Kate Warner in December 2019.

Senior Tasmanian of the Year, Brian Williams and Young Tasmanian of the Year, Toby Thorpe.


Kingborough Councillor Sue Bastone met with the three Kingborough winners recently while they undertook the Hobart section of their state tour.



Balancing all the pieces

It is often difficult to pinpoint the underlying causes of balance problems.

The balance system relies on ears, eyes and sensory receptors working together to maintain steadiness.

According to the Australian Society of Otolaryngology Head and Neck Surgery, over 36 per cent of Australians over fifty report some form of dizziness or vertigo.

Conditions such as Meniere's Disease and Benign Paroxysmal Positional Vertigo (BPPV) result in the sufferer losing confidence on their feet and may lead to seri-

"This is the condition where the calcium crystals have loosened in our inner ear which then overstimulate the system," said Mr Modrovich.

"This causes dizziness and even nausea in some people." "BPPV can easily be resolved with the Epley manoeu-

movements in the clinic. "The full test can take about two hours depending on

the patient.

"It really is a case of piecing together the findings to determine the potential cause of the dysfunction," Mr Modrovich concluded.

crimes and mass killings of civilians, leaving many from refugee backgrounds fearing for the safety of their loved ones overseas.

The funds awarded will pay for an expert lawyer on a temporary basis to directly provide free legal advice regarding this caseload and assist with the recent spike in requests for help with humanitarian visa applications for family members caught up in the conflict.

The conflict has resulted in approximately 62,255 Tigrinyian children and adults fleeing Ethiopia as refugees, primarily to Sudan.

The crisis has also left the region without electricity, water and food for several weeks.

"The legal advice provided by Tasmanian Refugee Legal Service (TRLS) lawyers may be the difference between family members being able to legally come to safety in Australia to join family members in Tasmania when borders re-open, or remaining separated from each other and facing ongoing danger," said Patrick O'Conner, a principal lawyer with the project.

"It is hoped that this free legal advice and casework will change the pathway of many people's lives and result in families being reunited and connected again in Tasmania.

"We are very grateful to the Harcourts Foundation for this grant.

"TRLS has received many requests for legal help with this caseload from Tasmanian community members in the past few months, who have requested legal help with the visa application process and the legal submissions required, and therefore we estimate that this projections ect will have a significant impact on the Tasmanian community," Mr O'Conner concluded.



Party pizza recipe idea from Breadd

With figs now in season, here is a sophisticated pizza recipe that is fabulous as nibbles with drinks.

INGREDIENTS:

- 2 plain Breadd pizza bases
- 8 fresh figs, quartered
- 230g mozzarella cheese, thinly sliced in round pieces or grated
- 8 slices prosciutto, torn into smaller pieces
- 1 cup rocket
- 1tbs olive oil
- 1/2 cup balsamic vinegar
- 2 tbs honey

METHOD:

- 1. Place the balsamic and honey in a saucepan. Bring to boil, reduce heat and simmer for around 20 minutes to reduce to about 1/3 cup. Remove from heat to cool.
- 2. Lightly brush the pizza bases with olive oil. Top evenly with the mozzarella and figs (4 figs per pizza base). Bake in an oven of 180 degrees for 10 minutes, or until the mozzarella is nicely melted.
- 3. Top with prosciutto and rocket and drizzle the balsamic liquid evenly over the two pizzas. Cut pizzas into 5 or 6 slices per pizza


