Council failure on gift record

An inspection of Kingborough Councillors' gift and benefits register has revealed noncompliance with regulatory requirements.

The Tasmanian Inquirer reported on August 2 that most Tasmanian Councils were in breach of State Government regulations requiring monthly disclosure of all donations and gifts to councillors of more than \$50.

Kingborough Council's applicable policy also states its public register of councillor gifts and benefits "will be updated at least monthly."

Documents reveal, however, that the register has not been updated since 2020.

Kingborough Council's policy also states the General Manager will review the register every three months to ensure compliance, further, in auditing the register, the General Manager will review councillor submissions of the previous six months and record they checked compliance.

Evidence publicly available does not demonstrate that a review or audit has been completed.

The Kingborough Chronicle viewed the hard copy of the register at the General Manager's office on August 4 and found it to be identical to the online

Council's register noted 25 gifts received in 2017, 23 in 2018, eight in 2019, one gift in 2020 and none

The last item reported on the register was received in March 2020

Council's web page, also viewed by the Kingborough Chronicle on August 4, stated the Register was updated in July 2021, however this date was found to be false and misleading as the online document, although dated November 2020, was created and last modified on December 3, 2020.

Government takes council to tribunal

The Tasmanian Government has taken the Kingborough Council to the Resource **Management and Planning Appeal Tribunal to** debate building a vital slip lane on its new **Huntingfield roundabout.**

The State Government is building a new roundabout to service the Huntingfield subdivision, but at a meeting last month, the Kingborough Council included a condition that the new infrastructure needed to include a slip lane to allow traffic going northward from Margate to avoid being held up at the roundabout.

Shadow Minister for Economic Development, Dean Winter, said the situation was ridiculous.

"The State Government has now taken its City Deal Partner, Kingborough Council, to the Planning Tribunal," Mr Winter said.

"Most City Deal projects are already delayed, the last thing Hobart needs is for the partners to be fighting each other in the tribunal.

'The State Government's proposed design would slow down every vehicle travelling from the Channel towards Hobart.

"That's why the community asked for a slip lane and the council insisted on improvements."

The Planning Tribunal commenced Thursday, August 5 and continued Friday, August 6.

During the hearing, Minister for Infrastructure and Transport, Michael Ferguson has assured Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt that a slip lane will be built at the Huntingfield roundabout at Kingston.

"I am pleased that the Minister has listened to Kingborough residents," Mayor Wriedt said.

"There was a great deal of concern last week when the State Government lodged an appeal to the Resources Management Planning Appeals Tribunal about the addition of a slip lane by Kingborough Council as part of the development application permit conditions.

"Since the appeal was lodged, Minister Ferguson and I have had many conversations in order to resolve this matter to ensure that the current and future needs of Kingborough residents are met.

"Minister Ferguson has committed that the slip lane at the Huntingfield roundabout will go ahead, through a separate development application (DA), to be lodged by the end of this year.

"I welcome this commitment by Minister Ferguson and council will now consider it at a special meeting this week.

"What's important here is that the slip lane is built and whether or not it's in this DA or another one, we have secured this commitment from the Government," Cr Wriedt said.

Minister Ferguson commented on commitment of the slip lane for the roundabout saying "The State Government will build a north-bound slip lane and has provided this commitment in writing to the council and the community.

"This is the Government's idea, and it's pleasing that everyone wants it to happen.

Meeting these criteria requires a detailed assessment of a proposed development by a suitably qualified ecologist.

Additional specialist advice from a forty-spotted pardalote expert is usually required where a proposal has the potential to impact on the nesting habitat of this species, as this species is sensitive to disturbance, limited in its distribution and has very specific habitat and management requirements.

In most instances (but not necessarily all), development of an existing vacant lot is capable of meeting these criteria, depending on the nature, scale and location of a development. This was the case with the property at 97 Mount Louis Road, which has approval for a dwelling and visitor accommodation subject to a number of conditions.

