Tarooma Fire Brigade celebrates 75 years

The Tarooma Volunteer Fire Brigade celebrated its 75th anniversary, with an open day on Saturday, November 21.

The Tarooma crew and community came out in support, to recognise the efforts of the volunteers and view the displays.

The open day included friendly competitions between Tarooma and Mount Nelson Fire Brigades, kids 'come and try' activities and Remote Area Team demonstrations.

A range of past and present fire trucks were also on show.

Chief Officer of the Tasmania Fire Service, Mr Dermot Barry addressed

the gathering.

Speeches were also delivered by volunteers and elected representatives.

The Tarooma Fire Brigade has been called to many fires locally, across Tasmania and interstate since it was first formed by Marc Ashton in the early 1950s.

Brigade volunteers assisted in the January 1957 fires, the February 1967 fires (known as Black Tuesday), the Tarooma Bowls Club arson of August 1974, the Tarooma Pre-School fire of September 1974, Dunalley in 2013 and in the North West in 2016 among many other fires.

Interstate deployments included NSW and QLD in 2018 and 2019.

Lowest rank on global climate index

Independent Member for Clark, Andrew Wilkie MP said the Federal Government's lack of commitment has led Australia to drop to the lowest rank on an international climate change performance index.

Australia has been given the lowest ranking on the international *Climate Change Performance Index 2022*, falling four points since last year.

The independent index monitors 60 countries on their climate change mitigation performance.

The *Kingborough Chronicle* wrote to Liberal Senators for Tasmania, Senators Eric Abetz, Wendy Askew and Jonathon Duniam on November 10 regarding the Australian Government's performance, asking the following questions.

"What does this result say about the Australian Government's policy?"

"What does the Australian Government's result say to the local community about the Australian Government's concern for the climate-heating futures of their children and grandchildren?"

"Is the Government going to withdraw from its gas industry expansion policy, given the potency of methane lost to the atmosphere in the process of gas mining will continue to increase global heating?"

The Liberal representative's response questioned the independent climate change analysis, making comparisons to China, despite China received a low rating overall.

"We would question the objectivity of this analysis, evidenced by the fact that China (which emits more carbon from burning fossil fuels than the United States and Europe combined) is somehow ranked higher than Australia," replied Senators Abetz, Askew and Duniam.

"We are more than pulling our weight internationally to combat climate change, but we have to be prepared for the fact that natural disasters such as bushfires will continue to occur and likely increase in severity regardless of what Australia does."

"Since 2005 Australia's emissions have fallen by over 20 per cent, which is more than New Zealand, Canada, Japan and the USA."

However, Independent Member for Clark, Andrew Wilkie MP strongly disagreed and said the government response was "an outrageous claim".

"The reason why Australia has been ranked in the very lowest category on climate policy performance is because of the Federal Government's appalling failure to commit to any meaningful action to reduce our greenhouse gas emissions," said Andrew Wilkie MP.

"To say we are pulling our weight internationally is an outrageous claim and the community is much smarter than that."

"Suggestions that Australia's emissions have fallen by 20 per cent are wildly overstated."

"Excluding changes in the land-use sector and the pandemic downturn, Australian emissions have in fact risen by seven per cent since 2005 and this puts us in breach of our own weak emissions targets."

"We're already seeing the devastating impact of climate change in Australia, and we know every fraction of a degree we can avoid really matters."

"The Federal Government must commit to net-zero carbon as fast as possible and it should also be laying out a detailed roadmap to get there, including rapid phasing out of coal, gas and oil, removing subsidies to the fossil-fuel industry, and fast tracking 100 per cent renewables."

