Check in changes

The State Government announced on Friday, February 18 a number of changes to its Check in TAS system.

The Check in TAS system will now only be used for higher-risk settings such as bars, pubs, clubs, registered and licenced clubs, hotels, gaming rooms (not TABs), casinos and major events.

There is no longer a requirement to check in at a wide variety of premises such as cafes, supermarkets, retail centres, shops, offices, schools, hospitals or aged care facilities.

Owners and operators of sites previously required to use Check in TAS are now advised to remove QR codes from display and keep them in a safe place in the event the system is reactivated.

The Tasmanian Government will review the use of Check in TAS in the coming weeks in relation to higher-risk settings, as well as other restrictions, such as masks.

In addition, the Department of Communities Tasmania will discontinue the use of the Travelodge Hobart City, Travelodge Hobart Airport, Rydges and the Best Western hotels in Hobart, as well as the Edgewater hotel in Devonport.

"Given we now have open borders, and with the majority of Tasmanians recovering at home, it is only those who are positive and unable to isolate at home who are utilising hotels," Premier Peter Gutwein said.

"This change will leave the Ibis in Hobart, Peppers Seaport in Launceston and the Sunrise Hotel in Devonport to be used for people who are unable to isolate at home or in other suitable premises.

"As we are now living with COVID, the Government will continue to step down restrictions sensibly, while remaining responsive to any future risk of new strains.

"Tasmania is well protected by vaccination, but I urge people to continue to maintain good hygiene, get vaccinated and get your booster when you're due," said Premier Gutwein.

Webby set to release first book

Local Kingston Beach podiatrist and now author, David Webby, has written his first novel and is launching it at the Hobart Bookshop in Salamanca on March 20.

David described it as a middle-grade children's book.
"My first book is called the '*Mis-adventures of Harry and Larry - the Chosen Ones*' and is about two mice that find out they are here to help humans reconnect with nature and animals," said David.

"Harry and Larry are from the Bunya Mountains and become trapped in a 4WD owned by two humans, known as Charlie and Izzy Humbledink, and are thrust into an exciting adventure all the way up the east coast of Australia.

"On the way, Wilmar, Queen Mother of all Humpback Whales in the vast ocean, reveals to them the Prophecy that they are the Chosen Ones that will save the world."

The book is illustrated by M. K. Perring.
"Books two and three in the series will be coming out in the next few months as well," David continued.

"I am also writing a new book with a Tasmanian theme called '*Harry and Larry Hunt for the Tasmanian Tiger*'."

David is a podiatrist by trade and enjoys bushwalking, photography, gardening and bee keeping.

His inspiration to write comes from his love for trees and wildlife, and his memories of childhood exploration.

David includes a richness of history and culture in his writing that has come from extensive travels, both with- in Australia and overseas.

Street paves path into Cabinet

Blackmans Bay resident and Member of Parliament (MP), Nic Street, has been appointed as the new member of Tasmanian Cabinet following the resignation of former MP, Sarah Courtney.

Announced on Thursday, February 17 by Premier Peter Gutwein, Ms Courtney's place in cabinet has been filled by Franklin MP, Nic Street, while Clark MP, Madeleine Ogilvie, has been elevated to the Deputy Speaker's position, formerly held by Mr Street.

"The changes to Cabinet are necessary following the resignation of my former colleague and friend, Sarah Courtney, this time last week.

"I again wish Sarah all the best and thank her for her service to Tasmania," said Premier Gutwein.

"Importantly, the Governments agenda is progressing and Tasmania is in a strong position, so I don't see the need for wholesale changes, but there is obviously the need for a new Minister and associated portfolio changes.

"So, I am pleased to announce that Nic Street will be appointed as the new member of Cabinet.

"Nic is an experienced Member of Parliament who was first elected in 2016, has been a strong and hard-working member within his Franklin electorate, and has served more recently very effectively in our Parliament as Deputy Speaker.

"He has served at the Local Government level as a Kingborough Councillor, he's been a small business operator, has long associations with community sport- ing organisations, and has also been a small business Ministerial Adviser.

"Nic is hardworking and a grassroots advocate for Tasmanians, with a strong focus on healthy, thriving communities and the opportunities we can grasp to make this happen.