Shining light on solar rates

Dear Editor.

There has been a lot of confusion regarding the decrease in the solar feed-in tariff rate, which coincided with substantial electricity price decreases of 7.11 per cent for residential customers and 11 per cent for small businesses for 2021-22. The standard feed-in rate is set by the Tasmanian Economic

Regulator and applies to all retailers operating in Tasmania. The Regulator is independent from both Aurora Energy

and the Tasmanian Government. For the Regulator, the most significant factor in setting the feed-in rate is the wholesale price energy retailers, like

Aurora Energy, pay. If the Regulator were to set the feed-in rate above the rate Aurora Energy pays for energy from other renewable energy gen-

erators, the overall cost of purchasing energy would increase. While customers with solar would benefit from the higher rate, the vast majority of our community who do not have


solar would pay more This would particularly disadvantage low-income households who may be unable to make large investments, like

installing a solar system. Some readers with solar systems have also expressed concern that the retail price they are charged for their energy use is much higher than the feed-in rate they receive for

the solar generation they export to the grid. The amount Aurora Energy charges its customers covers a range of costs associated with the electricity supply chain, including maintaining the electricity network.

Because households and businesses generating solar power only pay for the wholesale energy cost and not other retail costs, setting the feed-in tariff at the same rate as the retail price would significantly overstate the value of the solar generation. Kane Ingham





Fast charger for Kingborough

An electric vehicle charging station will be installed in Kingston, providing 120 kilowatts of fast-charging capacity to electric vehicles.

The charging station will be located in the car park of the Kingborough Council's Civic Centre and is one of five electric vehicle charging sites for the greater Hobart area, benefitting from ARENA funding of Electric Highway Tasmania.

Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt said the council has been actively preparing to transition to

"Council's support of an electric vehicle future is a

demonstration of our ongoing commitment to addressing climate change and reducing carbon emissions," said Mayor Wriedt.

"Council currently has six hybrid vehicles and is looking to continue investment into both more hybrids and full EV's.

"This year's budget allows for the purchase of our first fully electric vehicle.

"Council has been pleased to partner with Electric Highway Tasmania and will be contributing through and providing the necessary electrical and civil works to support installation of the new charging station.

"The Civic Centre location aligns well with our Transform Kingston project.

"People can enjoy shopping or have a bite to eat while charging their car.

A second Electric Vehicle ChargeSmart Grants program, providing \$600,000 for electric vehicle charging stations in regional Tasmania was announced by Premier Peter Gutwein MP on August 4.

The second round will offer individual grants of up to \$50,000 towards fast charging stations, and individual grants of up to \$2500 towards destination charging stations.

Vaccination clinics open for over 30s

Anyone over the age of 30 in Tasmania can now receive their COVID-19 vaccination in a State Vaccination Clinic, with appointments for the Pfizer vaccination made available in August.

Children aged 12 to 15 years with specified medical conditions or disability, or who are Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander or live in remote communities can now also book vaccinations at a State Vaccination Clinic.

In a media release on July 30, Premier for Tasmania, Peter Gutwein MP said with new cases continuing to emerge daily in other states, as many eligible adults as possible should be vaccinated and an additional 10,000 appointments had been made available a State Vaccination Clinics.

"We know we will be living with this virus for some time yet, particularly as new strains like Delta emerge, and we need to ensure we remain alert and responsive." Premier Gutwein said.

"We continue to urge those in our priority groups, including our aged care and disability sectors, to book a vaccination if they haven't already.

"You remain a priority for us and we will continue to ensure you receive a vaccine.

"Tasmania continues to lead the nation with our vaccination effort, with more than 47 per cent of eligible Tasmanians having had their first dose, compared to about 39 per cent nationally, and more than 23 per cent of eligible Tasmanians fully vaccinated, compared to about 17.5 per cent nationally."

