# Kettering remembers

The Kettering community gathered at 5pm on November 11 to remember those who died or suffered in armed conflicts, laying wreaths in appreciation of their sacrifices.

This year marks the 103rd anniversary of the Armistice that ended the First World War in 1918.

The Battle's Over was played on bagpipes by The Old Pretenders and Spent

While Australians generally observe one minute's silence at 11am on Remembrance Day, Kettering's ceremony was timed to coincide with the time and place where the Armistice was signed, in early hours of the morning at Le Francport near Compiègne in France.

The Armistice came into force at 11am Paris time on the same day.

Thus, one minute's silence is observed and wreath laving ceremonies are held around Tasmania and around Australia every year on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month.

A national ceremony was held at the Australian War Memorial, with the event also marking the 80th anniversary of the opening of the memorial, during the Second World War.

The Australian War Memorial was unveiled by the Governor-General, Lord Gowrie on November 11, 1941.

The Kettering service commenced with the marching band of pipers, veterans, service men and family members who made their way to the cenotaph and assembled locals outside the Kettering Community Hall.

The ceremony was led by Kettering local Colleen Frost, commencing with a Welcome to Country.

Local veteran David Archer read a poem and gave a tribute on behalf of the Returned and Services League of Australia veterans.

Kettering locals Linely Chopping and Ted Domenny shared family stories. Flowers were placed beside the memorial by community members, with Kingborough Council represented by Sue Bastone.

"Today we honour the previous owners of this land, who fought and battled courageously over many years to protect their homeland," said Colleen Frost. Colleen also paid tribute to the Indigenous Australians.

"Sadly we all deeply regret this time in history (and) regret that this war was never accurately recorded.'

Colleen reminded the gathering that Remembrance Day has also been known as Red Poppy Day.

"The red poppy symbolizing the shadow of sorrow and death of the many people known in our community and throughout this great country who were lost at war," noted Colleen Frost

"The service men and women who fought for our freedom, with thousands of lives lost in fierce battles.

"Many unknown to us.

"Today we remember those brave service people, and recognize to this day the sadness experienced by their families at home.

"We honour those who never returned to their homeland or families.

"We especially honour our Indigenous soldiers, who because of their colour were never awarded medals.

"Today we pray for the lives of those who rest here in Kettering, the surrounding Channel districts and beyond.

"We pray for every family who has been affected by the horrors of war." Lest we forget.

# Twin wickets or third ground?

A meeting of stakeholders to discuss the potential to install a second wicket at Kingston's Twins Oval has been confirmed for Monday, November 22.

The Kingborough Chronicle received confirmation of the meeting from Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt on November 11.

"I have organised a workshop on November 22 with the Kingborough Tigers Football Club, AFL Tasmania, Cricket Tasmania and Kingborough District Cricket Club and all Councillors to discuss the options going forward," confirmed Mayor Wriedt.

Tigers Football Club's president, Paul Gadomski, said the meeting had been organised to gain an understanding on proposed logistics surrounding the installation of a second wicket.

"The Tigers sports club as a whole continues to make our position known that we fully support a second turf wicket within the precinct," said Mr

"The future growth of the Kingborough community requires more sporting infrastructure and we are committed to encourage Council, the Mayor and all other sporting stakeholders in the precinct to focus on strategic thinking and work together to build a third multi-sports ground at the Twin Ovals with the second turf pitch in it.

"Such development will be integral to coping with future demand with cricket and Kingborough Little Athletics being the primary tenants of the new facility and also giving the Kingborough Lions Soccer Club and the Tigers Football Club over-flow access in the winter months.

Paul said Councillor Clare Glade-Wright provided verbal advice of commitment by Mayor Wriedt, that no progress would be made on development of the turf wicket at Twin Oval 1 until a stakeholder meeting occurred.

"All sports at the Twin Ovals precinct must now come together and in conjunction with the council develop a future growth plan that caters for everyone's needs.

