

## Motions and applications moved

The Kingborough Council Meeting was held online on Monday, February 7 where a number of key decisions were made by Kingborough Councillors.

"While the meetings have temporarily moved online, we are still having robust discussions and progressing important matters," said Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt.

"Amongst the items considered at the Meeting were significant trees, customer service and complaints policies, a development application and three councillor motions raising matters of community concern."

Council considered three motions, the first from Cr Gideon Cordover, seeking to improve public safety in Kingborough through Council's advocacy on a range of service provisions.

Following debate, Council agreed to focus on lobbying the State Government for construction of an Urgent Care Centre for the state's south and a new ambulance station for the Channel.

# **Leslie Vale** new home for cricket

Six years of begging councils, schools and cricket clubs for access to grounds has finally come to an end for the Intercultural Sports League (ICSL), thanks to a partnership with Kingborough Council and support from Cricket Tasmania.

Leslie Vale Oval will be the new home of the ICSL.

President of the ICSL, John Paul Palissery, said "This announcement is a real game changer for us."

"ICSL has grown every year since its inception.

"We now have more than 200 players and 13 teams, including our first women's team which started this season."

ICSL first met with then Mayor of Kingborough, Dean Winter seeking use of the Leslie Vale ground.

Soon after the ICSL secured a State Government grant for around \$70,000 to redevelop the ground, including a synthetic wicket.

Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt joined Cricket Tasmania's manager for community cricket, Ben Smith, along with Elise Archer MP, for the announcement of the new home ground on Friday, February 4 at the Leslie Vale Oval.

"Kingborough Council is delighted that we have been able to help facilitate a secure program for the Intercultural Sports League through the use of Leslie Vale Oval," said Mayor Wriedt.

"The Intercultural Sports League now has more than 200 players and 13 teams.

"This is an amazing achievement for all involved.

"Promoting multiculturalism through a shared love of cricket, the Intercultural Sports League is making change at grass roots, or turf

"We look forward to completion of the works on Leslie Vale Oval next year and the League hosting their first home games.

"As is evidenced by the numbers attending our citizenship ceremonies and the breadth of countries they represent, it is clear Kingborough is becoming increasingly multicultural and it is fantastic that our newly arrived residents can link into something like the Intercultural Sports League," said Mayor Wriedt.

Finding grounds on which to play was both a challenge and limitation for the ICLS.

The ICSL competition was the focus of a short SBS documentary released last year titled Sidelines, that followed the journey of a of working-class white Australian team, the Derwent Scorpions, as they interacted with players from a wide range of cultural backgrounds.

ICSL received the Human Rights Award for Tasmania in 2018.



#### Long grass reply

Dear Editor,

In reply to Ms Hofman's letter (1 Feb 2022), Council's roadside slashing program typically starts towards the end of October and finishes around the end of February.

We are on track to finish this program within the allocated timeframe.

This year, some south-eastern Tasmania weather stations had had their highest total spring rainfall on record and other sites had their highest total spring rainfall for at least 20 years.

The exceptional wet spring and early summer has extended the growing period.

This results in us seeing more growth than usual in areas that are scheduled for the latter end of the slash-

Similarly, areas that were cut earlier may need to be

Council will undertake additional cuts when required.

It is also important to note that Council is not responsible for State Roads and roundabouts.

We are currently engaging with State Growth about taking on the maintenance of these as part of our program but at this stage, the slashing of those areas cannot be undertaken by Council.

In order for our crews to understand which areas are of concern, it is best to send an email to kc@kingborough to report any concerns about unslashed road verges.

#### Restrictions lifted for Hawthorn and Snug Villages

Christian Homes Tasmania (CHT) has reported that both spread of the virus," Mr Hardwick said. of their aged facilities are currently out of lockdown.

CHT, which operates the Hawthorn Village and Snug Village facilities, advised that visitation restrictions were lifted on 15 January 2022 after being released by the Public Health Unit.

In addition to restricting visits to the facilities, increased levels of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) was deployed, which ensured that there was no internal spread of the virus within the facility.

CHT said it was well prepared for the community spread of COVID and its Outbreak Management Plan was able to contain the virus which resulted in the lifting of the lockdowns.

According to management, CHT remains aware of the potential impact from community transmission and has continued strict entry requirements for staff, visitors and

Monitoring of staff with daily Rapid Antigen Tests (RAT) are being undertaken and levels of PPE precautions are

Chief Executive Officer, Glenn Hardwick, stated all CHT staff performed well during the lockdowns.

"It was through their dedication and commitment that the residents were kept safe and prevented any further

"In addition to working in full PPE and practicing infection control procedures, staff also worked additional shifts and extended hours to cover for staff who were furloughed due to the virus

"During this time, staff ensured that residents were kept active and facilitated family contact via phone calls and on-line video calls.

"Staff are to be commended for keeping our residents safe during this difficult time," Mr Hardwick said.

# Council to seek scientific advice

A motion from Cr Clare Glade-Wright was sought to prohibit the use of glyphosate in fenced children's playgrounds.

