Honours for local Police

Australia Day Honours were awarded to two Tasmania Police officers on Wednesday, January 26 in recognition of their outstanding contribution to policing.

Detective Sergeant Shane Sinnitt, who has served Criminal Investigation Branches at Kingston, Bellerive and Hobart, and Commander Debbie Williams each received the Australian Police Medal which gives special recognition to members of Australian police forces for commendable service.

Expressing his congratulations, Commissioner Hine said, "On behalf of Tasmania Police, I congratulate Commander Debbie Williams and Detective Sergeant Shane Sinnitt on today's honour."

"Detective Sergeant Shane Sinnitt is a highly respected member of Tasmania Police, with over 25 years policing experience, predominantly in the field of Criminal Investigation.

"As a highly skilled investigator, Detective Sergeant Sinnitt was an instrumental part of the team who investigated the murder of Bob Chappell.

"In what was an extremely prolonged and complex investigation, the murder conviction was in part due to Detective Sergeant Sinnitt's commitment, professionalism and attention to detail throughout the investigation.

"Commander Debbie Williams has been a pioneer and trailblazer during her diverse career, which spans more than 30 years across the state.

"Leading by example with a wealth of policing knowledge, Commander Williams is an advocate and mentor to many.

"Commander Williams is notably the first female officer to be promoted to Commander of a geographical policing command.

"The commendable service of both Commander Debbie Williams and Detective Sergeant Shane Sinnitt makes them both worthy recipients of the Australian Police Medal."

Born and raised in Electrona, Detective Sergeant Sinnitt grew up locally and has always lived in Kingborough with his wife and five children.



All about Tasmania

Over the past four years, local history-gatherer John Tait has compiled an all-encompassing overview of Tasmania since it was first discovered by white men in 1642.

Detailed in an interesting fact-filled style, John covers the early events shaping the way the land was managed by the early British, and who those important figures were.

Included are multiple photos of Tasmania's wild scenery and multiple photos of Tasmania's classic homes with historical references.

There are over 16,300 alphabetically-listed Tasmanian place-names accompanied by why each was named, historical references to those associated

with each place-name, and distinct map reference points as to how to find each place.

John intends to create a website designed to attract locals and potential Tasmanian tourists to buy and download this huge 2,400 plus screen-size, 1.3 million-word summary.

"I has been waiting until the dreaded virus seems to have been squashed to the size of influenza, and tourism will thrive again," said John.

"Yet to be decided, but I guess the cost of a download will be about \$12, and Mr Google and Mr PayPal will take their share out of that, leaving John a wee margin for all his multiple hours of information-gathering."

Big dash to sign for greyhounds

In the last few years, greyhounds have joined the brigade of dogs, including labradors, poodle crosses, and bitzers, to become frequent and welcome participants in the thriving scene at the local dog parks, beaches, cafes and places where fur friends congregate with humans.

Greyhound Rehabilitation Enthusiasts and Advocates Tasmania (GREAT) said a loud call is going out for Kingborough dog owners to mobilise in large numbers and take ten seconds to make a stand on behalf of the greyhounds and their unfortunate brethren still languishing in Tasmania's often lethal dog racing industry.

Locals will see signs going up at places like the Kingston Dog Beach.

A petition to State Parliament was launched last month with strong support from the Kingborough Dog Walking Association, the RSPCA and other dog advocacy organisations.

"There is nothing radical about the petition," said Deborah Bauer on behalf of GREAT.

"It simply calls on the State Government, and the Labor Opposition, to stop providing taxpayer money to prop up dog racing.

"The petition has rapidly become the most popular on the Parliamentary petitions website with nearly 3000 signatures at time of writing.

"The target is 12,000 by the cut-off date of June 9,

which would make it the biggest petition ever in Tasmania. "Dog owners increasingly realise that greyhounds are no different to any other canine.

"It's their rotten luck that they run fast, so some people like to bet on them for fun.

