Dark deals with donors

Independent Member for Nelson, Meg Webb MLC has accused the Premier of Tasmania, Peter Gutwein MP, of withholding vital information on casino tax rates prior and during the May 2021 State election campaign.

Ms Webb released a statement on August 19, calling on the Premier "to defend his decision to keep secret" at the May 2021 State election "his gift to the Federal Group of a quarter of a billion dollars".

"The Premier has refused to explain why he confirmed the intended discount casino pokies tax rate with a 'stakeholder', Federal Group, in December last year, but then deliberately hid those same details during the election campaign from his most important stakeholders, the Tasmanian people," Ms Webb stated.

Ms Webb released Right to Information (RTI) documents on August 18, revealing the new deal could have been made as early as December 23, 2020, four months before the May 1 election this year.

"The deal was done, the fix was in, but the Tasmanian voter was cut out," stated Ms Webb.

"By his omission, [the Premier] misled, deceived and manipulated both the media and Tasmanian voters."

Ms Webb said "it was outrageous" a select few within the Treasury and the gaming industry were in the know regarding the proposed new tax rates when the Premier took the state to the polls.

"The state's media and Tasmanian electorates were kept in the dark," said Ms Webb.

"Any attempt to now claim a 'mandate' for the proposed new FGM (Future Gaming Market) reforms is laughable and offensive."

Ms Webb also released transcripts of an ABC interview questioning the Premier in the lead up to the election.

The transcripts show that in an ABC radio interview with Leon Compton on March 29, the Premier repeatedly avoided answering a question on the tax rate the Federal Hotel Group would pay on poker machines in their casinos.

"Premier, I think people have listened to this and heard you repeatedly refuse to say what rate one of your significant party donors will be charged," Leon Compton said in the transcript of the radio interview.

The following day, Thursday, August 19, Minister for Finance, Michael Ferguson MP claimed Ms Webb had it wrong.

Minister Ferguson said Ms Webb was "deliberately trying to muddy the waters" around the *Future Gaming Policy* and called the independent member "anti-jobs".

"With such opposition to the policy we took to two elections, anyone would think Ms Webb would rather the Federal monopoly deed to continue and get lower tax receipts for essential public services," said Minister Ferguson.

"The fact is that the Federal Group will be about \$20 million per annum worse off under proposed legislation due to ending the monopoly in Tasmania."

"It's anything but a special deal for Federal and to say otherwise is a simple lie."

"We said we would deliver more money for essential services and provide certainty and security for jobs in pubs and clubs, again this is what we are doing."

Minister Ferguson also stated the government was "very clear with the Tasmanian people" about their policy over the last two elections.

Ms Webb said the State Government's own Exposure Draft Bill document provides data reinforcing evidence that "the casino tax rates and industry deal had been finalised and signed off by Cabinet well before the election was called".

Major tree oversight

No trees have been added to Kingborough Council's Significant Tree Register since 2013, according to the online public Register dated February 2019.

The one-page list of significant trees includes 22 entries from 2012 and one entry from 2013.

A council spokesperson has confirmed that the 2019 document is current and that 33 applications for significant tree status are with council for assessment.

The spokesperson also confirmed council's last call for nominations was in 2019.

Kingborough Council's Significant Tree Register Policy, dated September 2018, requires an annual public call for nominations and allows nominations from the public to be accepted throughout the year.

The policy states: "determination of listing or delisting will be by council, although council may delegate this responsibility to the General Manager where no objections have been received".

According to the policy, councillors will receive an annual report on the status of the Register.

The policy also enables council to nominate trees for listing.

The objective of the policy is to recognise and protect trees that have the highest aesthetic, cultural and/or environmental values in the municipality by conserving individual or small groups of trees on either public or privately owned land.

Categories include historical significance, aesthetic significance, landscape significance, size, age, rarity of species, variety or genome.

The *Kingborough Chronicle* wrote to Kingborough Council and councillors regarding the matter on August 18 and 19.

Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt said the assessment process can take more than a year, but did not explain why it appeared no trees had been placed on the Register for eight years (since 2013), and no updates were made to the Register and no calls were made for public nominations since 2019.

"Council is currently progressing a number of requests to list/delist trees on council's Significant Tree Register," Mayor Wriedt said.

"The process is very complex and generally takes 12 plus months to finalise."

"Significant trees are regulated through planning legislation, so it is not just a matter of placing trees on a list."

Aquatic centre is beyond budget

A feasibility study into the potential for a swim-
ming pool located at the Kingborough Sports
Precinct is beyond the feasibility of budget con-
straints.

In a statement on August 16, Mayor of Kingborough,
Cr Paula Wriedt said although council supported the
building of an aquatic centre in Kingborough, it was
something that could only be afforded with State and
Federal Government assistance.
“Council acknowledged that it is unable to construct
an aquatic centre of this size within its existing budget,”
Mayor Wriedt said.
“Council resolved to lobby the State and Federal
Governments for funding and look at this issue from a
regional perspective, servicing the needs of the com-
munity from Taroona right through to the south.
“Due to a large amount of public interest in a pool for
Kingborough, the Tasmanian Government provided
funding to council to undertake a detailed feasibility
study for such a facility.
“Council engaged C Leisure consultancy to undertake
a feasibility study into the potential for a pool located at
the Kingborough Sports Precinct,” said Mayor Wriedt.
“The report highlighted that the community didn't just

want a swimming pool, they told us they wanted an
Aquatic Centre that catered for the diverse needs of
every member of the community.
“They mentioned the need to accommodate learn to
swimmers, lap swimmers, casual swimmers, small
pools that catered for families, water sports and a
diverse range of other water programs.
“Following a consultation with stakeholders and the
broader community the consultants recommended a
design.
“This design was costed at \$40.5 million, with an
additional \$4.5 million required to relocate a variety of
existing sporting clubs in the Kingborough Sporting
Precinct as well a running cost of approximately
\$700,00 to \$750,000 a year.
“Both the capital construction amount and the annual
operating costs are above the council's financial capac-
ity,” noted Mayor Wriedt.
“The running costs alone would require an increase in
the general rates of three per cent.
“The report indicated that national standards are gen-
erally that high-quality Aquatic Centres with a 50 metre
pool generally require a population base of at least
100,000 people.”

In his response, Minister Ferguson maintained that no decision was made until after the election, adding that the Tasmanian Government “have chosen to benchmark our taxation policy on that of regional Queensland”. “The inconvenient truth for Ms Webb is that the Future Gaming legislation consultation package was not approved by government until after the State Election,” Minister Ferguson claimed. “We were very clear that the taxation rates and licensing model for casinos and keno would be included in the Exposure Draft of the Bill and that we would commence stage two public consultation. “Until that time, the arrangements were not finalised and as is normal for any type of reform, consultation and discussions occur during the development of the policy. “Furthermore, a decision on the final bill (including the taxation and licencing regime) to take to Parliament is not

made until the consultation is reported to government.” In a follow up interview with the *Kingborough Chronicle* on August 20, Ms Webb said the legislation was being drafted long before the election. “The drafting of this legislation began in March and could only have started once Cabinet made decision to authorise it,” declared Ms Webb. “When Cabinet considered the gaming policy prior to March, did it include the intended discount casino pokies tax rate? “Tasmanians deserve honest answers to these questions.” Ms Webb said the main stakeholders are the Tasmanian people, especially during an election. “It remains to be confirmed or denied by all Cabinet members whether they knew the intended discount casino pokies tax rate prior to the election and, like the Premier, kept it hidden,” remarked Ms Webb. “If so, that’s an appalling travesty of our democracy.”

