## Leslie Vale new home for cricket

Six years of begging councils, schools and cricket clubs for access to grounds has finally come to an end for the Intercultural Sports League (ICSL), thanks to a partnership with Kingborough Council and support from Cricket Tasmania Leslie Vale Oval will be the new home of the ICSL.
President of the ICSL, John Paul Palissery, said "This announcemen s a real game changer for us."
"ICSL has grown every year since its inception.
"We now have more than 200 players and 13 teams, including ou first women's team which started this season."
ICSL first met with then Mayor of Kingborough, Dean Winte seeking use of the Leslie Vale ground.
Soon after the ICSL secured a State Government grant for around $\$ 70,000$ to redevelop the ground, including a synthetic wicket.
Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt joined Cricket Tasmania manager for community cricket, Ben Smith, along with Elise Archer MP, for the announcement of the new home ground on Friday February 4 at the Leslie Vale Oval.
"Kingborough Council is delighted that we have been able to help facilitate a secure program for the Intercultural Sports League through the use of Leslie Vale Oval," said Mayor Wriedt.
"The Intercultural Sports League now has more than 200 players and 13 teams.
"This is an amazing achievement for all involved.
"Promoting multiculturalism through a shared love of cricket, the Intercultural Sports League is making change at grass roots, or tur level.
"We look forward to completion of the works on Leslie Vale Ova next year and the League hosting their first home games.
"As is evidenced by the numbers attending our citizenship ceremonies and the breadth of countries they represent, it is clear Kingborough is becoming increasingly multicultural and it is fantastic that our newly arrived residents can link into something lik the Intercultural Sports League," said Mayor Wriedt.
Finding grounds on which to play was both a challenge and limitation for the ICLS.
The ICSL competition was the focus of a short SBS documentary released last year titled Sidelines, that followed the journey of a o working-class white Australian team, the Derwent Scorpions, as the interacted with players from a wide range of cultural backgrounds. ICSL received the Human Rights Award for Tasmania in 2018.

Dear Editor,
In reply to Ms Hofman's letter (1 Feb 2022), Council's roadside slashing program typically starts towards the end of October and finishes around the end of February.
We are on track to finish this program within the allo cated timeframe.
This year, some south-eastern Tasmania weather stations had had their highest total spring rainfall on recor and other sites had their highest total spring rainfall for at least 20 years.
The exceptional wet spring and early summer has extended the growing period.
This results in us seeing more growth than usual in areas that are scheduled for the latter end of the slash ing program.
Similarly, areas that were cut earlier may need to be revisited.
Council will undertake additional cuts when required. It is also important to note that Council is not responsi ble for State Roads and roundabouts.
We are currently engaging with State Growth abou taking on the maintenance of these as part of our program but at this stage, the slashing of those areas cannot be undertaken by Council.

## Restrictions lifted for Hawthorn and Snug Villages

Christian Homes Tasmania (CHT) has reported that both spread of the virus," Mr Hardwick said

According to management, CHT remains aware of the potential impact from community transmission and has continued strict entry requirements for staff, visitors and contractors
Monitoring of staff with daily Rapid Antigen Tests (RAT) are being undertaken and levels of PPE precautions are continuing.
Chief Executive Officer, Glenn Hardwick, stated all CHT staff performed well during the lockdowns.
"It was through their dedication and commitment that the residents were kept safe and prevented any further

A motion from Cr Clare Glade-Wright was sought to prohibit the use of glyphosate in fenced children's playgrounds "As Council officers already use an organic herbicide and undertake hand weeding for weed control in fenced children's playgrounds, and because the European Food Safety Agency will be releasing a comprehensive assessment of glyphosate this year, Council determined to defer this matter until the new scientific information is available and to work from an evidence base," said Mayor Wried "Like all Tasmanian councils, Kingborough Counci refers to the Australian Pesticides and Veterinary

Medicines Authority (APVMA) as the overarching agency and follows their advice regarding herbicide products.
"Regardless, Council officers have been investigating other, non-chemical, treatment methods for some time now. "We will continue to monitor scientific advice and legislative changes and will adjust our policies and practices accordingly," said Mayor Wriedt.
Cr Glade-Wright's second motion was to seek Local Government Association of Tasmania improved clarity around the circumstances in which fire bunkers can be approved. Council approved, with conditions, eight multiple dwellings at 165 Redwood Road Kingston.

## Significant trees set to be protected

Kingborough Council is determined to move to public consultation on 11 potential significant tree listings following an assessment of nominations by Council officers at a meeting on Tuesday, February 8.
The 11 listings represent over 200 trees in the municipality. "The main mechanism for protecting significant trees is through including them in Kingborough's planning scheme, requiring a planning scheme amendment," said Dr Katrena Stephenson, Director of Environment, Development and Community at Kingborough Council. "This is why it is easier to consider a lot of nomina-
tions at once.
"We can now move on some longstanding nominations and clear our backlog.
"Council unanimously supported these nomina tions going out to public consultation for four weeks. "Owners and occupiers of a property or adjoining properties to a tree that is proposed to be listed will be contacted directly in writing.
"A report will then come back to Council with all the feedback and Council can determine to amend any of the proposed listings or not before it is formally progressed to the Tasmanian Planning Commission."


Kingborough Council had over 740 replies to its online survey of the community as part of its proposed Kingston CBD upgrade. This data is now all being analysed so a report can be prepared for Council's consideration at the end of this month. ## Applications open for new CCYP Ambassadors

The Commissioner for Children and Young People (CCYP), Leanne McLean said the 2022 CCYP Ambassador Program is currently open for applications from a diverse cross-section of Tasmania's children and young people, including from the Kingborough and Channel area. "An important part of my role as the Commissioner for Children and Young People in Tasmania is to have as thorough an understanding as possible of what Tasmania's children and young people lives are like," Ms McLean said.
"This includes understanding the issues that are important to them, the different obstacles they face and how they think things can be improved for children and young people in this state.
"Having this information means I can better advocate for Tasmania's children and young people. "The CCYP Ambassador Program is one way I get these insights."
Ms McLean said the CCYP Ambassadors are a group of young Tasmanians aged 10 to 17 from
around the state.
"They meet with me in person around four times a year to talk about their life experiences and discuss various topical issues.
"They also get to meet with politicians and other decision makers at an annual statewide event to present their views on the big topics of the day and participate in fun creative activities.
"It's really important for the members of the CCYP Ambassador Program to be as diverse and representative of Tasmania's young population as possible. "That's why l'm really encouraging children and young people from all backgrounds to apply for the program.
"You don't have to be the most academically gifted or the best public speaker to apply. "Ideally, we'd have CCYP Ambassadors from all corners of the state, from diverse ethnic, cultural, social and religious backgrounds, diverse genders, different capabilities and different life experiences, and so forth.
"Support for anyone with particular needs can also be put in place to ensure everyone can participate fully.
"The only eligibility requirements to become a CCYP Ambassador is that you must be aged from 10 to 17 years of age when you apply, be a resident of Tasmania and be able to attend at least two CCYP Ambassador meetings in 2022."
Applications are open now and close on February 18.