Fifth lane nonsense

Dear Editor,
Does anyone other than Michael Ferguson MP believe that widening the Southern Outlet will solve traffic congestion in Macquarie Street?
No one I've met.
Yet Minister Ferguson told residents, "Nothing will change my mind on the fifth lane, except engineering".
Not logic, it seems, nor even common sense. This project is wrong on every level.
It is illogical.
The Government's *Hobart Congestion Traffic Analysis 2016* states that Macquarie Street is the problem causing congestion on the Southern Outlet.
Peak flow in Macquarie Street is 3500 cars/hr, including 530 cars/hr from upper Macquarie Street and an unknown number from Regent Street.
The Outlet alone can easily deliver 3400 cars/hr, based on the *Hobart Western Bypass Feasibility Study 2020*, so how will widening it help?
It lacks common sense.
Of all the options for reducing traffic congestion, why start with the most expensive, riskiest, and most damaging, while ignoring options that are cheap, effective, will improve quality of life and which could be implemented immediately?
Minister Ferguson is proposing to demolish houses

to build the lane.
At the current traffic growth rate on the Outlet, plus 10,000 extra homes in Kingborough in 10 years, Macquarie Street will need to be eight lanes wide unless commuters change to public transport (assuming the present rate of commuters to Hobart per home during the three-hour morning period continues).
However, the City Deal aims to only increase public transport use from 6.4 per cent (current) to 10 per cent.
At current traffic growth, this goal will be swamped in one year, or five months if the Kingborough population grows as above.
A strategic approach would be to specify the maximum traffic numbers per hour in Macquarie Street, then plan for how that goal could be attained.
It misdiagnoses the present problem that 93 per cent of commuters choose cars over buses.
We previously showed in *The Mercury* (Talking Point, April 19) that there were sufficient empty seats on existing buses during peak hour to accommodate all car occupants.
Congestion could be eliminated tomorrow if the government made bus travel more attractive than cars.
The City Deal provides no incentive to catch the bus.
Why not change commuter behaviour first with cheap options: free bus travel, improved services, including school buses, bus shelters, advertising, staggered work hours, coupled with increased rates for all-day parking, congestion tax and stopping commuters parking in residential streets.
Without such change, the fifth lane will be a futile and expensive white elephant.
The only practical alternative is constructing park-and-ride facilities that make public transport practical and convenient.
Cambridge, UK, with a population of 120,000 people, has five park-and-rides with spaces for 5385 cars, compare this to our pathetic 242, with nothing allocated in this year's budget.
One facility in Cambride with 1450 vehicle sites, has undercover parking with solar panels to charge electric vehicles.
We would recommend adding a grocer, making the site a natural magnet, and a coffee shop for parents awaiting the school bus.
Commuters would drive to the hub, ride the bus to

work and back, pick up the groceries and drive home.
One such facility would immediately solve congestion from the south if introduced along with appropriate carrots and sticks.
This will require acquisition of land for park-and-rides around Kingston and beyond, Sorell, New Norfolk and areas around the northern suburbs railway line.
They should immediately compulsorily acquire Kangaroo Point and build serious parking into a ferry terminal and mandate public transport facilities in any new housing developments.
If the government can't demonstrate that they can move most commuters by public transport, then they must stop promoting housing development in places like Kingborough.
If they can, they won't need a fifth lane.

Motherload is a US documentary exploring the benefits of cargo bicycles on all aspects of our lives.

The film is to be shown on Friday, December 10 at the Kingborough Community Hub in Kingston, commencing at 6.45pm.
Bicycle Network spokesperson Alison Hetherington said the film coincides with the consultation period for the new Kingborough Bicycle Plan.

"The new bike plan aims to create a network of protected and separated cycleways to connect people in the main residential areas to schools, shops, services, workplaces and other attractions," Ms Hetherington said.
"This is what we need if we are going to get parents riding with their kids or even better, kids being safe to get around on their own.
"It's also essential for all of us out there who would prefer to ride a bicycle for some of our trips but fear getting hit by a car if we ride on the road unseparated from traffic.
"Motherload was made by keen bike rider Liz Canning in response to having two children and finding herself driving more and feeling miserable about it.
"But then she discovered cargo bikes and the ability to get back into riding which gave her a choice and also made her and her children a lot happier.
"The film interviews everyday cargo bike riders as well as people using them to help older people to stay engaged with their community or for poorer communities who have little other transport choices.
"It's difficult to watch the film trailer and not be energised by the joy on the faces of the riders, their children and their dogs.
"They make it look like so much fun.
"We have to limit audience numbers because of COVID restrictions so we are asking people to book their free tickets online so we can ensure the number is below the cap.