Ms Webb said independent economic modelling shows “the dramatically discounted casino pokies tax rate equates to a quarter-of-a-billion dollar gift to Federal Group over the period of the licence”. “It looks like the Premier didn’t want to explain to the Tasmanian people during an election why he was giving away a \$248 million gift to a major party donor,” stated Ms Webb. “Polling this month shows only three per cent of Tasmanians agreed with a lower tax rate for casino pokies, while a total of 91 per cent disagreed with it.” The *Kingborough Chronicle* wrote to the Premier on August 18 asking why the details were withheld from the community before the election. “Given the Liberal members [of Parliament] may benefit from donations, does concealing deals of this nature amount to Fraud?” the *Kingborough Chronicle* asked. No reply was received from the Premier’s office at the time of printing.

Dam drowning risks revealed

More than 100 people drowned in dams in Australia in the past ten years, according to new data released by the Royal Life Saving Society Australia.

The data was drawn from coronial reports and compiled as part of Farm Safe Week to highlight the risks to people living and working on properties with dams, rivers or other water bodies.

Royal Life Saving Chief Executive Officer, Justin Scarr, said rural properties carry very specific drowning risks across the lifespan, from children, to employees working on farms and older farmers.

"In our most recent drowning report, 32 per cent of dam drowning deaths were work-related," Mr Scarr said. "Exposure to water in irrigation, aqua-culture and working stock can increase drowning risks on farms."

"The other most at-risk group of drowning on farms is small children.

"Children love the water and it only takes a moment for a tragedy to occur.

"The risk is heightened on farms because of the large size and remote location of properties and the fact that

it is not always feasible to fence off large bodies of water.

"There are ways to reduce the risk of drowning and we would ask everyone on farms to take action to protect themselves and the people they love."

These measures include:

- Create safe play areas for children on rural properties which have access to inland waterways, especially dams on private/residential properties.
- Fill in any unused holes where water can gather such as ditches, dips and postholes.
- Water storage such as wells and tanks should be securely covered.
- Never undertake work near a dam or river alone.
- Refresh your CPR training, particularly in remote locations.
- Install clear safety signage.
- Talk to guests, or workers visiting your property about where dams and rivers are located.

National family history month display

The Kingston Library is displaying a collection of historical photos and research provided by the local Family History Group until August 27, to coincide with National Family History Month.

The Family History Group's Facilitator Janet Cox said the group, nicknamed Skeletons-In-The-Cupboard, concentrates on a different area of genealogical research each year for the annual display.

"This year we showcased three of the Family History Groups Ancestors, and one of a personal interest," Ms Cox explained.

"A captain of Tasmanias whaling vessels. "His ancestor, a member of the group, recently discovered that Captain Smith was Samoan, confirming a family myth.

"Captain William Smith and his wife Sarah Ann Tedman, had ten or more children and many of their descendants live in Tasmania.

"The Captain and his wife are buried in the small cemetery at Cockle Creek.

"Their names, engraved on their headstones, have survived.

"The cemetery has been abandoned and unloved for decades."

Another part of the display includes a convict named James Hurst, who was sent from England to Van Diemen's Land.

"After gaining his freedom he became a notable builder," said Ms Cox.

"Many are the landmark buildings are in the town of Swansea on the east coast.

"The East Coast Heritage Museum, one of James Hurst's buildings can be enjoyed by visitors today.

"He also discovered coal in the Kaoota district near Sandfly.

"The History of James Hurst caught the interest of one

of the history group, who wanted to know more of his history and his connection to the Kaoota, Sandfly area."

Two of the policemen featured in the display are relatives of Ms Cox.

"The two policeman featured are cousins and they are both my third cousins twice removed," noted Ms Cox.

"When I started researching my father's family I discovered both of these gentleman and their interesting lives.

"Both men served in their different capacities at England's famous Old Scotland Yard, London."

"Chief Inspector James Stockley was, at the time, a Police Constable."

"He volunteered to go undercover, disguising himself as a vagrant in scruffy dirty clothing.

"He walked the dark foggy streets of London night after night in an attempt to apprehend Jack the Ripper.

