Double-edged home sale data

Two Kingborough suburbs have been listed among the top five best performing suburbs within Greater Hobart, for house sale and unit value categories, in the 12 months to September.

The news is grim, however, for locals in need of a home to rent or those seeking to purchase a first home. Blackmans Bay recorded the highest change in median

rental values of units across Greater Hobart, according to property analyst CoreLogic Best of Best Australia 2021 in a report released on December 16.

The median rental value for a unit in Blackmans Bay was \$451 per week, representing an annual change of 14.5 per cent.

Kingston units recorded a median rental value of

\$438 per week, representing an annual change of 13.9 per cent.

Kingston was also listed in the top five highest total value of unit sales for Greater Hobart, coming in fourth place with 54 units sold at a median sales value of \$583,557 during the 12-month period.

Blackmans Bay and Kingston were also in the top five

suburbs for the highest total value of house sales across Greater Hobart. Kingston, with 122 houses sold during the 12-month

period and a median sale value of \$703,851, came in

Blackmans Bay, with 89 houses sold, recorded a median sale value of \$895,414, coming in fourth place.

Virus exposure sites

Franklin Primary School, Huon Valley Takeaway and the Huonville Cellarbrations Bottle Shop were listed as 'low risk' COVID-19 public exposure sites on Sunday, December 19.

A media statement was sent by the Director of Public Health, Dr Mark Veitch on Sunday evening, regarding the Franklin exposure site.

Seven COVID-19 cases were recorded as active in Tasmania at the time.

"People who were at an end-of-year event at Franklin Primary School will be notified that the event is being listed as a low-risk exposure site after Public Health Services determined that a confirmed COVID-19 case was in attendance," stated Dr Veitch.

"Anyone who was at the event, which was held on the school's oval between 11:30am and 2pm on Thursday, December 16, must monitor themselves for symptoms for 14 days.

"If they experience any symptoms, regardless of how mild they may be, they will need to get tested.

"There is no requirement for anyone who was in attendance to quarantine unless they experience symptoms."

Anyone who was at the Huonville Cellarbrations Bottle Shop at Huon Village Shopping Centre, 79 Main Street, Huonville, between 2:22pm and 2:30pm on Thursday, December 16 must also monitor themselves for symptoms for 14 days and get tested if symptoms develop.

Similarly, anyone who was at the Huon Valley Takeaway at 3/56a Main Street, Huonville, between 2:30pm and 2:35pm on December 16.

"There are three different types of exposure sites; close contact, casual contact and low risk," noted Dr Veitch.

"Each classification requires people to take certain actions around testing and quarantining."

Masks back on as virus retu

Masks are required to be worn at indoor settings in Tasmania, after the coronavirus re-entered the community in recent days.

The mandate came less than five days after the State's border was reopened on December 15.

Seven COVID-19 cases were recorded as active in the State as of December 19.

In a media statement on Sunday, December 19, Premier of Tasmania, Peter Gutwein MP said Tasmanians would continue to "adjust" to living with COVID in the community.

The mask-wearing mandate applies at all indoor settings, other than a person's home, from Tuesday, December 21. However, the requirement does not apply to children aged 12 years and under.

Around 90 per cent of Tasmanians 12-years and over

have received at least two doses of an approved COVID-19 vaccine, while the rollout of vaccinations for children under 12-years is yet to commence.

Premier Gutwein said the wearing of masks would assist to limit the spread of the virus as we continue to see cases, and as we continue to adjust to living with COVID in our community.

"Masks will be mandatory for all indoor settings except in your place of residence, including on public transport or in taxis or ride sharing where you could come into contact with another person," said Premier

"I do want to stress once again, that this is not unexpected, we always knew that by reopening our borders, COVID would come, and it has."

Middleton on the Green will held on Saturday, February 5 next year, instead of the Middleton Country Fair.

The first Saturday in February is the traditional date

Expect to see dozens of scarecrows lining the Channel Highway, from Kettering to Verona Sands, in the lead-up to the fun day, generating a major attraction and talking point for residents and visitors alike. Scarecrows will appear from January 26 to February

26, reinforcing the Channel's reputation as scarecrow The scarecrow competition is organised by the South

Channel Ratepayers and Residents Association and West Winds Community Centre in Woodbridge.