High honours for Blackmans Bay Distillery

Blackmans Bay Distillery have recently been awarded at the Australian Gin Awards for 2021, adding to their awards for previous years.

Stuart and Danika Bumford are behind the local family-owned and run micro-distillery in Blackmans Bay.

“We are passionate about our product and produce everything in house, including our own base spirit that is made from Australian sugar,” said Danika.

“We use pure Tasmanian mountain water and homegrown produce, as well as local ingredients in our products and produce just 250 bottles of gin at a time.”

Blackmans Bay Distillery currently have three gins including the grey label Smoky Gin, winner of the silver award at the Australian Spirit Awards in 2020, the blue label Botanical Gin, winner of the bronze award at the Australian Gin Awards this year, and their red label Harvest Gin.

Danika explained how their label is unique in that it features a beautiful image designed by local Tasmania artist Mandy Renard.

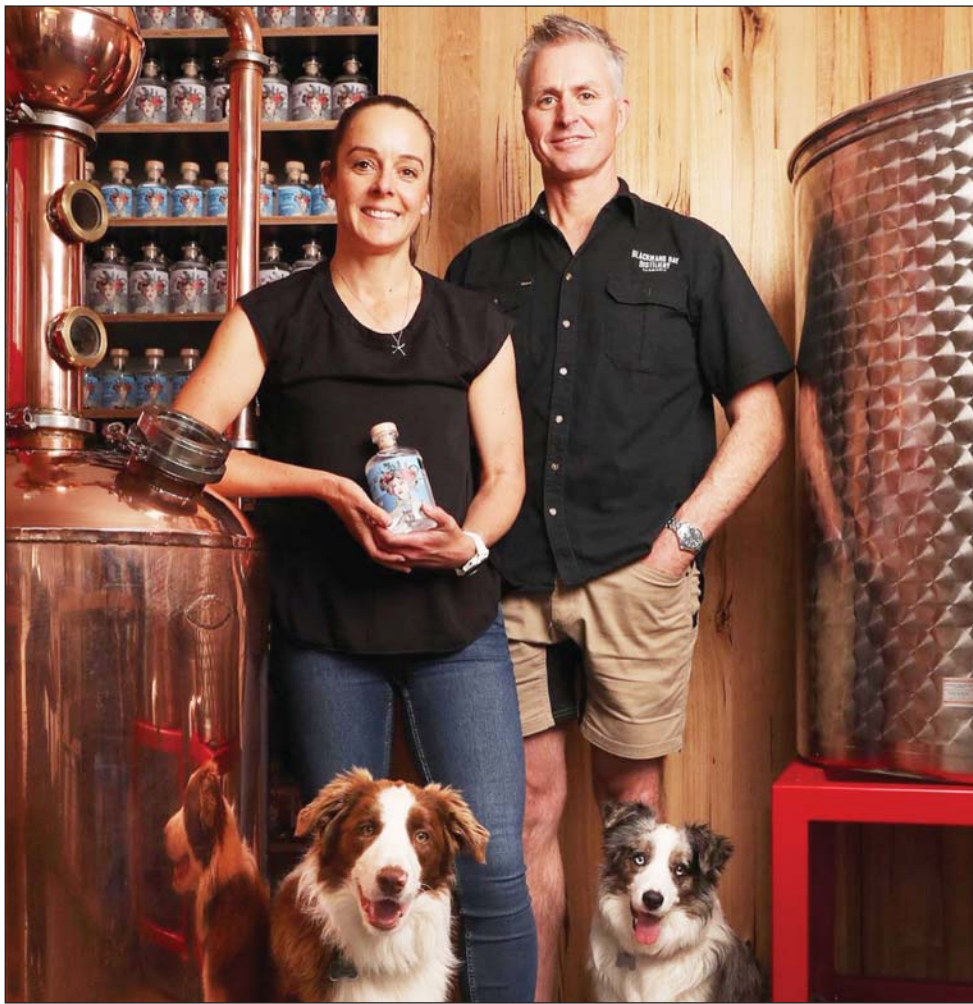
“It features a timeless woman with botanicals we use in our products as well as a native Tasmanian waratah in her hair.

