Mayor Wriedt's vision for Kingborough

Newly elected Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt was officially sworn into Kingborough Council on Monday, July 26.

Mayor Wriedt has served as a Kingborough Councillor since 2011 and is ready to continue her work with a positive vision for the growing local area. "It really is an honour, and I can assure our residents that I will be working hard to make a positive difference for Kingborough," said Mayor Wriedt.

"In the two and a half years that Dean Winter was in the role, he really got things happening in Kingborough and that's what I want to continue.

"As we all know the area has had significant growth in the last couple of decades.

"It is certainly a far different place than the one I moved to over 30 years ago.

"However, with this growth has come challenges and our infrastructure and services haven't kept pace," Mayor Wriedt said.

Prior to being elected as a councillor, Paula Wriedt served as a member of State Parliament.

Paula was elected to the Tasmanian Parliament in 1996, and was Tasmania's youngest female Minister

Wriedt was also the first female MP or Minister to have a baby whilst serving in Tasmania's Parliament. Being Kingborough's first female mayor is not lost on Mayor Paula Wriedt, who commented that the feeling had been surreal for her first days in the new role.

"I am excited to have been elected as Kingborough's Mayor to replace Dean Winter," said Mayor Wriedt.

"To be honest. I'm not sure that it has totally sunk in yet, especially the part that I am the first female Mayor in the 114-year history of our municipality.

"One of my supporters remarked to me the other day

that I had a habit of creating firsts; the youngest female Minister, first to have a baby whilst an MP, and

After being sworn in, Mayor Wriedt said that she has hit the ground running with many things she would like to achieve before the next election in October 2022.

"We need to get moving on the revitalisation of the main part of Kingston for a more attractive and user-friendly area for all.

"I am also keen to see Stage 2 of the Kingston Park playground completed to provide even more activities for everyone to enjoy.

The newly elected mayor has two adult children, Daniel and Amy, and commenced a conversation with the younger members of Kingborough to ensure their voices are heard.

"We need to ask our young people, rather than presume to know what they want," said Mayor Wriedt.

"Just recently there was a great exchange of ideas on one of the community social media pages about how we could offer more activities and safer places for our adolescents to meet up.

Mayor Wriedt has lived in Kingston since 1989 and is looking forward to the challenges of the leadership role, acknowledging she doesn't have the answer to every issue.

"I am just one of ten councillors who all take seriously the desire to make Kingborough an even better place to live, work and play.

"I will readily acknowledge that I don't hold all the answers, but I'm looking forward to having many conversations with our community and can assure residents I will have an open-door policy to hear their ideas on how we can make Kingborough shine,' Mayor Wriedt concluded.

Digital tracks and trails

Recreational walking is getting a digital lift with Kingborough Council developing a suite of interactive digital maps.

Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt said the digital maps will improve the community's access to information. "This month, we are launching a new Tracks and Trails interactive map," Mayor Wriedt said.

"Accessing information around the clock is important in enabling community members to connect with their local environment and neighbourhood.

"Our community members want to be able to locate information when they need it, not just during business hours.

"This new digital map gives community members

the chance to find out the track's walking grade, whether dogs can join in, the distance of the track and other helpful information such as the location of

"Discovering what tracks and trails are in your local area is a great way to improve both your mental and physical health.

"In our 2021/22 Budget, we have set aside over \$1 million to build better connections between communities by upgrading and constructing new tracks and shared paths.

"The maps are easy to access on the front page of the Kingborough Council website and I'd encourage all our residents to have a look and discover new linkages within their local area," Mayor Wriedt said.

Female convicts and their children

The Browns River History Group are presenting an opportunity to learn more about female convicts and their families for this month's history topic.

The talk is called 'Doing time for a Mother's Crime' and it will be given by Helen Quilty, who many in the community know as an artist, as well as a passionate

Ms Quilty has a great tale to tell, and a personal one, as her interest in the topic comes from her great, great grandmother being a convict sent to Van Diemen's Land in 1825 with her two children.

The three were placed in the Female Factory next to the Male Convict Prison in the centre of Hobart Town.

This place was described as both "insecure and moral-

ly corrupt" and the Cascades Female Factory was developed later to try to resolve the issues regarding female prisoners who were transported with their children.