The Middleton Country Fair has proved to be a major fundraiser for community projects in the South Channel and organisers are confident that next year's free community fun day will prove a popular replacement.

The Kingborough Chronicle is reliably informed that some scarecrows from past years proved to be highly desirable, with a few disappearing overnight at the hands of scarecrow snatchers seeking a back garden display, Next year the creators will be taking extra security

measures to foil potential raiders. The winning scarecrows will be judged by a public

vote, either via email or in person, at the community fun day on February 5. First place will receive \$200, with \$150 for second

place and \$50 for third.

Weapons used in public place

Two youths were taken into Tasmania Police custody on the evening of Tuesday, December 14 after an incident at a Kingston shopping centre.

Two members of the public were injured during the incident and received treatment at the scene from Ambulance Tasmania for non-life-threatening injuries.

Tasmania Police reported receiving multiple '000' calls around 8:30pm from members of the public relating to a disturbance at the Kingston Plaza Shopping Complex.

Members of the public reported two youths, armed with a hammer and a machete acting aggressively towards patrons and had assaulted a member of the public.

Two youths were taken into custody for the matter around 9pm.

Tasmania Police thanked the members of the public who witnessed the incident and immediately rang '000', it resulted in the alleged offenders being quickly taken

Tasmania Police have requested any members of the public who observed the incident, or the offenders in the vicinity, to contact police on 131 444 or Crime Stoppers Tasmania on 1800 333 000.

Vehicle set fire

Tasmania Police has advised that a Toyota Hilux utility was deliberately set on fire in the driveway of a private residence in Snug on Wednesday, December 15, around 2:40am. The Hilux and its contents were destroyed in the blaze.

A media release on December 17 stated three people had been charged in relation to two separate, deliberately lit fires in Snug and Cambridge.

Police said another, similar incident occurred in Cambridge on Thursday, December 18 around 2:30am, involving a break-in at a commercial business on Stanton Place, and setting fire to an Isuzu truck. The truck was partially destroyed and severe smoke

damage was caused to the building and contents. Three people were taken into custody on Thursday,

December 18, including a 27-year-old man from Campania, and a 26-year-old woman and 39-year-old man from Dodges Ferry.

The trio were charged with a range of offences including unlawfully setting fire to property, burglary and stealing.

Police believe the fires were targeted and have advised that investigations are continuing. Anyone with information is asked to contact Bellerive

Border reopened, items of note

Tasmania's border reopened last week with COVID-19 vaccinations for childcare workers mandated, the boostershot waiting period shortened, additional testing clinics announced and a range of rules for Tasmanian travellers and visitors from interstate and overseas.

On the eve of the border reopening, Premier of Tasmania, Peter Gutwein said the State Government had "made sure everyone has had the opportunity to be vaccinated" and he had a "clear message" for the Tasmanian public.

"More than 90 per cent of Tasmanians over 16 and nearly 90 per cent of Tasmanians over 12 now fully vaccinated," said Premier Gutwein.

"We are ready."

However, the roll-out of COVID-19 vaccinations for children aged 5 to 11 years is yet to begin.

A last-minute, childcare-worker mandate on December 14 came a week after the State Government announced vaccinations of children aged 5 to 11 years would commence on January 10, 2022.

State Vaccination Commander Dale Webster stated on December 14 that although children have lower risk of serious illness from COVID-19, they have high rates of viral infection and transmission.

"We know children and young people experience some of the highest rates of infection and are one of the biggest social spreaders of the virus in households," said

"By getting vaccinated children will be less likely to pass the virus on to other more vulnerable members of your household.'

The State Opposition welcomed the mandate for childcare workers however criticised the delay.

Shadow Minister for Education and Early Years Josh Willie MLC said on December 14 the mandate should have been introduced much sooner.

"With children under five unable to be vaccinated, it defies belief that it has taken until today, the day before the borders reopen, to mandate vaccines for childcare workers," Mr Willie said.

