Expectations exceeded

On Thursday, August 12, members of the Kingston Beach Surf Life Saving Club (KBSLC) partnered with the Salvation Army, members of local government, business leaders and the community to raise awareness and support for those experiencing homelessness.

KBSLC President Danielle Campbell said the event was a fantastic learning experience.

"It was a great opportunity for two local organisations to link up and raise money for such a worthy cause," stated Ms Campbell.

"Our club members learnt so much from the experience and it provided members and local community members an opportunity to learn more about homelessness in Hobart.

"We hope to run a bigger and better event next year at our Kingston home and encourage more of the community to get involved."

State Manager of the Salvation Army's Doorways (Emergency Relief) Program, Stacey Milbourne spoke with those in attendance about the services they offer.

Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt, Deputy Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Jo Westwood, Cr Amanda Midgley, Commander from Tasmania Police, Jo Stolp and Member for Franklin, Nic Street MP were some of the public figures who participated in the sleep out.

Mayor Wriedt said it was terrific to see the event held in Kingborough for the first time.

"With participants gathering at the Kingston Beach Surf Life Saving Club it was also a great example of a partnership between two well respected community organisations," Mayor Wriedt remarked.

"The Salvation Army offers support through their Doorways program at their premises at Opal Drive, Blackmans Bay, every Thursday for members of the community who are experiencing difficult circumstances.

"The sleep out was a great opportunity to get a better understanding of the homeless situation in Kingborough and I think all of us came away with an appreciation of the work that the Salvation Army does.

"But at the same time it was distressing to hear that so many Kingborough

residents find themselves in circumstances where they require help.

"As well as raising funds, we also got to contribute in a small way by preparing emergency relief packs to be distributed to local residents.

"I look forward to the next sleep out and congratulate both the Salvation Army and Kingston Beach Surf Life Saving Club for working together to bring this event to Kingborough for the first time."

Approximately 35 people attended the KBSLC event and helped pack bags of non-perishable food items and supplies, which were then donated to the Salvos, with 10 staying for the sleep out.

Aiming to raise \$60,000 for the Street to Home community outreach program, the statewide sleepout exceeded expectations, with over \$90,000 donated to the cause.

Huon Aquaculture sale imminent

Brazilian meat company JBS is set to buy local salmon producer Huon Aquaculture for around \$425 million and attain 100 per cent of the company's shares after a deal was made on Friday, August 6.

Huon Aquaculture's board has made a recommendation to its shareholders to vote in favour of the new deal which would see the company's shares valued at \$3.85, increasing its current market value of \$2.79.

Chief Executive Officer and Managing Director of Huon Aquaculture Peter Bender said that the Board is set to vote in favour of the deal.

"The Board considers this offer to be compelling for all Huon shareholders and will enable shareholders to realise an attractive value for their shares," Mr Bender stated.

The sale comes after continuing financial losses for Huon Aquaculture, with the company posting a loss of \$95.3 million in the six months ending December 2020. However, JBS has committed to continuing to support the local economy

and communities in taking over Huon Aquaculture and to continue with current staff growing the company to its next phase.

"On a company level, JBS is committed to ensuring Huon continues to be a leading Tasmanian salmon producer that supports the Australian economy, continues to be a significant employer nationally and supports the local communities in which it operates," Mr Bender commented.

JBS, currently one of the world's largest meat processing companies, also own a beef cattle processing unit at Longford, with the purchase of Huon Aquaculture marking the company's move into aquaculture in Tasmania.

The sale also involves the transfer of Huon Aquaculture's debt of around \$120 million to JBS as well as 43 per cent gearing, providing the company with a sale value of around \$550 million, some financial experts say.

Mr Benders concluded his recent statement by saying that both his wife Frances, Executive Director of Huon Aquaculture, and himself wish to thank

their staff for their loyalty over the years and state they are happy to see the continued success of Huon Aquaculture into the future.

