Huntingfield approved

Kingborough Council, sitting as the Planning Authority, has unanimously passed a development application for stage one of a controversial subdivision in Huntingfield.

The major subdivision, proposed by the State Government, was passed at a meeting held on October 25.

In a media release on October 26, Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt said the scale of the development and associated impacts on the local area had caused "heightened concerns" in the community.

"Huntingfield has for a long time been marked for housing," stated Mayor Wriedt.

"Back in the seventies the State Government purchased the land and later rezoned it in 2019 to enable the land to be used for affordable housing.

"Council is aware of the concern in the community, and we are here to make sure that our community is heard at State Government level.

"Council hopes that the Minister for Housing, Michael Ferguson will listen and act on the broad issues raised by the community around access to schools and health care.

"The Minister's willingness to listen was well demonstrated when he promised to build a slip road to ease future congestion at the new roundabout at Huntingfield estate."

"Despite the many concerns surrounding this new development, Council welcomes the prospect of more houses being built in our community.

"We also welcome the strict environmental covenant on keeping cats as well as the significant number of street trees proposed.

"One of the issues raised in the community was the proximity of the area in relation to the Peter Murrell Reserve.

"The Reserve is home to a number of threatened species such as the eastern quoll, eastern-barred bandicoot, Tasmanian devil, forty-spotted pardalote, grey goshawk and swift parrot.

"The cat covenant means that anyone who owns or occupies any of the titles in this stage one, may not introduce or keep domestic cats, unless otherwise approved by the General Manager in writing.

"The developers are also planning to plant a significant number of street trees which will add to the amenity, environment and the ability for the area to reduce heat build-up," stated Mayor Wriedt.

Penguin habitat

Researchers and scientists have collaborated with local ceramic artists to make little penguin nesting modules for threatened colonies of Derwent Estuary.

Fourteen clay works were presented and sold in an exhibition held at the Kingborough Community Hub from October 28 to 31.

IMAS, Birdlife Tasmania and the Derwent Estuary Penguin Advisory Group scientists and researchers worked with six artists and two emerging artists creating nesting modules that embodied the design features in the scientist's brief.

The clay works were modelled and fired at The Friends' School.

The exhibition was officially opened on Thursday, October 28, attended by the Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt, Cr Sue Bastone and Cr Amanda Midgeley.

Philanthropists in the local community purchased the 'gift habitat' works in response to the environmental cause.

Prior to being placed in situ, monitoring devices, called iButtons, are to be placed inside the nesting modules to provide temperature and humidity data for the scientists.

Surveillance law overreach is disturbing

Dear Editor,
The 'Identify and Disrupt' amendment to the *Surveillance Legislation and the Crimes Act*, assented September 3, via the *Surveillance Legislation Amendment (Identify and Disrupt) Bill 2021* is legislation that allows the Australian Federal Police (AFP) and Australian Criminal Intelligence Commission (ACIC) to take control of one's computer or internet-based account and change, add to, remove, or copy data. The Bill intends to "introduce data disruption warrants to enable the AFP and the ACIC to disrupt data by modifying, adding, copying or deleting data in order to frustrate the commission of serious offences online."

Whilst a warrant does have to be issued, they only have to apply for one three days after the access had been made. In this time, action can be taken.

On the website, and indeed in the legislation itself, examples of application include child abusers, trafficking rings, terrorist organisations.

However, after these examples, "other crimes" are mentioned. This could include whistleblowers such as the silently prosecuted David McBride, and in a situation where evidence is planted, any anti-government activist.

As three days are allowed for the AFP or ACIC to seek out a warrant, ample time is left for evidence to be planted.

Whilst this was in the works, the mainstream media did not speak a word of it, except Sky News who spoke of it in a positive light.

All media talked about was COVID-19 cases and how Government is "working so hard to fight this deadly pandemic."

I do not mean to digress into conspiracy theories,

however I do not have any trust in our Government and I recommend the people of Kingborough, Tasmania, and indeed the rest of Australia, look at the Government's recent actions in a far more sceptical light than most people do currently.

Defining affordable housing

The *Kingborough Chronicle* asked Minister Ferguson to define affordable housing in monetary terms.

“What is the Minister’s definition of low income households, in monetary terms?”

“What is the “affordable” rent price and purchase price for “low income households”, in monetary terms?”

“The Government’s Affordable Housing Strategy 2015-2025, released in 2015, adopts the below commonly used definitions for affordable housing,” Minister Ferguson replied.

