

Wanted: federal watchdog

Australians across the country overwhelmingly want a national anti-corruption watchdog that can hold public hearings and act on whistle-blower complaints.

The findings, released on September 8, come from research commissioned by the Australia Institute and was conducted across numerous federal electorates during August.

The *Kingborough Chronicle* wrote to independent, Green, Labor and Liberal party representatives regarding the findings and asked why Australians don't have a national anti-corruption watchdog.

Federal Independent Member for Clark, Andrew Wilkie MP was scathing of the Government's inaction.

"It's been more than 1000 days since Prime Minister Scott Morrison and his then Attorney-General, Christian Porter, promised to establish a federal anti-corruption authority," noted Mr Wilkie.

"Since then, the Government has put forward a half-baked proposal for an Independent Commission Against Corruption.

"But it's worse than useless, creating the weakest watchdog in the country with hearings for all MPs and public servants to be held behind closed doors, no transparency on findings and penalties for whistleblowers.

"Just what do they have to hide?"

"That's what the community is understandably asking, because any half-decent government would see the sense in having a first-rate corruption-busting body.

"Late last year I supported my crossbench colleagues in putting forward a Bill that would introduce an anti-corruption body with wide-ranging powers, but it has not been supported by the Government or the Opposition," noted Mr Wilkie.

"The only way we are going to see confidence in governance restored in this country is for the Government and Opposition to work together and quickly set up a watchdog with teeth."

Tasmanian Liberal Senator, Eric Abetz said integrity in public administration is vital to all good governance.

"The only issue is how it is best achieved," said Mr Abetz.

"A draft Bill was presented to the Government for circulation in December 2020.

"Since then, quite understandably, COVID has taken precedence.

"Setting the balance right and not denying people their legal rights is vital with any such body.

"The real excesses of such bodies have been exposed in NSW, especially where the courts have needed to intervene, but not before reputations and careers have been trashed.

"Getting it right is, therefore, vital and that is what we will be concentrating on," Mr Abetz concluded.

The Greens elected representatives have a bill to establish a federal Independent Commission Against Corruption that has passed the Senate, and which they said could be brought on for debate in the Lower House immediately "if the Government stopped blocking its passage".

Huntingfield Stage 1 open for comment

The Development Application for the first stage of the controversial housing development in Huntingfield was publicly advertised on September 11.

Public submissions on the proposed development, located at 1287 Channel Highway, Huntingfield, close on October 1.

The first stage proposes 218 residential lots, one commercial lot, 13 road lots, public open space and associated infrastructure works, including sewer pump station, stormwater and road works.

The applicant, the Department of Communities Tasmania, sent an email to the *Kingborough Chronicle* on September 17, that stated "most" of the first stage residential lots will be available to purchase for new homes.

"We encourage you to review the application documents and use the statutory consultation period to provide further feedback to the proposal," stated the Department of Communities Tasmania, Housing Projects Team.

The Department of Communities also noted the unresolved issue of a slip

lane, deemed by Kingborough Council to be a necessary addition to the associated, and recently approved, Channel Highway roundabout at Huntingfield.

"You may also be aware that the development application for the roundabout was approved early in July," stated the Department of Communities Tasmania, Housing Projects Team.

"We are working with the Kingborough Council to resolve outstanding legal issues related to this approval however we expect to advertise the tender for construction works for the roundabout in October."