"Nic will be taking on the portfolios of Minister for Sport and Recreation, Minister for Community Services and Development, Minister for Science and Technology, and Minister for Heritage.

"I'd like to congratulate Nic and welcome him to our Cabinet team."

Premier Gutwein retained the Treasury portfolio, Minister for Tourism and Climate Change.

Deputy Premier, Jeremy Rockliff, will continue as Minister for Health, Minister for Mental Health and Wellbeing, and Minister for Advanced Manufacturing and Defence Industries.

"To enable him more opportunity to focus specifically on the Health portfolio, especially as we transition through to living with COVID, his role as Community Services and Development Minister will be allocated to Minister Nic Street," said Premier Gutwein.

"Given the substantial investment the Government is making across health in every region, it is critical Minister Rockliff has the dedicated time to invest in this, and I know how committed he is to improving Tasmania's health system.

"In regard to Education, I'm pleased to confirm today that experienced Minister Roger Jaensch, will take on the new combined Ministerial portfolio of Education, Children and Youth, as well as the Minister for Skills, Training and Workforce Growth.

"He will retain State Growth, which will complement Education and Skills and Training in relation to regional jobs growth and planning, as well as Aboriginal Affairs.

"Mr Jaensch will also retain the Environment portfolio."

Michael Ferguson remains the Leader of Government Business in the House and retains his portfolios for State Development, Construction and Housing, Infrastructure and Transport, as well as Finance.

Minister Ferguson will also now be responsible for Local Government and Planning.

Jane Howlett retains the portfolios of Small Business, Women, Racing and in addition will take on the Ministerial responsibilities for Hospitality and Events, as well as Disability Services.

Three Ministers will have no changes to their portfolios.

Elise Archer will continue her strong work as Attorney General, and will continue with her portfolios of Justice, Corrections, Workplace Safety and Consumer Affairs, and the Arts.

Minister Barnett retains Trade, Primary Industries and Water, Energy and Emissions Reduction, Resources, and Veterans' Affairs.

Jacquie Petrusma retains her current portfolios of Police, Fire and Emergency Management, Prevention of Family Violence and Parks.

Mark Shelton remains Speaker of the House of Assembly, while Premier Gutwein intends to nominate Madeleine Ogilvie to take on additional responsibilities in the role of Deputy Speaker and Chair of Committees.

John Tucker remains Parliamentary Secretary to the Premier and Felix Ellis will now also hold that role.

Council backs ALGA advocacy

The Australian Local Government Association (ALGA) has used its Federal Pre-Budget Submission to outline how local government is a key partner in driving national recovery as we move to a new phase of living with COVID-19.

“Like councils all across Australia, projects we undertake in Kingborough can play a pivotal role in stimulating the economy, locally and beyond,” said Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt.

ALGA President and City of Sydney councillor, Linda Scott, said Australia’s 537 local governments have the capacity for growing partnerships with the Commonwealth Government, as well as state and territory governments, to support economic and community recovery in every community, improve Australia’s transport and community infrastructure, increase local resilience to emergency events and the impacts of climate change, and help build a new circular economy.

“Only local governments can deliver a locally led recovery in every corner of our nation,” Cr Scott said.

“Our local government priorities for the Federal Budget have been independently assessed, and if funded and implemented they would contribute at least \$6.65 billion per year to Australia’s Gross Domestic Product and create 44,905 new jobs.”

“Councils are offering solutions to achieve a tailored, community-focussed post-COVID economic recovery, from creating jobs to supporting local business to building new community facilities like libraries, community centres, roads, recreation trails and playgrounds.”

“Councils have an excellent track record of partnering with the Commonwealth on projects and programs that improve our communities and build better lives for all Australians.”

The key funding requests in ALGA’s 2022-23 Pre-Budget Submission are an initial injection of Financial Assistance Grants worth \$1.3 billion to drive economic recovery across the country, and for the total value of these untied grants to be gradually restored to at least one percent of Commonwealth taxation revenue.

Mayor Wriedt spoke about the previous success and future potential of partnerships with the Federal Government.

“Kingston Park and our main street transformation, our support for events across the municipality, our focus on expanding recreation spaces and trails, our investment in infrastructure to support continued growth, all these things improve the lives of our residents,” said Mayor Wriedt.

