Budget debate over infrastructure promises

The State Government recently released its 2021-22 Budget which features some targeted funding for the Kingborough region, although opposition comments have stated it isn't living up to election promises.

A statement from the Department of Premier and Cabinet (DPAC) said the Budget aims to deliver on the State Government's plan to secure Tasmania's future. "It builds on the strong foundations this government has established, growing our economy, creating jobs, supporting business and connecting the skills and training Tasmanians need to grasp the opportunities ahead," read the DPAC statement.

"We are delivering the biggest health spend in Tasmania's history, a record spend into education, skills and training and we're helping more Tasmanians into homes."

"This Budget invests in climate action and renewable initiatives and provides a more competitive tax system, one that is fair, sensible and sustainable."

"This Budget is based on listening to what the Tasmanian community wants and providing support where it is most needed."

"It delivers on our plan to secure Tasmania's future," the DPAC statement concluded.

Former Mayor of Kingborough and Member for Franklin, Dean Winter MP said the Budget has fallen short of promises made by the State Government, especially regarding the Kingston Health Centre and infrastructure at Huntingfield and Algoa Road.

"The Liberals promised to build a new stage of the Kingston Health Centre," Mr Winter remarked.

"The Budget pushes this project out to not be completed for at least four years and only funds \$10 million out of the \$30 million cost."

"The Algoa roundabout interchange and Kingston Bypass will not be built until at least 2027."

"Only \$11 million of the \$60 million has been funded."

Mr Winter said the government have already broken its promises to Kingborough residents, only three months since the election.

"The signs around the Algoa Road roundabout at the election told us they would fix this major issue," Mr Winter stated.

"It turns out they won't fix it for at least six years."

"The upgrades have been underfunded by \$50 million and the project won't be finished until at least 2027."

"This is not what they said only a few months ago."

"Likewise, the badly needed Kingston Health Centre expansion, a policy copied from Labor, has been pushed out until 2025, and underfunded by \$20 million."

"Nothing has changed."

"They make commitments but don't deliver," Mr Winter finished.

The *Kingborough Chronicle* reached out to State Government about the funding and priorities for Kingborough and received a response from Minister for Infrastructure and Transport, Michael Ferguson MP.

"The Liberal Government brought forward the Algoa Interchange vision from the recommended 10 years because we decided that the simple solution of a second roundabout was not the best approach," claimed Minister Ferguson.

"With the State and Federal budgets now delivered, we have funding certainty for the very first time."

Minister Ferguson did not mention if pressure from Kingborough Council regarding changes to the State Government's recent Development Application for the new Channel Highway roundabout played any part in this decision.

Minister Ferguson also declared the completion date in the Budget papers was a "conservative estimate" and said he expected that "the project will be delivered earlier".

"Within the first 100 days of the re-elected Liberal Government, we have already put in place engineering specialists to commence the planning and design for the Algoa Road grade-separated interchange as well as the Kingston Bypass duplication, which will provide two lanes in each direction between the Channel Highway and the Southern Outlet," Minister Ferguson remarked.

Huon member departs

Huon Member of the Legislative Council, Dr Bastian Seidel resigned on August 23, citing political infighting, stupid games and a toxic environment as reasons for his departure from politics, as well as wanting to be there for his family.

"I have tried to work constructively to solve some of our issues in our party but have come to the realisation that I have failed," said Dr Seidel

"I can't work in a toxic environment and I can't work

with people who constantly leak information to the media out of pure selfishness."

"I don't enjoy political infighting."

"Compared to others, I actually don't get a kick out of it."

"It is sad and depressing and too often I felt like I was a dispensable pawn in somebody else's stupid game."

"I did not sign up for that."

"My community and my electorate of Huon did not sign up for that either."

Growing community spirit

Following a very successful planting of 100 trees in August last year, the Kingborough Bahá'í community again donated and planted 100 Tasmanian native plants at Dru Point Bicentennial Park.

The morning began with a welcome to country by Kris Schaffer, an Indigenous horticulturalist and educator living on Muwinina Country in Neika, who spoke of how the land on which the park is situated has been cared for and sustained by the Palawa people for 150,000 years.

Ms Schaffer said that by donating and planting natives the Bahá'í community was helping to bring about a more sustainable future in harmony with the Palawa culture.

Sophie Appleton, speaking on behalf of the Bahá'ís of Kingborough, took up the theme of sustainability and said that that the Bahá'í teachings see humans as deeply interconnected with the natural world and everyone has a responsibility to protect it for future generations.

We would throw a pebble into the well to see how long it took to reach the bottom.

Unfortunately, much history has already been lost, such as the barn with the cross on top and dungeons underneath.