"No sport is above another and working together will deliver the right strategic outcome for the Kingborough community, in a balanced, well thought out approach, removing all risks associated with quick fixes and short-term thinking to deliver the right outcome for the entire community.

#### Cycling and golf don't play well

As a member of Kingston Beach Golf Club, I find the release of the Draft Cycling Strategy (Kingborough Chronicle, November 2), proposing a shared walk/cycle path through our golf course, laughable.

Most local parks have signs displayed saying "no golf practice " for good reason.

Recreational walking/cycling in close proximity to a golf ball area is not compatible due to risk of injury.

I note in The Mercury on Saturday, November 13, Mayor Paula Wreidt defends the Kingborough Council strategy by inferring that the publication of a map with a line through private land is somehow not determinative of, or in any way intended to mean, a final decision has been made on a shared pathway.

As the Mayor, being an ex-minister and highly skilled politician, would no doubt be aware, there is an old adage; never ask a question that you haven't already got an answer for.

I do note since at least 2017, two Councillors have sat as chairpersons on the Kingborough Bicycle Advisory Board, and Council engineering operatives have variously attended the same.

I note these same persons have variously recommended to Council approved expenditure on a range of initiatives that are listed on its website.

From pursuing the minutes of this bicycle advisory board, one item has been regularly canvassed since 2017, namely a Browns River cycle trail through the golf

Yet management of the golf club, which has been in existence for over 100 years, has not been engaged by the Council or its consultants prior to public release of the Draft Strategy 2021-2030, that is likely to be costed at millions of dollars to fully execute and require significant State and Federal funding.

One wonders why?

But then I forgot we are assured by Mayor Wreidt that a

line on a map is not necessarily determinative of any final decision by Council especially when that line is located on land in other ownership and where external funding is to be sought from other levels of government based on these mappings.

# Mega market tradition

Rotarian Ross Jones recalls the first car boot sale, when he and two other sellers were present.

Within a few years, when shop trading hours changed, and the car boot sale was transferred next door to the Roberts building.

Ross can recall over 80 sellers on a particular day. "The Roberts premises could not accommodate them all so the market spilled out onto John Street.

"Eventually the Roberts building was sold to Coles to make additional car parking, and Kingston Rotary had to move the market to other locations including the rooftop of Channel Court, then to the Kingston Library,

# Council complaints policy consultation

An updated draft of Kingborough Council's Complaints Management Policy was released for public input on November 8.

Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt said the draft complaints handling framework was available for residents and key stakeholders to provide feedback via the Council's website.

"The potential exists for complaints to be seen as a nuisance," Cr Wriedt said.

"Yet complaints can be an important resource to councils as they give valuable feedback about services and, if used effectively, are a catalyst for improvement.

"Good complaint handling increases confidence in public administration," continued Cr Wriedt.

"On the other hand, mishandled complaints can carry a high potential cost, both financial and reputational.

"Council's current complaints management process is contained in within its Customer Service Charter.

"The updated policy builds on the Charter by providing more detail for both the community and Council staff about to how complaints will be managed in a consistent way across Council's operations.

"The complaints framework is based on the Victorian Ombudsman's guide *Councils and Complaints: A Good Practice Guide 2015.* 

"Given the similar nature of Local Government across the country, the Victorian Ombudsman's resources can be easily adapted for Tasmanian Councils. "A good complaint handling process increases confidence in public administration and generates financial benefits for an organisation, so it makes sense that we want to get this policy and process right.

"It is timely to revisit the way that customer complaints are dealt with at all levels of the organisation.

"This way we can ensure our complaints mechanisms are integrated throughout Kingborough's operational activities and are effective, efficient and promote fairness, integrity, and administrative excellence."

# Heartfelt walk for cancer cure

This year's Walk4BrainCancer event was a resounding success, with around 150 people participating at Dru Point Bicentennial Park in Margate.

The event was the seventh walk organised by Tasmanian Senator Catryna Bilyk and it raised \$16,565. Senator Bilyk is a brain tumour survivor and a Cure Brain Cancer Ambassador.

In a media release on November 10, Senator Bilyk said she was grateful for the community's overwhelming support over the past seven years.

