Inquiry sought into elections

Independent Member of the Tasmanian Legislative Council, Meg Webb, is seeking to establish a Joint Select Committee to inquire into Tasmania's 2021 House of Assembly and Legislative Council elections.

The Kingborough based Independent Member for Nelson tabled a Notice of Motion on Tuesday, June 22, to establish a Joint Select Committee consisting of four members.

Ms Webb said elections are a fundamental right of the Tasmanian people. "We are now seeing a pattern of Tasmanian voters losing confidence in the integrity of our elections and their politicians," Ms Webb said.

"We must put an end to that pattern.

"It is vital public confidence in the conduct of elections is maintained." Ms Webb said Parliament can and must play a key role in maintaining that

"In other jurisdictions this is undertaken through the routine practice of conducting a Parliamentary review or inquiry after each election.

"For example, the Federal Parliament has a Joint Standing Committee on Electoral Matters, which undertakes a routine inquiry after each federal election." Ms Webb said the 2021 elections raised a number of concerns, including:

- The legitimacy of the rationale for calling an early election for the House of Assembly
- Concerns over potential voter disenfranchisement with a failure to provide Legislative Council ballot papers at voting booths beyond the borders of Windemere and Derwent.
- Issues with the preselection and subsequent resignation of Adam Brooks.
- The impact of holding concurrent House of Assembly and Legislative Council elections, including clarity on how the financial benefit accrued from the Lower House election campaigning activities will be assessed against the legislated restrictions applied to Legislative Council elections."

Ms Webb said a Joint Select Committee will deliver a general review of the administration of the elections, as opposed to the election outcome.

"It is in the public interest to strengthen our democracy and should be a routine priority for Parliament.

"This inquiry will provide a vehicle for Tasmanian citizens and expert stakeholders to raise concerns, provide evidence and suggest improvements or solutions.

"A Joint House approach is the most appropriate way to conduct this inquiry. "I hope to have the support of colleagues in both chambers to progress the establishment of a Joint House Select Committee for this purpose.

Plan to increase traffic squeeze

Southern Outlet "traffic squeeze" in Macquarie and Davey Streets in Hobart was given a special mention in the Federal Parliament during question time on June 21, by Independent Member for Clark, Andrew Wilkie MP.

Mr Wilkie said State Government funding of \$35 million for a fifth lane for the Southern Outlet would not fix the problem.

"The Southern Outlet plan is especially unfathomable as all it will do is see many homes demolished and more vehicles squeezed into the already grid-locked Macquarie and Davey Streets," Mr Wilkie said.

Mr Wilkie called on the Federal Minister for Communications, Urban

Infrastructure, Cities and the Arts, Paul Fletcher MP, to intervene and help sort out the situation, noting that the Hobart City Deal is "a working partnership between all levels of government".

However, in reply Minister Fletcher did not provide any commitment to intervene and help sort out the situation.

Mr Wilkie later summarised the outcome on his webpage, stating a 'sustainable vision" for transport was needed in Hobart.

"The Southern Outlet expansion is especially ill-considered because all it'll do is see homes demolished and more traffic squeezed into Macquarie and Davey Streets," Mr Wilkie noted

"The Minister for Communications, Urban Infrastructure, Cities and the Arts refused to acknowledge the traffic congestion being experienced in Hobart nowadays.

"What's actually needed is a sustainable vision for transport in the city including the broadest range of alternative technologies and systems.

"Not just a couple of ferries, but the reintroduction of trains, much improved public transport and a genuinely effective network of bicycle infrastructure.

"Doing so will not only fix current problems, but also set the city up for the challenges of the future including UTAS's relocation into the CBD," Mi Wilkie concluded

Mountain wilderness is our identity

Thank you for your articles "Premier silent on cable car donors" (June 1) and "Representations open on cable

I took the opportunity to make a representation to Hobart City Council and have urged the council to reject the cable car proposal.

My opposition is based on sentiments similar to those expressed in the proponent's visual impact assessments, which correctly says in its executive summary:

"The mountain plays a central role in the psyche of Hobart residents, as the pre-eminent representation of place.

"In addition to grounding its viewers in place, its constant presence serves to ground viewers in time, as an ever-present reminder of geological deep-history and the relative fleetingness and impermanence of the lives of those living below and playing upon its mass.

