

Masks on as virus cases skyrocket

Many people out and about in Kingborough were choosing to wear face masks last week, as Tasmania's daily COVID case numbers surpassed previous peaks since the coronavirus pandemic began. Meanwhile the State Government went into self-defence mode regarding

its roll back of mask rules. By Thursday, March 17, the Royal Hobart Hospital had escalated its

COVID-19 management escalation plan to Level 2.

"This afternoon at 4pm, the Royal Hobart Hospital has escalated from Level 1 to Level 2 of its COVID-19 management escalation plan," said State Health Commander, Kathrine Morgan-Wicks.

"The move follows the recommendations of the Regional Health Emergency Management Team and is based on the current level of COVID-positive inpatients (15 inpatients, 4 being treated for COVID) and increasing level of COVID-related staff absences impacting general operations."

Tasmania recorded (known) daily new case numbers of 1909 on Thursday, March 17, with an additional 1779 on Friday, March 18 bringing the total active cases to 9,105, surpassing previous peaks.

By Sunday, March 20 there were 9,803 known active cases of COVID-19 in Tasmania, with 1479 and 1305 new cases reported on Saturday and Sunday respectively.

Since the State's border opened on December 14 last year, there have reportedly been 14 deaths linked to the virus, including another death recorded on March 15.

There were 57,753 cases notified in Tasmania between December 15, 2021 and March 12 this year, with 2814 of people residing in Kingborough, 7108 in Hobart and 593 from the Huon Valley.

The Tasmanian Government blamed the significant surge in recent days on the new Omicron subvariant BA 2, rather than its decision to roll-back the mask mandate.

"I'd like to be clear that this up-peak is not related to the recent removal of masks, it's related to the more transmissible BA 2 variant," claimed Minister Barnett at a media conference on March 16.

Meanwhile, Tasmanian Greens have called for the mask mandate to be

On Twitter on March 19, Member for Clark Cassy O'Connor MP wrote:

"When, in response to reported cases doubling in 48 hours, Minister Barnett said yesterday it had nothing to do with removing masks, he was lying," wrote Ms O'Connor MP.

'We're being gaslit during a public health crisis.

"The sense of abandonment and loss on this island is a tangible thing." The Kingborough Chronicle wrote to the Tasmanian Premier and the Health Minister on March 17.

"As you would know, Minister Barnett was on ABC last night defending the government's decision to roll-back the mask mandate.

"Regarding the spike in Tasmanian COVID cases in recent days, Minister Barnett claimed: "This up-peak is not related to the recent removal of masks."

"Can Minister Rockliff and the Premier please provide the source of information forming the basis of Minister Barnett's claim that the increase in COVID-19 case numbers is not related to rolling-back the mask mandate.

"On what scientific/medical evidence can such a claim be made?

"Is it more likely that the spike is a cumulative effect of the government opening schools combined with the rolling back of the mask mandate?"

Neither the Premier's office nor the Health Minister provided direct answers to the questions, however a spokesperson referred the Kingborough Chronicle to a subsequent media interview by Director Public Health, Dr Mark Veitch on March 18.

Dr Veitch said "if we look back at the change in case numbers in Tasmania, the increase started in the north west about a month ago.

"It was followed a week or so ago by an increase in the north, and now the increase is most marked in the south.

"And this corresponds very closely to the timing of increases in the BA 2 variant "Almost all cases in the North West and the North are now the BA 2 strain. "Last week, around half of the cases in the south are the BA 2 strain."

A weekly report providing current updates on the epidemiology of COVID-19 in the Tasmania was launched by the Department of Health on Saturday, March 19.

"While Tasmania has been publishing the daily tile with daily case numbers, the new weekly Surveillance Report provides much more detail about characteristics, distribution, and trends in COVID-19 cases across

Tasmania," said Director Public Health, Dr Mark Veitch. "The weekly Surveillance Report enables the public to better understand the current risks posed by COVID-19, and the reasons for policy decisions. "It also provides locally and personally relevant information that many people may find helpful to inform their own choices and actions during the pandemic.