"In closing we wish to thank all our loyal and valued employees for their contribution to the company and we are extremely proud of what we have built and achieved together," Mr Bender commended.

"The proposed scheme with JBS is testament to the highly attractive business we have all built with our continued focus on high quality and environmentally sustainable salmon farming."

It has been reported by the United States Department of Justice that JBS' parent company, Brazil's J&F Investimentos, pleaded guilty to United States foreign bribery charges and agreed to pay more than \$100 million in criminal fines in 2020 and paid more than \$1 billion in fines in Brazil for its role in corruption scandals, due to bribing corrupt Brazilian officials in order to obtain benefits for the company.

Residents treated with contempt

Dear Editor,

The State Government is treating the residents south of Kingston with contempt.

The government had put in a Development Application to build a standard roundabout in the middle of the Channel Highway, the major route from the south of Kingston, for their proposed large subdivision at Huntingfield.

Kingborough Council listened to southern residents and put a condition on the approval of the roundabout by adding a slip lane for northbound traffic.

The slip lane would have allowed southern residents

from Margate, Snug and the rest of the southern Channel area through access to the Southern Outlet without having to give way to the traffic from what could be up to 1000 new dwellings in Huntingfield.

The government is now appealing this amendment saying that the slip lane 'was not necessary to protect the safety and efficiency of the road'.

This is another case of poor future planning by the State Government.

A standard roundabout may do the job now, in 2021, but what happens when the subdivision at Huntingfield is completed or another subdivision is built further south in Margate or Snug?

The slip lane may be necessary in as little as three to five years requiring land acquisitions and causing angst to the land owners involved, similar to the angst for those who are impacted by the proposed fifth lane on the Southern Outlet.

This lack of future planning could be just like the Kingston bypass that should have had been two lanes when it was built, now requiring a \$63m upgrade after just 10 years.

Michael Ferguson is just being bloody-minded in saying he won't drop the government's appeal against council's conditions, as reported in *The Mercury* on August 9.

Council listened to residents' concerns and mandated a slip lane on the Huntingfield roundabout the government wanted to plonk right the middle of the Channel Highway.

The slip lane would have future-proofed the roundabout to make sure that it would cope with the expected traffic.

And an added bonus, travellers from the south won't have to put up with roadworks twice; once while they build the inadequate roundabout and again when they add a slip lane, after it is proven that it was needed in the first place.

Yes, we need the housing but, Mr Ferguson, make sure we have adequate infrastructure to support it.

Dog park unfriendly for greyhounds

Dear Editor,

The description "off leash dog friendly park" no longer applies to the Kingston View Drive dog park.

Recently a section of this park has been sectioned off for the use of greyhounds.

Initially it was fenced in a dangerous, unsafe design, causing injuries to three greyhounds, one of which had serious injuries to his neck area.

The section was then sign posted 'Do Not Enter', indicating the seriousness in the lack of planning of this enclosure.

The erection of this unnecessary enclosure by the council was a liability and danger to these beautiful dogs.

Today is has a black shade cloth covering the whole

enclosure, including the fencing alongside the nature strip by the footpath, which was not previously covered.

It should also be noted that the height of the fencing around this enclosure is inappropriate as a greyhound could still jump the fence, so the area is still a danger.

I and many others are regular users of this park in the afternoons, most of us and our furry friends gradually congregating after 4pm.

This park has lost the ambience it once had, where all the dogs are socialized and happily interact with each other.

The greyhounds have never been a problem to any of the dogs and the regulars in this park are in total confusion as to why this enclosure was erected.

Many greyhounds who have been adopted have very sad backgrounds and to see them running free is an absolute pleasure.

To see them now being segregated, along with their owners, behind a black fence demonstrates lack of thought and empathy for these beautiful greyhounds and the park is no longer the happy friendly place it once was.

On discussion with one of the other dog owners who frequents many dog parks in Hobart, they have not seen such an enclosure before.