"The mountain symbolises not only permanence and grounded-ness, it is the very symbol of 'wilderness' that is central to Hobart and Tasmania's identity and sense of place."

It is precisely for these reasons that an unnecessary piece of meddling with the soul of Hobart for, what is essentially entertainment, an amusement ride designed to enrich a few private individuals, should be rejected.

The impact of a cable car up the side of the mountain will very seriously diminish the 'wilderness' aesthetic value of it. It should not drape itself over the mountain.

In a media release on May 19, Tasmania's Minister for Infrastructure and Transport Michael Ferguson MP, said the State Government always strongly supported the proposal. I don't want this government influence to affect the proposal outcome.

I would also like to draw attention to the proposal's community-benefit-analysis, which is not an analysis, but more a piece of marketing spin.

It does not address counter-benefits or adverse community impacts and the proposal should be rejected because of it.

Hobart City Council now has the opportunity to be bold on behalf of the wider community by not approving the

advised the Integrity Commission Act 2009 does not apply to Members of Parliament during an election campaign, according to the Member for Clark, Cassy O'Connor MP.

In a media statement on June 23, the Tasmanian Greens leader announced a Bill had been tabled to remove the loophole. "Today we tabled the Integrity Commission (Members

of Parliament) Bill 2021 to remedy that loophole," said Ms O'Connor. "While it is true a Member of Parliament is not consid-

ered a Member during an election period, they retain benefits of the office," noted Ms O'Connor MP.

These benefits include staffing and resources, a Parliamentary salary and general influence." Ms O'Connor said the Integrity Commission recommended

fixing the loophole seven years ago.

"Our amendment bill ensures an incumbent MP contesting an election, who retains numerous benefits of office, is still accountable under the Integrity Commission Act 2009," said Ms O'Connor MP.

Meanwhile, Tasmania is the only state in Australia without a 'Misconduct in Public Office' offence in its criminal code or common law.

On June 23 Ms O'Connor announced the tabling of a Criminal Code Amendment (Misconduct in Public Office) Bill 2021.

"In 2014, the Integrity Commission released a report recommending that this (Misconduct in Public Office) offence be established," said Ms O'Connor.

"The offence establishes that a public officer who intentionally and dishonestly, using the benefits of their office, gains a benefit for themselves or another person or causes a detriment to another person is guilty of misconduct in public office.

"This reform is long overdue."

Ms O'Connor said the Tasmanian Greens members had moved for this offence in Parliament twice previously.

Swift parrot habitat secured via covenants

Kingborough residents may be familiar with the sight of migrating swift parrots.

Bigger than a budgie but smaller than a rosella, the critically endangered swift parrot streaks through the air at speeds of up to 90 kilometres an hour.

The brightly coloured and iconic bird is one of only two parrots that annually migrate from mainland Australia to breed in Tasmania.

Arriving in spring, they seek out flowering blue gums, find a mate and a suitable nest, and spend the summer raising chicks.

However, habitat loss, competition for increasingly fewer nesting hollows and predation by introduced sugar gliders are all having a devastating impact on this critically endangered bird according to Natural Resource Management (NRM) South.

Through funding from the Australian Government's National Landcare Program, NRM South has embarked on a project aimed at helping swift parrots establish a road to recovery, including using a system of conservation covenants to secure swift parrot habitat on private land.

One of the challenges for swift parrot conservation is knowing where they will nest.

They choose nesting sites based on where their preferred food, nectar from Tasmanian blue gum flowers, is most abundant during that year and this varies.

"This means we have to be highly adaptive when implementing conservation actions," explained Maudie Brown, Senior Project Officer for NRM South's Biodiversity Program.

"To successfully breed, swift parrots need the right kind of nesting and food resources, so we're working to protect areas of high-value swift parrot habitat on private land to increase their chances.

"This is a longer-term approach to protecting areas we

know they need, if not this year, then maybe the next."

Working with project partners, the Tasmanian Land

Conservancy and the Department of Primary Industries, Parks, Water and Environment (DPIPWE), sites in Pelverata and Wielangta have now been surveyed and approved for covenants, representing 122 hectares of high-value habitat.

These legally binding agreements will contribute pockets of ecologically valuable land to Australia's National Reserve System.

Simon Roberts, a landholder who has signed on to the project, feels privileged to contribute to endangered species protection.