“Affordable housing refers to rental homes or home purchases that are affordable to low income households, meaning that the housing costs are low enough that the household is not in housing stress or crisis.

“Housing stress is defined as the lowest 40 per cent of income earners who pay more than 30 per cent of their gross income on housing costs.

“This is known as the 30/40 rule and is the benchmark measure of housing affordability in the Strategy.

“Shelter Tasmania’s website defines affordable housing in the same way,” continued Minister Ferguson.

“The standard test for affordable housing is that a household in the lower 40 per cent by income should not pay more than 30 per cent of their gross income on housing, known as the 30/40 rule.

“In a broader sense, housing is generally considered to be ‘affordable’ if the household members are not in housing stress after they have paid for their housing, whether renting or buying.

“Housing is unaffordable for a household when paying their housing cost leaves them in housing stress or living in poverty,” Minister Ferguson said.

Meanwhile, Shadow Housing Minister Ella Haddad MP criticised the State Government’s record regarding

housing on October 29.

“The number of Tasmanian families languishing on Tasmania’s historically high social housing waitlist has reached a devastating new record regarding housing under Housing Minister Michael Ferguson,” said Ella Haddad MP.

Ella Haddad MP said the latest government data, released today shows the waiting list has grown to a new record of 4468 families.

“That’s an increase of more than 100 families in just the past month alone,” Ms Haddad said.

“It continues a tragic, heartbreaking trend under this Liberal Government which all Tasmanians can now see simply does not place any priority on housing Tasmanians who need it most.

“Michael Ferguson is known to Tasmanians as a failed Health Minister but now he seems determined to also have the record as the Minister who kept thousands of families out of housing and, at worst, forced thousands to the brink of homelessness.

“The average time to house even the most priority applicants for housing has also blown out to a massive 74 weeks, up from the historic record low of 26 weeks when the Liberals assumed government, that’s almost a year longer for even the most urgent of cases.

“Additionally, the government and Mr Ferguson’s mantra as being a building government is a pitiful, heartbreaking hoax.

“In the past year this Minister has built just 183 new social properties and absolutely no homelessness accommodation,” said Ella Haddad MP.

“When you also consider the number of times requests for emergency accommodation at shelters were turned away jumped from 15,221 in 2019-20 to


18,421 in 2020-21, it’s absolutely clear the Liberals place no priority on housing and homelessness.

“Premier Peter Gutwein cannot allow Mr Ferguson to bungle yet another portfolio.

“There is too much at risk and the Liberals must finally get serious, stop the spin and tell Tasmania what they are going to do to address this debacle.”

Kettering to commemorate Remembrance Day

The tune *The Battle's Over* will be played by The Old Pretenders and Spent Sporrans pipers in Kettering on November 11, to mark Remembrance Day.

The community is invited to gather at the Kettering Community Hall northern carpark at 4:30pm for a march to the cenotaph.

A service will be held at the cenotaph at 5pm, to coincide with the signing of the Armistice in France, early in the morning on the 11th day of November in 1918, ending the war in western Europe.

During the service, Kettering locals will speak about their memories of ancestors.

Another march, accompanied by pipers, will take place after the service.

The Remembrance Day formalities will be followed by a sausage sizzle, tea and coffee organised by Channel RSL Sub-Branch members.

Lin Thompson has shared a photo taken at the Kettering School around 1919-20.

An honour board, in remembrance of past pupils who served in the Great War, can be seen resting against the flag pole.

The same honour board is now found in the Kettering Community Hall.

"Many descendants of people on the honour board still live in Kettering," Lin Thompson noted.

"My great uncle Raymond Keith Pybus was killed in France on the 15th of April 1917.

"He was from Kettering, only 26 years old and not long married."

Lin Thompson said the honour board was presented to the school by the Pybus family in remembrance of past pupils who served in the war, including their son and brother Major Raymond Keith Pybus who is buried in Bapaume cemetery, France.

Lin said the photo had belonged to his mother, Nora Cook.

"Mum's probably in background with the girl guides", said Lin.

The Kettering Remembrance Day tribute began in 2018, when piper Stewart Ims and another piper played pieces on their Great Highland bagpipes at the local cemetery and were overheard by neighbours.

"The tune from 2018, *The Battle's Over* will be playing (again this year)," said Stewart Ims.

"We hope to march to the cenotaph.