“While traditionally funding doesn’t always flow to stable electorates, Kingborough Council has demonstrated we can be a key partner in delivering on Federal priorities, as is evidenced by our contribution to the Hobart City Deal.

“The program investments proposed by ALGA have strong resonance for Kingborough.

“Continued access to equitable funding across councils, through programs like the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program, would be welcome.

“As would funding to help mitigate against natural disaster events, given our extensive coastline and bushfire risks.

“We know that despite our housing growth, many Kingborough residents are being impacted by inflation in everyday living costs, but especially by the increases in rents and housing purchase costs, and so an affordable housing focus in this election is welcomed,” Mayor Wriedt concluded.

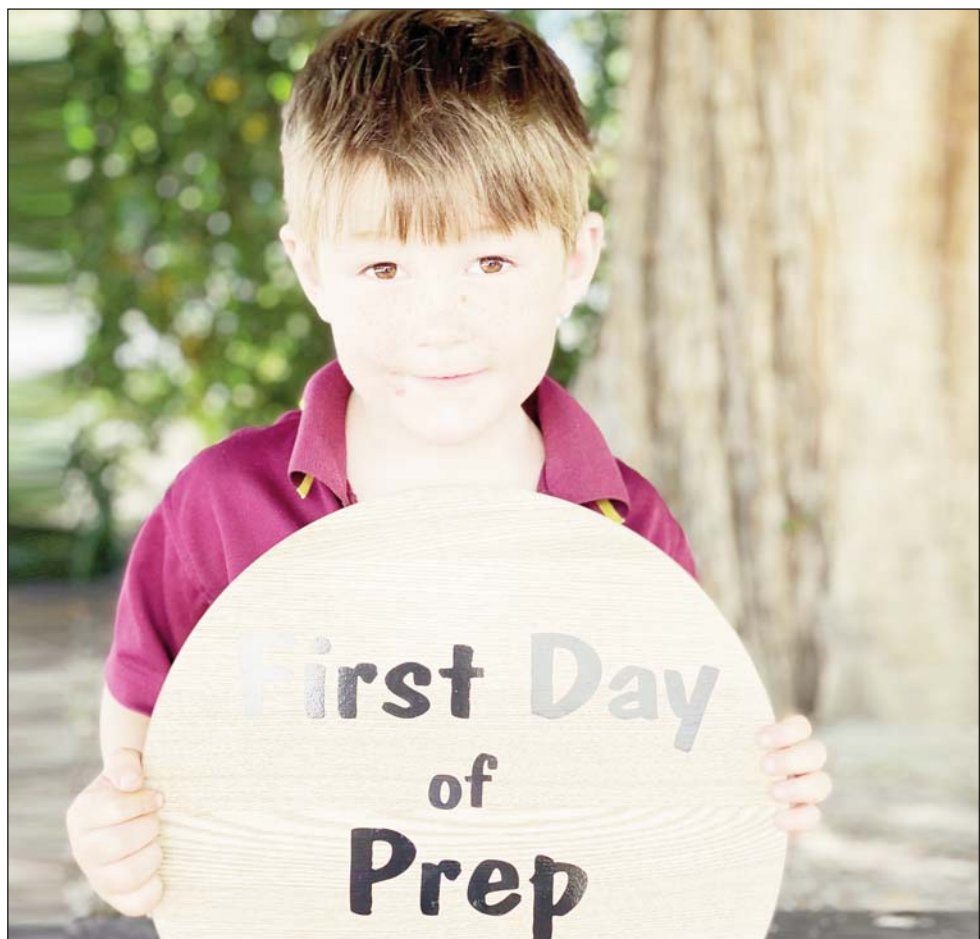

Tallies are still being made, however the day was a huge success.



