Shop developer chases rates discount

Kingborough Council will investigate options for providing temporary rate remission for a proposed shopping development in Margate, to encourage the uptake of the first tenancy.

Councillors considered a request for a rates and fee concession from the Kalis Group at a Council meeting on Monday, June 6.

In a media release on Tuesday, June 7, Kingborough Mayor, Cr Paula Wreidt stated most Councillors thought the request for a 20-year concession on Council rates and fees associated with the development on the Channel Highway in Margate was "too large" and that the development had already "received sufficient support".

"There was a lot of Council debate over the

request from Kalis Group," Cr Wriedt said.

"Like many in the community, we just want the development to be completed.

"This is why I introduced an amendment which would see Council investigate legal options of tying any rates relief to the future anchor tenant's rent.

"We don't feel the Kalis Group needs the help, but the lead tenant will take the biggest risk and help others to establish, so if we can encourage the take up of that first tenancy, the development has more chance of being completed.

"Council also voted to make sure that any remission, if granted, was limited to a two-year period," noted Cr Wriedt.

A further report with advice on how to target relief to the anchor tenant is due to be presented Council by July 31 this year.

Construction has been a decade-long wait for locals, as the development application for the supermarket was submitted in 2011.

"Under planning legislation, the initial demolition work and laying of a slab is considered to be 'substantial completion' towards the development," noted the media release, "and so Council has no power to compel further work on the site"

"Everyone wants this development to proceed so we can see the reinvigoration of Margate," explained Cr Wriedt.

"If Council can assist the process by creating an incentive to secure an anchor tenancy it may speed up completion.

A dual apology

Volume and tension escalated in the Kingborough Council chamber on Monday evening, June 6, when the Deputy Mayor, Cr Jo Westwood and a Councillor, David Grace, became embroiled in a yelling conflict.

The conflict occurred in part of the proceedings involving consideration of a partial rate remission and fee relief for a shopping centre developer at Margate.

"If you keep interjecting, I will eject you from this part of the meeting," Cr Westwood said to Cr Grace.

'You come across and eject me from the meeting, girl," Cr Grace is heard stating on the full audio recording available for viewing online.

"You come and try and take me. "Don't threaten me, I've had enough of you lot threatening me.

"I'll be going off my head here one night and I will tear this place apart if you keep threatening me like that," yelled Cr Grace.

Cr Westwood then yelled, "Leave the meeting, go".

"You will leave the meeting, I have warned vou."

An adjournment was called 7.11pm and resumed at 7.22pm, with the pair of elected members apologising for the outburst.

Council workers' wages unsettled

Kingborough Council remains open to negotiation on staff wage increases according to General Manager, Gary Arnold, as the Australian Services Union commences the progress of taking protracted industrial action.

In an email to the Kingborough Chronicle on Monday, June 6, Mr Arnold said Council valued their staff and would continue to talk to parties involved in the Enterprise Bargaining process.

The Kingborough Chronicle wrote to General Manager, Gary Arnold after Council employees rejected Council's third wage offer.

The Australian Services Union said members rejected the latest offer, an increase this year of 2.8 per cent, as it represented a proposed cut in real wages, given significant cost-of-living increases and a pay freeze placed on the Council's workers in 2020-21.

The union said with the cost of living in Hobart increasing by 5.8 percent over the last year the latest wage offer would amount to a cut of 3 per cent or \$1650 for labourers and customer service staff.

union also indicated significant disparity exists between Kingborough and other councils. with Kingborough labourers earning up to \$2.20 per hour less than neighbouring jurisdictions, and Kingborough Council is experiencing staff turnover that is much higher than at other councils.

"Unfortunately, the (previous) proposed increase offer of 3.4 per cent was rejected by Kingborough staff," stated Mr Arnold.

"We are still open to negotiations and until there is a settled outcome. I have instigated an across the board pay increase of 2.8 per cent to all staff, in good faith.

"Negotiations are continuing but I admit that it is a difficult time for everyone with the Hobart CPI currently at 5.8 per cent adding to cost of living pressures."

Mr Arnold did not respond to the question of the cost to Council in time, money and quality of services, resulting from high staff turnover.

Regarding firearms dealer article

Dear Editor

I am writing in response to your recent articles in the Kingborough Chronicle regarding the firearms dealer located in Margate.

I must take issue with the slant of this article, as it only seems to give an opinion that is designed to stir up fear and to create an outcome that is desired by a certain section of the community.

