## **Antarctic boost**

A funding package to support Antarctic scientific capabilities was announced by the Australian government on Tuesday, February 22.

An additional \$804.4 million is promised over the next decade, including supporting transport and observational capacity across East Antarctica. Chairman of the Tasmanian Polar Network (TPN), Richard Fader said the

investment "will be right across the entirety of Antarctic logistics, science and manufacturing".

"The funding will also support Australia's contribution to the Antarctic treaty system, which is extremely critical for the future of the continent.

"There is also extra support for increased sea days on the RSV Nuyina, the world's leading Antarctic scientific vessel.

"The investment also focuses the importance of Hobart as the Antarctic Gateway and opportunity for TPN members to continue to grow their businesses around Antarctic-related work.

"This increased spending will give businesses the opportunity to build an experienced workforce and offers continuity of projects in the Antarctic sector.' The announcement includes:


- \$17.4 million for marine science in the Southern Ocean and a new krill
- \$14.3 million for environmental management, including a 'Cleaner Antarctica Strategy' to remove legacy waste and to establish new 'geographic information system' technology to support environmental management; and
- \$7.4 million for research focused on Antarctic ice sheet science, to build global understanding of climate change impacts.

The Hobart City Deal has already committed to establish an Antarctic and Science Precinct at Macquarie Point.

Tasmania's Minister for State Growth, Roger Jaensch said the sector employs "almost 950 Tasmanians and injects almost \$160 million into Tasmania's economy each year"

"We expect this funding boost will have significant flow-on effects for both local jobs and our economy," said Minister Jaensch.

"With this investment coupled with and increased focus on inland-Antarctic science, upgrading of facilities in Antarctica and Macquarie Island and the much-anticipated new Antarctic and Science Precinct at Macquarie Point we are already moving to increase the capacity and capability of Antarctic operations available in Hobart."

# Margate moving ahead with shopping centre

A long-delayed shopping centre development in Margate is making progress, with leases advertised and an IGA supermarket confirmed.

The site, located on the Channel Highway adjacent to Margate Bottle-O and the (currently closed) Margate Tavern, is being developed by the Kalis Group, a privately owned Tasmanian company.

Construction is due to be completed later this year.

The shopping precinct is expected to have up to 16 retail spaces, including an IGA supermarket as the anchoring tenant.

Kingborough Mayor, Cr Paula Wriedt said Council has held regular meetings with the Kalis Group "over many years".

"We were advised some weeks ago that an anchor tenant for the supermarket had been secured," noted Cr Wriedt, in a statement given to the Kingborough Chronicle on February 25.

"Since becoming Mayor, I have been actively pursuing the Kalis Group owners to get them to start work on this development.

"Like many of Margate's residents, we are all looking forward to the completion of this project."

Kalis Group told the Kingborough Chronicle on February 25, the company is keen to see the proposed development become a reality.

"We're really looking forward to seeing the project come to fruition," stated General Manager Property and Finance, Corey Bygraves.

It's been a long wait for many in Margate, and those travelling through. The shopping centre project appeared to have started in 2015, when the Margate

Hardware building was demolished to make way for the new development. The large site, in the centre of Margate, had fencing erected around the property and some groundworks, including curbing for the car park, in late 2015 and into 2016, however visually no progress had been made since.

Kingborough Councillor David Grace informed the Kingborough Chronicle he had facilitated the supermarket tenancy, after being a long-time supporter of the project.

"It will be an asset for Margate," said Cr Grace.

"I have long been a supporter of this project and even helped Kalis sign up IGA.

"There is a lot of interest in businesses for the shops; it's quite exciting.

"I'm so proud to continue supporting a project like this.

"Margate is becoming a centre of its own."

The commercial real estate listing gives an indication of what locals may

The listing states, "the Kalis Group aim to bring a new shopping experience to Margate, with IGA supermarket anchoring the development and new strip retail with direct street frontage.

"Construction is due to be completed late 2022, early 2023 and we have the pleasure of offering the remaining retail and office opportunities to the market.

"Ground level, various retail sites from 72 square metres to 93 square metres fronting the highway.

"Shops can be combined to form larger footprints.

"Retail shop of 242 square metres and Kiosk opportunity exist alongside IGA supermarket.

"Two first floor commercial tenancies 570 square metres each, ideal for allied health, medical or office uses.'

From today, various provisions of the Tasmanian government's new rules for feline owners come into play.

Due to the absence of associated funding however, Council's compliance role with respect to the new rules will be responsive, rather than proactive, according to Kingborough Council's Director Environment, Development and Community Services, Dr Katrena Stephenson.

The funding issue arose in response to a question from Kingborough Cr Gideon Cordover at a meeting on February 21.

"In terms of compliance in relation to these new regulations, as with a lot of these types of activities, it is responsive rather than proactive compliance which was always the intent of the government's legislation otherwise it would be a new cost shift to councils," responded Dr Stephenson.

"However, as you know, we do co-resource a cat management officer and we are still in the tail end of delivering the last phase of the Regional Cat Management Project.

"So there is a really strong opportunity to have synergies around those activities, but our focus will continue to be an educative role rather than a compliance roll.' Under amendments to the Cat Management Act 2009, all domestic cats over the age of four months are required to be micro-chipped and desexed.