"While I am incredibly grateful for the number of people who come out year after year in support of this cause, I probably shouldn't be surprised given how many have been affected by this terrible disease," Senator Bilyk said.

"Sadly, brain cancer has a five-year survival rate of just 22 per cent and kills more Australian children than any other disease

"Since 2014, thousands of Tasmanians have joined in my efforts to turn these shocking statistics around.

"Together, we have raised enough money to fund a small-scale clinical trial."

Senator Bilyk acknowledged that the walk took on a special significance for her as she was dealing with a brain tumour for the second time in her life.

"I appreciated the opportunity to walk in solidarity with others who have been touched by this disease, whether it's brain cancer and tumour patients or their friends and families," Senator Bilyk said.

This year's memorial address was delivered by State Member for Franklin, Dean Winter MP.

Speaking to the crowd, Mr Winter paid tribute to the struggles of brain cancer patients and those who had

ost loved ones to brain cancer.

Mr Winter spoke about his difficulty attending the event because of the painful memories it brought up of his mother's death nine years ago from glioblastoma, the most aggressive and deadly form of brain cancer.

"When the event first started seven years ago I was going to arrive, but I sat in the car and couldn't make it through the gates," Mr Winter said.

Mr Winter said that each year he had progressed a little further, and was met with applause when he announced, "and this year I'm going to walk with you."

More than \$200,000 has been raised with the help of
the community through seven walks and Russell

Morris's Ranelagh concert.

Senator Bilyk acknowledged and thanked everyone

"We had some very generous raffle prize donors including Choices Flooring, the Briggs family, Betta Electric World, Priory Ridge Wines, Rockwall Bar and Grill, and Island Trophies and Print," Senator Bilyk said.

"I would also like to thank Woolworths Kingston Town for donating the goods for our sausage sizzle, Kingborough Council for providing the venue, St John Ambulance for choosing Cure Brain Cancer as one of their 'charities of choice' this year and providing medical support free of charge, and local entertainer Fiona Hutchison for the live musical entertainment.

"Volunteers Else, Margaret, Edna, Ray, Helen and Charlotte put in a stellar effort and have all volunteered for several Walk4BrainCancer events now, as has the event's official photographer, my husband, Robert.

"A special thank you goes to the Lions Club of Sorell,

which raised \$1000.

All funds raised from registration fees, donations, merchandise sales, the raffle and the sausage sizzle will go to Cure Brain Cancer Foundation to help in its mission to rapidly increase brain cancer survival and improve

the quality of life of brain cancer patients.

## The never-ending weedy roundabout story

An arrangement between the Tasmanian Government and Kingborough Council is yet to be reached on the maintenance of overgrown vegetation on Statecontrolled roundabouts in the municipality.

The Kingborough community may have noticed the thorny issue of weedy roundabouts on the Channel Highway has been sticking around all year, despite ongoing efforts of locals to uproot and remove the problem.

Responsibility for the problem resides with the Department of State Growth, the portfolio of Minister Jaensch MP.

Local volunteers have offered to assist in weed removal. Kingborough Council have also offered to undertake maintenance of the roundabout vegetation and advised the Kingborough Chronicle on September 16 that their discussions with the Department of State Growth appeared to be coming to fruition.

"Council has only recently received a proposal from the Department of State Growth (DSG) for Council to undertake maintenance on their behalf for the Margate and Algona roundabouts," wrote Kingborough Council's Director Environment, Development and Community, Dr Katrena Stephenson.

"Council is reviewing the proposal by Department of State Growth and may need to negotiate amendments.

"Once an agreement is finalised, we can provide an update." The Kingborough Chronicle wrote to the Minister for State Growth, Roger Jaensch MP on November 10, seeking an

update on whether an agreement had been finalised. A spokesperson replied that a mutually suitable arrangement has not yet been reached.

"The Department and Council have discussed possible options for landscaping on the roundabouts.