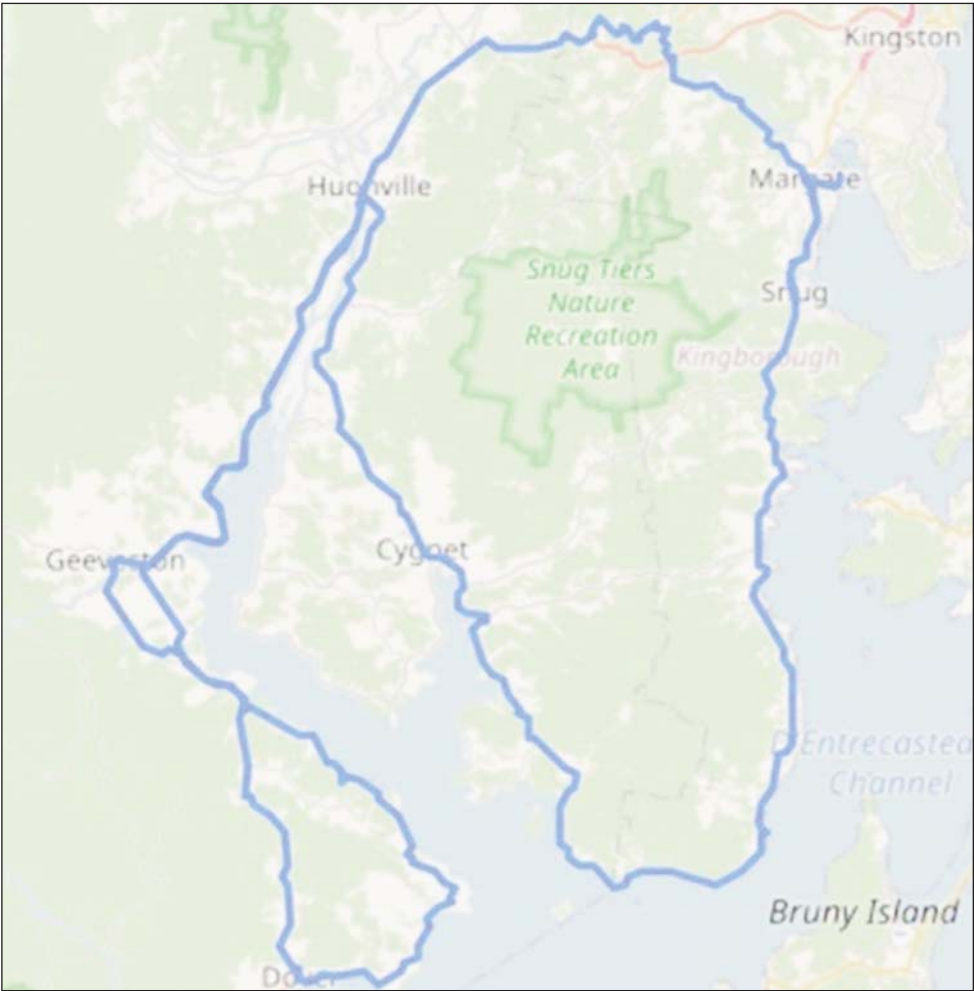

Australia's elite cricketers give back to local clubs

Across Tasmania, 17 cricket clubs and indoor cricket centres including Kettering Cricket Club, Margate Cricket Club, Slab Road Cricket Club and The Cricket Hub Tasmania, will provide enhanced cricket experiences to encourage further participation, after receiving grants totalling \$50,500 during round one of the 2021-22 Grassroots Cricket Fund (GCF).

The GCF is a joint initiative between Cricket Australia and the Australian Cricketers' Association that will provide

up to \$30 million to grassroots cricket across Australia over the life of the fund.

The funds will ensure clubs and centres maintain their position as pillars of local communities by providing equipment and using grants to fund the development of coaches and volunteers and the adoption of marketing and recruitment initiatives to attract new participants.

In total, 432 clubs and centres nationally successfully applied for first round grants and will share \$1.3 million in funding, part of the total \$2.5 million available in GCF

grants this season.

A second round of grant applications opened Monday, February 14, for a three-week period, allowing clubs and centres that did not receive a grant in the first round to access funding that can be used to purchase products through GCF partners such as defibrillators via the Community Heart Program, portable 2G Flick pitches from Flick UK and Kookaburra training packs.

Launching the second round of grant applications, Australian cricketer, Usman Khawaja, said, "Clubs and

indoor centres across Australia have done an amazing job in creating great experiences for their members, despite the impact of COVID-19."

"The players are proud to be able to support these efforts.

"We hope these grants will help clubs and indoor centres best provide a great and inclusive environment in which to play and enjoy our game."