"The signing of the Armistice occurred in France at 6am, which is 5pm Australian time."

Each plan is tailored to the individual community to best suit its needs.

Tasmania Fire Service's Bushfire Risk Mitigation Manager, Chris Collins said it was important for people

to be prepared, regardless of whether they choose to stay at their property or leave it.

"Understanding risks and taking steps to mitigate them is important for all members of the community, but especially those living in bushfire prone areas.

"We want to make sure that people are informed, pre-

pared and ready for when a bushfire strikes," Chris said.

There are currently 133 Community Bushfire Protection Plans in place across Tasmania, with nine new plans being developed this year for release prior to the fire season.

"If people can't attend, please make a donation to Kingborough Helping Hands," requested Mrs Pennicott.

Cycling strategy for Kingborough

Kingborough Council has released its new *Cycling Strategy 2021 to 2030* for public consultation.

In a media release on October 26, Kingborough Councillor and Bicycle Advisory Committee Chair, Amanda Midgley said the strategy looked at the growing cycling needs of Kingborough over the next 10 years.

"This is a draft document that outlines the potential for improving cycling in the community," Cr Midgley said.

"It identifies a range of infrastructure upgrades and advocacy actions

that will make Kingborough a better place to cycle around.

Councillor Midgley said the strategy catered for the whole cycling community, in particular trying to attract new cyclists of all ages and abilities.

"The Network Plan looks at the potential for developing networks for all bike riders including cycling tourists as well as occasional bike riders.

"We are a growing municipality in Kingborough, so the more we can improve transport options, the more we can decrease congestion on our streets.

"This strategy outlines projects that Council can use in their pitch for State and Federal funding when it arises.

"I would like to thank the members of Kingborough Bicycle Advisory committee for their input in getting this strategy to the engagement stage.

"We are all looking forward to the feedback from the community."

100 years of Rotary service celebrated

The Rotary Club of D'Entrecasteaux Channel hosted a celebration in October to mark 100 years of Rotary in Australia.

Rotarians met in fellowship to share stories and projects, with catering provided by the Kingborough Bowls Women's Committee.

District Governor Heather Chong said it was important for Rotarians to reflect on their efforts.

"Rotarians are people of action who serve to change lives," said Heather Chong.

"We are so busy working in our communities that we don't always get the chance to come together to celebrate.

"Rotary has evolved as an organisation.

"We have a diverse membership and more women than ever, as you can see.

"100 years of Rotary in Australia is something we are all very proud of."

Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt attended the event and reflected on the efforts of Rotarians, noting Kingborough has the highest level of volunteering in Tasmania.

"Rotarians generate nearly 47 million volunteer hours in a typical year worldwide," noted Cr Wriedt.

"If communities had to pay for the services that Rotary volunteers provide, this is conservatively worth \$850 million a year."

