Land tax concerns for Kingborough

Tasmania's land tax structure was built for another time when houses were comparatively cheap and bills were manageable, according to Louise Elliot, President of the Tasmanian Residential Property Owners Association.

Louise said that today the land tax picture in Tasmania is very different, it's unsustainable, worsening housing affordability and in urgent need of attention.

"Looking at the national picture, Tasmania is a complete outlier, with everyday Tasmanians who have small land holdings often paying quadruple what our mainland friends do for the same land value.

"For example, if you hold \$500,000 of taxable land in any other state, the most you'll pay in land tax is \$780 per year, but in Tasmania, it's \$3475.

"If you hold \$750,000, the highest bill you'll cop elsewhere is \$2000, at home here in Tasmania, it's \$7225.

Louise acknowledges that the property has grown in value, however, mentions the issue is land tax bills come in every year and the State Revenue Office won't accept an IOU until the property is sold.

"An urgent review of Tasmania's land tax system is overdue.

"Tasmania's extreme and outdated land tax system is hurting everyone. "Many shack owners will struggle to keep their property,

landlords will be forced to absorb the costs or pass the additional cost on to tenants through rent increases.

Louise warns Kingborough residents to brace for land tax increases as fresh valuations roll out across the municipality next year.

"From what we have already seen, increases of 30 per cent are common, with many going much higher.

"The good news is, there are options, other states like NSW are already well down the track of overhauling their land tax and stamp duty structure, recognising that there are fairer and more equitable ways of ensuring that the Government has the revenue it needs.

"Tasmania needs to urgently start what will be a lengthy but inevitable process as the status quo is not an option," Louise concluded

The Kingborough Chronicle wrote to the State

Government about the concerns for land tax rates.

"Land tax is an important source of funding to the Tasmanian Government," said the Tasmanian Government spokesperson.

"The Tasmanian Government recognises that it is important that land tax arrangements remain contemporary, fair and equitable for those required to pay it.

"That is why we recently legislated changes to land tax thresholds by increasing the tax-free threshold from \$24,999 to \$49,999, and increasing the top tax band threshold from \$350,000 to \$400,000 and reducing the threshold for paying land tax in three instalments from \$1,000 to \$500.

"These changes are estimated to save around 70,000 Tasmanians up to \$613 on their land tax bill.

"It will also mean an additional 4.100 land owners will now pay no land tax in the 2021/22 year.

"The Government has also asked Treasury to provide options on capping significant land tax increases and the introduction of a foreign investor land tax surcharge.

"Consultation with relevant stakeholders are currently

underway in relation to a number of policy and implementation aspects of the surcharge."

Tasmanian Greens Leader and MP, Cassy O'Connor, made the following comments on Tasmania's land tax

"It should also be recognised that, while Tasmania may have a higher rate of land tax for lower value properties, it in fact has the lowest maximum rate," said Ms O'Connor.

"This means that those with a smaller property portfolio may pay a higher rate in Tasmania, but those with a larger portfolio in fact pay a lower rate.

"There has been no (land tax) hike.

"The land tax rate has, in fact, been reduced in this year's State Budget.

"No evidence has been presented that tax increases, following land value adjustments, has impacted renters.

"Rent hikes have occurred consistently prior to land value adjustments occurring.

'This is a red herring, all the evidence suggests that rental rates are increasing because demand outstrips supply," Ms O'Connor concluded.

Channel development 'sugar', a highway to tourism decline

Dear Editor.

The Hobart area is an ideal subject for social physics analysis, being relatively small and has serious topological boundaries.

Historically those who worked in the D'Entrecasteaux Channel coast region lived in the Channel coast region.

The Channel is an agricultural and marine production facility a "contained system".

This changed with the construction of the Southern Outlet. Slowly Kingston became a dormitory suburb for city workers.

There is some kind of formula of human nature that if you make a highway, then human nature will try to fill it to capacity.

This has happened and current proposals to increase flow will be quickly absorbed by large housing develops such as Spring Farm, Whitewater Park and now Huntingfield.

These types of developments on virgin farmland are an "economic sugar hit".

The Huntingfield development will, when fully established, cause a short-term economic boost of around half a billion dollars.

They are addictive to both the private sector and government.

Governments must realise that it is a finite world and in areas such as the Channel, the old simplistic expansionist economics are no longer appropriate and indeed have long-term, damaging effects.

Perhaps a new word should now enter the scene for the Channel, sustainability.

A far more challenging concept of living than simple expansionist economics.

If anything, Kingston, or the Channel does not need any more population but suitable attractive local employment to absorb our current working population and therefore reduce the peak hour load on the Southern Outlet, the goods transport link to the port of Hobart.