"We feel a duty of care not only to the animals and plants on our properties but also to their future viability," said Mr Roberts.
"We try to think globally and act locally by considering

"We try to think globally and act locally by considering our property as part of the wider landscape through its potential contribution to the local, regional, state and federal ecological assets."

Ms Brown said the two covenants are a start toward addressing conservation.

"The approval of these two covenants is a great start and DPIPWE have provided valuable in-kind support for the project," remarked Ms Brown.

"It demonstrates that there are many ways of addressing conservation issues, and that community can be involved in these solutions, boosting efforts across our landscapes."

The swift parrot *Lathamus* discolor is listed as Endangered under the Tasmanian *Threatened Species Protection Act 1995*, and listed as Endangered on the Commonwealth's *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999*.

Making Kingborough better for biking

Riding a bike has so many benefits; it's fun, a practical transport mode, great for health and fitness and environmentally friendly.

There are many bike riders, and potential bike riders, in Kingborough and the new Kingborough Bicycle User Group (KBUG) are seeking to bring them together.

A small steering committee has met and agreed on some broad directions for the group, to direct their efforts towards improving cycling conditions across the region and keeping cyclists connected.

KBUG hopes to establish a community of Kingborough riders, keeping them informed, planning group rides, liaising with other riding groups and sharing information about routes, hazards, activities and new facilities.

The group also plans to advocate for better cycling conditions such as safer roads, off-road paths, route connectivity and improved access to key destinations including shops, schools and parks, among others.

Promoting bike riding for both transport and recreation, KBUG is a community group run by bicycle users for bicycle users.

KBUG is independent of Kingborough Council but plans to liaise with the official Bicycle Advisory Committee associated with the council.

"There are already some linkages between KBUG and

that committee which we hope will facilitate the best possible input to council actions related to cycling," explained group member Peter Tuft.

"One important thing that council and the bike committee are managing is development of a long-term Cycling Strategy for Kingborough.

"A draft will shortly be released for community consultation and if you have any interest at all in cycling then you ought to have a look and make comment."

KBUG also hopes to provide a broader voice to those in the Kingborough cycling community through their membership and connection with the council's advisory committee.

"The council bike committee necessarily has restricted membership and is perhaps unavoidably a bit distant, but we hope that KBUG will allow more personal connections between all types of cyclists; a riders' community," explained Mr Tuft.

"KBUG is your opportunity to keep in touch with local cycling issues and help make Kingborough better for bikes.

"People who cycle in Kingborough, or would like to but feel that conditions are not yet right for them and want to help with initiatives for the future can sign up to KBUG through their website, kbugbike.wordpress.com and can also keep an eye out for the draft Kingborough Cycling Strategy and send their feedback to Kingborough Council."

New quick response grants announced

A Quick Response Community Assistance component has been added to Kingborough Council's Community Grants program, following a review of the program in late 2020.

The Community Grants program is aimed at assisting projects that have a significant community benefit.

The next round of Community Grant opens in July, with the program annual budget of \$40,000, with individual grants of up to of \$3000.

The Quick Response Community Assistance component has been allocated \$5000 out of the total annual grant budget.

Quick Response Community Assistance grants of up to \$1000 will be available throughout the year, or until the allocation is spent.

Kingborough Acting Mayor, Jo Westwood said changes to the Community Grants program were needed to improve efficiency and help to meet the community's needs.

"One funding round annually has now been adopted for the program, rather than splitting the funding over two rounds," Ms Westwood said.

"A Quick Response Community Assistance component has also been added to the program, which allows community groups to apply and receive funding up to \$1000 guickly.

"Starting in the new financial year, the Community Grant program will run with an annual budget of \$40,000 with the grant round opening in July and closing in September. "Grant allocations will remain at a maximum of

\$3000 and will be allocated to projects that have a significant community benefit," Cr Westwood said. \$5000 of the total grant budget is set aside for the

'Quick Response Community Assistance' grants. "Criteria remains the same for the Quick Response

"Our aim is to support organisations that are run-

ning an activity or event who need that little extra bit of assistance to make it happen."

Midwinter plunge

Midwinter traditions in Antarctica live on as Australian expeditioners celebrated the year's shortest day and longest night with a sub-zero swim through the sea-ice.

Eighty-six expeditioners are currently spending winter at Australia's three research stations in Antarctica and on sub-Antarctic Macquarie Island.

Casey Station Leader Kyle Williams said midwinter is a significant milestone for expeditioners because it marks 'hump day' in a long dark winter.