Playing field grant winners

Raw sewage spills

A warning sign was erected at the southern end of Kingston Beach on Thursday, March 17, following detection of a sewage leak.

The Kingborough Council sign warned the public against recreational use of the beach area, due to a sewer overflow.

TasWater informed the Kingborough Chronicle on March 17 that tree root blockages had caused two separate manhole spills into stormwater.

"As a result of the tree root blockages, raw sewage leaked into the stormwater system," a Taswater Spokesperson wrote. "The sewage and stormwater was then discharged at

the southern end of Kingston beach. "TasWater was on site within 30 minutes of becoming aware of the issue and our team repaired the pipe sections, cleaned and disinfected the area.

"Water quality at Blackmans Bay is unaffected." Kingborough Council also posted a notice on its Facebook page on March 17, advising against swimming at the southern end of Kingston Beach.

"The leak was discovered by Council staff this morning who immediately contacted TasWater," noted the Council's social media post.

"Council can report that TasWater have now fixed the leak, but water quality is still likely to be unsuitable for swimming.

"The water quality will be tested tomorrow morning and the public will be advised as soon as the results

Water bills on the way up

Tasmanians struggling to pay basic living expenses will be under further pressure, with a rise in water bills on the way.

The warning came in a media release from the Member for Franklin, Dean Winter MP on March 15.

Mr Winter reported that the State's Economic Regulator allowed increases of 3.07 per cent over the next four years. "Labor will be making a submission to the Economic Regulator to argue against these excessive increases,' said Mr Winter MP.

"While the Economic Regulator has slapped down Peter Gutwein and TasWater's plan for a massive 3.5 per cent rise in water bills, it will still allow increases of 3.07 per cent over the next four years

"For Tasmanians already struggling under the financial weight of cost-of-living pressures, this is still far too high.

"The cash grab could not come at a worse time for families and individuals trying to stretch the household budget further and further to cover massive fuel bills, rising grocery costs, soaring rents and Peter Gutwein's new bin tax.

"The Premier is seriously out of touch if he thinks families can afford a massive increase to water bills right now, on top of everything else.

"The Tasmanians who are living these pressures know ust how much they are hurting.

"With families under so much financial pressure, it is clear Peter Gutwein is not getting the basics of economic management right.

According to the Wage Price Index in the December quarter 2021 wage growth rates have tended to display "considerable intertia"

"In the December guarter 2021, both Tasmanian private sector wages and Tasmanian public sector wages increased by 0.6 per cent," notes the Tasmanian Department of Treasury and Finance report.

Meanwhile, Tasmania is "commissioning more irrigation schemes than any other State" according to Minister for Primary Industries and Water, Guy Barnett MP.

The Kingborough Chronicle wrote to Premier Gutwein and Minister for Infrastructure, Michael Ferguson MP on Wednesday, March 16,

"Why isn't water a basic human right for people living in Tasmania?

"Why is the Tasmanian government giving large sums of public money to private water pipeline proponents and private business interests, whilst at the same time expecting citizens to pay more for basic human water needs?

"How can local people afford increases in water bills, given the crisis in rent and housing affordability?

A Government Spokesperson provided the following response on March 18.

"As a former mayor who fought tooth and nail along with the Labor Party to defeat the government's proposed takeover of TasWater, Dean Winter should be reminded that the Government does not control TasWater, rather, Councils do," claimed the Government Spokesperson.

'Water bill increases have been frozen due to the Liberal Government's policy during the pandemic, and future increases are overseen by the economic regulator, as per the Labor legislation.

However, Mr Winter said the Government's reply was "an extraordinarily inaccurate statement"

As evidence, Mr Winter provided a May 2018 joint Tasmanian Government – TasWater media release containing a memorandum of understanding between the State Government, the Local Government Owners Chief representative and TasWater.

The 3.5 per cent price rises were proposed by the Liberal Government and agreed to by Local Government in this very public (May 2018) document," noted Dean Winter MP.

"I also note it was agreed to almost six months before I was elected as Mayor.'

