Fifth lane

Dear Editor,
I enjoyed the letter by Simon Wright (November 23),
discussing the proposed fifth lane from Kingston to
Hobart.
He seems to have analysed the problem well, but I
think his reference to engineers, logic and common
sense is a little unkind.
I think engineers are quite good at logic and common
sense, and part of the problem is that they are relatively low
in the pecking order and are not asked, "is a fifth lane here
a good idea", rather they're told, "design a fifth lane here".
Dr Wright makes several sensible suggestions and
asks a few questions including why not change com-

muter behaviour?
I think I can answer that question.
Dr Wright's suggestions require many small changes to
many pieces of the transport network.
Politically attractive solutions are those that require few
big changes to few pieces of the network.
It is useful for Dr Wright to present numbers identifying
the facts of the problem, but many people are not won-
derfully numerate, and I think a plumbing analogy might
help the understanding of the problem.
We have a four-inch pipe delivering traffic to a two-inch pipe.
If we replace the four-inch pipe with a five-inch pipe,
we'll achieve a good approximation of nothing.

Opposition on bulldozing Dynnyrne homes

Over 2500 Tasmanians have signed a petition opposed to Infrastructure Minister Michael Ferguson's plan to bulldoze homes to widen the Southern Outlet.

Travellers along the Southern Outlet may have noticed red crosses on the fences of Dynnyrne homes.

Labor Member for Clark Ella Haddad MP sponsored the petition and was joined by affected residents when she formally tabled the petition in Tasmanian Parliament on November 24.

Ms Haddad said Mr Ferguson should "listen to residents and stop recklessly pushing ahead with this plan, a plan that would not actually do what is needed to address the traffic congestion issues on the outlet."

"Today I tabled the petition signed by over 2500 people calling on the government to stop this project and it is time their voices were heard," Ms Haddad said.

"Minister Ferguson continues to push ahead with his plan to demolish homes on Dynnyrne Road despite strong opposition from residents, and despite the fact the plan won't address the issue of traffic congestion."

"A short extra strip of road from Olinda Grove to Macquarie Street is not going to fix traffic congestion and the community can see right through this cruel flawed plan."

"Mr Ferguson is planning to unnecessarily demolish people's homes, plunging them into the most inflated housing market we've ever seen, at a time when Hobart is the least affordable city to rent in the nation and the housing crisis continues to grow."

"The Minister's performance in Parliament today was incredibly disrespectful to residents, and despite saying there would be "far fewer" than 17 homes demolished, it is clear he has no idea what the actual number is."

"Mr Ferguson should stop this project, it is cruel and will not do anything to fix Hobart's traffic woes."

SOS Hobart 2021 member Tony Dell said the residents' group placed the red crosses on the fences of 17 Dynnyrne homes whose owners were told by the Government' consultants, WSP and Pitt and Sherry, that their homes were to be acquired and demolished.

"The Government continues to deny that this happened but have, nevertheless, refused to be transparent and publicly advise how many homes will be affected and how."

"It is on this issue that Michael Ferguson MP continues, erroneously, to say SOS is being misleading."

"We know that at least two houses, numbers 34 and 40 Dynnyrne Road, have been acquired and we think also number 42, but at least another 11 are in limbo with the (State) Government playing ducks and drakes; telling one owner one thing, other owner's other things and then changing its mind."

"It is a classic divide and conquer strategy based on the necessity for negotiations with individual owners but, coincidentally, being used as an invalid excuse for its lack of public transparency about its intentions."

"We also know that the other three of the original 17 have been given a wink and a nod that they won't now be impacted, but no written formal confirmation."

"Also at least one of those three has been again approached to discuss a probable impact."

The *Kingborough Chronicle* wrote to Minister Ferguson on November 25, asking for confirmation of the number of houses to be demolished.

"Can Minister Ferguson please confirm the number of properties to be demolished under the Government's

current plan?

"Has the Minister and/or the Tasmanian Liberals received political donations from private consultants, engineering and/or construction firms with potential to profit from removing homes and widening the Southern Outlet?"

"If so, would the Minister agree this could be a potential conflict of interest?"

Minister Ferguson did not confirm the exact number of properties to be demolished.

"Despite the incorrect assertions of Labor, there will be far fewer than 17 homes impacted by the project designed to help congested traffic move better," replied Minister Ferguson.

"Further, it should not be assumed that properties will be compulsorily acquired."

"I acknowledged in Parliament the concerns of those who signed the petition and I have instructed that property acquisitions should be minimised as part of this project, which will be to the benefit of the commuting public from Kingborough and the Huon Valley."

"The Southern Projects has, from inception to now, followed good governance and been subject to robust checks and balances, as have all our infrastructure projects."

"There is no conflict of interest."

The message on prostate cancer: get tested

Former Member for Huon Paul Harriss is now living with advanced, metastasized prostate cancer and has an important message for Tasmanian men.
Get tested.

Around 550 Tasmanian men are diagnosed with prostate cancer annually, meanwhile over 100 die from the disease each year.

Cancer Council Tasmania have been raising awareness of prostate cancer during November, holding an event at the Southern Cancer Support Centre in Sandy Bay on Wednesday, November 17.

Former Member for Huon Paul Harriss was invited along to share his cancer journey.