"As anyone who has encountered one at the dog park knows, they're friendly, goofy, laid-back and make ideal pets."

Last year the Coalition for the Protection of Greyhounds reported 171 track deaths and a staggering 10,198 injuries.

"But what sets jaws dropping is the fact that Tasmania actually props up this carnage with our hard earned taxpayer dollars," Ms Bauer continued.

"It is the last straw in the minds of many.

"The majority of pet lovers agree that in 2022 there is no good reason why the greyhound breed should continue to be the permanent underdog of the canine world.

"If you looked closely at a greyhound you'll see the delicacy of the limbs, and the fact that you can see daylight through them, along with the fine tracery of blood vessels.

"Just picture what happens if six or eight of these dogs collide into each other or a barrier at 70km per hour."

Tasmanians in housing crisis insulted by government's spin

The State Government is more interested in trying to spin the true extent of its housing failures than provide solutions for thousands of Tasmanian families trapped in accommodation crisis according to Labor Shadow Housing Minister, Ella Haddad.

Minister Haddad said the Report on Government Services released recently showed that despite its claims to be building homes, the Liberal Government continues to oversee a housing crisis.

Ms Haddad said for the Government to claim today that Tasmania "continues to perform well on housing and homelessness assistance" was an insult to each of the 4,400 families on the housing wait list and shows just how out of touch Ministers Michael Ferguson and Elise Archer are.

Minister Michael Ferguson said the "Government is investing an unprecedented \$615 million into social and affordable housing, and homelessness initiatives, to ensure that more Tasmanians have a place that they

can call home, and these figures are underpinning Tasmania's strong building sector."

"We are taking decisive action and the results show that so far the Affordable Housing Strategy has delivered a total of 1,922 additional new homes, land lots and new places in supported accommodation and homeless services, including 938, since July 2019," Mr Ferguson said.

"This is on top of the 1,370 dwellings in the pipeline, including 1,075 new social housing dwellings, 192 supported accommodation units and 103 homeless accommodation units.

"There were also 300 building approvals in November 2021, in seasonally adjusted terms, which was 40.8 per cent higher than the October 2021 figure."

Ms Haddad didn't agree with Mr Ferguson's view on the housing crisis.

"The reality felt by thousands of Tasmanians paints a very different picture," Ms Haddad said.

"There are already more than 4,400 families on the

housing waiting list, with an average wait time of over a year to be housed.

"Ms Archer and Mr Ferguson claim social housing is keeping pace with population growth, but they know that even on their own projections the wait list is set to blow out to over 5,000 imminently.

"Michael Ferguson has boasted he is delivering "a house a day" but even if that were the case, what that actually means is he will fall short of even meeting his own targets of 3,500 homes by 2027.

"Meanwhile Tasmanians are sleeping rough, emergency shelters are turning away people in droves because they are full and there is insufficient transitional housing available to transition people from emergency shelters into secure housing.

"The Government says the ROGS data shows people who need housing are being housed but they know that is just not true.

"There are thousands of Tasmanians missing out

every day under this government and things are only getting worse on their watch."

Mr Ferguson responded to Ms Haddad's comments. "Rather than criticising the news of 150 approved Ancillary Dwelling Grants for units and granny flats, I'm sure the Tasmanians who will now be able to access and live in one of these units in the future will be extremely grateful.

"The Tasmanian Government's comprehensive plan to increase housing supply is the only way to make housing as affordable as possible for Tasmanians.

"There will always be more we can all do to reduce homelessness and provide housing support and the Tasmanian Liberal Government recognises the real struggles that many Tasmanians are experiencing.

"The Tasmanian Liberal Government will continue to invest record amounts into social and affordable housing, even as Labor continues to ignore the record housing effort in Tasmania," Mr Ferguson concluded.

Under-developed COVID Return to School plan needs revising

The Australian Education Union Tasmanian Branch (AEU) has called on the State Government to revisit its "under-developed" back-to-school plan amid growing teacher unrest ahead of the 2022 school year.