Friends of Longley picnic birthday

The Friends of Longley Area Group (FLAG) are seeking to increase community awareness around the immediate need to eradicate the highly invasive foxglove weed.

The local group aim to care for the upper North West Bay River catchment and its communities.

FLAG member Sue Quarmby said the group formed in late 2020 and represents and advocates for the interests of the communities within the catchment, including Longley, Neika, Leslie Vale and Lower Longley.

Sue said the group has produced a weed information sheet on foxglove and are also conducting regular working bees to assist community members who cannot manage their own foxglove eradication.

“With the current climatic conditions, these weeds are rapidly taking over local paddocks and threatening native bush and our riparian (waterway) areas,” noted Sue.

“As the plants are now in flower, it is imperative that we send a strong messaging though the local commu-

nity about the threat and disseminate information to them on how to manage such.”

Foxglove *Digitalis purpurea* is a biennial herb which flowers in its second year then dies.

The plant has a rosette of soft, blue-grey hairy leaves that produce a tall flower spike of white, pink or purple tubular flowers with dark mottling.

Flowers turn into seed balls, distributing millions of seeds. Some of the group’s major projects to date include:

- Caretaking of the Longley Waterhole and ensuring the river environment is kept clean and safe;
- Weed control within the catchment particularly foxgloves, Erica species and wild mignonette;
- Planning tree planting and tree maintenance activities;
- Funding for an update for the Longley Management Plan; and
- Funding for a feasibility study for a multiuse pathway alongside Leslie Road at Leslie Vale.

To celebrate its first year, FLAG has planned a neighbourhood activity and information day titled *Picnic in the Paddock*.

“The event will be held on the Matthews Road Recreation Ground at Longley on Sunday, December 5, from 11am to 3pm, an opportunity to promote community awareness and to all come together to share views on the future of our beautiful area.

“This free family event will centre around information on weeds, water quality, fire awareness and planning and local history, plus displays by community groups, short talks, coffee, a Q&A session and a sausage sizzle, combined with fun activities for children, including a jumping castle.

“The event will be sponsored by the Kingborough Council and the Longley International Hotel Social Club.”

Diary published from Bruny's past

The Wildcare group Friends of Bruny Island Quarantine Station have published the diary of German (POW) Fritz Stegherr who was 4th Officer on the S. S. Oberhausen in 1914 when England declared war on Germany.

As an Officer, Fritz was out on parole for five months in Hobart and then five months on Bruny Island.

The book *Dear Mama* was launched during the Tasmanian Writers Festival on October 10 at the Maritime Museum with limited books due to COVID related postage delays.

In August 2014 Friends of Bruny Island Quarantine Station group held a special S. S. Oberhausen day to commemorate the capture and internment of the crew by naval reservists when war with Germany was declared by England.

The day started with an introduction by President of the group at that time, Kathy Duncombe, and was followed by brief talks by the Honorary Consul of France and Germany in Tasmania Dianne Bye, Bob Minchin, John Lennox, Reg Watson and Wendy Bowman.

The day concluded with a barbeque of bratwurst sausages, sauerkraut, black bread, all washed down with German beer.

Prior to this occasion the group had discussed how wonderful it would be if they could make contact with descendants of some of the crew members to find out what happened to them on their return.

Kathy was able to get in contact with an online German magazine *GeschiMag* and conducted an email interview with the editor which was published in March 2014.

The article was headed 'The wrong place at the wrong time'.

In July this was followed up with another article about the day the group was holding in August.

In 2016 Roswitha Müller had read the articles online and contacted Kathy as her grandfather Fritz Stegherr (4th Officer on the S. S. Oberhausen) had completed five diaries during WW1 in his time as a German Internee, although he refers to himself as a Prisoner of War.

Roswitha wanted to send the diary that documented his time in Hobart and Bruny Island Quarantine Station group on a 'loan' basis.