President of the group, Rosie Severs said this is definitely a story worth hearing.

The talk will take place on Monday, August 9, from 3pm to 4pm in Room A1 of Block A at the Library Learning Centre, 8 Hutchins Street, Kingston (old Kingston Primary School).

COVID-19 safety rules still apply, so room numbers are restricted to 27 and it is recommended to come early to get a seat as it is first come, first seated.

The talk is free to attend for paid up members and a gold coin donation is appreciated from non-members.

"In the lead up to Census, we've undertaken extensive planning about how we engage with the community and ensure the safety of our staff during the pandemic," Mr Henderson stated.

Historic debate rejects mountain development

Hobart City Council voted to refuse the planning application for a proposed cable car and associated infrastructure development on kunanyi/Mt Wellington at a special council meeting on July 27.

An independent report produced by a team of planning professionals with extensive experience dealing with large complex projects recommended refusal of the application, based on 21 key points of non-compliance with the planning scheme.

More than 1380 people tuned in to the live streaming of the five-and-a-half-hour extensive debate.

16,589 representations were received by council during the 28-day advertising period between May 24 and June 22

More than 71 per cent of submissions received from the public were against the proposal.

The motion for refusal, put forward by Deputy Lord Mayor of Hobart, Councillor Helen Burnet, was carried nine votes to three.

Deputy Lord Mayor said the proposal had split the community for many years and that the proposed development would "cut across the Organ Pipes just as

"I move this for refusal based on 21 [planning] reasons," Cr Burnet said.

"This is an application which must be refused."

Hobart's Lord Mayor Anna Reynolds said the

"It has been an historic debate tonight," noted Mayor Reynolds. The decision was delegated to the elected members due to the number of representations received, the location on council-owned land, over three storeys in height and over 2000 square metres in land area, and as the independent consultant's report recommended refusal of the application.

During the deputations hearing, the Residents Opposed to the Cable Car Inc spokesperson Vica Bayley said this is the eighth cable car proposal since the first application in 1905 and records show Mt Wellington was declared a public park the following year, "predating any of Tasmania's iconic National Parks".

Mr Bayley said the development application is "shallow, erroneous and deliberately misleading" and the independent report found it to be non-compliant with Tasmania's with Aboriginal Heritage guidelines.

Mr Bayley said it was found that the proposal would diminish Mt Wellington Park's tourism, recreational, cultural and landscape values.

"This is the eighth cable car proposal," noted Vica Bayley.

"Again, strongly opposed by citizens.

"This is not really a transport solution.

"It's a land grab for exclusive access to undeveloped real estate through the privatisation of publicly owned and long reserved land.

"At a cost to the community and its cohesion, and at the expense of truly sustainable ideas.

"This project has haunted us for over a century."

Hobart Cable Car Supporters spokesperson Tony Donaghy said "all issues can be deeply viewed as oppor-

"The Hobart tip was extended and is still being extended in exactly the same environmental area," said Mr Donaghy.

"The mountain summit is hardly pristine wilderness."

"It has industrial sheds.

"It has a long-suffering toilet block pumped by a truck. "It has literally thousands of square metres of basalt

car parks.

"Yet we accept all that."



Set up nearly 30 years ago by Diane and Phillip Tompson, Novaris designs and makes devices to prevent equipment damage by direct and indirect lightning strikes, surges and other electrical disturbances on power and

The company employs about 30 people locally and another 34 in Malaysia across two companies, Novaris and Powercom Group.

When the pandemic hit early last year, the business lost a critical supply chain and the ability to manufacture its high-tech products in Malaysia.

Quickly moving its manufacturing operations to Tasmania, Novaris can now make every item on the product list in its home state.

This agility and resilience earned Novaris a gong under a national recognition program set up under the auspices of the Australian Export and Investment Awards.

Independent Member for Clark, Andrew Wilkie MP, who recently presented the Tompson's with their award certificate, said the program received more than 360 submissions, with just eight exporters selected for special recognition across Australia.

"Novaris is a role model for resilience during the pandemic," Mr Wilkie said.