I urge those now developing this site to respect what is left before it is too late.

The entrance to Huntingfield House used to be to the left of the old oak tree, now opposite Mitre 10.

This tree would be over one hundred years old.

In the 1950's when we stayed with our grandmother, we used to shelter under it to catch the bus.

The fitter cousins and siblings used to climb it.

It is a very special tree.

I hope the oak tree is healthy enough to not suffer the

same fate as the other trees and that Huntingfield's

incredible history will be safely protected for future generations to enjoy.

Seidel resigns over toxic politics

Dr Seidel stated that although politics wasn't a planned career path, he wanted to work harder for better health services and give back to the Huon Valley community, especially after losing his first wife unexpectedly from a brain haemorrhage in 2014.

Now remarried with two young children, Dr Seidel said he has not been there enough for them and is disillusioned about the cost to his family compared to what can be achieved in the political arena.

"They don't mind really as long as they know that my time away is filled with meaning for my community," Dr Seidel explained.

"They wanted me to make a difference."

"It is about standing up for what is right.

"But my brief time in politics has left me disillusioned, bitter and just sad.

"There has to be virtue in politics but I just can't see it, and it is for that reason that I have decided to resign."

Dr Seidel will continue in his role until the final sitting of Parliament on December 3.

His resignation from the Labor Party and as Shadow Minister for Health, Mental Health and Wellbeing and as Shadow Minister for Parks and the Environment was reluctantly accepted by Rebecca White.

"It is with great sadness and reluctance that I accepted Member for Huon, Dr Bastian Seidel's resignation," said Ms White.

"His departure is not just a loss to the Labor party but

to the Parliament and the people of Tasmania.

"I understand Bastian's frustrations with the party and it is terrible that as a consequence of the events of the past few months Labor has lost someone of his credibility, calibre, dedication to the community and who has so much to offer public life in this state.

"Both before and during his political career, Bastian has made a significant contribution to public policy and I want to acknowledge and thank him for the huge amount of work he did to prepare and present Labor's health policies at the most recent election and for his hard work during the campaign.

"We will miss his thoughtful contributions and I wish him and his family well as they look towards the future," Ms White concluded.

upon driving into the park at Dru Point and is a space designed for contemplation.

The plants, all Tasmanian natives, were selected by Kingborough Council and purchased from Redbreast Plants in Margate.

They include last year's flourishing line of black gums, *Eucalyptus Ovata*, planted next to the path leading down to the Aboriginal Reconciliation Garden and the waterfront.

The black gum provides a food source and habitat for the Swift Parrot, a threatened species which breeds only in Tasmania.

Last year's planting marked the 100th anniversary of the Bahai Faith's arrival in Australia and was organised with Bridget Jupe, Natural Areas Interpretation Officer at Kingborough Council, who also coordinated the planting on the day.

Smoke alarm saved lives in Margate

Five fire crews attended a blaze at Nierinna Road, Margate on Saturday, August 21.

Both volunteer and career fire fighters from Margate, Snug, Kingston, Sandfly and Hobart attended the site, which was already fully alight upon arrival, at approximately 8pm.

Fortunately for the two occupants, they were able to escape the home without injury, although the mostly timber structure was quickly and completely destroyed by the fire.

After a thorough investigation on the morning of Sunday, August 22, Regional Fire Investigator Tim McKay determined the cause of the fire was an electric blanket which started the fire in the main bedroom.

Mr McKay credited a working smoke alarm with saving the lives of the occupants and also encouraged the public to ensure all household appliances, including electric blankets, are in good working order and inspected regularly for defects.

"Mr Winter should be committing to match these accelerated commitments in his Budget reply, if he makes one. "The Tasmanian Government's priority for the Kingborough region is to help to meet increased demand for essential services, especially in our health system and priority infrastructure," Minister Ferguson concluded.

The Budget lists the following funding for the Kingborough and Huon regions:

- \$10 million for Stage 2 of the \$30 million Kingston Health Centre upgrades,
- \$3 million for improvements at the Hastings Thermal Pool,
- \$1 million to upgrade the Dover Medical Centre and \$300,000 for a new helipad,
- \$18.6 million for the \$60 million Algoa Interchange and duplicate the Kingston Bypass from Algoa Road to the Huon Highway,
- \$26.6 million for six new Child and Family Learning Centres statewide, including Kingborough,
- \$1.75 million towards \$3 million upgrades to the Cockle Creek Camping area and access*,
- \$250,000 for upgrades to the Kingborough Basketball stadium,
- \$150,000 to upgrade the Huonville Oval for the Huonville Lions Football Club,
- \$50,000 for a feasibility study for expansion of netball facilities at Kingborough Sports Centre,