There was great excitement when it arrived, with photos of the station in 1915, the first photo so far located that showed the Shelter Cove jetty.

The other diaries were put into the German Archives.

The mission then began to find someone who could translate the Old German into English.

Doro Forck visited Germany at Christmas and met Roswitha, and together they translated some of the pages, however being Old German it proved difficult, and with Doro's work commitments, the group had to look further for someone else to translate the 500 plus pages.

Paul Thost who works on a voluntary basis at the Anglesea Barracks Museum and for the National Archive of Australia (NAA) was suggested and spent the next two and a half years translating the diary.

The book was expected to be available in all good bookshops mid-November.

Raising funds for Team Maddy

Maddison (Maddy) Arthur was diagnosed with acute lymphoblastic leukaemia on August 16, 2018 when she was eight-years-old.

Maddy fought hard and had treatment for the next two years and three months. Treatments consisted of lumbar punctures, bone marrow aspirations, general anaesthetics and missing out on a lot of school and fun with friends. On October 26, 2020 Maddy rang the school bell to signify the end of treatment and back to a normal life. Now aged 11, Maddy and her Mum received the news on October 20, 2021 that she had relapsed and they had 24 hours to pack up and move to Melbourne for treatment at the Royal Children's Hospital. Maddy is expected to be there for at least six months. Maddy's mum Sarah Higginson shared her thoughts on the Team Maddy Facebook page. "One week shy of our one year off treatment anniversary October 20, 2021 and once again our world was shattered. "The exact same fear, dread and terror ran through my blood, how am I going to tell Maddy that what she endured during her last treatment would have to be repeated, only this time without our army in close range. "This time treatment is to be carried out at the Royal Children's Hospital in Melbourne for a minimum of six months, with 24 hours to pack up your life and leave to face this beast again."

Following the news that Maddy had relapsed with leukaemia a group of Grade 5 students at St Aloysius College are shaving their hair to raise funds for Maddy. The team includes Campbell, Lucas, Logan, Rhys, Ren, Ryan, Harry, Tom, Archer, Austin and Eddie. The Brave Shave for Maddy is being held at St Aloysius on Friday, December 3 with staff from Cyber Hair donating their time to shave the students' hair. Donations can be made at <https://www.mycase.com.au/events/thebraveshaveformaddy> St Aloysius also held a sausage sizzle and a bake sale on November 9 and 10, raising approximately \$2500. Maddy lives in Kingston with her mum Sarah and two dogs Billy and Buddy. Sarah cannot work during this time, meaning all funds raised will help to alleviate some of the financial pressures, allowing Sarah to focus on Maddy's treatment and healing over the next six months. Maddy loves animals, especially dogs, playing basketball and her beloved DOSA football club. THE KINGBOROUGH COOK

Ottolenghi spiced nuts



“A little jar of nuttiness” to make, give and try this festive season.

In the spirit of Christmas, Kingborough chef Kirsten Bacon has offered her recipe for Ottolenghi spiced nuts. “These are the most fantastic nuts and perfect for Christmas treats,” said Kirsten. “Wrap them in a jar with a piece of ribbon and they are a wonderful gift or something delicious to take to a party. “Double or triple the quantities. “You’ll easily get hooked.”

INGREDIENTS:

- 100g cashew nuts
- 100g macadamia nuts
- 120g pecan nuts
- 60g whole almonds (skin on)
- 80g pumpkin seeds
- 1 Tbsp sunflower seeds

- 2 tbsp nigella seeds
- 3 tbsp sunflower oil
- 2 tbsp honey
- 1 tsp fine salt
- 2 sprigs rosemary, leaves picked
- 2 tsp coarsely ground black pepper
- 2 tsp cayenne spicy nuts

METHOD:

1. Preheat the oven to 170C/325F/gas mark 3.
2. Scatter all the ingredients, except the pepper and cayenne, in a roasting tray.
3. Roast for 15-17 minutes, stirring occasionally, until the nuts turn dark brown.
4. Remove, stir in the pepper and cayenne, and taste. Add salt if you like.
5. Leave to cool in the tray, stirring from time to time. Once cool, transfer to an air-tight container.