I find it hard to believe government town planning has not advised our political decision makers of these basic limitations that we are facing.

Therefore, where political/commercial factors are involved in a physical science analysis, the question must be asked "In who's interest are our political leaders making their decisions?'

One last point when tourism returns, just imagine tourists driving down our Channel of "suburban sprawl"

What a tourist attraction.

I can you tell you from my life in Perth, Western Australia, how quickly this can happen when you deliberately push in population into large virgin land

Higher housing densities compounding the problems on a scarce and expensive Channel resource, our roads.

Be warned suburban development sugar is highly addictive, quickly leading to obesity and severe chronic health conditions.

Family day to replace Middleton Fair

A new event for families is planned for early next year as a replacement for the Middleton Country Fair.

The fair has been the major community event in the Channel region for 30 years.

Due to coronavirus requirements and additional pressure on the event organisers, the long-term future of the fair has been in doubt.

The fair will be replaced with a family-based Community Fun Day on the first Saturday in February, the traditional date for the fair.

Organisers hope the Community Fun Day will be as successful in bringing past and present Channel residents together.

Middleton resident Gloria Lonergan, whom along with a group of volunteers has been a driving force behind

the fair, said maintaining the first Saturday in February as a special day for the community was important.

as a special day for the community was important.

Community input is now invited to ensure the February
6 event has a wide-ranging appeal.

Musical entertainment from local performers, along with special attractions for children will be held in the area around Middleton Community Hall which for years has been the traditional home of the fair.

Organisers said the decision to cancel next year's fair and replace it with a new event had been taken well in advance to avoid confusion and disappointment for the many stall-holders, some of who have supported the fair for years.

The fair has raised thousands for local community projects and had been cancelled twice in the past three years: first because of smoke hazards from bushfires in

the Huon Valley and last year because of COVID.

"The decision to cancel this iconic event is heart-breaking", said Gloria.

"But with so much uncertainty surrounding COVID 19 we felt there was no alternative.

"We would have needed many more volunteers to meet the standards required for public events during COVID."

It is hoped that the Scarecrow Competition, which brings colour and creativity each year with scarecrows dotted along Channel Highway, will continue.

The fair began life as a market in Middleton with stalls and displays of cattle and sheep before becoming an annual event.

It was for a few years known as the Middleton Expo before becoming Middleton Country Fair and one of the most anticipated yearly events in the Channel.

Senator Abetz, who attended the presentation, said he was exceptionally impressed by the service being delivered by CyberUp.

"I took myself along to check out the presentation and see if we were getting value for the taxpayer investment " said Senator Abetz

"I have no doubt CyberUp are doing an excellent job."

Spirited local directs acclaimed classic

Blithe Spirit, Noël Coward's classic farce, is coming to the Playhouse Theatre this October and is directed by local director, Nicholas Lahey.

"I'm a huge fan of Noël Coward's work, as it is clever, colourful and always contains some sort of calamity, plus I'm a sucker for a good ghost story.'

The play is performed by well-known, talented local actors Petr Divis, Fransina Kennedy, Kath Uziallo, Sarah Phillips, Leigh Faulkner, Sandy Velini, and Chloe Harle. Nicholas said it is a stunning cast that has been willing to be silly, yet so smart with the interpretation of the

sharp, witty script. "I can't remember a rehearsal room being so full of positive, genuine laughter and at the same time able to apply serious analysis and skill to develop character and atmosphere."

Originally scheduled for 2020, the show was unfortunately postponed four weeks into rehearsal, in March last year Eighteen months later, with some changes to the original cast, the show is gearing up to open at the Playhouse Theatre on Friday, October 8.

"It is believed that Coward wrote the play in just five days in 1941 as a merry diversion to World War II," said Nicholas.

"History it seems, is almost repeating itself, as we present it to audiences today to escape from our own bleak battle with COVID.

"In its 80th anniversary year, I am hoping Blithe Spirit will continue to resonate with audiences today, due to its cheeky tone and opportunity to escape to another time and spirit filled world."

Blithe Spirit is showing at the Playhouse Theatre, 106 Bathurst Street, Hobart, from October 8 to 23, with evening and matinee shows available.


"Thanks also to the adults who helped supervise and assist the children during the event.

Our Antarctic whaling history

A presentation on Antarctic whaling history is to be delivered by Dr Michael Stoddart, a former chief scientist of Australia's Antarctic science program and former director of the Institute of Marine and Antarctic Studies.

Now retired, Dr Stoddart is keeping busy as a researcher at the Maritime Museum and is due to deliver a whale of a story to locals on Monday, October 11. Hobart's young men were recruited to hunt blue whales in Antarctic waters up until 1932.