Slip lane secured for Huntingfield

"Unfortunately, the good intentions of council have resulted in a permit which is invalid.

"We are advised that because of the way the slip lane has been added as a formal condition to the DA, the permit must be legally corrected and the only way to do this was with the formal appeal pathway, either with mediation toward an amended permit or by the tribunal.

"Either way, we look forward to the technicality being resolved as we can only build public infrastructure with a legally correct DA approval.

"The Government will continue to work with the council through this process, which is a normal part of the planning system.

"This does not delay the overall development and in fact proves the excellent working relationship between

the Government and council.

"Meanwhile, the irrelevant Labor Party are playing politics with the critical housing project at Huntingfield right at the middle of Homelessness Week.

"They can say what they want about our intent to build an appropriate road connection but remain eerily silent on the core issue, that hundreds of much-needed housing lots will be released at Huntingfield. "The only interest I hold in the Hungtingfield development is as Minister for State Development, Construction and Housing is to see more people able to achieve their dream of home ownership or rental," Minister Ferguson concluded.

COMMENT COLUMN with Federal Senator Catryna Bilyk

Most Tasmanians are familiar with the coastal town of Kettering, but the release of the hit Australian drama, *The Kettering Incident*, has

helped boost the town's national profile.

Around 300 Tasmanians were involved in this local production, including seven Tasmanian cast members.

Also located in Kingborough, the Longley Hotel is one of several filming locations for the comedy series *Rosehaven*.

These local screen productions help our regional economies, through spending on the production itself and promoting regional towns as tourist destinations.

They also help apples local producers directors

They also help employ local producers, directors, writers, film crew, artists and animators, musicians and composers, and many other skilled workers.

As well as being important for the local economy, Australian screen production helps tell Australian stories to Australians, thereby promoting and preserving our culture, identity and history.

While Aussies love and support local screen content, we cannot simply rely on the commercial interests of broadcasters to produce it.

As the Federal Government's Media Reform Green Paper points out: "due to Australia's small market, this content can be financially risky to produce, with costs often not able to be recouped in the domestic market." Australian content quotas provide the continuity of work needed to sustain our screen industry and produce the iconic Australian films, dramas and documentaries that we know and love.

Sadly, the Morrison Government has conducted an all-out assault against Australian screen content, with

little regard for the tens of thousands of screen industry jobs they are putting at risk.

The Minister for Communications, Paul Fletcher, unsuccessfully pushed legislation that would have cut in half the Australian content expenditure requirement for subscription TV services like Foxtel, legislation that was criticised by the Government's own senators.

In 2020, the Minister temporarily suspended local content rules for free-to-air broadcasters as an emergency COVID-19 measure right at the time when our screen industry needed support.

The sub-quotas for drama, documentary and children's content were reintroduced on January 1, but have been so watered down that there is almost no requirement to invest in children's content.

The Morrison Government's savage cuts to the ABC have also impacted on Australian screen production.


While France, Germany, Canada and the European Union are introducing local content requirements for video-on-demand streaming services like Netflix, Australia's Liberal Government is dragging its feet.

With his poor record on supporting local screen production, it is little surprise that Minister Fletcher loves to take up photo opportunities with Hollywood stars but ducks for cover when the opportunity arises to meet with representatives of Australia's local screen industry. Labor supports the industry's call to 'Make it Australian' and apply local content obligations to streaming services. We want to see Australia's local screen production industry thrive during our post-COVID recovery, espe-

cially in regions like Kingborough.

Everybody needs a home

Homelessness Week is a national event held each year during the first week of August, which aims to raise awareness of people experiencing homelessness, the issues they face and the actions needed to achieve enduring solutions.

The theme for Homelessness Week 2021 in Tasmania is Housing Ends Homelessness.

Shelter Tas also supports Homelessness Australia's national theme of Everybody Needs a Home.