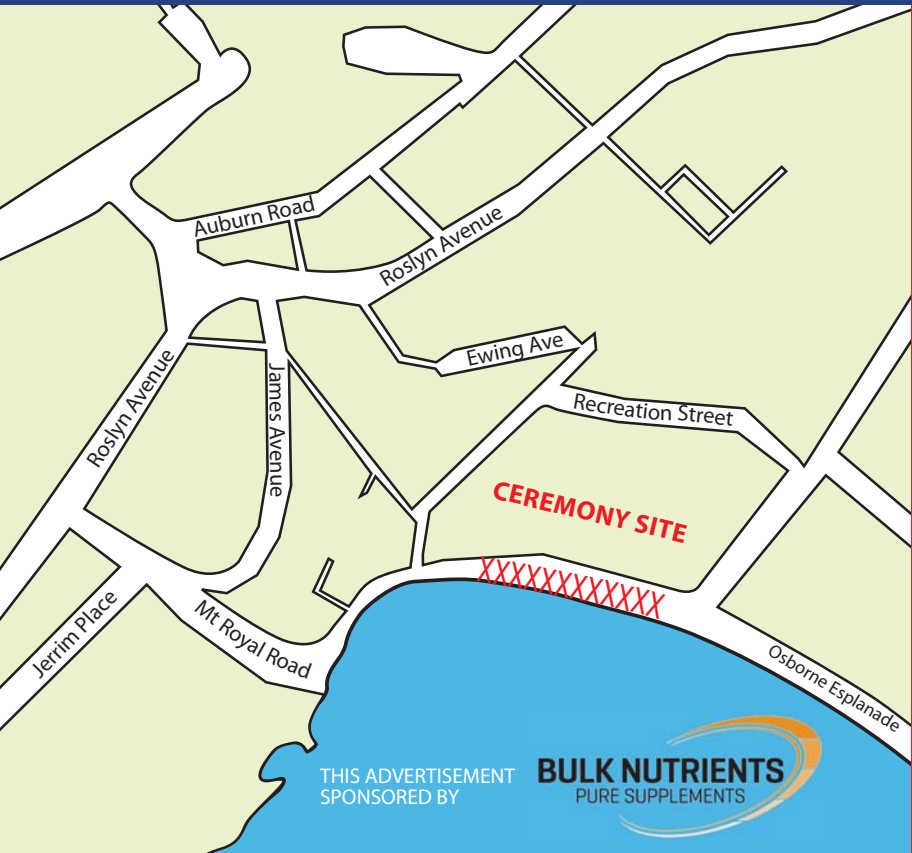

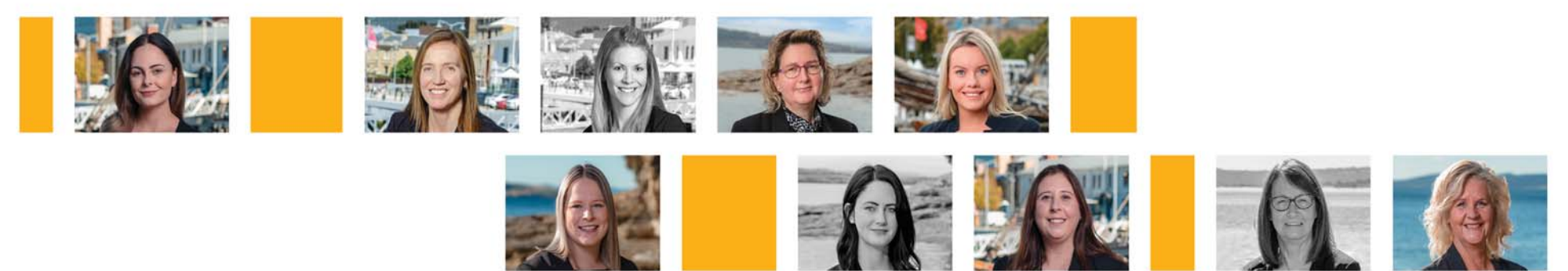

Stroke awareness

The Rotary Club of Kingston recently hosted a talk on the importance of recognising stroke symptoms quickly.

Stroke Ambassador Michael Whittle was the guest speaker.

Michael Whittle, a former CSIRO human resources manager, had spent 20 years in the Australian Navy, joining the service at age 15.

Michael revealed he had had two strokes and one heart attack in recent times.

He advised that stroke was the third leading cause of death in Australia, and one-in-four deaths worldwide follows a stroke.

Michael said one-in-four people will suffer a stroke in their lifetime, with every sixth being fatal.

Michael pointed out that 80 per cent of these deaths are preventable, thus it is imperative that stroke symptoms are recognised quickly.

Symptoms of stroke

- The face - Is it drooped?
- Arms - Can they be lifted without help?
- Speech - Is it slurred?

Should any of these be apparent, call 000 immediately.

Michael Whittle's speech also covered identification of cardiac issues and steps on the road to prevention.

Michael said high blood pressure is the greatest risk to good health and the chief factor in bringing about a stroke or heart attack.

Michael emphasized that what we eat and drink are of prime importance in maintaining a healthy lifestyle and avoiding the perils of stroke or heart attack.

Preventative measures

- Avoiding salt and sugar
- Eat fresh, non-processed food
- Stay active
- Reduce weight
- Walk five kilometres each day
- Only drink alcohol in moderation
- Quit smoking, or (better still) don't even start

The Stroke Ambassador concluded with one, startling statistic.

Around 500 children a year suffer a stroke, including developing babies *in utero*.

Michael thanked the club for the invitation and wished them well in their 50th year of serving the Kingborough Community.