The only dogs who usually aggravate the other dogs are the smaller ones and never the larger breeds, especially the greyhounds.

Yet the smaller dogs who don't need the space to run, have a larger area separated at the top of the park, another ridiculous decision by the council, who have not carried out proper research into the space required for greyhounds.

I did notice the other day a couple of greyhounds running on the dog beach.

This is a double standard.

Many dog owners were unaware of the New Greyhound Area Public Submissions process as, surprisingly, there was no notice of such a process on the gate of the dog park otherwise the number of submissions would have been overwhelming.

The council says the proposed Kingston View Drive dog exercise area would include "barriers within the space to break line of sight and restrict speed".

Breaking the line of sight caused injuries to three greyhounds who were used to having the whole area to run in and were used to the open space.

Restricting speed caused greyhounds to run into the fence, whether it be shaded or not.

Other dogs in the park run at an ongoing high speed for long periods, whereas greyhounds run in short sprints then gently continue their exercise, usually staying by their owner's side.

I don't own a greyhound so I am providing this information due to how strongly I feel about the injustice to this beautiful breed of dog.

Greyhound off-leash confusion

In response to claims that Kingborough Council's new off leash greyhound exercise area is unnecessary and unsafe, Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt provided more information.

The specific greyhound exercise area is close to completion and will be the first in southern Tasmania and just the second in the state.

Mayor Wriedt said this specific area was developed to provide more exercise freedom for greyhounds.

"What some people may not be aware of is that under the Tasmanian Government's Dog Control Act 2000, greyhounds can only be exercised off-lead in specific areas declared by council," Mayor Wriedt said.

"Back in April this year, council undertook consultation

with the community that allowed the public, dog and greyhound owners to provide feedback on the proposal and it was overwhelmingly in favour of it proceeding.

"Council also consulted greyhound experts on the design prior to it being built.

"The area was closed in late June following an accident with a greyhound running into the fence and hurting itself, which of course would be very distressing for the owner.

"We sought further expert advice and have now made modifications to the greyhound exercise area to reduce the risk of injury or accident to greyhounds using the space.

"Newly developed signs will go up at the entrance, ask-

ing dog owners to slowly introduce their greyhounds to the area to avoid any accidents," commented Mayor Wriedt.

"These signs will highlight that dogs may become overexcited in the area after being let off leash and for owners to watch out for this.

"Other modifications to the area include a dark coloured, durable material over the fence.

"This is to help the greyhounds identify the boundaries more easily.

"A seat will also be removed, to reduce the need for greyhounds to negotiate obstacles in the area and for maximum safety," Mayor Wriedt concluded.

Kingborough Council will inform the public when this area is reopening for use.



Big fines for not using COVID app

The Kingborough community are advised that Tasmania Police will be issuing infringement notices to anyone failing to use the State Government's Check in Tas app.

The warning came in a press release from Premier of Tasmania, Peter Gutwein MP on Wednesday, August 11.

The fine will remain at \$774.80 for people who break the rules.

"The Delta strain is challenging communities right across Australia's Eastern seaboard, creating serious health and economic challenges," said Premier Gutwein.

"NSW will continue to be classified as high-risk

Level 1 for the foreseeable future and in terms of Victoria, we plan to remain closed to that state for at least the next two weeks and potentially up to four weeks depending on the COVID situation in that state."

All taxis, rideshare, luxury hire and restricted hire vehicles are also now required to have a QR code for the Check in TAS app.

Alternate means of checking in will be available if a customer does not have a smartphone.

Drivers can check them in on paper or on their device using the business profile functionality in the app.

COVID vaccination clinics open to youth

A COVID-vaccination program commenced for Tasmanian college students aged 16 to 18 years on August 23.

The vaccinations are part of a six-week campaign by the State Department of Health, announced on Wednesday, August 11, aimed at boosting the rate of vaccinations into the 60 per cent range by September.

The timing has been selected in conjunction with the Department of Education to best suit examination scheduling.