"Too many Tasmanians are facing the cold reality of homelessness this winter," Shelter Tas CEO, Pattie Ching said

"Homelessness Week is more than just another week on the calendar, it can make a real difference to vulnerable Tasmanians, as well as improving community awareness and highlighting the work that homelessness services do every day."

The 2016 Australian Census showed that on any given night in Tasmania over 1600 people were

This could mean staying on the couch or floor in someone else's home, sleeping on the streets, or struggling to get by in insecure, overcrowded or inappropriate accommodation.

"As we learn to live with the ongoing impact of COVID-19, the need to reduce and eliminate home-lessness in Tasmania remains an urgent priority," Ms Chugg said.

There were a wide range of activities and events scheduled for Homelessness Week 2021 right around Tasmania including Kingston Neighbourhood House's event and launch of Orange Sky service on Friday, August 6.

Shelter Tas is also calling for more homes to be built for women and children fleeing family violence situations.

Nowhere to Go, a new report commissioned by Everybody's Home, found that family and domestic violence is the leading cause of homelessness for women and children, and has analysed the benefits of providing long term social housing to victims of family violence.

"We know that one in three requests to homeless-

ness services in Tasmania involve family violence," Ms Chugg said.

"Access to safe and secure housing will allow women to rebuild their lives and protect their children, which is why Shelter Tas supports the findings of this new report, as well as the Everybody's Home campaign petition, calling on the Prime Minister to make an urgent investment in social housing to support women and children."

Tasmania unfortunately continues to face an unprecedented housing crisis.

Michael Ferguson, Minister for State Development, Construction and Housing, recently announced an investment of \$615 million into social and affordable housing, and homelessness initiatives.

This includes a \$280 million commitment to more social housing for Tasmanians in need, resulting in around 3500 additional households by 2027.

Shadow Housing Minister Anita Dow said despite a stunning attempt at spin by Michael Ferguson, the true picture on homelessness remains stark.

"On the eve of Homelessness Week, Mr Ferguson has yet again tried to convince Tasmanians he is taking action when the fact is the Liberal Government has quite spectacularly failed to act over the past seven years," Ms Dow said.

"There is no escaping the reality that Tasmania is in an unprecedented housing and homelessness crisis because of that lack of action.

"In just the past few days, Mr Ferguson has released new data, including the social housing waiting list which on his watch has again blown out to 4,144 people.

"The amount of time even the most urgent of those families will have to wait for a home is one year and six weeks.

"The fact is when the Liberals assumed government more than seven years ago, the housing wait list was at a record low of 20 weeks.

"The fact is in the middle of another freezing winter, thousands of Tasmanian families are without adequate shelter, are relying on the kindness of family and friends and, in the worst cases, sleeping rough or sleeping in their cars," Ms Dow concluded.

New Orange Sky laundry service

Kingston Neighbourhood House launched their new Orange Sky service on Friday, August 6.

Orange Sky Australia is the world's first free mobile laundry service for people experiencing homelessness, an idea founded in a Brisbane garage by two 20-year-old mates, Nic Marchesi and Lucas Patchett.

What started as an idea to improve hygiene standards and restore dignity to people doing it tough has evolved

into something much bigger and more powerful.

The Orange Sky service will operate from Kingston Neighbourhood House every Friday 11am to 1pm.

Orange Sky has 36 services across the country, providing access to free laundry services and their volunteers have engaged in 252,476 hours of conversations to date, helping to challenge the perception of homelessness and positively connect communities all around Australia.

Salvos Sleep Out in Kingborough

The Salvation Army Tasmania and Kingston Beach Surf Life Saving Club (KBSLSC) have partnered together to help raise awareness and support for people experiencing homelessness in greater Hobart.

On Thursday, August 12, members of local government, community and business leaders, along with KBSLSC club members, will spend the night sleeping out to highlight the challenges many people in our community experience every night of the year.

Participants will be encouraged to challenge their existing understanding of homelessness and discuss the actions we need to take, as a community, to make lasting and impactful change.