Vaccination booster shot wait time shortened

Booster shots are now available for people five months after their second dose of the COVID-19 vaccine.

Tasmanian Vaccination Emergency Operations Centre, Commander Dale Webster said the wait time had been shortened from six months in response to the increased transmissibility of the Omicron variant.

"Following advice from the Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation, appointments can now be made for booster shots for people five months after their second dose of the vaccine," said Mr Webster.

"Boosters are available in State clinics and at participating GP and pharmacy clinics.

"Bookings are essential at vaccination clinics as we transition away from walk-ins from Wednesday, December 15 to ensure COVID-19 safe management of crowds and waiting areas.

"If you have a State clinic booking matched to six months you are invited to make an earlier booking but please remember to cancel your existing booking, this can be done online.

Children's vaccinations

State Vaccination Commander Dale Webster stated on December 14 that parents could now book 5 to 11year-old children in for COVID-19 vaccinations at special children's clinics "to protect their children, their families and the wider community", although the vaccinations of children are not mandatory.

"Last week a smaller paediatric dose of the Pfizer vaccine was approved as safe and effective for children aged 5 to 11 by the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) and the Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation (ATAGI).

"Children will get two doses, eight weeks apart, but they

will only be available in special children's clinics and GPs.

"Appointments are available from 10 January 2022. with the aim of giving every primary school aged child the opportunity to get at least one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine before they return to school in February.

"The choice to vaccinate children in this cohort, while strongly recommended, is entirely voluntary and will not be mandated."

Testing clinics extended

Operating hours for the Hobart Macquarie Point drivethrough COVID-19 testing clinic have been extended to 8:30am to 6pm seven days a week, bookings are required, see https://covidtestbooking.health.tas.gov.au/ An additional testing clinic is also operating at the Hobart Showgrounds.

Traveller requirements

All travellers over 12 years of age must be fully vaccinated to come to Tasmania and must carry proof of vaccination and obtain a traveller registration Tas-E- Travel pass for scanning on arrival in Tasmania.

Travellers coming from areas declared by the Tasmanian Government to be a 'high-risk', due to COVID-19 cases in the area, must produce a negative COVID test before coming to Tasmania.

"All travellers entering Tasmania will be required to complete a Tas-E-Travel pass, which is now available on the Tas-E-Travel website," said Premier Gutwein.

"All travellers will be required to carry proof of vaccination and/or their negative COVID test result with them, whether that's a digital vaccination certificate and COVID-19 negative test result SMS message, or hard

"Anyone caught flouting our rules faces an on-thespot fine of \$1557 and could be summonsed and charged with an offence resulting in up to six months iail or a \$17,000 fine.

Traveller registration Tas-E-Travel passes can be obtained up to seven days before intended travel and are available at https://register.tasetravel.tas.gov.au/

A new warning system

The Australian Calls to Action system is a new national approach to information and calls to action for hazards like bushfire, flood, storm, cyclone, extreme heat and severe weather.

Until now there has been different warning systems for different hazard types across Australia.

The new Australian warning system aims to provide consistent warnings to Australian communities so that people know what to do when they see a warning level.

If you live in a bushfire risk area, you may already be familiar with the new warnings as they were implemented across bushfire agencies in the lead up to the 20/21 fire season.

A warning provides point-in-time information about a hazard that is impacting or is expected to impact communities.

It describes the impact and expected consequences for communities and includes advice on what people should do.

There are three warning levels using coloured triangles in yellow, orange and red, each with actions on what to do.

Calls to Action can be used flexibly across all three warning levels depending on the hazard, whether it be bushfire, flood, storm, cyclone, extreme heat or severe weather.

Advice - Yellow triangle

An incident has started, there is no immediate danger.

- Prepare now
- Stay informed
- Monitor conditions
- · Stay informed/threat is reduced

Watch and Act - Orange triangle

There is a heightened level of threat, conditions are changing and start taking action now to protect your life.