Land tax hikes in Kingborough

Dear Editor,
Tasmania's land tax structure was built for another time when houses were comparatively cheap and the bills manageable.
Today, the land tax picture in Tasmania is very different, it's unsustainable, worsening housing affordability and in urgent need of attention.
Looking at the national picture, Tasmania is a complete outlier, with everyday Tasmanians who have small land holdings often paying quadruple what our mainland friends do for the same land value.
For example, if you hold \$500,000 of taxable land in any other state, the most you'll pay in land tax is \$780 per year, but in Tasmania, it's \$3475.
If you hold \$750,000, the highest bill you'll cop elsewhere is \$2000, at home here in Tasmania, it's \$7225.
Yes, the property has grown in value.
The issue is that land tax bills come in every year and the State Revenue Office won't accept an IOU until the property is sold.
An urgent review of Tasmania's land tax system is overdue.
Tasmania's extreme and outdated land tax system is hurting everyone.
Many shack owners will struggle to keep their property, landlords will be forced to absorb the costs or pass the additional cost on to tenants through rent increases.
The motivation and ability to increase rents as a result of a huge land tax shock is high.
When landlords open bills that have doubled, many will increase the rent accordingly and as demand is so great, the market will be forced to pay it.
Kingborough residents would be wise to brace for land tax increases as fresh valuations roll out across the municipality next year.
From what we have already seen, increases of 30 per cent are common, with many going much higher.
The good news is, there are options.
Other states, like NSW, are already well down the track of overhauling their land tax and stamp duty structure, recognising that there are fairer and more equitable ways of ensuring that the Government has the revenue it needs.
Tasmania needs to urgently start what will be a lengthy but inevitable process as the status quo is not an option.

Public consultation for Dynnyrne 5th lane, really?

Dear Editor,
I, like many of the Dynnyrne Road community, have recently navigated my way through the Tasmanian Government's online "Public Consultation" website, to provide feedback on the proposed Dynnyrne fifth lane and Davey and Macquarie streets "improvements".
It was far from a salutary experience.
We have had a jaundiced view about the sincerity of the State Government's commitment to proper community consultation, at our last meeting with Minister Ferguson on June 30, we were told whatever came out of the public consultation would make no difference to the project going ahead because "it isn't a popularity contest".
On closely examining the online "survey", it is quite obvious it has been designed to give the State Government the answer it wants.
Nothing makes this clearer than Question 12, on the second page of the survey.
How can anyone not strongly support statements such as: 12 (1) "Improved travel times and reliability for private vehicles carrying three or more occupants, buses, taxis, motorbikes, and emergency service vehicles"; or 12 (2) "Support for a greater uptake of public transport and car-pooling"; and, interestingly, the most misleading, 12 (5) "Additional lane to accommodate transit lane traffic into Macquarie Street at the Southern Outlet/Macquarie Street/Davey Street intersection".
That clearly does not translate to support for the project to extend the current bus lane southward at the cost of people's homes.
In fact, if the project implied in question 12(5) was undertaken from the northern end of the existing dysfunctional bus lane, it would cure the intersection problem without destroying people's homes.
It is not rocket science to see that the on-line tick-box responses will be statistically analysed to generate the pre-determined outcome the State Government has designed the feedback platform to give.
This is not public consultation, merely a box-ticking exercise, in both the literal and pejorative senses of that term.

Blackmans Bay Primary School Parents and Friends Association's main priority is enabling students learn and grow with the tools they need.

Thousand days, no corruption watchdog

Greens Senator for Tasmania, Peter Whish-Wilson said "Governments of all stripes push back against corruption watchdogs because they're terrified of what they may find."

"People have watched the Government get more brazen, cocky and corrupt, all while the hopes of a federal ICAC get dashed."

"One thousand days after promising Australians an anti-corruption body, this Government has nothing to show for it but deeply flawed legislation trapped in an endless cycle of review."

"It took 10 years of pressure by the Greens and civil society groups to get the government to accept the need for a corruption watchdog, but the PM is still spinning his wheels."

"Since they made that promise 1000 days ago, the Senate has passed my National Integrity Commission

Bill, but the Government has refused to allow it to be debated in the House.

"Perhaps that's not surprising given that 12 of the 23 current members of his Cabinet have been implicated in integrity scandals."

"We need to clean up politics so we can be sure that politicians are working in the public interest, not the interests of their donors and their re-election campaigns."

A committee of retired judges and anti-corruption specialists prepared design principles for a national anti-corruption body in 2017.

The distinguished National Integrity Committee designed a well-resourced independent body, with broad jurisdiction, strong investigative powers of a Royal Commission and the ability to hold public hearings.

The body was designed to have oversight of federal

public administration and the committee was supported by 41 of their colleagues, however, the Government model does not use their recommendations.

Federal Liberal Senators Jonathon Duniam and Senator Wendy Askew stated the Government is currently considering submissions and will introduce legislation this year but did not explain the years of delay.