The Salvos Sleep Out aims to raise \$60,000 to

keep the vital Street 2 Home community outreach program running for another year.

Street 2 Home is funded by The Salvation Army with support from donors and the Salvos Sleep Out.

It is the only primary outreach service that meets people on the streets and in parks, ensuring the welfare of people experiencing homelessness and connecting them to relevant supports.

There are a number of ways Kingborough residents can get involved and show their support, including registering to take the part in the event, making a donation to support a participant or tuning into the Salvos Sleep Out broadcast online.



The history of Saddle Road - Part 1

Introduction

Lifetime resident of Kettering, Ian King, has complied a history of his memories of Saddle Road and its residents, to share with the local community.

The scope of this account covers the area along Saddle Road, beginning at the foothills west of the village of Kettering and travelling down to the Channel Highway, from west to east.

lan notes he provides this account with apologies to anyone he may have inadvertently missed.

Below is Part 1 of the account and Part 2 shall be published in a following edition of the Kingborough Chronicle.

The early days

Saddle Road was one of the first thoroughfares in Kettering, and in the early days continued over Farewell Hill to Oyster Cove.

Descendants of these early settlers still live in

his farm, consisting of his residence, his son Ron's residence and Ian King's residence. Two of the original residences and two large apple

sheds, with a cool store, remain today, along with 14 new residences. Ron King's original house was destroyed by fire, how-

ever he retained around five hectares of the land and built a new home lan King retained six hectares of land and built a new

ing a gravity-fed fresh water supply year-round from the Little Oyster Cove Rivulet to Charles' residence.

The Rivulet still runs through lan's property today. Orchardists like Bill Proctor, Ron Imms and Charles

King employed large numbers of people in the harvesting and packing of fruit.

In the early days the fruit was packed into wooden boxes, which were all handmade.

Local sawmills supplied the timber.


The packaged product was transported to Hobart by local cartage contractors and transported around the world by large cargo ships.

Many people were also employed by farms that grew small fruits, such as loganberries, raspberries and strawberries

The picked fruit was transported to Hobart for processing in the jam factories.

Children played a large part in helping their farming parents to ensure farms were productive and successful.

The Kingborough Chronicle had written to Kingborough Council on December 2, 2020 to enquire regarding disclosure of donations and an article was published on

Access to confidential information is considered to be a non-token benefit, meaning above the nominal limit and therefore required to be reported.

However, there has been no disclosure of any councillor receiving confidential information since the Register

The Councillors Gifts and Benefits Policy says token gifts may be accepted by councillors without disclosing details to the Mayor and without recording the details of the gift or benefit on the register, however if a councillor receives more than three gifts of a token nature from the same person or organisation in a six-month period, this must be disclosed.

Numerous gifts reported prior to 2020 were below the \$50 nominal value limit, however these token gift items represented less than half of all registered gifts since 2015.

Council has published an updated policy document dated February 2021, although the content appears to be the same as the previous version.





Snug Village extension

Christian Homes Tasmania (CHT) was incorporated in 1972 and has a long history in Kingborough.

The first accommodation was a group of ten units in Denison Street, Kingston, still owned and occupied by CHT today.

In 1989 CHT constructed a 25-bed facility in Blackmans Bay, known as Hawthorn Village, which is still in operation, albeit in an expanded capacity.

In 2002 a 28-bed facility was constructed at Snug, opening in 2003.

At the time, there was already 13 independent living inits on the site

Today the Snug Village complex comprises a total of 62 beds in the residential facility and 32 two bed villa units. CHT has recently been awarded a Federal Government capital grant of \$3.41 million towards a \$5 million expansion of Snug Village, including an additional 14 rooms, an improved dining area, an internal courtyard and other internal modifications to improve the amenity and operational efficiency for res-

It is anticipated that works should commence in October. Works are expected to be finished by July 2022.