The article does not present a balanced view and seems to be slanted in the direction of the anti-gun section of our community.

The reason that I say this is because the article gives the impression that firearms owners are irresponsible. law breaking, American-style mass murderers, and that there will be an accident or incident involving firearms just because its located next to a school.

Making the location of this dealer, who as far as I am aware, is not going to be operating it as a shopfront, but merely to facilitate the sale and purchase of firearms by legitimate firearms licence holders, as is required by the Firearms Act 1996, a fact that you either seem to be unaware of or have chosen not to report.

As required by the legislation, anyone who is transporting a firearm, it must be carried in a locked receptacle with the bolt removed (if it has one), and temporarily deactivated.

This usually means with a trigger lock fitted.

The impression your article gives is that all firearms owners are reckless, careless, and wander around waving their firearms around in public, nothing could be further from the truth.

I have been a firearms owner on both sides of this

planet for nearly 40 years and was a police officer in the UK for 26 years.

I had the misfortune to stare down the barrel of a firearm whilst on duty, bearing in mind I never carried a firearm in the execution of my duty, nor did I want to.

So I, like the firearms owner that I know, am exceptionally mindful of the security and safety of my firearms, and take every measure possible to ensure that I comply fully by law.

Australia has some if the best checks and balances in place, both in firearms legislation and with many clubs and organisations doing their utmost to promote safe handling, storage and transportation of firearms.

As a firearms owner, and former law enforcement officer, the vast majority of anti-gun sentiment is driven by a minority within our community, like so many other things these days.

They will use any means they can to achieve their point of view, which usually means preying on the fears of others, who are ignorant as to how to use firearms safely and ignorance is what drives most people's fears in my experience.

So I say to you, if you are going to champion a cause, then please do so in a fair and balanced way, and report all of the facts, not just those that further someone's petty, bigoted point of view.

Choppy waters for Ogilvie

It was revealed during Budget Estimates hearings on Wednesday, June 8 that Member for Clark, Madeleine Ogilvie MP had announced a \$150,000 grant for the Sandy Bay Rowing Club during the 2021 state election campaign without publicly declaring her daughter was a member of the club.

The revelations follow a scathing report by the Tasmanian Integrity Commission released in April.

The Integrity Commission report revealing that, during the 2018 campaign, the Tasmanian Liberals promised \$21.4 million of public money in regional grants, including amounts ranging up to \$500,000, however did not list them individually anywhere.

Grants included \$500,000 to the Kingborough District Cricket Club.

The 2018 election campaign was the subject of a twoyear investigation by Tasmania's integrity watchdog.

Former Premier of Tasmania, Peter Gutwein MP, who was the state's Treasurer at the time of the 2018 election campaign, resigned on April 4, just two days before the release of the Integrity Commission's damning report on April 6.

Ms Ogilvie currently holds numerous ministerial portfolios, including Racing, Heritage, Small Business, Science

and Technology, Advanced Manufacturing and Defence. The *Kingborough Chronicle* has written to Madeleine Ogilvie MP and Premier Jeremy Rockliff MP.

"Why did the Member for Clark not disclose this conflict of interest to the people who elected her?

"Is the Member for Clark in breach of the ethical standards section of the Code of Conduct for Members of the Parliament of Tasmania?

"If so, what are the consequences?"

On Thursday, June 9 a spokesperson replied, stating the Liberal Party had been aware of the conflict of interest at the time of the election campaign.

"Madeleine Ogilvie disclosed to the Liberal Party during the 2021 election that a member of her family was a member of the Sandy Bay Rowing Club," replied the Government spokesperson.

"In 2021, the Liberal Party pledged \$15 million for the establishment of a Local Communities Facilities Fund to help communities recover from the impacts of Covid. "Funding was available for one-off projects.

"Requests were assessed by a policy team against a set of criteria, including how projects would improve economic activity, create jobs, support local businesses and help rebuild Tasmania post Covid, as well as demonstrating they would improve community amenity. "Taking commitments to the election and giving people the right to vote on these community projects is transparent and fair, and a fundamental part of democracy.

"All of our commitments were clearly documented in the 2021-22 Budget Papers and approved by Parliament."

When questioned again regarding why there had been

no public disclosure, neither Premier Rockliff, Ms Ogilvie, nor a spokesperson replied to *Kingborough Chronicle*.