Paul's story is a warning on how not following-up a prostate-specific antigen (PSA) test can lead to devastating circumstances.

The PSA test is a blood test used to screen for prostate cancer and it can be done at a GP surgery.

"A good mate of mine died at the age of 58 in 2001," recalls Paul.

"I visited him a number of times after he had a prostatectomy, but he died three years later.

"After that, I decided to get a PSA test every year and I was very disciplined about it."

Paul said in April 2019, he went for a yearly test and the result recorded a "blip".

"My GP said I should get another test in three months," recalls Paul.

"I put the pathology form beside my car keys as a constant reminder.

"But when it came time, it was July in the middle of winter and I just never got around to dropping into pathology in Kingston.

"I had no symptoms and no pain".

Paul Harriss eventually had his next test in December 2020.

"I went to see my doctor for the results and he said, you're in trouble," continued Paul.

"My PSA reading was 24."

Paul had nuclear scans in January this year and returned to his doctor.

"The scans showed that the prostate cancer had metastasized into my bones (in particular the) pelvis, ribs and spine, but not into any organs.

"However, my PSA had jumped to 156, and I found out later the alarm bells start ringing at 5.9, so this was very aggressive".

Paul was immediately put on hormone therapy and over three months his PSA decreased to 1, but in September this year it began increasing again.

The 67-year-old is now working with his oncologist to extend his life for as long as possible and enjoying time with his four children and 11 grandchildren.

"I have no symptoms and very little pain," notes Paul.

"It was just the PSA test that I missed.

"If I had gone for that test in July 2019, who knows what may have happened.

"But those are 'what ifs' and I'm not going to live my life thinking like that.

"My attitude is that we have to deal with it and do whatever we can to extend life."

Paul said his message to Tasmanian men is, to be informed.

"Whatever the suggested age to have the PSA test, talk to your GP and have the blood test," said Paul.

"It's once a year, a little needle.

"Don't be complacent.

"Don't be ignorant.

"Just do it."

Cancer Council Tasmania CEO Penny Egan said major risk factors for prostate cancer include age and family history.

"Cancer Council recommends that men get to know the symptoms of prostate cancer, and if they experience any of these symptoms, they should discuss their options with their GP," said Ms Egan.

"Every man has the right to decide for himself whether or not to be tested, and that his decision should be an informed choice."

eScooters hit Tasmanian streets this summer

Electric scooters will be out and about on our streets this summer as another mode of transport, after the Tasmanian Government unanimously passed an amendment to the Traffic Act 1925.

The eScooters are restricted to a speed of 15 kilometres per hour on footpaths, and 25km/h on shared paths, bicycle paths and local roads.

Anyone aged 16 years or over can use an eScooter provided they wear a helmet, comply with all road rules and are not using a mobile phone.

Tasmania Police have the power to confiscate devices ridden without due care and attention.

The uptake of eScooters has grown in popularity in cities globally as a cost-effective, low-pollution and convenient

transport alternative, replacing cars for short commutes.

In a media release on November 22, Minister for Infrastructure and Transport, Michael Ferguson MP said councils will have the power to restrict footpaths that should not be shared and to add divided local roads to the network on a case-by-case basis.

"These modern e-scooters, which contain a range of

safety features such as pedestrian detection sensors and poor rider behaviour detection, will be used at certain speeds on most local roads, footpaths, shared paths and bicycle paths," said Minister Ferguson.

"A public education campaign on the legal and safe use of eScooters will be delivered next month, and an evaluation of the regulatory framework will be conducted after one year."

Bruny Island general meeting

The Bruny Island Community Association held its annual general meeting on Sunday, November 14 with the president of the association, Bill Hughes, re-elected unopposed.

The meeting inaugurated the Leigh Higgins Award for Volunteering, with Leigh himself the first awardee.

Leigh is a local ambulance service volunteer of 60 years, a former councillor and former principal of the Bruny Island District School.

Kingborough Councillor David Grace was awarded an honorary life membership of the association for his long-term service of Bruny Island ratepayers over 20 years.

Carer recognition consultation

Initial input is invited on the development of Carer Recognition legislation, with further consultation scheduled to take place in mid-2022.

Unpaid carers play a vital role, contributing significantly to the health, wellbeing and security of family members and friends who are in need of support and assistance.

The Tasmanian Department of Communities has released a short *Carer Recognition Legislation Discussion Paper*, including questions.

The discussion paper acknowledges that a person's caring role may be:

- Lifelong, such as an ageing parent or a partner or child with disability, acquired injury or chronic illness;
 - Short term, due to injury, acute illness, or end-of-life care; or
 - Episodic, due to mental ill health or degenerative conditions.
- Anyone can become a carer at any time during their

life, as a child, a young person, an adult, in retirement or old age.

They may be caring for their partner, parent, child, sister or brother, a relative or a friend.

They may be carers for a few months, several years or decades.

The unique journey of carers means that many do not see themselves as 'carers'.

They do what they do because it is a natural part, or extension of, their relationship with that person.

Written, video and audio submissions are being collected, and an online survey can be completed at https://www.communities.tas.gov.au/csr/policy/Policy_Work/car_policy_and_action_plan/car-recognition-legislation-consultation

Submissions, including the survey, will close on Friday, December 10.