"As history tells us, Jack was never caught," noted Ms Cox.

"His cousin, Superintendent Charles Stockley Collins was the head of the New Finger Print Division of Old Scotland Yard.

"In the early years the identification of fingerprints was in its early stages," explained Ms Cox.

"A violent robbery took place in a jewellery shop in London's Covent Garden.

"The robber removed jewellery and monies from a cashbox after brutally murdering the elderly owner and injuring his wife.

"Charles discovered one of the robber's fingerprints on the cashbox.

"Charles was able to get his first conviction using fingerprint identification and got justice for the owners family."

Janet Cox said her interest in family history started in 2009 when she joined an introductory presentation for genealogy at the Kingston Library.

"Over the years of my research into my ancestors I have uncovered murderers, a love affair, convicts transported to Tasmania, many untrue family myths, a second family and the death of a baby sister," remarked Janet.

"[I was] unaware of her existence.

"She was killed during a bombing raid in England in WW2.

"Uncovering my past history has been tinged with sadness but also with great joy."

Janet Cox encourages others to experience the highs

and lows in researching the lives of their ancestors and to view all the valuable information available on the library website.

The group meets at the Kingston Library on Fridays between 1:30pm and 4:30pm.

Access to a computer and assistance with research is provided to participants and a one-to-one research session for an hour is also available.

For further information call Kingston Library to discuss the research session options with Janet.

Inspiration for spring

Spring is just around the corner.

Gardeners looking for inspiration or nature-lovers looking to learn about native plants and the wildlife they sustain, may be interested to hear the local Inverawe Native Gardens opens for the season on September 1.

Bill and Margaret Chestnut have provided some tips on what to look for and how to prepare.

"September 1 is Wattle Day, when wattles come into bloom," notes Bill.

"Bottlebrushes bud up.

"Spring flowering banksias get a move on.

"New Holland honeyeaters get antsy, chasing other species off grevilleas, now in full bloom.

"Birds strip bark off paperbarks, to line their nests."

Bill advises gardeners to check mowers as they will be needed when weeds such as milkweed, flick, oxalis,

chickweed, thistles and vetch spring to life.

"Mulch the garden," advises Bill.

"This suppresses weeds, insulates soil from extremes of heat and cold and retains moisture.

"Medium pine bark mulch does the trick.

"It's slightly acid, which suits natives, and will break down over time to increase the organic content of soil.

"Finish off the winter planting.

"With south eastern Tasmania's dry summers, they will need to be watered in over their first summer.

"If the plant is on a slope, dig a rill, a small trench on the uphill side, big enough to hold a bucket of water, because rainfall will tend to skive off, not soak in.

"Most of all, enjoy the garden.

"Sit in a sheltered spot with a cup of tea and watch the bird life swirl about you," Bill advised.

Huntingfield House is a heritage listed property located at 1179 Channel Highway, opposite Clennett's Mitre 10.

Originally built around 200 years ago in the 1820's by James Baynton, the historic property and land has been faithfully maintained by its previous owner of 20 years

Gennaro Mazzella, who sold the property February 2021.

The house, which has three levels and a loft, does not have any footings as it was built on bedrock.

"We had boomboxes as kids that we'd make mixtapes on, we had cassette players in our first cars.