Anyone breeding cats in Tasmania is required be either a registered breeder or hold a Cat Breeding Permit and all cats/kittens sold must be no less than eight weeks of age, desexed, microchipped and have passed a health assessment.

Permits are also required to keep more than four cats over the age of four months at a property.

Environment Minister Roger Jaensch was contacted by the Kinaborouah Chronicle on February 25.

"Has funding been given to Kingborough Council in association with the commencement of the new rules? "If so, please detail."

No Response was received at time of print.

Six-year-old Lilah of Geeveston was granted a special wish on February 23, to strap on some fairy wings and "fly like a real fairy".

Lilah is now in remission, after being diagnosed with acute lymphoblastic leukaemia in 2019.

A team of volunteers, including the Hobart branch of the children's charity Make-A-Wish Australia and local supporters, brought Lilah's wish to life last Wednesday.

The team hope the experience will help form new, positive memories for Lilah, to replace any negative memories from the leukaemia treatment period.

Lilah's mum, Amelia, said it's been an emotional time. "I know how much Make-A-Wish has been doing to make this day special and Lilah is so excited and she often talks about her wish," said Amelia.

"It will be something she will talk about forever."

Amelia said Lilah had medical treatment for two years and is "finally in remission now".

"She's always very positive," remarked Amelia.

"She's loved going to school and is so full of energy you wouldn't know she's been unwell.

"She smiles all the time

"If she's feeling unwell, she's quiet."

Amelia thanked the volunteers and said the thought of flying' has allowed Lilah to feel free after the experience of hospital treatment and having to isolate during the coronavirus pandemic.

The Kingborough Chronicle was there to catch a glimpse of fairy Lilah 'flying', with her spirit soaring skyhigh in 'fairy land', aka The Circus Studio at the Kingborough Sports Centre.

Adie and Genevieve from The Circus Studio assisted Lilah to swing on the flying trapeze.

Lilah said she wanted to "touch the clouds".

The smiles and excitement on Lilah's face was there



#### New Rules for Cats

Additional Changes to the Cat Management Act 2009 come into effect on Tuesday 1 March 2022.

"All Cat owners will be required to have their cats microchipped and desexed, and not keep more than four cats without a permit," said Mayor Paula Wriedt.

"There are significant benefits to these changes in regulations, not only for our environment but also for the cats, their owners and our neighbourhoods," Cr Wriedt said.

"Currently there are no restrictions on the number of cats that can be kept at a property.

Under the Cat Management Act 2009, it is also required that:

- Only registered breeders can breed
- Cats can only be sold or given away if desexed, microchipped, wormed, vaccinated and over eight weeks of age; and
- Cats are not to be abandoned.

#### Seasonal fruit solutions



#### In a jam about what to do with loads of fruit?

Kingborough chef Kirsten Bacon said she's often asked by friends and colleagues about what to do with excess fruit when they already have plenty of jam.

"I think it's really nice to be able to in some way preserve fruit, not always into jam, but in a way that we can use them throughout the winter," comments Kirsten.

"Don't get me wrong, jam is wonderful, but there is only so much you can use."

Kirsten has shared the following fruitful inspiration and

#### Dry that fruit

Kirsten recommends using a dehydrator, to dry the fruit. "If you don't have a dehydrator, you can do it in a slow oven," suggests Kirsten.

"I do it around 70 degrees Celsius and often leave it overnight.

"Dried fruit is a wonderful addition to the pantry.

"You can dry out your fruit and keep in an airtight container, use them for snacks, rehydrate them and use them for cakes and crumbles.

"Also, fantastic to put the fruit in a cup and pour boiling water over to make a hot, fruity tisane (tea).

"You can also toss it into your muesli and in fact chop it up into your porridge when you cook it in winter.

"Chop up your dried fruit and add it to your hot cross buns or Christmas puddings and cakes.

"You will love it." Syrup that fruit

meat you serve.

"Make a beautiful fruit sauce, a gorgeous thing to have over ice cream and in the warmer months.

"Pour it over your steamed pudding, add to yoghurt or porridge for breakfast or make fruit swirl cake."

#### Sauce that fruit

"Make a spicy plum sauce with the plums," Kirsten suggests. "Spice it up a bit with some cloves, chillies and garlic. "A fantastic addition to grilled meats and in fact any

"It's also fantastic to dip dumplings into."

#### **Bottle that fruit**

"Vacola bottling is making a return and in fact, is a very simple process for preserving fruit," notes Kirsten. "Make your own cling peaches in a jar.

"There are many recipes online and wonderful pre-

"Vacola also has a great website on how to bottle fruit. "I have bottles of fruit and particularly quinces which I

bottle in a light, cinnamon syrup and then in winter use in all sorts of wondrous things, including a Moroccan lamb dish, clafoutis and yes, the good old crumble."

#### Compote that fruit

"I tell you what, this is one of my favourites.

"Place all your dried fruit into a mixture of water just covering, a small amount of sugar, some orange peel, spice and bring to the boil, let sit overnight and serve for breakfast for any meal.

"Totally delicious.

"Great in mulled wine as well."