AEU representatives this week met with Government and Department of Education (DoE) officials to raise concerns about the COVID Return to School plan, a measure union President David Genford said lacked initiative.

It comes as the AEU this week released its eight-point Safe Schools 2022 operational plan outlining measures needed in Tasmanian schools to help safeguard staff and students against COVID-19.

The AEU is calling for:

Proper ventilation audit

Ventilation in all school learning spaces must, as a matter of urgency, be measured using CO2 monitors to determine if they are safe for staff and student occupancy.

Isolation requirements

Educators must not be exempted from the definition of close contacts.

This forces staff to return to work, despite knowing they could be a risk to their students and colleagues.

Proper and adequate mask availability in all schools

Cloth and surgical masks are insufficient to adequately protect people from the Omicron variant.

The Government must ban cloth masks for students and make available N95 or P2 masks to all staff.

Free and available RATs

Rapid Antigen Tests need to be made available freely to all staff, students and families to keep schools safe and reassure anxious parents, carers, students and staff.

Thorough assessment of available relief teacher numbers

To ensure schools can continue operating safely, proper assessment is needed to identify all relief teachers willing and able to work in 2022.

Flexible working arrangements

Educators should only be required to attend their school for tasks which require their physical presence, such as teaching. Other duties should be undertaken remotely.

Reduced gatherings

All non-essential activities and events with increased attendance or participation should be postponed for safety reasons, including physical gatherings like assemblies.

Ongoing support and consultation

The AEU is ready and willing to work with DoE and Government to ensure learning in 2022 occurs in the safest possible way.

So that this can happen, the DoE must frequently update and consult with educators ahead of any further measures.

Mr Genford said teachers and school staff were rightfully feeling anxious about returning school with the limited safety measures in place.

"Parents, as well as teachers, are also understandably concerned about sending their kids to school under the current arrangements," Mr Genford said.

"While it's pleasing to finally see a government back-to-school COVID plan in place, it's clear much more needs doing.

"The safety of our staff and students cannot be compromised.

"Bare minimum safety measures are not good enough.

"The State Government must show a proactive approach and do everything possible to prevent COVID outbreaks in our schools."

The State Government's COVID schools plan comes as the Federal Labor Party this week pledged to significantly invest in education during the COVID-19 recovery, with new targeted funding for public schools.

"We warmly welcome this commitment of \$50 million for COVID-19 related capital works which

would help our schools access much needed resources such as air purifiers, improved ventilation and outdoor classrooms, ensuring our school communities can be as safe as possible," Mr Genford said.

"Providing public schools with 100 per cent of the Schooling Resource Standard will ensure Tasmanian schools have more teachers, smaller class sizes, greater individual attention and more support to assist students to achieve to their full potential."

Acting Minister for Education, Jeremy Rockliff commented on the State Government's Return to School plan. "The health and wellbeing of our staff and students is our highest priority.

"We know our classrooms are the best place for students, for learning and engagement, a position supported by public health at a national and state level.

"It is important students attend school regularly to learn, to support their health and wellbeing and have minimal disruption to do so.

"The Tasmanian Government has been actively engaging with the AEU throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, with regular meetings in place with senior Department leadership.

"Last week I met with the AEU and other Tasmanian Union representatives on the Return to School plan and I appreciated their input.

"Tasmanians can be assured that the COVID-19 Return to School plan is strongly informed by Public

Health advice, with a combination of COVID safe measures to be in place in our schools to keep our learners and staff as safe as possible.

Key measures in the Plan include:

- All schools having Outbreak Management Plans in place.
- Students not automatically being defined as close contacts in a classroom. Parents and carers will be notified if a positive case is detected in the classroom and asked to monitor for symptoms.
- Improved ventilation of learning areas with opened windows, checking and maintenance of mechanical ventilation, and the use of air purifiers in learning areas.
- Masks being mandatory for all secondary students in indoor settings. These will be supplied where needed. Masks will be available for primary school students should they wish to wear one.
- Rapid Antigen Tests being provided to both school staff and students to use if they are symptomatic.
- Virtual learning approaches to support students required to isolate.