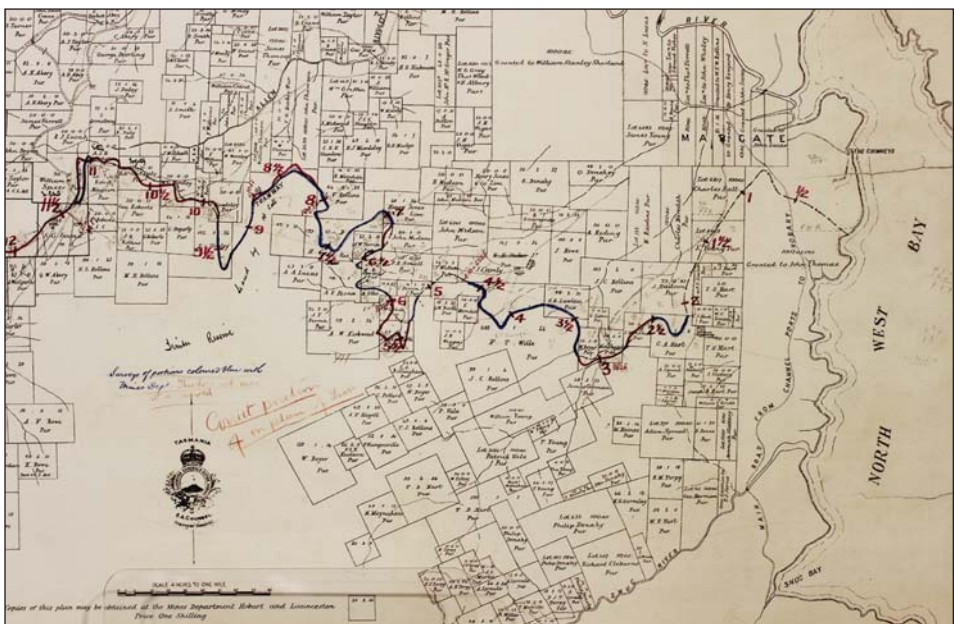
The importance of native habitats in sustaining insect biodiversity and providing a healthy environment will be celebrated visually and practically through this exhibition.