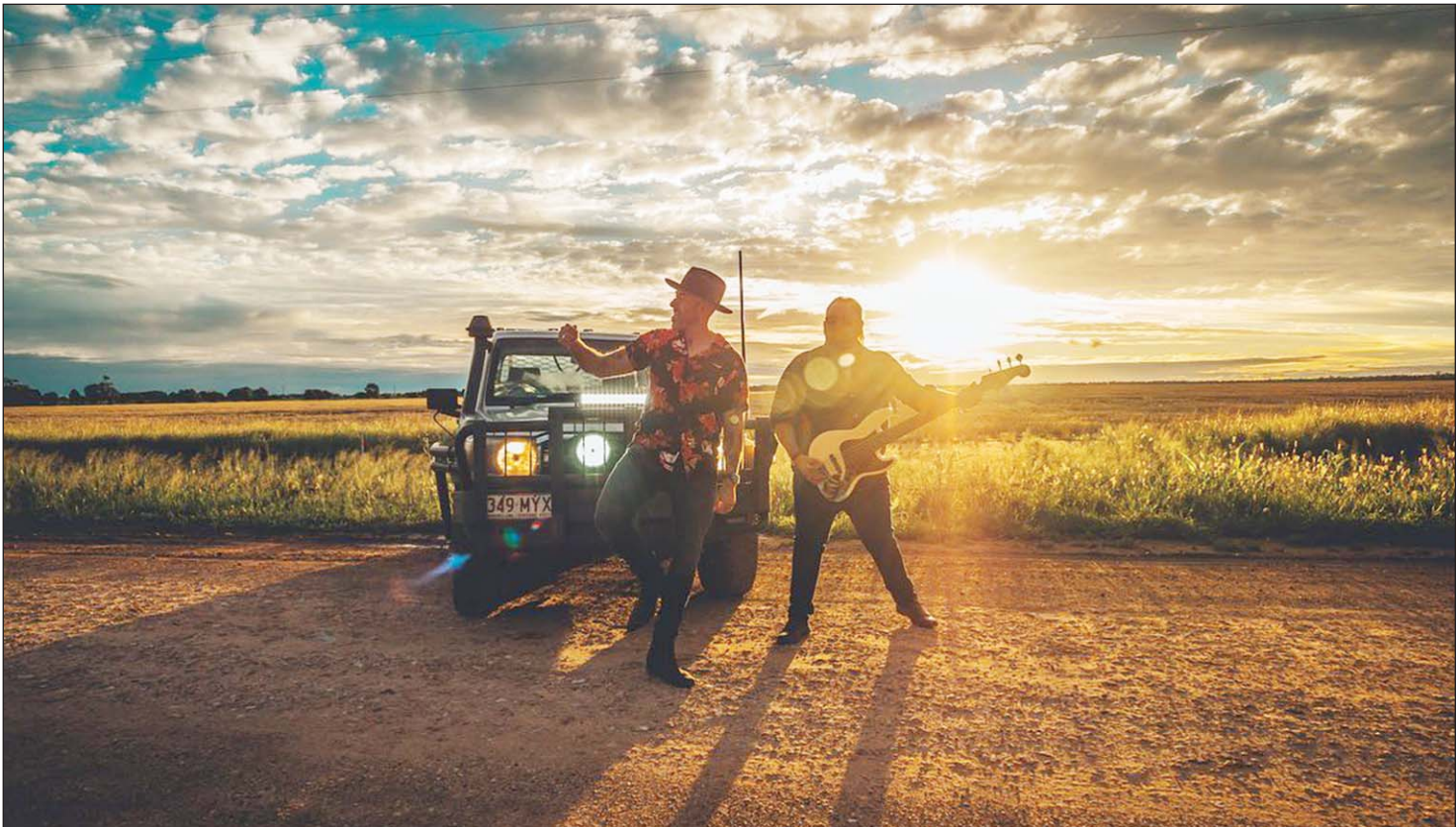
"There's some elements on this record from all our favourite sounds from the 80s right up to the now.