The 2018 media release, sighted by the Kingborough Chronicle, promised "Tasmanians will benefit from a partnership that will see a reduction in forecast price increases"

The memorandum of understanding proposed a package of reforms including, among other things:

- "The State will introduce legislation into the Parliament to allow TasWater to be jointly owned by the councils of Tasmania and the State.
- "The State will provide contributions to TasWater, to a total of \$200 million over the ten year period commencing on January 1, 2019."
- "The parties will work cooperatively to develop a schedule for the State's contributions over the ten year period."
- "The parties will investigate the introduction of a community service obligation mechanism.
- "TasWater provides in principle commitment to develop a future price profile for regulated water and sewerage services with annual price increases for target tariffs to be no greater than 3.5 per cent."



The young writer's chronicle Huon by-election

In case you missed it, there is a vacancy advertised on the Tasmanian Electoral Commission (TEC) web-

The TEC advise that electoral rolls close at 6pm on Monday, March 28, ahead of a by-election for a Tasmanian Parliament Legislative Council (upper house) member, to represent people in the electoral division of Huon.

The electoral division of Huon covers parts of the local municipalities of Kingborough and Huon Valley, including Sandfly, Grove, Howden, Margate, Snug, Kettering, Woodbridge, Middleton, Cygnet, Bruny Island, Huonville, Franklin, Geeveston, Dover and Southport.

Polling day is set to take place on Saturday, May 7. The by-election for Huon is being held in parallel with the 2022 periodic Legislative Council elections, following the resignation of Bastian Seidel on Friday, January 7.

There are 15 Legislative Council divisions in Tasmania. Periodic elections for the Legislative Council are held on the first Saturday in May each year, over a six-year cycle, with elections for three divisions one year and two divisions the following year, continually.

According to a statement by the Electoral Commissioner, Andrew Hawkey on February 8, there were 26,734 electors enrolled to vote in the Division of Huon at the end of January.

The TEC advise that anyone 18 years of age or older and eligible to vote, must enrol or otherwise may be fined.

Also, voting in Tasmania's Legislative Council elections is compulsory, and citizens eligible to vote may be fined if they do not vote.

To enrol to vote, or to check or update enrolment details, visit www.tec.tas.gov.au/Info/Enrolment.html Nominations for Huon's Legislative Council member

vacancy close on Thursday, April 7 and the TEC is due

to announce all nominees on Friday, April 8. Pre-poll voting is expected to commence on Monday, April 11 and postal vote applications close on Friday April 29.

The elected member will serve until May 2026.





"Three local women to the Channel, Amy Robinson, Carolyn Carius and Rosie Ottevanger were courageous enough to share their stories," noted Kate.

Guest speaker Amy Robinson is a staff member at the local school and founded the Reaching Out Festival, a mental health and wellbeing expo for young people of the Channel region.

"Being a part of the Woodbridge community makes me feel at peace," reflected Amy Robinson.

"We all should remember every day that we have the right to be happy and to explore widely.

"We can feel hope and enthusiasm that we live in a world where gender will not define how big you can dream or how far you can go."

Guest speaker Carolyn Carius has lived in the south Channel for nearly 30 years and attributes much of her strength to the strong women in her life along the way.

Kate Franke said Carolyn shared her story of raising a

child that needed extra care, "the sacrifices this took, the overwhelming grief when her child died at the tender age of 12 and how she used that energy to be better and stronger".

"Carolyn spoke of how we can make choices that impact how we move forward with our lives," noted Kate.

"Carolyn recently came first in Australia in her age division in a national cross-fit competition.

"Carolyn's strength over adversity had the room in tears."
The third guest speaker, Rosie Ottevanger, grew up in
England on the cusp of the Second World War, "in a privileged family where she was expected to follow societal
norms of a what a lady was meant to be," explained Kate.

"This took her on a very colourful journey of rebellion and self-discovery that was very different to what was expected of her at the time.

"Rosie chose to be with 'the people' rather than follow the path her parents had expected of her.

"She was booted out of some of the most elite education institutions in the UK due to how 'stuffy' it was.

"She eventually chose a career that allowed her to meet people from all walks of life through nursing.