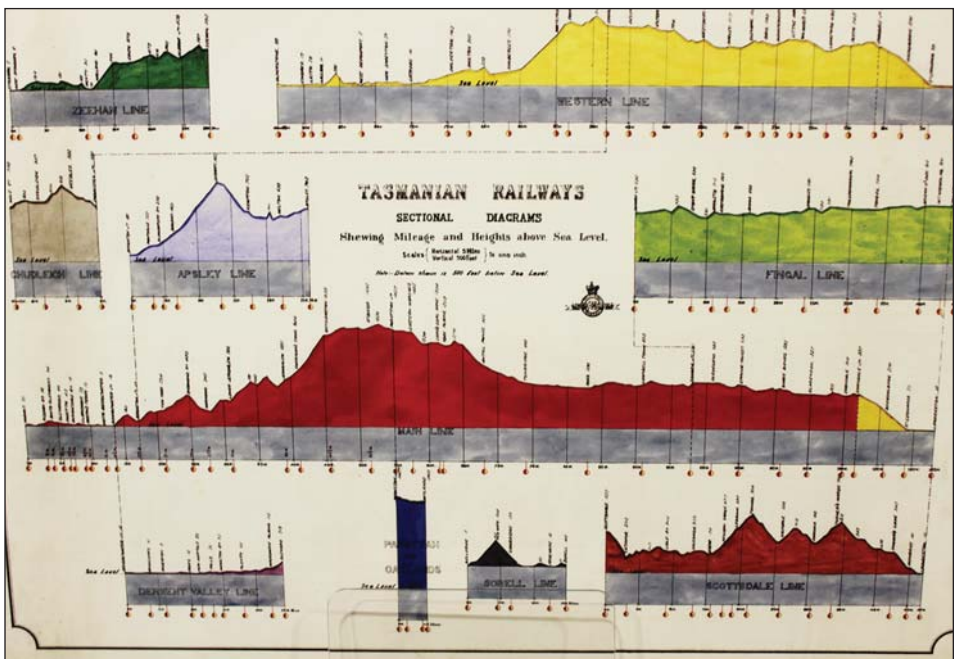

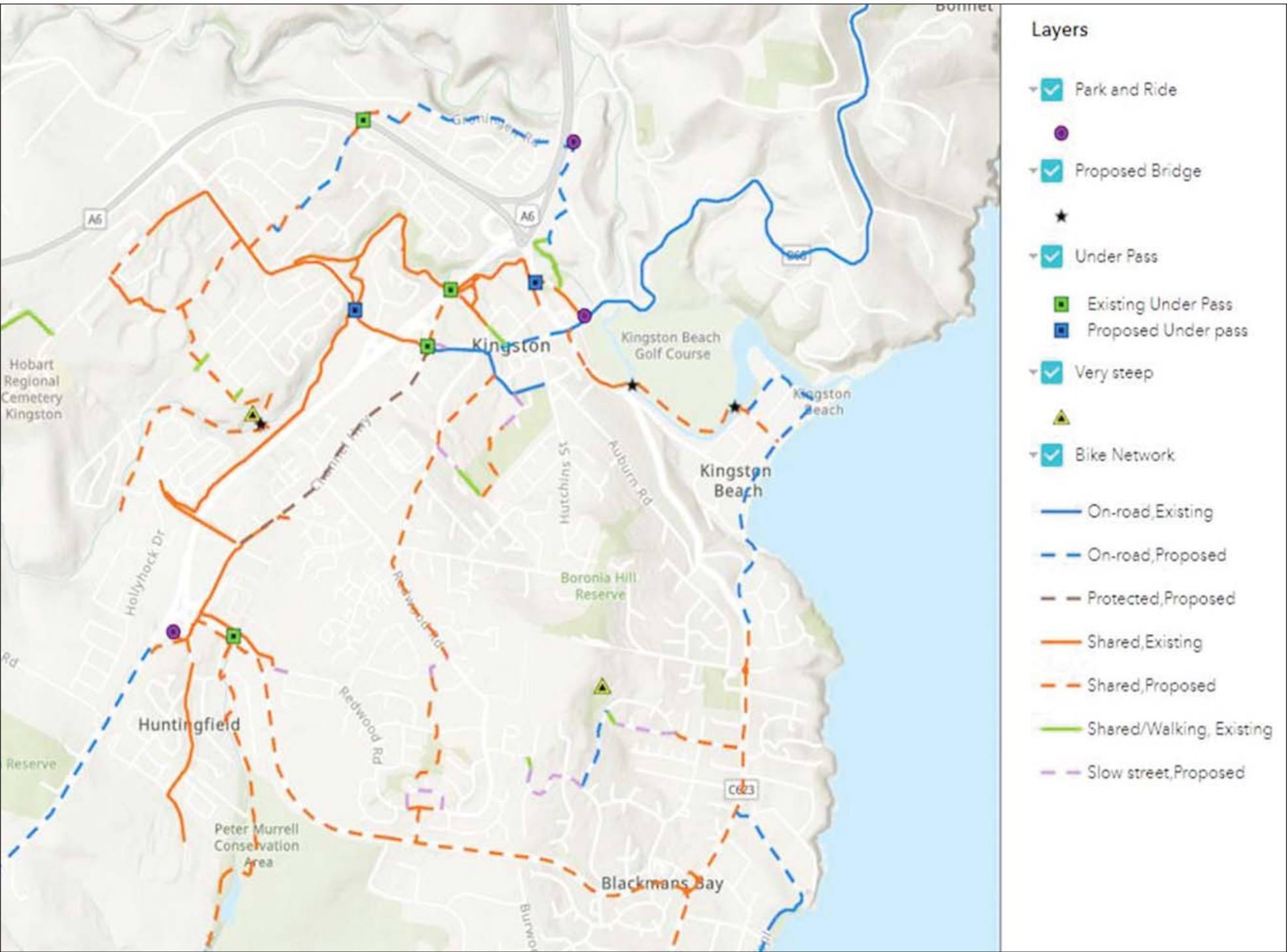

Raingardens treat our stormwater

National Water Week was held in the third week of October to raise awareness around the value of water.

Kingborough Council used the occasion to talk about the role of raingardens in minimising potential pollutants in our waterways.

Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt said the small garden beds are an important part of the municipalities water assets.

"Throughout the municipality Council owns and manages a range of waterway assets used to protect our waterways from pollution," said Mayor Wriedt.

"A lot of people don't realise what happens to the stormwater that falls on the roads, carparks and footpaths in their neighbourhoods.

"As stormwater water flows, it collects pollutants from the surfaces and washes them into our rivulets and

stormwater systems.

"Raingardens are one of these assets that filters out pollution before it ends up in our rivers and creeks.

