# Conversing with kids campaign launched

Inspiring conversational ideas to engage children may be just the thing parents and grandparents need right now as they embark on the school

The Department of Education has developed a campaign titled Let's Talk, as part of the Tasmanian Government's Literacy Plan for Action 2019-2022.

Let's Talk aims to encourage parents and carers to spend more time talking to their children and young people, in a life typically challenged by busy schedules, screen time distractions and, perhaps, teenagers reluctant to talk.

The campaign material includes posters and stickers containing 'Talk Ideas', as prompts, to stimulate conversation and provide inspiration.

The campaign highlights that short conversation every day, can make a big difference to the development of listening, literacy, thinking and learning skills, leading to better understanding of one another and the world.

Conversations help young people to learn words to describe their thoughts and express feelings, ask guestions, make friends and share stories.

Kingston High School's Year 7 students participated in the development of the program, providing ideas and

The students were given the opportunity to test the final products during the official campaign launch at the school on Thursday, September 16.

Testing the 'Talk Idea' "What's a good food combo?," student Millie Nemeth responded she'd tried dipping her chips into a chocolate sundae.

Student Esther Thomasson responded her preferred combo is watermelon with sugar sprinkled on the top. Verity Briton recommended a sausage in bread with

# Public oral health hits a nerve

Public oral health became a sore point for the Tasmanian Government last week when the Opposition's Shadow Health Minister, Anita Dow MP, highlighted the ballooning list of around 18,000 people, waiting for an average of two years for dental services.

Ms Dow called on the State Government and Health Minister, Jeremy Rockliff MP to urgently address the situation, calling for long-term funding, workforce recruitment and improved access for the public.

Ms Dow said Tasmanians experiencing poor oral health continued to suffer under the current system.

"The dire situation in Tasmania when it comes to accessing public oral health services is simply shocking," Ms Dow stated via a media release on September 22.

"It is clear the oral health system is in crisis, with patients having to wait an average of two years to get an appointment. "Currently there are almost 18,000 Tasmanians on the public oral health waiting list and today we have learned the full cost of what these delays to dental treatment mean for the overall health and wellbeing of our communities.

"We have heard of Tasmanians who are choosing to completely remove their teeth, rather than enduring the cost of addressing the problem or waiting on the ballooning public oral health waitlist.

"Poor oral health leads to poorer health outcomes for Tasmanians and puts pressure on the whole health system. "Dental problems are the most common reason for preventable hospital admissions."

Ms Dow said the State Government's budgeted increase in funding was welcome but much more is required to prevent further deterioration of public oral health and improve access to dental services no matter where people live.

According to the Department of Health website, Kingston Dental Clinic is the only Oral Health Services Tasmania dental clinic in Kingborough, however it is listed as a 'children and teens only' clinic.

Oral Health Services clinics treating adults in southern Tasmania are listed in Rosny Park, New Town and Glenorchy.

The Kingborough Chronicle wrote to the Health Minister on September 22, seeking clarification regarding access to the major public dental clinics for people based in Kingborough.

Minister Rockliff replied on September 23, stating local public dental patients were referred by Oral Services Tasmania to local private dental practices.

"Oral Health Services Tasmania contracts a private dentist in Kingston and private dental prosthetists in Kingston, Margate and Huonville who provide services to public patients on referral," replied Minister Rockliff.

The Kingborough Chronicle also requested confirmation of the number of people on the waiting list in southern Tasmania and average waiting periods for appointments.

"As of August 31, there were 6255 people waiting for general care in southern Tasmania and 189 people waiting for dentures," confirmed Minister Rockliff.

"The COVID-19 pandemic has had a detrimental effect on public dental service delivery nationally.

"The 2021-22 Tasmanian Budget includes \$5 million for an additional 20,000 dental procedures.

"The Government has also implemented a dentist and oral health therapist recruitment campaign and will introduce a graduate program, starting in January to secure the dental workforce going forward."

#### Why build fifth lane on Southern Outlet?

Dear Editor

Everybody in southern Tasmania knows that Hobart has a major problem with traffic congestion.

It is therefore unbelievable that the State Government proposes to build a fifth lane on the Southern Outlet to provide even more vehicles with quicker access to the city to block up the streets.

And, of course, to do this, a swag of houses need to be demolished which will exacerbate the State's dire housing shortage.

There are far better transport solutions available that can deliver better outcomes and don't require a capital cost that could top \$100 million.

Circular Economy Huon (CEH), a community group in the Huon Valley, believes Tasmania's transport system can be improved.

This can be achieved without bankrupting the State with unnecessary infrastructure projects.

Our group's proposed solutions have the potential to reduce in the total number of vehicles on our roads and will also reduce greenhouse gas emissions from ground transport, currently over a million tonnes per year in Tasmania. Our current transport system is outdated and extreme-

Most car journeys are made with only one person, even when most vehicles can carry five.

Only seven per cent of people use buses to travel to work. Cars sit, unused for over 90 per cent of the time and take up valuable space parking in the city.

We should not let this continue.

There are better and cheaper ways of solving the congestion problem, which would free up scarce capital to be spent on health, housing and other areas where there are severe funding shortfalls.