- Prepare to leave/evacuate
- Leave/evacuate now (if you are not prepared)
 - · Prepare to take shelter
 - Move/stay indoors
- Stay near shelter
- Walk two or more streets back
- · Monitor conditions as they are changing
- Be aware of ember attacks
- Move to higher ground (away from creeks/rivers/coast)
- Limit time outside (cyclone, heat asthma)
- Avoid the area
- Stay away from damaged buildings and other hazards
- Prepare for isolation
- Protect yourself against the impacts of extreme heat **Emergency Warning - Red triangle**

The highest level of warning, meaning you may be in danger and need to take action immediately.

Any delay now puts your life at risk.

- Leave/evacuate (immediately, by am/pm/hazard timing)
- Seek/take shelter now
- Shelter indoors now
- Too late/dangerous to leave

Only rain in our drains

Street stencil art is sending an important environmental message this summer, as Kingborough's primary school students use their imaginations and creativity to help keep pollutants out of stormwater drains, our natural waterways and ocean.

The artwork contains the simple message, "only rain in our drains'

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said the artwork would be positioned near drains on local footpaths.

Schools involved to date include Kingston, Margate and Illawarra Primary Schools.

"Stormwater is the water that runs off pavements, roads, rooves, gardens, parks, car parks and construction sites when it rains," Mayor Wriedt said.

"It is important that everyone understands that whatever gets washed down Kingborough's stormwater drains ends up in our waterways and beaches.

"As people move about Kingborough, these creative street stencils will remind everyone that stormwater is connected to our waterways."

Kingborough Council's Natural Areas Interpretation Officer, Bridget Jupe said the stencil designs were inspired by participants in Council's school holiday program.

'We have worked these ideas into a series of street stencils and will be placing them in prime locations with the help of a number of schools in Kingborough," Ms Jupe said.

"The stencils will be promoting the message 'only rain in our drains'.

"We hope to roll this project out to other municipalities located on the Derwent Estuary and build on stormwater education in all our communities.

Swimming is not advised at any beach in the Derwent estuary for two days after heavy rain, as beaches are likely to be impacted by stormwater.

Kingborough Council said their environmental health officers shall conduct weekly water sampling at local swimming beaches during summer. Sampling results are to be posted to the Derwent

Estuary's Beach Watch program.

Coronation Turkey

Kingston chef, Kirsten Bacon, has kindly compiled some helpful, tasty recipes for anyone who ends Christmas Day wondering what to do with all the food.

"I have a couple of wicked recipes that work well with leftovers," notes Kirsten.

"Great for Boxing Day is Coronation Turkey traditionally known as Coronation Chicken and the story behind that is a good read here https://www.cordonbleu.edu/london/coronation-chicken/en

"So, for my recipe, you can use chicken or turkey.

"Both work really well and it's fabulous in this weather.
"The beauty about this is really you don't need to have the exact amount of ingredients and you can be a little experimental.

"By that I mean don't go too outside the recipe but if you don't have apricot chutney, then use another one.
"If you don't have apricots, perhaps use mango."

INGREDIENTS

• 500g to 1kg of cooked turkey or chicken shredded

- 1 bunch of spring onions, sliced
- 150g apricot chutney
- 100g crème fraiche or Greek natural yoghurt
- 200g whole egg mayonnaise (the soy one works a treat too)
- 1/2 cup chopped dried apricots
- 3 Tbsp sliced, toasted almonds
- 1/2 tsp Keens Curry powder, or to taste
- 2 Tbsp chopped fresh coriander
- Salt and pepper to taste

METHOD

- 1. Mix chutney, mayonnaise, crème fraiche (or yoghurt), spring onions and curry powder together.
- 2. Gently fold in chicken, apricots, almonds and coriander, reserving a little of the coriander and almonds.
- 3. Add salt and pepper to taste. Let sit for 30 minutes to let flavours develop. Place in in serving dish and garnish with remaining coriander and almonds.

- 3. Arrange vegetables in dish and sprinkle with herbs. Pour egg mixture over.
- Bake for 25 minutes. Cover with foil and bake a further 10-15 minutes, until set. Cut into wedges.