The blue whale population is struggling to recover. The talk has been arranged by the Browns River

"Well, it wasn't always like that in the Derwent and in the southern waters with whaling a major industry.


"If you thought whaling out of Hobart Port stopped almost 150 years ago, this talk by Michael Stoddart will provide you with the real story."



Cultural Burning Program provides valuable insights

A Cultural Burning Workshop took place at Garden Island Creek on Tuesday, September 28.

As part of the Tasmanian Government's commitment to cultural burning in Tasmania, the Parks and Wildlife Service has employed three new Aboriginal cultural burning specialists including an Aboriginal Burning Project Officer, to support the development of policy and management of the program along with two specialist Aboriginal Fire Rangers to work with communities to identify potential cultural burn sites.

In addition, to the new Aboriginal Fire Ranger employee roles, the Government also committed \$100,000 in grant funding to ensure the success and delivery of this important program.

The Cultural Burning Grant Funding is to support burning related activities, with funds going towards the provision of equipment, the cost of travel to attend burn locations, along with funding to support cultural burning training.

Jacquie Petrusma MP attended the Cultural Burning Workshop at Garden Island Creek.

"Today I was privileged to attend a Cultural Burning Workshop that was undertaken by the South East Tasmanian Aboriginal Corporation.

"This workshop was an educational exercise, which was also attended by members of the Tasmania Fire Service and the Parks and Wildlife Service.

"The Tasmanian community can learn from Tasmanian Aboriginal people as a result of their deep connection with our land and landscape, including sophisticated land management practices such as cool burning and the important part this has played in Tasmania's culture and history," Minister Petrusma said.

The Tasmanian Fire Service (TFS) has responsibility for the state-wide Fuel Reduction Program, and this event is assisting to educate TFS personnel in Aboriginal cultural

Ten grant applications of a maximum of \$10,000 each have been approved to:

- The Aboriginal Land Council of Tasmania, who were successful in securing 3 grants
- The Karadi Aboriginal Corporation, securing 2 grants
- The melythina tiakana warrana Aboriginal

Aquaculture future deeper offshore

agreed to support a framework to deliver offshore aquaculture in Commonwealth waters off the coast of Tasmania.

Assistant Minister for Forestry and Fisheries and Senator for Tasmania Jonathon Duniam and Tasmanian Minister for Primary Industries and Water Guy Barnett said the joint agreement between the Australian and Tasmanian Governments will help examine the economic, environmental and operational feasibility of offshore aquaculture.

"Currently, aquaculture in Australia is operated in state or territory waters and by moving further offshore, more than three nautical miles, we can harness recent technological improvements and investigate the potential environmental and resource access benefits available from undertaking aquaculture in deeper waters,"

"In 2017, the Australian Government committed to developing arrangements for aquaculture in Commonwealth waters, and this is a significant step towards reaching that goal.

"The work will be led by the Blue Economy Cooperative Research Centre (CRC), an independent not-for-profit company funded under the Australian Government's

"The outcomes of this work won't just be about Tasmania. "This will provide valuable information on the potential for offshore aquaculture for all states and territories.

"Aquaculture is currently worth \$1.6 billion nationally and is growing both here and globally.

"By going offshore, the Australian Government is backing growth towards the \$100 billion 2030 goal. "I couldn't be prouder to be working with the

Tasmanian Government on this project." Huon Aquaculture pioneered offshore farming in Tasmania and has been successfully farming in Storm

A significant amount of research, undertaken over many years, has informed their operations in Storm Bay;

one of the roughest aquaculture farming areas in the "During the five-year implementation phase of the Controlled Growth Strategy, Huon focused on re-engineering every step in the production processes to enable

the forefront of our industry internationally. "Research is and always has been an important intellectual partnership between Huon and external research

The Australian and Tasmanian Governments have providers, and will remain so as Huon is already actively involved in a number of Blue Economy CRC projects," Pene said





Why wait to get help with hearing loss?

Around 3.6 million Australians suffer from hearing

A recent study published in the International Journal of Audiology found that only seven per cent of those who need hearing aids seek help.

Audiologist Nick Modrovich said being told you need a hearing aid can be quite confronting.

"Often people are pushed into getting a test as their family is frustrated," said Nick Modrovich.

"For many clients, the hearing aid signify the first perception of ageing, it can sometimes be the reason why someone may delay getting help for years.

The socio-psychological aspects of correcting hearing loss cannot be underestimated.

In Australia, pensioners are entitled to subsidized hearing aids under the Commonwealth Hearing Services Program. However, a recent independent review found that over half of all eligible people with hearing loss are not actively taking advantage of the services available.

"It is part of the stigma of hearing loss and ageing