Gingerbread house

A gingerbread house with extra cookies is just the thing to kick off Christmas celebrations.

Local chef Kirsten Bacon has kindly shared her gingerbread house and royal icing recipe. “Now is the time to start looking for gingerbread house cutters and start preparing to build your gingerbread house,” notes Kirsten. “These also make a lovely family gift and can be filled with treats. “Just make sure you fill the house before you put the treats in as it can be tricky through the door and the window’s.”

INGREDIENTS:

- 725g plain flour
- 1/2 tsp bicarb of soda
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 2 tsp ground ginger
- 2 tsp cinnamon
- 1 tsp nutmeg
- 1 tsp cloves
- 225g copha/butter
- 225g castor sugar
- 300g black treacle or molasses/golden syrup
- 2 eggs, beaten

METHOD:

1. In a bowl, sieve together the flour, bi-carb, salt and spices.
2. Put the shortening in a pan and melt slowly. Add the sugar and treacle and mix until runny.
3. Pour the fat mixture into the flour and add the eggs. Mix well together until stiff, then knead lightly with the hands until smooth.
4. Wrap the dough tightly in a plastic bag. Use as desired. If the gingerbread is used for large pieces such as walls, the cooking time will be 10 to 14 minutes. Smaller pieces will need less time.
5. Bake in a pre-heated oven at 180 C.
6. Roll out the dough on baking paper (silicon) with cling wrap on top (not always necessary), as needed, to 5mm (1/4 inch).
7. Using the cutters, cut out two roof pieces: a front and a back. To make a chimney, cut out four rectangular pieces 5cm x 4cm (2 x 11/2 inches), then cut

- out a wedge out of two of them so they will sit on the roof when joined together. To make windows or doors, cut these from the gingerbread. I use star and heart cutters.
8. Carefully lift the pieces onto the trays, and refrigerate for 20 minutes, then bake each tray for 12 minutes.
 9. Set aside to cool. For stained glass effect, crush assorted boiled lollies, then fill the cut-out windows about 5 minutes before the gingerbread is cooked. They will melt together.

ROYAL ICING:

- 280g (2 1/4 cups) pure icing sugar
- 1 egg white, room temperature
- 1/2 tsp lemon juice

1. Sift icing sugar through a fine sieve onto a large square of greaseproof paper.
2. Place egg whites into a mixing bowl and beat lightly until frothy.
3. Using a wooden spoon gradually beat in about half the quantity of sifted icing sugar. Beat each addition in well before adding the next. Continue beating until the mixture becomes light and fluffy. It may take from 5 to 10 minutes but it is worth the effort.
4. Then add lemon juice and remaining icing sugar, stirring in a little at a time. Sufficient sugar has been added when the icing holds up in peaks on the spoon; the quantity will vary depending on the volume of egg whites. If you leave the icing at any time during beating, cover with damp cloth or cling wrap to seal and prevent a crust forming. An electric mixer can also be used, but don’t over beat otherwise too many air bubbles will spoil the surface finish.

HINTS:

- Icing will keep for about two weeks un-refrigerated.
- Icing can be coloured red and green for effect.
- Any oil will cause this icing to become unusable.
- Add 1/4 teaspoon of cream of tartar for additional icing strength.

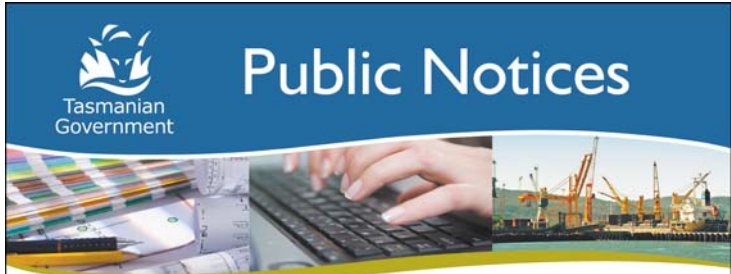
