Breaking the bias

International Women's Day was celebrated around Kingborough on Tuesday, March 8, with numerous well-attended events.

The fifth consecutive International Women's Day dinner for the Kingborough and Huon Business Enterprise Centre (KHBEC) was held at Robbie Browns Restaurant, Kingston Beach on Tuesday, March 8. Guest speakers were Cancer Council Tasmania CEO, Penny Egan and owner of Songbird Collection, Alexandra Somner, with KHBEC board member Diane Carter, MC for the evening.

Meanwhile, Unions Tasmania marked the day with a community rally at lunch time on March 8, with women, men and non-binary people raising their voices for gender equality.

"The last twelve months have seen a spotlight shone on the treatment of women in our communities and our workplaces, spearheaded by Tasmania's own Grace Tame," said Unions Tasmania Secretary.

"It's 2022 yet women are still paid less than men, retire with less,

and aren't safe at work.

"The gender pay gap between Tasmanian men and women's full-time earnings is 9.1 per cent (at November 2021) but it's even higher when you look at women working part time.

"Tasmania has a high percentage of women working part time and when you include part time workers in gender pay gap calculations you see the gap blow out to 23.5 per cent.

"No-one should think gender pay gaps of this size are acceptable," said Jessica Munday.

The IWD 2022 campaign theme was #break the bias, encouraged that collectively we can all work to break the gender bias:

- Imagine a gender equal world.
- A world free of bias, stereotypes, and discrimination.
- A world that is diverse, equitable, and inclusive.
- A world where difference is valued and celebrated.
- Together we can forge women's equality.

In harmony

Kingborough Council will be hosting a Harmony Week celebration, with live music and dancing, on the lawns of the Kingborough Community Hub, this Friday, March 18.

The event will be licenced, with the Coffee Hole serving drinks and food, from 4.30pm until 7.30pm. Harmony week celebrates cultural diversity and promotes inclusive-

Masks on and off

While there have been changes to mandatory mask-wearing requirements in recent days, many Kingborough residents and businesses owners appear to be proceeding with caution, with many shoppers and staff continuing to wear face masks to protect themselves and others.

Tasmania's daily COVID-19 case numbers reached 1130 new cases on March 12, with four people in ICU.

According to the latest information provided by the Tasmanian Government, wearing a face mask is mandatory for people aged 12 years and older (unless exempt) in the following settings:

- · Health care and medical facilities and services/treatments, including
- Primary schools (teachers/staff/visitors only), secondary schools (including students) and early childhood services;
- Hospitals (not patients);
- · Residential aged care facilities (not residents) and in-home and community aged care;
- Residential disability care facilities (not residents) and in-home care, including disability support provider and NDIS-funded services;
- Correctional facilities (not prisoners/detainees);
- Public transport, airports and aircraft, the Spirit of Tasmania and ports.

Masks must still be worn by workers who have an exemption from mandatory vaccination requirements at their workplace, or are critical worker close contacts who have been exempted from quarantine requirements to return to work.

Masks are no longer required at indoor or outdoor events, regardless of the number of people attending, unless specified by Public Health when approving an event under the COVID-19 Safe Events and Activities in Tasmania Framework.

Masks are no longer mandatory in many settings, such as workplaces; hospitality and tourism premises; personal care; sport and recreation, retail and service sectors, businesses and organisations may require staff and/or patrons and visitors to wear masks as part of their COVID-19 Safety Plans.

Tasmania Police were called to a shop at Maranoa Heights in Kingston on the evening of Sunday, March 6 in response to an armed robbery. In a media statement on Monday, March 7, Tasmania

The second round of the Better Fishing Grants program has opened for applications.

- pontoons, jetties or other structures for recreational fishing;
- fish cleaning tables, bins, tables, shelters and lighting;
- toilets near fishing facilities;

· paths, steps, walkways or other access routes to fishing locations; and other facilities directly. Minister for Primary Industries and Water, Guy Barnett MP

said the Department of Natural Resources and Environment Tasmania has been undertaking an audit of marine and shore-based recreational fishing infrastructure and has identified a range of potential infrastructure upgrades.

"The aim is to seek proposals to provide, upgrade or retrofit facilities that enhance recreational marine fishing access, or the quality of the fishing experience," said Minister Barnett.

Gender budget impact statement

Tasmania's Legislative Council marked International Women's Day on March 8 by debating a call for Tasmania to adopt a Gender Budget Impact Statement as part of the annual State Budget Papers.

Independent Member for Nelson, Meg Webb MLC, tabled the motion.

"The proposal seeks to hardwire gender responsive budgeting processes into the State Budget cycle to ensure all expenditure or income proposals are assessed for gender implications and effects on equality before they could proceed," Ms Webb said.

"Participating in the State Budget process is a key decision-making process for women and gender diverse Tasmanians.

"Voting in support of this motion will demonstrate leadership and commitment to 'break the bias', by moving beyond piecemeal schemes and tokenistic lip service to challenge the structural barriers faced by many

Tasmanian women and girls.

Ms Webb said providing a formal statement analysing and assessing the gender and equality implications of budget spending and cuts is considered standard best practice elsewhere.

"Federally we saw the Australian government reintroduce a national budget gender impact statement last year and Victoria has been doing so since the 1980s.

"The Women Tasmania website highlights the constructive role of gender budgeting analysis but directs viewers to international and national examples of models in place.

"Wouldn't it be great if our state agency, Women Tasmania, could aspire to being able to list on its website a Tasmanian model of a Gender Budget Impact analysis and assessment?

"There is no good reason for the Tasmanian government to fail to produce an analytical Gender Budget Impact Statement when it delivers the May State Budget."

Ms Webb reiterated a gender budget impact assessment would not only focus upon how budgetary processes and priorities impact upon women and girls, but will also include men, boys, LGBTIQ+ Tasmanians, and those who identify as non-binary.

Speed limit calls tabled in Parliament

A petition has been tabled in the Tasmanian Parliament with signatures from hundreds of locals, calling for a uniform speed limit of 50-kilometres per hour through towns on the Channel Highway.

Member for Franklin, Dean Winter MP tabled the petition when State Parliament returned at the beginning of March.

Currently the speed limit through Kettering and Snug is 60km/h, while in Margate and Woodbridge the limit is 50km/h.

"Residents in Kettering and Snug want to boost road safety in their towns and they have been pushing for this for a long time," Mr Winter noted in a statement to the Kingborough Chronicle on March 4. "People have told me of near misses when pulling out of side streets or driveways, especially in Kettering where bends and hills make it harder to see oncoming vehicles.

"There are also local businesses like shops and cafes, other services and bus stops that people need to get to safely.

"These towns are growing and there are more people out and about.

"Having consistent speed limits through all towns would improve safety for everyone, including the many visitors who are not familiar with the road and who we want to encourage to come down to the Channel."

Mr Winter said now that the petition had been tabled, a response is required within 15 sitting-days of Tasmania's Parliament.