"The company is a tremendous example of a cutting-edge business born

in Tasmania that makes highly specialised products for national and international markets

"It's ingenuity is also on show closer to home, with Powercom's solar panels adorning the roof of the Hobart Aquatic Centre and the Australian Antarctic Division

"Industries like this remind us of the rich potential of Tasmania, especially in niche, high-tech manufacturing."

Mr Tompson said the award came as a pleasant surprise and was testament to the hard work of staff in Tasmania and Malaysia, which was now working at about 50 per cent of pre-pandemic capacity while COVID restrictions continued.

Dental education

Dental Health Week is taking place this week and the Australian Dental Association (ADA) is educating the public on the steps to care for teeth and gums, to smile for life.

The ADA says the oral health of many Australians is not where it should be.

Australia's Oral Health Tracker 2020 report states the prevalence of tooth decay and gum disease have worsened over the past 15 years.

Tooth decay: 32.1 per cent of adults (aged 15+) have untreated tooth decay, a 6.6 per cent increase from 25.5 per cent in 2004/06.

Gum disease: 28.8 per cent of adults (aged 15+) have periodontal pockets greater than four millimetres, a nine per cent increase from 19.8 per cent in 2004/06.

A visit to the dentist is great for face-to-face advice where questions can be answered.

Brushing and flossing

Brushing

Most people probably don't give much thought to how they brush their teeth, beyond squirting on some tooth-paste and brushing back and forth.

But brushing technique matters.

How often teeth are brushed, the length of time spent brushing, the brushing technique and the toothbrush used can all influence the effectiveness of brushing.

Technique

Here's a step-by-step guide:

- Start at the back of the mouth with the toothbrush bristles placed at the gum line where the teeth meet the gums.
- Hold the brush on a 45-degree angle, brushing gently back and forth. If too much pressure is applied when brushing, this can cause gums to recede, as well as damaging the white tooth enamel.
- Take care to gently brush the outside, inside and chewing surfaces of each tooth, making sure to include the inside surfaces of the front teeth, which are often missed.
- When brushing is finished, spit out the excess toothpaste but do not rinse with water. By not rinsing, a thin layer of toothpaste remains on the surface of the teeth helping to

protect them for longer. Aim to brush twice per day, in the morning and again at night before bed.

It should only take two minutes.

And don't forget the tongue, as a lot of bacteria live on

ts surface.

Brushing the tongue can reduce the bacteria present, which can help with bad breath, officially known as halitosis or oral malodour.

Use the toothbrush bristles to gently scrape in a forward motion along the surface of the tongue.

Tools

Look to use a toothbrush with a small head and soft bristles. For those who find a manual toothbrush difficult to manage, an electric toothbrush or a three-sided toothbrush may be worthwhile.

Some electric toothbrushes come with an in-built twominute timer.

Softly, softly

Too much pressure can damage gums and tooth enamel. If your toothbrush bristles become worn where they are pushed out and sit outside the base of the toothbrush in less than three months, you may be pressing too hard.

Some electric toothbrushes come with a built-in pressure sensor that will warn you when you brush with too much pressure.

Consider replacing your toothbrush every three months, when the bristles are worn or splayed or after you've been unwell.

Flossing

To care for both teeth and gums, it is recommended that as well as brushing, cleaning between teeth be done at least once a day, with floss or interdental brushes.

Brush bristles will not reach the surfaces between the teeth to remove bacteria, plaque or leftover food. That is where flossing and interdental brushes come in.

It is recommended that once a child has two or more teeth touching side-by-side, parents should start flossing their children's teeth.





Missing persons week

Tasmania Police are raising awareness of seven long-term missing people during National Missing Persons Week, which commences on Monday, August 30.

"National Missing Persons Week is an annual week of action aimed at profiling long-term missing persons and raising awareness of the significant issues surrounding missing persons," said Sergeant John Delpero of the Tasmania Police Missing Persons Unit.

"While a number of missing persons will be highlighted this week, it is important that we remember all our missing persons and the pain felt by their families and loved ones.

Currently in Tasmania, there are 168 long-term missing persons dating back to the 1950s.

The seven Tasmanian long-term missing persons being highlighted this week are: Craig Taylor (missing since 1993), David Sushames (missing since 2005), Michael Lenssen (missing since 2019), Nancy Grunwaldt (missing since 1993), Robert Mansell (missing since 2015) Gilbert Midson (missing since 1964) and Zedric Woolley (missing since 2012).