"We will continue to take Public Health advice and will always consider any reasonable suggestions that might further improve our strong Return to School plan.

"We acknowledge that this is a challenging period, but we are putting these balanced measures in place as part of our transition to living with COVID-19 in our community," Mr Rockliff said.

Labor's plan for schoolkids and COVID

The Federal Member for Franklin, Julie Collins MP, has welcomed a commitment Federal Labor will deliver \$440 million to schools for better ventilation, building upgrades and mental health support, as part of a new plan to help Australian kids bounce back after COVID, if elected at the upcoming Federal election.

"As schools prepare to return for 2022, parents are worried sick about sending their kids back to school," said Ms Collins.

"Scott Morrison's delays getting a COVID vaccine for young people, and a shortage of Rapid Antigen Tests, means many students will be more exposed than they should be returning to class.

"Under Labor's plan, schools in Franklin will be able to access grants from a Local Schools Upgrade Fund to improve air quality with measures such as better ventilation, building more outdoor classrooms, replacing boarded-up windows and doors and buying air purifiers.

"Funding will be available for other much needed school upgrades as well.

"Labor will also provide schools with extra funding to

get children's mental health and wellbeing back on track with a Student Wellbeing Boost.

"This will mean more school counsellors and psychologists, and extra funding for camps, excursions, as well as sporting and social activities that improve kids' wellbeing.

"The past two years have been tough for many Tasmanian families.

"This funding will be a welcome addition to our schools and to our kids' wellbeing to ensure that teachers and kids are kept as safe as possible at school."

"Labor doesn't want any Tasmanian child held back because of the pandemic.

"Our plan will help make sure our schools are safe places for kids to learn and our investment in mental health and school upgrades will make sure every kid can get back on track and benefit from a world class education.

"I want to thank our teachers and school staff for the extraordinary work they have done in adapting to COVID-safe learning environments and trust that this extra funding will go a long way in assisting these efforts." Ms Collins said.

Schools returning with safer school buses

The State Government's recent media release states that "Tasmanians can be rest assured that contingencies are in place to allow for safe school bus travel when students start heading back to school."

New measures have been put in place including additional cleaning of all dedicated school buses with a focus on high-contact areas.

Parents are reminded that it is a requirement for children aged 12 years and older (unless exempt) to wear a mask in all public indoor spaces.

This includes buses, taxis and ride-share services.

While bus drivers are not responsible for policing mask-wearing or for providing masks, the Government has urged all Tasmanian students to do the right thing to keep themselves and the community safe by wearing a mask.

The Department of State Growth is working with bus operators to manage service continuity should COVID-19 impact on availability of bus drivers.

Advice on school bus cleaning has been circulated to all contracted school bus operators regarding regular cleaning of bus interiors, and students are also encouraged to get a Greencard or multi-trip tickets for cashless payment.


In addition, the Department of State Growth has planned to cater for services known to have increased demand.

If capacity issues arise, the Department will work with relevant operators to monitor services and vary contracts where appropriate.

Importantly, students should not use public transport or go to school if they are unwell.

To support physical distancing, students should consider the following:

- When queuing at bus stops, maintain physical distancing from other passengers.
- Always comply with requests from the driver.
- Practice good hand hygiene. If possible, use hand sanitiser before you board and after you disembark.

Blood donations will continue to be counted by the teams with donations counting towards their annual tally.

Booster cut to three months

Tasmanians aged 18 and over will be able to get their booster shot three months from the date of their second dose of vaccine from today, Tuesday, February 1.

The new three-month booster interval will be cut from the current four-month interval in line with advice from the Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisations (ATAGI).

This means about 66,000 more Tasmanians will become eligible for a booster shot and be able to increase their immunity against COVID-19.

