

## Antarctic Division celebrates 40 years

**2021 marks the 40th anniversary of the Australian Antarctic Division's move to Tasmania and the establishment of Hobart as an Antarctic Gateway City in 1981.**

For 40 years now, the Australian Antarctic Division (AAD) has attracted world-class experts from science to policy, polar medicine to operations, to work locally in Tasmania.

To mark this anniversary, celebrations were held at the Tasmanian Museum and Art Gallery in recognition of the role AAD and generations of Antarctic families play in the southern Tasmanian community.

Minister for State Growth, Roger Jaensch attended the anniversary and commented on the achievements of the Australian Antarctic Division.

"Supporting the Australian Antarctic Division to deliver our national Antarctic program is an honour, and provides Tasmania with an opportunity to showcase our capacity to supply quality produce and develop highly specialised equipment, custom-designed for Antarctic conditions," said Minister Jaensch.

The Antarctic Division was established in Melbourne in 1948 as a part of the Federal Government's Department of External Affairs.

In 1973, in a move aimed at promoting regional development and decentralisation, it was proposed the Division be relocated to Hobart.

In April 1981, the newly built AAD headquarters in Kingston was officially opened by HRH Prince Charles.

Since then, Tasmania has grown to support the sector, establishing industries producing specialised equipment, produce and other supplies that support Australia's Antarctic program, as well as several international partner programs.

This growth continues, with the sector contributing \$229.4 million in value to the economy in 2019-20, of which \$158.7 million was spent directly in Tasmania.

The sector also employs nearly 950 people locally, both directly and indirectly.

With October marking the start of the Antarctic season, Hobart is set to become a hive of activity around Macquarie Point and Wharf with the deployment of supplies, equipment and expeditioners to Antarctica and the Southern Ocean.

A new era for the AAD and the broader Australian Antarctic Program will begin in just days, when the nation's new icebreaker *RSV Nuyina*, arrives in Hobart for the first time.

"We thank the Australian Antarctic Division for being part of Tasmania's community and identity, and I wish all expeditioners well for the coming season," Minister Jaensch concluded.

## \$5 million in the pipeline

**A pipeline from the Blackmans Bay Water Treatment Plant to a private golf course development has received \$5 million in Federal funding.**

The pipeline is proposed to travel from Blackmans Bay, eastward across the Derwent River, to South Arm, to deliver water security, according to a media release by Federal Senator, Jonno Duniam on September 30.

However, the media release omits any mention of the words 'golf course'.

"This pipeline will allow water from the Blackmans Bay Water Treatment Plant to be delivered to the South Arm Peninsula for irrigation purposes," Senator Duniam said.

"It will improve the reliability of South Arm's water infrastructure, support agricultural production and help to deliver water security across the region."

The \$5 million in funding was first announced by the Deputy Prime Minister, Barnaby Joyce MP and Senator Duniam in a media release on August 11.

The *Kingborough Chronicle* wrote to Senator Duniam on August 12, requesting a copy of the cost-benefit analysis used by the Government in its decision to fund the pipeline, however we were referred to the golf course developer's generic email address.

"Can Senator Duniam confirm this pipeline is to irrigate the private golf course development at South Arm?"

"What is the total cost of the pipeline?"

"Where is the cost-benefit analysis, showing who will benefit?"

Senator Duniam's office directed the questions regarding the Government's

decision making to the private developer.

"The pipeline will irrigate South Arm, including the golf course," Senator Duniam's office replied.

"Your other questions would be best directed to Arm End."

The *Kingborough Chronicle* wrote to TasWater on September 29 regarding their involvement in the project.

"In line with our Shareholder's Letter of Expectations, TasWater supports economic development within Tasmania," replied a TasWater spokesperson.

"Our involvement is limited to the supply of treated effluent from our Blackmans Bay Sewage Treatment Plant."

The associated costs to the State's Budget is unknown.

# Minister responds to housing crisis

Minister for State Development, Construction and Housing, Michael Ferguson has responded to the Shadow Housing Minister, Ella Haddad's comments in the article "Housing crisis goes from bad to worse", published in the Kingborough Chronicle on September 21.