Cracker night

Cracker Night is scheduled to be held on Saturday, May 28, with displays limited to a maximum of 30 minutes between the hours of 6pm and 10pm.

Anyone taking part in this year's event is encouraged to notify neighbours before the event and be flexible to address any concerns they may have.

According to WorkSafe Tasmania, children under 5 years of age should not use sparklers and any bonfires must be registered with the Tasmania Fire Service.

To hold a fireworks display, a permit is required from WorkSafe Tasmania.

It is an offence to use fireworks while smoking or under the influence of an intoxicating drug or medication, including alcohol.

WorkSafe Tasmania advises that any fireworks displays held without a permit are illegal and attract severe monetary fines.

If a permit is issued, it is limited to use of Type 2 fireworks, while all other fireworks displays must be conducted by a pyrotechnician endorsed by WorkSafe Tasmania or another Workplace, Health and Safety regulator.

Permit holders must comply with Council regulations and permit conditions, including notification requirements and separation distances and must not hold fireworks display in unsafe weather.

Permit holders are responsible for ensuring spectators do not gain access to fireworks or firing areas, ensuring spectators are kept at least 100 metres away from landing areas.



This can lead to pain, infection and tooth loss.

Regular dental visits are thus very important, yet some

people avoid a trip to the dentist due to dental phobia or

People who have a phobia for the dental surgery would often do anything they can to avoid going, unless pain forces them to go.

Causes of fear can including past experience, general anxiety and need for personal space.

Avoidance can lead to deterioration of mouth health. Dr Viviers noted that dentists and dental staff are

aware of these issues and can help people overcome feelings of anxiety and any guilt and embarrassment

"Talk to the staff and your dentist so that they know you feel anxious," Dr Viviers said.

"You and your dentist might be able to discuss ways to potentially make it easier for you.

"We have found that it helps to establish a good relationship with your dentist where there is a sense of trust. "It might also help to bring a trusted person with you."

Integrity Commission teeth are missing

Integrity Commission Tasmania this month titled "Still toothless".

The Australia Institute research, including a comparison of Australian anti-corruption agencies across Australia, found Tasmania's Integrity to be failing

"Tasmania's Integrity Commission is weak and is losing public trust," stated the report.

"All other integrity bodies in Australia have completed between 3.6 and 12.4 times as many investigations per year as Tasmania's Commission.

"Tasmania's Integrity Commission is weak and is losing public trust

"It has never held a public hearing.

"It has run fewer investigations than any other State's integrity body.

"It has the second lowest per capita budget.

"It has only ever referred two people for prosecution, the lowest number of any state.

"The Commission has a limited jurisdiction.

"It cannot investigate matters covered by parliamentary privilege and can only investigate public officers.

"The definition of public officers is particularly limited and has resulted in complaints about the last two state elections not being investigated.

"Tasmania's Commission needs broader jurisdiction, public hearings and more funding."

"Australia Institute research has found that nearly one in two (48.5 percent) of Tasmanians distrust the Commission's ability to uncover and prevent misconduct in public administration.

"Significant reform is needed for the Commission to

once again have public confidence that it can prevent and investigate misconduct.

This has been evident since at least 2016, when an Independent Review of the Commission recommended 55 changes to improve the body.

'Only six of these recommendations have been adopted." The Kingborough Chronicle sent the following questions to Premier's office on March 10.

'Can Premier Gutwein please advise us of the timeframe for implementation of the remaining 49 recommendations in the 2016 review?'

"Why has it taken so long for the government to implement these recommendations?

A Government Spokesperson responded on March 11

"As indicated in our Government's response to the Cox Review in 2016, many of the 55 recommendations contained within the final report involve complex policy issues, requiring considered assessment and analysis," stated the Government Spokesperson.

'The Department of Justice has commenced work to progress the next tranche of reforms, and is currently working with the Integrity Commission to bring forward matters informed by the statutory review, along with other potential issues that have subsequently been identified, which require detailed policy consideration, analysis and consultation.

'The Government intends to consult on any further proposed amendments to the Act that arise from those