"At this time of year at Casey research station, the sun only rises above the horizon for about 2.5 hours, which can be challenging for our small wintering team of 27 people," Mr Williams said.

"After we pass the winter solstice on June 21, the sun begins to climb higher in the sky and we slowly start to get more daylight hours.'

Located further south than Casey, expeditioners at Mawson and Davis Research Stations are now living in constant twilight and darkness, with no sunrise for several weeks.

"A midwinter tradition at Australian stations is an icy swim," explained Mr Williams.

"We created a 1.5 metre square pool by cutting through the 80-centimetre thick sea-ice with chainsaws and other equipment.

"The water temperature proved to be a bracing minus 2°C and the air temperature of minus 9°C really got us moving."

The swims are conducted under medical supervision and with safety equipment.

Other midwinter activities include a formal dinner and expeditioners giving each other home-made

Australian Antarctic Division Director, Kim Ellis, said the year since the last midwinter celebrations has seen "dramatic" changes for Australia's Antarctic Program to deal with the COVID-19 pandemic.

"We have been resilient and adaptive and kept all our research stations going strong and our expeditioners safe for another year," Mr Ellis said.

"Our people deployed south and their families are always in our thoughts.

"Midwinter is an opportunity to have some fun as we reflect on how far we've come and what is yet to be achieved.

New constables join Tasmania Police ranks

Tasmania Police has celebrated the largest ever Accelerated Training Program graduation with 17 new constables joining the ranks and starting their careers dedicated to keeping Tasmanians safe, including two new officers to be stationed at Kingston.

The five women and 12 men Graduates underwent a rigorous 12-week Accelerated Training Program. which was developed in 2018 to formalise entry into Tasmania Police for applicants who are current or expolice officers from Australian Policing jurisdictions or from New Zealand Police.

"I would like to congratulate all the graduating officers and wish them well as they embark on a rewarding career serving the Tasmanian community," said Liberal MP, Jacquie Petrusma.

Along with the two at Kingston, the new officers will be stationed across the state, with three in Burnie, three in Devonport, one at George Town, two at Launceston, four at Glenorchy and two at Bridgewater.

Strong culture, strong youth

The South East Tasmanian Aboriginal Corporation (SETAC) was among 25 recipients of the State Government's Healthy Tasmania grants.

SETAC was awarded \$87,450 towards its Strong Culture, Strong Youth program, which promotes healthy eating, physical activity, reducing smoking, positive mental health and wellbeing in the Aboriginal community across Kingborough and the Huon Valley.

Minister for Mental Health and Wellbeing, Jeremy Rockliff MP said the grants were a positive way to support local initiatives.

"The best way to support Tasmanians to be healthy

and active is through grassroots initiatives in their own communities and locals know best what their communities need," commented Minister Rockcliff.

SETAC was among 15 organisations to receive one of the larger grants on offer, which covered projects and programs between \$30,000 and \$200,000.

Other recipients active in the Kingborough area included the Red Cross, Bicycle Network Tasmania and Council on the Ageing (TAS) Inc.

Antarctic lake lost

Scientists in Australia and the United States have reported the sudden loss of a large ice-covered lake in eastern Antarctica, which held more water than Sydney Harbour.

A media release from the Australian Antarctic Program Partnership (AAPP) on June 24 stated the event, detailed in a paper just published in the journal Geophysical Research Letters, occurred during the winter of 2019 and was noticed in satellite images the following summer by Dr Roland Warner at the University of Tasmania.

Dr Warner said that the event, which occurred on the Amery Ice Shelf, was most likely caused by a process known as 'hydrofracturing'.

"We believe a large crack opened briefly in the floating ice shelf and drained the entire lake into the ocean within three days," Dr Warner said.

"The lake held more water than Sydney Harbour and the flow into the ocean beneath would have been like the flow over Niagara Falls, so it would have been an impressive sight.'

According to the AAPP, hydrofracture occurs when liquid water, which is denser than ice, exerts sufficient extra pressure on cracks in ice shelves to open them right through to the ocean below.

"Multiple hydrofractures have been implicated in the collapse of smaller ice shelves in the Antarctic Peninsula, where plentiful melt-water forms on the surface during summer," noted the AAPP.

"It is rare to see hydrofracture through ice as thick as the 1400 metres on Amery Ice Shelf, and in the middle