"This includes the possibility of providing Council with

funding to plant and maintain the roundabouts

"To be viable, any such arrangement would need to be long term, and a mutually suitable arrangement has not

vet been reached. "We continue to maintain the roundabouts in line with our usual maintenance schedule, which is normally to cut the vegetation twice yearly to keep them tidy.

"The recent heavy rain and warmer weather has led to increased vegetation growth across southern Tasmania.

"The vegetation maintenance program operates year round, but ramps up in spring.


"Our priority for vegetation maintenance is to deliver effective treatments which deal with weeds and maintain sight distances.

"This helps us maximise use of the maintenance budget, focussing on safety issues such as fixing potholes and maintaining drainage and barriers.

# Micro business grants

A second round of the Tasmanian Government's micro and small business grants program opened on November 10 and will close next week.

The grant round is aimed at small businesses still experiencing difficulties due to interstate COVID-19 travel and border restrictions.

"This new second round of the program will provide grants of between \$3000 and \$50,000 to eligible Tasmanian businesses," stated a joint media from Tasmanian Premier Peter Gutwein MP and Minister for Small Business, Jane Howlett MP.

"This funding will continue to support micro and small businesses operating in the tourism, hospitality, arts and

events, seafood and transport (hire car, coach tours) sectors.

"This round of the program is open both to new applicants and those who received support under the first round which ran across September and October.

"The first round of the program was highly successful, with over 3400 eligible Tasmanian micro and small businesses sharing more than \$42 million."

"The eligibility criteria will remain the same as the first bund."

Cr Wriedt said.

Chewy chocolate-gingerbread cookies

Local chef Kirsten Bacon has kindly shared her chewy chocolate-gingerbread cookies recipe, in time for Christmas baking and gift-giving.

"My lovely friend Paula has now made these twice for

"Once they were devoured by my children before I got home and the second time, they were under strict instruction not to touch.

"I first had them over 20 years ago.

"I absolutely love the combination of fresh and ground ginger, molasses, and chunks of semisweet chocolate that makes the cookies sophisticated enough for adults but chocolaty enough for children.

"Also, a fantastic thing to have stored away in a tin ready for those visitors or place in a jar and decorate.

"Homemade gifts are wonderful."

#### INGREDIENTS:

- 1 1/2 cups plus 1 Tablespoon unbleached all-purpose flour
- 1 1/4 teaspoons ground ginger • 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cloves
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly grated nutmeg
- 1 tablespoon unsweetened Dutch-process cocoa powder
- 1/2 cup unsalted butter, room temperature
- 1 tablespoon grated peeled fresh ginger
- 1/2 cup dark-brown sugar, packed
- 1/4 cup molasses
- 1 teaspoon baking soda

- 1 1/2 teaspoons boiling water
- 210 grams of bitter (70 per cent) chocolate, cut into 1/4-inch chunks
- 1/4 cup granulated sugar

#### **METHOD:**

- 1. In a medium bowl, sift together flour, ground ginger, cinnamon, cloves, nutmeg and cocoa.
- 2. In a second bowl, beat butter and grated ginger until lightened. Add brown sugar, beat until combined. Add molasses; beat until combined.
- 3. In a large bowl, dissolve baking soda in boiling water. Beat half of flour mixture into butter mixture. Beat in baking-soda mixture, then remaining half of
- 4. Mix in chocolate; turn out onto a piece of plastic wrap. Pat dough out to about 1-inch thick; seal with wrap. Refrigerate until firm, two hours or overnight.
- 5. Line two baking trays with baking paper. Heat oven to 180 degrees Celsius. Roll dough into 1 1/2-inch balls; place 2-inches apart on prepared baking trays. Refrigerate for 20-minutes. Roll in granulated sugar.
- 6. Bake until the surfaces crack slightly, 10 to 12minutes, rotating halfway through. Let cool on sheets for 5-minutes, then transfer cookies to a wire rack and let cool completely. Cookies are best the day they are made but can be stored in an airtight container at room temperature up to five days.

This recipe makes around 24 biscuits.

#### **Detoured access into South Hobart**