"The Morrison Government has committed to establishing a National Integrity Commission and will introduce legislation this year," stated Senators Duniam and Askew.

"It is important to get this Bill right and have an effective body, rather than try and score political points for short term political gain."

"The Government is currently considering hundreds of submissions as part of the consultation process to establish an Integrity Commission."

Federal Labor Member for Franklin, Julie Collins MP reinforced the lack of action and inadequacy of the Government's proposal to date.

"It has been more 1000 days since Scott Morrison promised the Australian people a national anti-corruption commission," said Ms Collins.

"More than 1000 days later, nothing has happened."

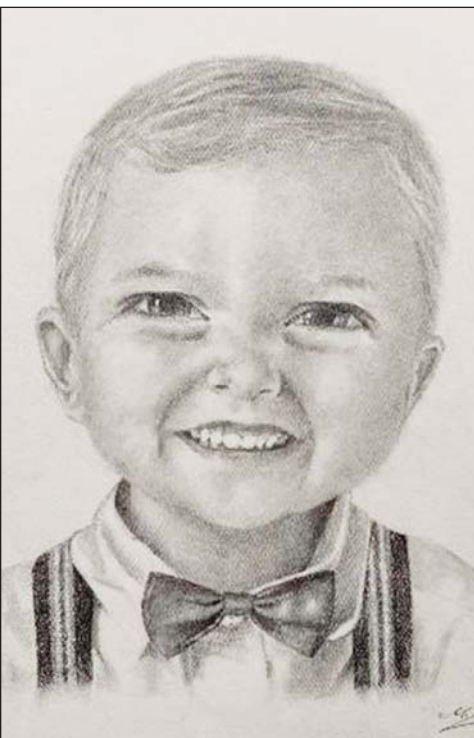
"Mr Morrison has not even brought a bill before the Parliament."

"All we've seen is an exposure draft which was so badly drafted, the Centre for Public Integrity said that if it ever became law it would be the weakest watchdog in the country."

"This is a government that lives in fear of accountability and what a powerful, independent, and transparent anti-corruption commission would reveal."

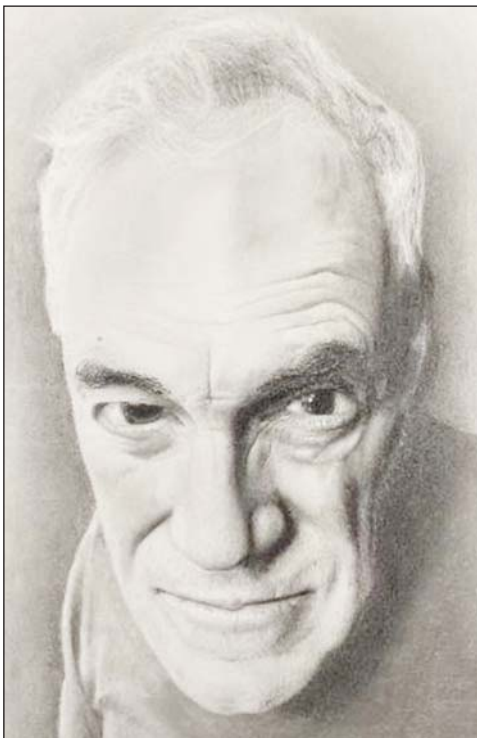

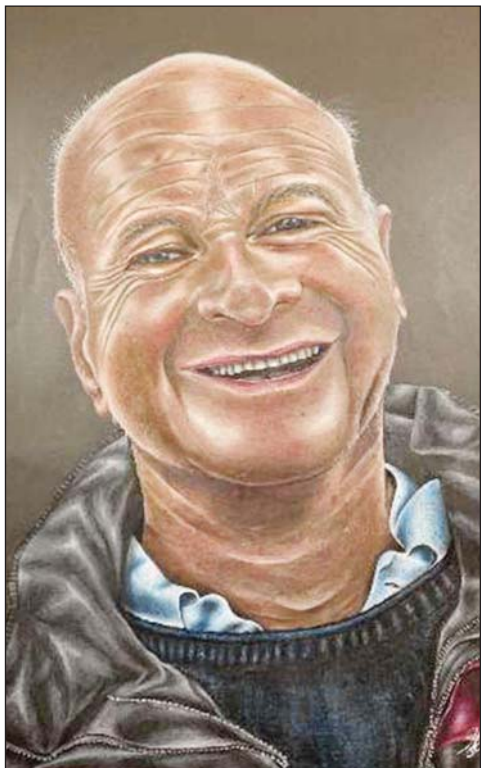

The Kingston Summerleas intersection with the Huon Highway to the Lesley Road turn-off is a particularly deadly stretch of road for wildlife that a local group wants to improve.