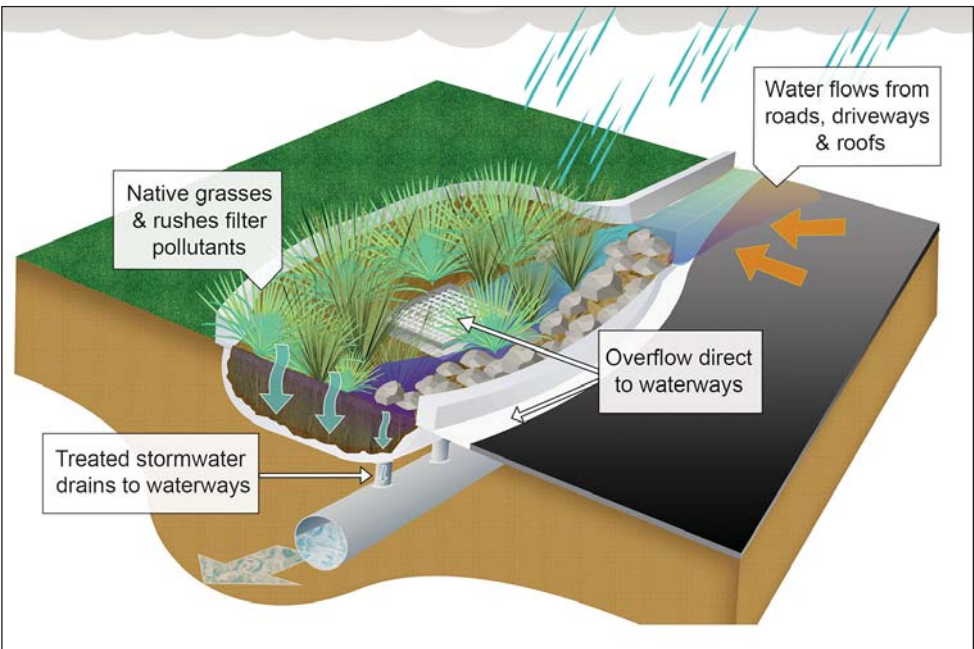
"Raingardens are small garden beds located in kerb buildouts on the edge of the road.

"They capture stormwater and use native grasses and rushes to remove pollutants that may have washed into the streets.

"The treated stormwater then flows into the underground network of stormwater pipes before being discharged into pipes and our creeks and river systems.

"As they are a relatively new concept, they are sometimes mismanaged by adjacent residents who do not understand their purpose.

"We are asking everyone to remember that what we put on the roads and footpaths ends up in the Derwent at some stage."

Conserve water

Kingborough residents are being encouraged to be mindful of their water use as summer approaches, despite the rainy conditions.

Whilst climate models are predicting above-average rainfall over coming months, changing conditions make managing water supplies challenging.

TasWater Climate Change Strategy Lead Luc Richard said conserving water is vital all-year-round, even when Tasmania is experiencing wet weather.

"Just because it is raining does not always mean that water supplies are increasing overall," said Luc Richard. "Rainfall does help fill storages including our dams, but about half of our supplies rely on continuing good water flows in rivers and creeks.

"Also, we are only able to treat a certain amount of water at a time and each summer brings increased demand on our systems as our customers need and use more water.

"The warmer temperatures can also bring other

challenges to the treatment process and sometimes requires more intensive treatment to ensure water continues to meet the Australian Drinking Water Guidelines.

"If we are mindful of our water use throughout the year, we can get into some good water conserving habits when our supplies are at their peak demand."

According to the Australian Bureau of Meteorology, sea surface temperatures in the central tropical Pacific Ocean have cooled and Australia is on a La Niña watch.

"La Niña is one of the two primary drivers of weather conditions in the spring and summer period.

"It increases the chances of above-average rainfall for northern and eastern Australia during spring and summer, which is what we are predicting and have already seen."

"Our climate is changing, and our rainfall patterns will differ year-on-year, so it is important to be mindful of our water use, not just for now but for the future."

Drier than normal conditions will eventually return.

Gaming legislation

The Tasmanian Council of Social Service Inc (TasCOSS) has criticised gaming legislation passed in Tasmania's House of Assembly on October 27, warning of ongoing harm.

TasCOSS CEO Ms Adrienne Picone stated in a media release on October 28 that the legislation "failed Tasmanians" and the State Government's "band-aid measures" to curb pokies harm is "insufficient".

"Gaming legislation passed in the House of Assembly late last night is not fit for purpose and will not protect at risk Tasmanians from the harms caused by poker machines," said Ms Picone.

"Poker machines are a dangerous product.

"This legislation does nothing to make them less dangerous and in fact could well result in more Tasmanians losing their money to poker machines.