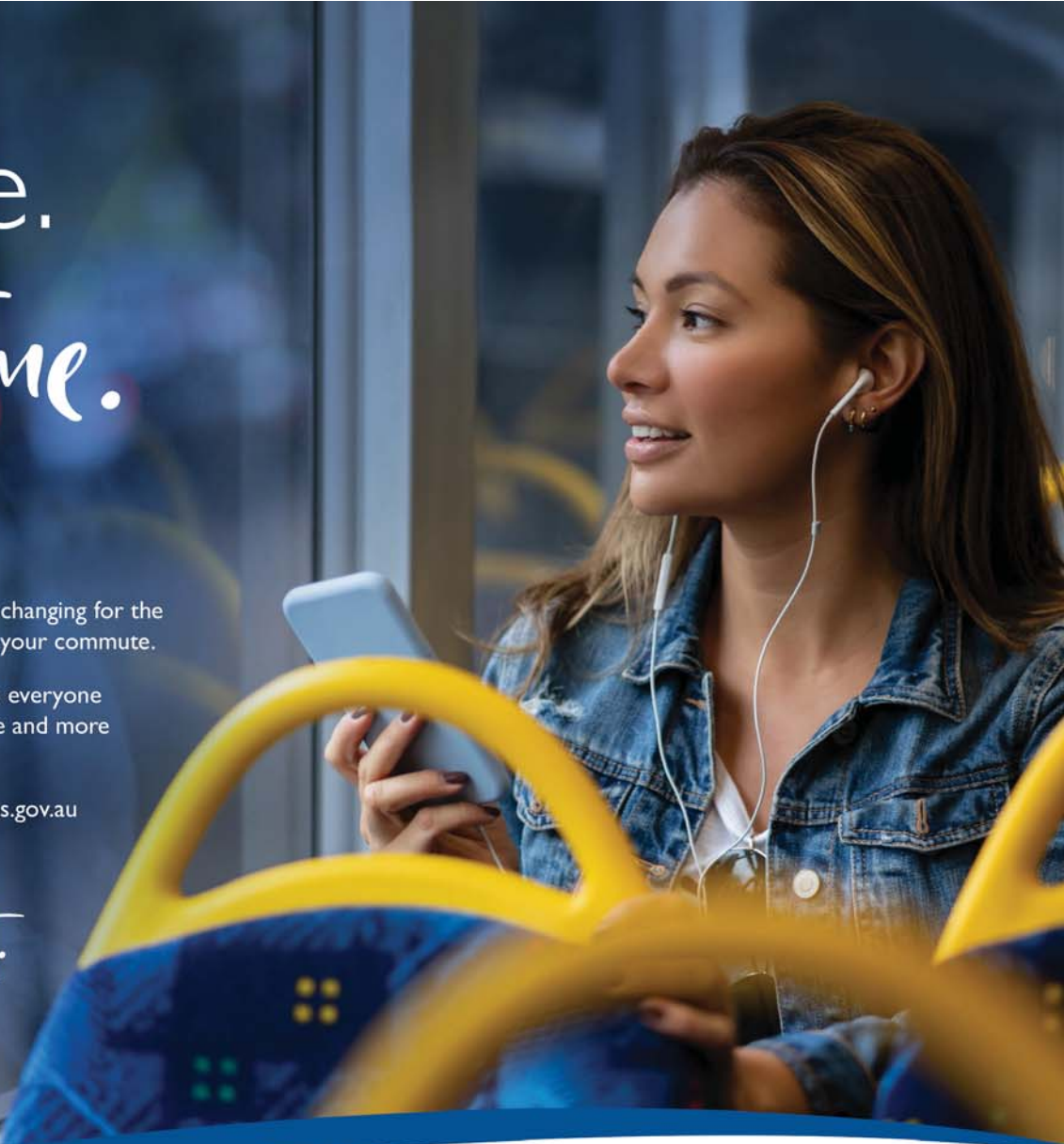

Forest on farms protection program

NRM South's new Forests on Farms Program is designed to help production-focussed landholders improve and protect remnant stands of this critically endangered ecological community on their property.

Tasmanian black gum and Brooker's gum forest and woodland is a habitat under threat.

This vegetation community, known formally as 'Tasmanian forests and woodlands dominated by black gum or Brookers gum' is unique to Tasmania and is classed as a critically endangered.

This is relevant to farmers in the southern Tasmania region, particularly the Kingborough and Huon Valley, where the type of forest listed is most frequently found.

Protecting and improving this type of forest and woodland can benefit production on farms in many ways.