A small but growing group of people are trying to improve this including Ruth Waterhouse.

"I know that I cannot be alone with my feelings of sadness, frustration and outrage at the sheer number of innocent creatures that have lost their lives on this small but deadly section of road," said Ruth.

"I hope to work together as a community with a common goal, to limit and mitigate these needless deaths."

On Ruth's facebook page she asked for the community to share ideas and to be creative with solutions.

"I also wish this to be a place (Facebook page) of hope and joy where I will introduce you to the orphans in my care," said Ruth.

"I will tell you their stories, what to do if you come across injured or orphaned wildlife and share info and tips about how to live with and enjoy the amazing wildlife we all share our lives with."

"I felt compelled to do something, so I designed signs and a marker to highlight the animal deaths."

The markers have the same intention as the black road fatality signs that mark the spot on the road where someone has died from a road accident.

"The response from most people has been encour-

aging and it has been over a week with no new deaths," said Ruth.

"With the help of volunteers from the community the "T" markers have been placed with flowers for extra symbolism."

Housing crisis goes from bad to worse

Housing Minister, Michael Ferguson has revealed through budget estimates the extreme extent of Tasmania's housing crisis.

Shadow Housing Minister, Ella Haddad said it was clear housing remained the lowest priority for the State Government.

"Today, Minister Ferguson admitted that in the year 2019/20, there were 15,600 times that Tasmanians were turned away from emergency shelters across the state," Ms Haddad said.

"This is a simply breathtaking number, and as the housing waitlist blows out beyond 4,000 it is clear not enough is being done to fix the catastrophic crisis our state is in."

Ms Haddad said Minister Ferguson was following in the footsteps of failed former Housing Minister, Roger Jaensch.

"The legacy of this government will be its lack of action in housing."

"Minister Ferguson has taken the torch from Minister Jaensch and continued the legacy of ensuring housing is not a priority for this government."

"While Tasmanians continue to find it more and more challenging to put a roof over their head, this government fails to act."

"Minister Ferguson needs to take real action to fix the Housing crisis, another year of talking will get us nowhere."

Could a wheelchair user enjoy everything you've got to offer?

ParaQuad Tasmania is a not-for-profit association and the peak body for Tasmanians with spinal cord injury and physical disability.

It produces the www.wheeliegoodguide.com.au, which lists accessible accommodation, recreational activities, events, parks and reserves and transport options around the state.

It's a tool specifically aimed at wheelchair users who need a quick access guide to places to stay and things to do that are accessible and welcoming.

ParaQuad's Access Coordinator, Richard Jones, has visited many of the sites in the guide.

"All the accommodation sites listed in the guide have been personally tested and assessed by a wheelchair user," Richard said.

"We list the features of each, like parking and access to the room or unit, and other things like bathroom additions that make life easier."

Other listings for attractions, parks and reserves let potential visitors know if there are paths as opposed to steps, accessible toilets, and where wheelchair users

can easily go, or not.

"It's so important that businesses and attractions are inclusive, not just for wheelchair users, but for anyone with mobility issues, and even parents with prams," Richard added.

Inclusion in the guide is a smart move too, as it's used by Tasmanians and people from interstate who are planning a trip.

Kingborough Council's Access Committee Chair, Paula Wriedt is encouraging people with mobility issues to use the Wheelie Good Guide.

"This is an excellent resource," said Cr Wriedt.

"I really encourage businesses in Kingborough to get on board to help promote accessible tourism."

"We want businesses to remove barriers and actively welcome people with mobility aids."

"I'm hoping the Wheelie Good Guide can grow to be an important reference for promoting business inclusiveness throughout Kingborough."