"As police officers, our aim is to locate missing persons and bring answers.

"A missing person case is never closed until the person is located.

"Even in instances where the disappearance of a person is reported to the Coroner, the case remains open," said Sergeant Delpero.

"This week I urge anyone with information about any missing person to please come forward and help us provide some kind of closure to the families and loved ones of the victims.

Information relating to a missing person can be provided to Tasmania Police on 131 444 or to Crime Stoppers anonymously online at crimestopperstas.com. au or on 1800 333 000.

All information received will be assessed for investigation.

Craig Taylor was reported missing from the Coningham area on September 3, 1993, when he was 9 years old.

At the time of his disappearance, Craig and his family were holidaying at Coningham, an area he was familiar with as he had visited on numerous occasions.

Craig was of slim build with brown hair. Police conducted full scale searches of the area

however Craig was not located.

Craig was born in the United Kingdom in 1984. Craig later moved to Tasmania and, at the time of his disappearance in 1993, resided at Launceston.

Craig's disappearance was reported to the Coroner who in 2014 determined he was deceased but was unable to determine the precise cause of death.

Zedric Woolley

Zedric Woolley was reported missing from the Huon Valley on April 7, 2012, when he was 81 years old.

On the day he was last seen, Zedric had lunch with his daughter at a Huonville bakery. He was last seen later that evening driving his blue

Hyundai i30 south on the Huon Highway towards Franklin. This is the last confirmed sighting of Zedric, however

possible sightings occurred in Huonville on April 8, 2012. At the time of his disappearance Zedric was in reasonable health.

He was around 175cm tall, of medium build and had grey hair.

Tasmania Police and volunteers conducted extensive

searches. On April 14, 2012, a family member located Zedric's

Hyundai on Watsons Road, Glen Huon. Despite further searches, Zedric was not located, and

he remains a missing person. Zedric's disappearance was reported to the Coroner

who in 2019 found that his Hyundai became stuck in soft ground at Watsons Road, Glen Huon, following which he walked away from and died.

Registration race

Kingborough residents are being urged to sign on as organ and tissue donors as part of the Great Registration Race for DonateLife Week.

New data released to mark the start of the 10th annual DonateLife Week, which runs from Sunday, July 25 until Sunday, August 1, shows just how many residents in each Tasmanian postcode signed on as organ and tissue donors last year.

In the Kingborough region, an estimated 300 new donors registered for 2020.

In the Huon Valley, this number was estimated at 120 Anyone aged 16 or older can register, it only takes one

minute and a Medicare card to register at donatelife.gov.au/register There are currently 1800 Australians on the transplant

waitlist and an additional 12,000 people on dialysis for kidney failure. The number of Australians signing on to become

organ and tissue donors dropped by 16 per cent last year as the COVID-19 pandemic grew.

The rate of donations also dropped by 16 per cent and the number of people receiving transplants dropped by 12 per cent.

DonateLife State Medical Director Dr Andrew Turner said when Australians are registered, their family have one less decision to make during the highly emotional time in their lives.

"The biggest barrier to families saying yes to donation

is not knowing their family member was willing to be a

donor," Dr Turner said. "In a hospital setting, discussing organ and tissue donation comes at an intensely emotional time for families, usually associated with the unexpected death of their loved one.

"When donation is a possibility, it helps when families know what their loved one wanted.

'Across Australia we know that nine in 10 families give consent to donation when their loved one was a registered donor, and this number is halved when a person is not registered and has not discussed donation with their family.

There are 13 million Australians aged over 16 who are eligible to register as organ and tissue donors but haven't.

The Great Registration Race for DonateLife Week is encouraging 100,000 more Australians to register as

organ and tissue donors. Almost 50 per cent of Tasmanians are currently registered, but the drive is encouraging more people to register or check their registration status, in order to

provide help and hope to the 1800 Australians now waitlisted for a transplant. "With a consent rate of 74 per cent in Tasmania in

2020, I urge residents to join the Great Registration Race for DonateLife Week to register if you haven't already, or to check you're registered if you think you are," said Dr Turner,

"It only takes one minute online to do either."