They support populations of birds, bats, insects and other native animals, that pollinate crops, control pests and help maintain soil health.

Native vegetation stands also help prevent erosion, provide shelter for crops and stock, maintain air and water quality and river condition.

Through the program, NRM South is providing capacity building for landholders and helping fund on-ground work.

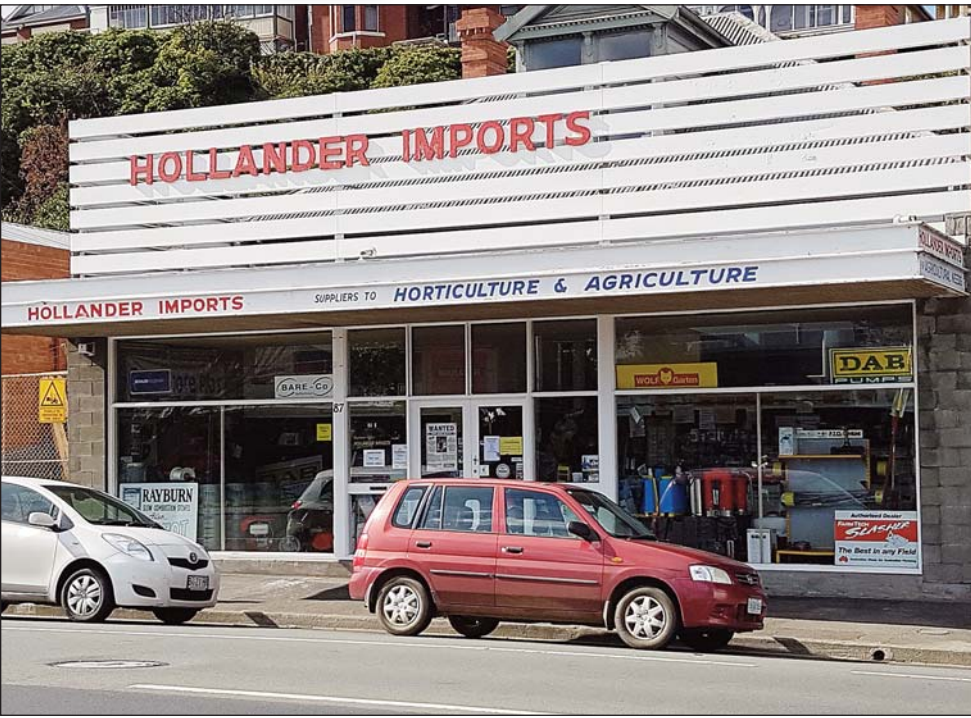



Tigers' leaders re-sign

The new season of lawn bowls competition at the Kingborough Bowls and Community Club has commenced, with entries now closed for the Men's Two Bowl and 100 up handicapped events.

The entered bowlers have now been advised of the draw and games have commenced in the Donald Hazell Indoor Centre.

Handicaps are worked out in these competitions by what division each bowler played last season.

Great interest has also been displayed in an up-and-coming competition to be held at the club.

The Two Bowls Triples Super Challenge Competition has been programmed for Saturday, September 25 and Sunday, September 26, where 16 teams will compete over the two-day competition for prize money of \$1200 for first place, second place \$600, third place \$400, and fourth place \$200.

Scoring an eight on one end is the holy grail of lawn bowls, the maximum possible score in a standard end in a game of fours, not counting a Power Play end.

In this current competition, all teams can nominate one of the ends played in each game as a Power Play end and if they win the end, they double their score.

Team Lee also managed to score eight points after they scored four shots on their power play end, but this is not considered a holy grail.

Ladder leaders from last week, team Newbolds, were beaten in their second game by Cygnet based team Schooling and as a result, dropped to second place in favour of Harra's Harem.

Other teams on the ladder are, in order, Chaffey, Family Affair, Hinkley and Pam Rosevear.

Again, the results show a prudent call and win of a Power Play end often is an important turning point in a game.