"While any measures to reduce losses and harms as a result of use of addictive machines are welcome, we know that self-exclusion or voluntary measures, such as facial recognition technology and card-based play, have minimal impact compared to universal and mandatory measures such as a one dollar bet limit, slower spin speeds and stopping losses-disguised-as-wins.

"If the Tasmanian Government is serious about being 'nation-leading' in the area of harm minimisation, it will not restrict the Liquor and Gaming Commission's work on this to only industry-approved measures.

The Commission must consider measures that have

already been shown to successfully minimise player losses, and therefore harm."

Ms Picone also highlighted that poker machines in hotels and clubs were concentrated in lower socio-economic areas where losses are the highest.

"Gambling harm is a public health issue because it impacts the health, finances, relationships and security of Tasmanians and their families.

Beyond the person experiencing gambling problems, family members, friends, employers and colleagues can also be affected," Ms Picone said.

"We're concerned that the proposed legislation will make it harder to regulate pokies, meaning more Tasmanians will experience harm.

"One in three Tasmanians personally know someone with a serious problem gambling on poker machines and there is a legitimate expectation in the community that our elected representatives take decisive action to address the harms caused by poker machines.

"The Gutwein Government and Tasmanian Labor have failed to make good on their commitments to protect at risk Tasmanians from the harms caused by poker machines.

"The fate of this legislation now rests in the Legislative Council.

"We call on the members of the Upper House to respect the real interests of their communities and oppose this damaging legislation."

Disability inclusion nominations open

Nominations are now open for membership on Kingborough Council's Disability Inclusion and Access Advisory Committee.

Kingborough Mayor and Chair of the committee, Paula Wriedt said the Council was seeking members for a two-year period from 2022 to 2023.

"The committee provides advice and assistance to Council on access issues and makes sure the disability concerns in the community are raised and addressed," Cr Wriedt said.

"Every two months the committee meets here at the Council Chambers during business hours.

"As a committee we have initiated a number of

projects that raise awareness and improve the access needs of our community.

"As a committee we have created a *Building an Accessible Home* brochure and recommended improved access conditions in some commercial premises in Kingborough.

"This is an important committee which has influence over how the Council makes sure best practice access is considered.

"I look forward to welcoming our new members to the committee and encourage nominations."

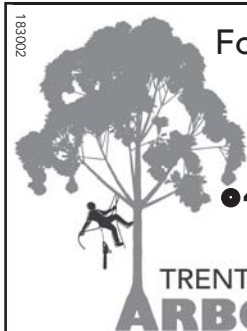

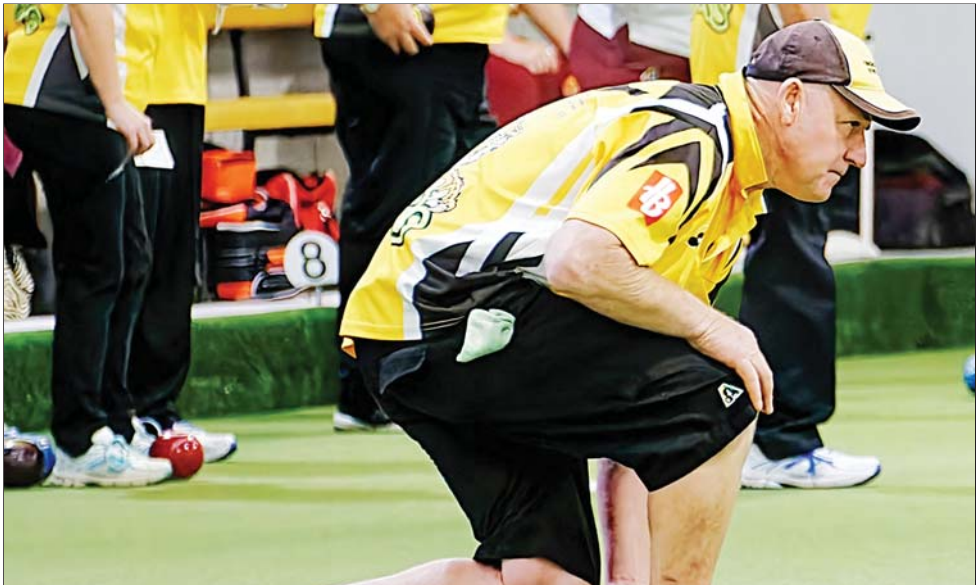