"As Council officers already use an organic herbicide and undertake hand weeding for weed control in fenced children's playgrounds, and because the European Food Safety Agency will be releasing a comprehensive assessment of glyphosate this year, Council determined to defer this matter until the new scientific information is available and to work from an evidence base," said Mayor Wriedt.

"Like all Tasmanian councils, Kingborough Council refers to the Australian Pesticides and Veterinary

Medicines Authority (APVMA) as the overarching agency and follows their advice regarding herbicide products.

"Regardless, Council officers have been investigating other, non-chemical, treatment methods for some time now.

"We will continue to monitor scientific advice and legislative changes and will adjust our policies and practices accordingly," said Mayor Wriedt.

Cr Glade-Wright's second motion was to seek Local Government Association of Tasmania improved clarity around the circumstances in which fire bunkers can be approved.

Council approved, with conditions, eight multiple dwellings at 165 Redwood Road Kingston.

"While limited stationery and supplies are sometimes provided, it is significantly less than what students need to get through the school year," said Mr O'Byrne.

"The donations received so far have filled a room in my electorate office.

"It's amazing to see the community come together and help these kids out," David O'Byrne said.

With the help of various community organisations, Neighborhood Houses and schools, supply packs will be provided to primary and high school students in need of assistance.

Some supplies will be provided to schools directly.

#### Council's new complaints policy

During the Kingborough Council meeting on Monday, February 7, Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt vacated her chair in order to move Council's new Complaints Management Policy.

"This is something I have feel very strongly about", said Mayor Wriedt.

"There has been considerable consultation and the staff have done a lot of work on this and I think it is now

a best practice approach. "We have modelled our approach on the Victorian Ombudsman's Framework which has been in place, tested and reviewed over a number of years.

"By implementing such a system, Kingborough Council can ensure its complaints mechanisms are integrated throughout Kingborough's operational activities and are effective, efficient and promote fairness, integrity, and administrative excellence.

"The proposed policy incorporates most of the changes and additions suggested by respondents who provided submissions.

"The Policy will be effective from March 21 allowing for a period of staff training," Mayor Wriedt said.

Related to the Complaints Management Policy, Council also approved an updated Customer Service Charter to ensure alignment of approach.

# Significant trees set to be protected

Kingborough Council is determined to move to public consultation on 11 potential significant tree listings following an assessment of nominations by Council officers at a meeting on Tuesday, February 8.

The 11 listings represent over 200 trees in the municipality. "The main mechanism for protecting significant trees is through including them in Kingborough's planning scheme, requiring a planning scheme amendment," said Dr Katrena Stephenson, Director of Environment, Development and Community at Kingborough Council. "This is why it is easier to consider a lot of nomina-

"We can now move on some longstanding nominations and clear our backlog.

"Council unanimously supported these nominations going out to public consultation for four weeks.

"Owners and occupiers of a property or adjoining properties to a tree that is proposed to be listed will be contacted directly in writing.

"A report will then come back to Council with all the feedback and Council can determine to amend any of the proposed listings or not before it is formally progressed to the Tasmanian Planning Commission.'

"They also get to meet with politicians and other decision makers at an annual statewide event to present their views on the big topics of the day and participate in fun creative activities.

"It's really important for the members of the CCYP Ambassador Program to be as diverse and representative of Tasmania's young population as possible.

"That's why I'm really encouraging children and young people from all backgrounds to apply for the

"You don't have to be the most academically gifted or the best public speaker to apply.

"Ideally, we'd have CCYP Ambassadors from all corners of the state, from diverse ethnic, cultural, social and religious backgrounds, diverse genders, different capabilities and different life experiences, and so forth.

"Support for anyone with particular needs can also be put in place to ensure everyone can participate

"The only eligibility requirements to become a CCYP Ambassador is that you must be aged from 10 to 17 years of age when you apply, be a resident of Tasmania and be able to attend at least two CCYP Ambassador meetings in 2022."

# Nierinna Creek working bee

The Tramway Hill Landcare Group held a working bee on Wednesday, February 2 at the Nierinna Creek Reserve.

Volunteers for the working bee were Roz Thurn, Morris Worsley, Angela Brinkhoff and David Reynolds.

The weather during the working bee was fine and the Nierinna Creek was not flowing.

A goose and some bandicoots were spotted on the dam and some native hens on the reserve.

Sadly, one dead eastern barred bandicoot was found in a plastic shopping bag partly submerged in the creek. Volunteers reported that the Reserve was overgrown and appeared not to have been slashed for some time and the weeds are prolific in certain areas.

Some interesting fungi were observed growing on fallen poplars south side of the creek.

Work carried out included weeding of Scotch thistle (some flowering and around two meters tall), other types of thistle, broom, Spanish heath (a small number of small plants), hemlock (large and flowering), umbrella sedge (many flowering at the Reserve entrance and some on the edges of the creek), elderberry, greater burdock (some flowering), monbretia (flowering), hawthorn (small plants) and blackberries.

Stakes and guards from the larger plants were also