Congestion is far less of an issue during school holidays

when traffic volumes are down by around 10 per cent.

If the number of vehicles entering Hobart could be reduced by at least 10 per cent we would be well on the way to solving congestion.

The solution to addressing congestion, greenhouse gas emissions and inefficiencies associated with transport is simple. Increase the occupancy of vehicles and facilitate active

A bus that carries 40 people could reduce the number of single-passenger cars by the same number.

Likewise, the number of cars can be dramatically reduced if each car carries four or five people.

To encourage this shift, one of the existing lanes on the Southern Outlet should be reserved for high occupancy vehicles.

This can be done now.

We need to develop attractive alternatives to using our own private cars.

Buses, at least those operated by TassieLink from the Huon, are warm and comfortable and have courteous drivers. But there are problems to be addressed.

There is a lack of frequency on some routes; fares from distant locations are too expensive; some bus stops have limited access and no parking; many bus stops have little protection from the weather and are shoddy.

But there are positives such as not having to concentrate on driving or finding a parking space in an endlessly winding multi-storey carpark, and ability to read or respond to emails while travelling.

Many other jurisdictions around the world have well organised and functioning ride-share systems.

Informally, these operate already between friends and co-workers in Tasmania. But with a small injection of capital, this form of trans-

port could become more utilised.

Car sharing is another way to maintain mobility. The mystery around the proposed fifth lane is knowing

why it is being seriously considered. Surely it is logical to make better use of our existing vehi-

cles rather than spending an enormous amount of money to shift the problem down the road into central Hobart? Circular Economy Huon is keen for residents south of

Hobart to comment on the Southern Outlet plan so that the Government considers a range of workable options before resorting to building a fifth lane and knocking down houses in Dynnyrne.

That letter to the editor makes false statements concerning the subdivision of the Spring Farm Estate by Mr Josef Chromy's JAC Group.

- The JAC Group has never owed Kingborough Council \$353,000.00;
- Kingborough Council in fact held bonds worth \$207,100.00 in lieu of public open space from the developer;
- The JAC Group did in fact lodge a development application and paid an application fee to Kingborough Council for a pathway at Spring Farm Estate; and
- in its letter to Council dated 6 September, the reason given by the JAC Group for withdrawing its offer to build the pathway at Spring Farm Estate was because "Council officers have... recently sought to change the path design and were seeking a level of additional detail not required in their own DA-2021-305 proposed for North West Bay River Track."

The statements contained in the letter of Mr Bain were wrong and defamatory.

The Kingborough Chronicle unreservedly and unconditionally withdraws those statements and apologises to Mr Josef Chromy OAM for the hurt and offence caused to him by reason of the publication.

# Roundabout to inform **CBD** transformation

Kingston's CBD will be transformed into an attractive, vibrant and more accessible destination with wide, leafy green walkways, outdoor dining and slower traffic.

Upgrades to the section of Channel Highway that runs through central Kingston are to commence in mid-2022. In preparation, Kingborough Council will be trialling a temporary roundabout at the intersection of Channel Highway and Hutchins Street, for at least a four-to-six-

Council will be collecting data on pedestrian movements, traffic flows and speeds, to inform the final configuration of the Channel Hwy upgrade.

week period, commencing this week.

There will also be a temporary pedestrian refuge islands, signage and line marking installed.

Kingborough Mayor, Paula Wriedt said the upgrades would create a more welcoming and accessible shop-

"The community have told us that they want Kingston to be a healthy and vibrant centre of the municipality," Cr Wriedt said.

"As a council, we want to transform Kingston's CBD with leafy walkways and greener areas that are connected physically and visually to the natural surroundings.

"To do this we will be upgrading the main road with wider footpaths for pedestrians and outdoor dining, installing more plantings, slowing traffic down, improving cycling access and supporting the use of public transport with appealing infrastructure.

"By upgrading the CBD in Kingston, council aims to support the creation of local jobs and attract further investment for Kingborough, diverting people having to travel to Hobart for shopping."

## Sandfly intersection completed

Motorists travelling along the Huon Highway in the past week may have noticed that construction works on the Sandfly Road intersection are now

Works included the construction of a wide and elongated median strip to enable traffic entering, exiting or crossing the intersection at Sandfly Road to wait for gaps in highway traffic.

The new median strip caters for buses and trucks up to 19 metres long.

A left turn slip lane has been added from Sandfly Road south onto the highway heading to Huonville.

A new deceleration lane takes traffic slowing down to turn left into Sandfly Road towards Longley out of through-traffic on the Highway.

The intersection upgrade included measures to increase car parking and improve safety for pedestrians, those using bus services along the highway, and

A previous gravel car park for seven cars has been replaced with a sealed car park for 12 cars, including a disabled car space.

A fenced footpath links the car park to the southbound bus stop and to a pedestrian crossing leading to the northbound bus stop on the other side of the highway.

A dedicated crossing has also been provided for cyclists and lighting improvements have been completed.