Nearly 145,000 Tasmanians have had a booster, or more than a third of people aged 18 and over.

It's also a timely reminder that there are still 60,000 people aged 50 and over who haven't had their booster, leaving them more vulnerable to the potentially serious effects of COVID.

"We've seen from the experience in other countries and across the world that the booster is the best way to strengthen your immunity and continue protecting your-

self, your family and the community against the Omicron variant," said Jeremy Rockliff, Minister for Health.

"Now is not the time to be complacent.

"I want to encourage all Tasmanians to check when they had their second dose of the vaccine and when that three month milestone arrives, I urge them to please book that booster.

"Thousands of booster appointments are available in state-run vaccination centres across Tasmania including at ongoing clinics in Burnie, Devonport, Hobart and Launceston.

"Bookings are also available at pharmacies and GPs who are doing a phenomenal job administering boosters in record numbers."

In the last two weeks pharmacies and GPs have delivered 55,000 vaccinations, the highest number since the start of the rollout.







Stage 1 water restrictions in place until February 28

TasWater is reminding the greater Hobart community, including Kingborough, that stage 1 water restrictions still apply for the region.

The greater Hobart area includes all suburbs within the City of Hobart, along with Glenorchy, Brighton, Clarence, New Norfolk, Kingborough, Sorell, Kempton, Colebrook and surrounding suburbs.

TasWater Asset Management Services General Manager, Matt Derbyshire said the greater Hobart water supply is still facing the same impacts it did ahead of the Christmas period.

"Months of heavy rain prior to December impacted on water quality, causing turbidity in our storages which has led to the issues that we are still experiencing," Mr Derbyshire said.

These factors also come at a time when TasWater is undertaking a \$200 million upgrade of the Bryn Estyn water treatment plant, which will help ensure capacity for greater Hobart into the future.

"We are encouraging Hobart residents and visitors to continue to be mindful of their water use while stage 1 water restrictions are still in place.

"These measures are based on advice from our engineers, scientists, and field operators who monitor our systems across the state."


Stage 1 requires only small changes to how people use water, with the aim of reducing non-essential water use by 20 per cent by encouraging more conscious use of water at home, outside, and at work.

"We thank the community for their continued cooperation to reduce water usage as it is a precious and finite resource," Mr Derbyshire said.

"TasWater is working on water surety improvements for the greater Hobart drinking water supply to increase the capacity of the system into the future."

Greater Hobart will be on stage 1 water restrictions until February 28, 2022.

Aerial firefighting fleet bolstered

Tasmania's firefighting capacity has been bolstered with the launch of the summer aviation fleet to help keep Tasmanians safe from the threat of bushfires.

Tasmania now has 12 specialised aircraft on hand to help fight fires from above, including a mix of firebombing, air supervision and aerial intelligence gathering aircraft.

Eight are helicopters and four are fixed wing planes. These aircraft are made possible through the collaboration of the Tasmanian and Australian Governments who jointly fund the aircraft through the National Aerial Firefighting Centre.

The fleet are all strategically positioned so that they can be moved quickly around the State to respond to fires.

In addition, 20 local aircraft are available to call on to assist when required, taking the total firefighting aircraft available in Tasmania to 32.

This will ensure a rapid response to bushfires when they start, keeping fires small until ground crews arrive.

"Tasmania is well prepared for the bushfire season, and we recognise the importance of having access to a sophisticated, flexible, aerial firefighting capability to respond to bushfires, protect our communities and to support firefighters on the ground," said Jacquie Petrusma, Minister for Police, Fire and Emergency Management.

"The Tasmania Fire Service, Parks and Wildlife Service and Sustainable Timbers Tasmania have been busy prepar-

ing for, and responding to bushfires over the last month.

"We know that investing in the aerial firefighting fleet is a critical part of keeping Tasmanians safe during bushfire season.

The Tasmanian Government is investing \$111.5 million over the forward estimates for bushfire prevention and safety measures.