State community vaccination clinics, including at the Kingborough Hub, will be opening on additional days and extending hours in an effort to accommodate people aged 30 to 59.

By lifting vaccination rates in the 30 to 59 age group, the campaign aims to bring forward vaccination of the 16 to 29 age group, to enable the state clinics to begin vaccinations for people aged 16 to 29 years on September 13.

The Tasmanian Government said pharmacies will also be brought on line more quickly.

Petition to lower speed limit

Kingborough residents have joined forces in calling for consistent speed limits in towns on the Channel Highway to improve road safety.

Currently the speed limit through Kettering and Snug is 60 kilometres per hour, however the residents are seeking a reduction to 50km/h, bringing their towns into line with Margate and Woodbridge.

Member for Franklin, Dean Winter MP is sponsoring a petition with residents, asking Tasmania's Minister for Infrastructure and Transport to change the speed limits.

The petition suggests consistent speed limits throughout the Channel towns would benefit drivers, many of whom are visitors to the region.

Another goal is to make it easier for residents to walk or ride a bike on short trips in their local area, including to shops and schools.

Mr Winter introduced the petition at a meeting of the Kettering Community Association (KCA) recently.

The locals have been involved in a long-running campaign for their town, with the KCA having requested lower speed limits 10 years ago.

KCA Chairman, Alan Gluyas said residents had been worried about safety for a long time while traffic in the area had increased.

Mr Gluyas noted the Bruny Island ferry terminal generated significant visiting traffic in the area, including drivers unfamiliar with the road.

"The main issue is that we want better safety for access and egress for side roads and driveways," said Mr Gluyas.

"The sightlines are not long and turning into the highway or off it can be tricky when someone is driving towards you at 60km/h."

Mr Gluyas said pedestrian safety was a part of the campaign, particularly at the bus stop located opposite the Kettering post office and residents wanted action now.

"It's too late to only do it after someone gets injured," remarked Mr Gluyas.

"The risk is there every day."

Mr Winter said lowering the speed limits would have very little effect on travel times, as decreasing the speed from 60km/h to 50km/h adds just 12 seconds for every kilometre of road.



Cat trapping Bruny's shearwater colonies

Feral cat trapping is now underway around the island's short-tailed shearwater colonies, located on The Bruny Island Neck Game Reserve.

Over the next two years, NRM South will be supporting this work through \$1.5 million in project funding from the Australian Government's Environment Restoration Fund.

Bruny Island's shearwater colonies are known to be hotspots for feral cats, with some of the highest cat densities recorded in Australia, as many as 15 cats every square kilometre compared to a national average of one cat every three to four square kilometres.

Cats congregate in the short-tailed shearwater colonies on Bruny Island, particularly after the migrating birds arrive in September from the Northern Hemisphere.

In the subsequent months, the birds dig their burrows, reforge pair bonds and breed.

Each day the birds leave their burrows to forage, providing easy pickings for feral cats.

Rosie Hohnen, the NRM South project manager, said this creates a problem not just for the birds, but for many native animals on Bruny.

"Every year feral cats have a huge impact on Bruny Island's shearwater population.

"The birds are an abundant source of food for cats, supporting big numbers, which prey on other native species, particularly after the birds leave on their migration in May."

Conrad Daniels, manager for Bruny Farming and a feral cat control contractor based on Bruny Island, has observed the devastation caused by cats firsthand but he is hopeful that the trapping in the shearwater colonies will help protect the birds.

"Feral cats are in big numbers around shearwater colonies and I've seen a lot of the devastation they've caused," Mr Daniels said.

"After previous trapping work, we saw a significant dent in the cat population and a definite change for the better in shearwater colonies.

"We're hoping to see a rapid decline in younger cats now trapping has started as they're easier to catch."

Dr Jennifer Lavers, seabird expert at the University of Tasmania, said short-tailed shearwaters are under pressure from many threats, including fisheries by-catch, plastic and chemical pollution, ocean warming and invasive predators such as cats.