"It's clear that Ms Haddad was in a different estimated committee to the rest of the world," said Minister Ferguson. "She and I discussed a range of affordability measures that we both agreed should be considered as the Government works to increase supply in the face of a growing population. "While access to affordable housing is a national problem,

Tasmania's strong local economy, and the fact that our state is one of the safest and most desirable places in the world to live, work and raise a family is also contributing.

"The Tasmanian Government recognises the real struggles many Tasmanians are experiencing with their housing situation and is responding with serious action.

"We have made a record investment of \$615 million into the supply of social and affordable housing and homelessness initiatives.

"This is in addition to the Government's \$30 million annual funding of 17 existing Specialist Homelessness Services including Housing Connect Front Door and Support, crisis shelters, brokered accommodation and supported accommodation.

"We are also responding by investing \$2 million to develop a comprehensive Tasmanian Housing Strategy.

"This will investigate all the opportunities available to the State Government to influence the housing market through regulatory systems, strategic land use planning, policies, taxes, subsidies, and capital investment.

"Ultimately, increasing housing supply is the only way to combat rising house prices, get Tasmanians off the housing register and into suitable homes.

"Which is why we are building an extra 2000 new homes

by 2027, on top of the 1,500 already being built over the next three years, bringing the total to 3,500 new homes by 2027 to help our most vulnerable, which includes our record investment to help around 5,000 Tasmanian households out of housing stress or homelessness by 30 June 2023.

"In the last financial year, our Government invested \$90.9 million on capital expenditure for housing.

"In contrast, the last time Labor was in government, they managed to invest only \$28.9 million, one third of what this Government invested last year.

"Labor's unbudgeted plan for housing they took to election this year suggested they would deliver the same number of new homes as this Government, for \$80 million less.

"I was merciful on Ms Haddad by not challenging her to explain this giant policy gap.

"Like so many of Labor's policies, this is an impossible and un-costed pipe dream.

"Unlike Labor, we are making more than empty promises.

"In 2020-21, 99.7 per cent of housing's capital budget was spent.

"This means almost every dollar committed has translated to real world action to assist those facing housing stress," Minister Ferguson concluded.



# A Tapestry of Bruny Island

**Bruny Island author Karen Darby launched the second edition of her book *A Tapestry of Bruny Island Tasmania* at the Lunawanna Appleshed, on Sunday, September 12.**

Utilising a rich collection of extracts, diary entries, radio broadcasts, photographs, artworks and poetry, Karen has woven a vivid history of Bruny Island life during the twentieth century, as experienced, witnessed and recorded by four generations of family members, including a personal account from Karen herself.

Karen said she was encouraged to embark on a second edition of the book, after the first edition, published in 2013, went out of print.

"Many people were asking for a copy of it, so I thought why not," explained Karen.

"The book is a culmination of some years of very enjoyable, and not uneventful, research and of course blood sweat and tears.

"It makes me happy to be told things like 'dad is reading it to mum in the aged care home'."

The reader gains colourful insights into the comings and goings of Bruny Island characters in the mid-1900s, through diarised observations of Karen's paternal grandmother, Katie Jennings.

As a resident of the mariner's cottage at Simpsons Bay jetty, and with a background as a presenter on national radio, Katie Jennings was perfectly positioned to record this period, with grace, humour and flare.

The account describes the various transportation and infrastructure including the local watercraft, school, post and telegraph office and local identities.

The second generation of storytelling is led by Karen's father, Roger Jennings, a former Solicitor-General of Tasmania who began holidaying on the island as a youngster in 1935, fishing and adventuring.

Roger Jennings' account covers the war years, Saturday night dances and sly grog.

Karen Darby continues the tale from the third-generation view, with treasured and delicious memories, including Christmas, berries and jam.

Karen generously embellishes her account with quirky anecdotes.

"Bill King, the baker, also doubled as the local butcher," Karen wrote.

"One obtained eggs from the post office, milk from the school and meat and bread from the pub.

"The postmistress from on the telephone exchange unflinchingly knew where anyone was if they were ever enquired after."

The final chapters in the collection detail the memories and connection to the island as recorded by Karen's sons, Saul and Liam Darby, the fourth generation.

This book is truly a tapestry of Bruny Island, woven from parts of personal and family histories, into a living story of the island and its community, on a journey through time.