The project had attracted criticism from local residents in an article published in The Mercury on August 25, including that the number of car parking spaces was

The \$6.4 million project was jointly funded by the Australian and Tasmanian Governments, with the Australian Government committing \$5 million from its COVID-19 infrastructure stimulus package and the Tasmanian Government providing \$1.4 million.

A draft Bill aimed at reducing reduce levels of family violence in Tasmania is now available for public comment.

The Family Violence Reforms Bill 2021 amends the existing legislative framework and aims to improve the way the justice system deals with perpetrators of family violence.

This includes the creation of a new 'Serial Family Violence Perpetrator' Declaration for serious and repeat offenders, as well as a series of further amendments to improve the operation of the family and sexual violence legislative framework.

The serial family violence perpetrator declaration framework will ensure that perpetrators who repeatedly commit family violence offences against a single partner or multiple and successive partners are appropriately identified, in recognition that this behaviour presents a high risk of repeated and escalating offending.

The declaration will be recorded on the perpetrator's criminal record, and importantly will restrict their ability to possess firearms, while also being considered as an aggravating factor at sentencing for any subsequent family violence offences committed.

It will also allow the courts to take further steps regarding orders relating to supervision and rehabilitation, as well as behavioural change program participation or electronic monitoring.

The bill is available for consultation until October 13 and is available for viewing at www.justice.tas. gov.au/community-consultation

# Scouts build for forty-spotted bird

Blackmans Bay Scout Group banded together recently to build wire-meshed feather dispensers in an effort to protect Tasmania's forty-spotted pardalote population.

A research fellow from the Australian National University, Fernanda Alves, recently discovered the endemic and endangered birds were being attacked by a parasitic fly which laid eggs in the birds' nests.

Once made, the dispensers are filled with sterilised chicken feathers treated with an insecticide that targets the parasitic fly.

The feather-filled dispensers are then placed in forest environments, where the pardalotes favourite food, white gums, are present.

The small birds are only found in distinct populations in south-eastern Tasmania, with strongholds on Bruny and Maria Islands and smaller populations in areas including the Tinderbox Peninsula and Southport.

It is hoped the treated feathers will be collected by Kingborough's forty-spotted pardalote population and taken back to their nests.

Ms Alves said the forty-spotted pardalote species has been pushed to the brink of extinction due to the clearing of bushland and now, among other threats, the parasitic fly threatens them.

"The forty-spotted pardalotes are a highly specialised species that rely on white gums *Eucalyptus viminalis* for food," Ms Alves said.

"They build their nests in the hollows of trees combining grass, tree bark and soft material, such as feathers and mammal fur.

"When the chicks hatch the maggots burrow into their skin and feed on their blood.

Because the parasites attack chicks when they are young, the birds chance of survival is small and often the entire brood dies.

"It was really hard emotionally to collect the data, when you are climbing trees to check nests that you know and all you find are dead chicks," commented Ms Alves.

"Inspired by the Galapagos Finches project, I wanted to develop a treatment for this parasite and came up with the idea of a feather dispenser.

Ms Alves built the first wire-meshed feather dispensers for Tasmania's forty-spotted pardalotes and inserted the sprayed feathers.

Ms Alves found the nests that used the sprayed feathers had a 95 per cent survival rate for the chicks, whereas nests which used unsterilised feathers had only an 8 per cent survival rate.

"This was good news for the pardalotes and we wanted to expand the project, which meant building a lot more dispensers before the current breeding season began."

This is where Kingborough Council's Natural Areas Interpretation Officer, Bridget Jupe stepped in to provide the local community connections and resources necessary to get the important job done.

"Fernanda had a lot of dispensers she needed built in a short amount of time," Ms Jupe said.

"I approached the Blackmans Bay Scouts, a group we have been working with for over 10 years on environmental projects, including habitat restoration for the forty-spotted pardalote.

"This group had the skills and interest needed and donated a whole day.

"Guided by Fernanda, the Scouts built more than a hundred dispensers which have been distributed across North Bruny Island."

Blackmans Bay Scout Group's Tammy Webster said the building project involved people of all ages and some dispensers are also now in trees surrounding the Scout Hall.

"It was a joint effort with kids of all ages, even our fiveyear-old Joeys," noted Ms Webster.

"The younger ones helped with cutting the wire and drilling holes, whilst the older ones helped assemble them.

"We had plenty of parents who helped too, which was great.
"With our hall being in a bush setting and plenty of

wildlife around we were delighted to help with this project and have a few dispensers in trees around our hall."

Kingborough Mayor, Paula Wriedt said Kingborough

Council was pleased to have been able to link science and the community together to support the survival of this species. "Recent research on the species, conducted by

Australian National University Fellow, Fernanda Alves, has

confirmed the importance of the Kingborough population to the survival of the species," Cr Wriedt said.

"Fernanda's amazing invention, along with the physical help from the Blackmans Bay Scouts and the wider

help from the Blackmans Bay Scouts and the wider Bruny and Tinderbox communities are such important environmental wins for Kingborough.

"As the insecticide degrades and the dispensers need refilling it will be an ongoing effort by all the participants.

"As a Council, we are really committed to being part of this journey, protecting the Kingborough populations of forty-spotted pardalotes in Tasmania."