Dr Lavers said control of invasive predators such as feral cats is a very effective strategy that local commu-

nities can implement to help support the birds.

In 2010, a global review of the impacts of predator removal on seabird colonies published by Dr Lavers, found that on average, the breeding success of seabird populations increased 25 per cent in years following predator control, with some increasing as much as 65 per cent.


"In colonies such as those found on north Bruny, adult breeding birds are the most important component of the population," noted Dr Lavers.

"Feral cats often target breeding birds when they leave their burrows, causing big impacts.

"Significant population declines have been seen in shearwater populations, and other seabird species elsewhere, when cats are present in colonies.

"Invasive predator control can be a really powerful way of increasing the breeding success of the birds and supporting them in the long term."

This project is delivered in partnership between Kingborough Council, Biosecurity Tasmania, Bruny Farming, weetaoona Aboriginal Corporation, Parks and Wildlife Service and the Ten Lives Cat Centre.

Sandfly Road intersection changes

Traffic arrangements at the intersection of Huon Highway and Sandfly Road are beginning to change as work on the intersection upgrade progresses.

Traffic will now be directed around the centre median. Vehicles travelling from Sandfly towards Huonville will enter a dedicated acceleration lane.

Vehicles travelling between Longley and Sandfly on Sandfly Road will cross one lane of the highway into the open section of the turning lane, then round the new centre median and wait before safely crossing the other lane of the highway and entering Sandfly Road again.

Vehicles travelling from Longley towards Huonville will cross one lane of the highway, turn around the new centre median and wait safely until there is a gap in the traffic before turning towards Huonville.

Vehicles travelling from Sandfly towards Hobart will exit Sandfly Road South, cross the single lane of traffic on the Huon Highway and enter the partially open turning lane, before turning around the new centre median and waiting safely until there is a gap in the traffic before entering the highway.

The speed limit for vehicles travelling between Hobart and Huonville has been reduced to 40 kilometres per hour, Monday to Friday, from 7am to 5pm, with occasional works on Saturdays.

Outside of working hours, the speed limit will be 60km/h.

The arrangements are expected to remain until completion of the intersection upgrade, due in late 2021.







Originating in a pickle

Pickleball originated on Bainbridge Island, Washington in 1965.

It began when three fathers arrived home from their golf game to find their children bored during the summer holidays. They searched around for some sporting equipment and started playing with some table tennis paddles and a wiffle ball, while lowering their badminton net to make it easier to hit the ball over the top. The rules evolved as they played, with the adults enjoying the game as much as their children. One of the most common questions about the sport is "Where did the name Pickleball originate?" and there are two conflicting stories. One states it was named after one of the family's dog, called Pickles, who was continually running away with the ball. The other contends that one of the mums involved had been a competitive rower and came up with the name because the game reminded her of a pickle boat. Apparently people referred to weaker mismatched crew boat teams as pickle boats. If nothing else, the contradictory stories make for interesting conversation regarding the early history of the sport. Pickleball was officially incorporated in 1972 in the US and has been steadily growing across the world. Pickleball is a low impact sport that is easy to learn and play at almost any age and is regularly described as the fastest growing sport worldwide. It is commonly referred to as a cross between tennis, badminton and table tennis. The sport was brought to the Kingborough Sports

Centre (KSC) in October 2019 by two avid tennis players who had enjoyed playing Pickleball at other venues around the world. Roy Barker and Phil Exton purchased a couple of nets, a few paddles and balls and invited their friends to join them at the KSC for some fun and exercise. The sport took off like wildfire, despite being derailed by COVID-19 during 2020. The KSC recently hosted the first Tasmanian Pickleball Championships with people from around the state attending. The Kingborough Pickleball Club Inc has recently been formed to help facilitate the continued growth of Pickleball in the area and to encourage participation by all ages and genders. 