The ethical standards section of the *Code of Conduct for Mambara of the Parliament of Tagmaia*, states

The ethical standards section of the *Code of Conduct* for *Members of the Parliament of Tasmania*, states, among other things:

"A Member protects and upholds the public interest by taking all reasonable steps to avoid, disclose and manage any conflict of interest that arises, or is likely to arise, between their personal interests and their official duties.

"Each Member is individually responsible for avoiding and managing conflicts of interest.

"A Member makes proper use of their office to represent and serve the community, conducting themselves in ways that maintains the trust and confidence of the public.

"A Member uses public resources and assets strictly for the purpose of performing their role as a Member of Parliament, and in accordance with any rules and guidelines regarding the use of those resources and assets."

Coats needed for Tassie kids this winter

Tassie Mums are gathering 500 coats for babies and children in need this winter, as the number of people in need of assistance rises.

The local charity's Coats for Kids campaign is seeking new or clean, second-hand children's coats, jackets and vests from sizes 2 to 14.

Tassie Mums founder and CEO Clair Harris said there is a high need for coats for girls in sizes 10 to 14.

There is also a high need for nappies for newborn babies (size 1) and crawlers (size 3) at present.

The charity provides carefully bundled baby and children's items to families via 60 social services organisations across Tasmania.

The bundle for each child includes clothes and teddies to help see them through the year.

Clair said the charity is experiencing a record need and is "set to double" the number of children assisted since last year.

"Last month we helped 175 kids, the highest on record," remarked Clair, whereas the Tassie Mums normally supplies packs for around 100 children per month

"Last year we helped 660 children, and this year the number is set to double."

Volunteers are needed to help with putting the packs together, by ensuring the clothes are clean, sorting, folding and packing.

If you have a few hours to spare, you can join other volunteers, Tuesdays to Thursdays, Thursday evenings or on a Saturday once a month.

An induction for new volunteers is planned to be held in coming weeks, before the end of June.

Some of the organisations supported include the Kingston Child Health Centre, Kingston Neighbourhood House, Snug Child and Family Health Centre, Huonville Child Health Centre, Geeveston Child and Family Centre, Tasmanian Aboriginal Health Service, Hobart Women's Shelter, Anglicare and The Salvation Army.





Winter solstice talk explores Douglas Mawson

John Williamson is delivering a talk on the intrepid, Antarctic explorer and scientist, Douglas Mawson on Monday, June 20.

"The restrictions of the numbers in the room are lifted so come along for the talk.



Broken Glass Soup

As autumn rolled into winter, I raided my garden to find the last of the tomatillos and jalapeno chillies to make Broken Glass Soup.

It is one of the heartiest soups I know of and is quick

So you don't have a garden full of tomatillos?

Never fear, the local spice shops sells them in large tins (one of which will do for this recipe - just drain off the liquid and use as if they were fresh).

This recipe originated in Mexico and its name comes from the broken crispy tortilla chips added as the

A great peasant dishes, it makes the most of local Mexican produce.

Tomatillo pronounced (toh-muh-tee-oh, -teel-yoh) is a member of the nightshade family and like its cousin the Peruvian Ground Cherry (aka Cape Gooseberry) it grows on a vine and presents itself in a paper-like lantern that you peel away to find the treasured fruit inside.

They are easy to grow, prolific and freeze well, as does the soup itself

I always have a freezer full of both tomatillos and premade soup for the winter.

This recipe can be adjusted to your taste, if you want a spicier soup, leave the chilli seeds in however remember it is easier to bump the heat at the end if you need to.

The addition of the avocado and sour cream brings it from a peasant dish to haute cuisine.

Served with a quesadilla on the side (a Mexican toasted cheese), it is a perfect meal for the cooler months. Quesadillas are made from two (corn or flour) tortillas, with cheese in the middle, heated until crisp and crunchy.

Add anything else inside or on top, it's very versatile.

Ingredients

- 2 chicken breasts cooked and shredded
- 500g chopped tomatillos (fresh frozen or canned)
- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 onion chopped
- 3 cloves of garlic, minced
- 2 jalapeno chillies, seeded and chopped
- 4 cups chicken stock
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cayenne or jalapeno pepper (or
- ½ teaspoon tabasco sauce or similar (optional)
- 1 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1 bunch chopped coriander (leaves and stems)
- Reserve some leaves for garnish
- Salt and pepper to taste

Method

In a saucepan, heat the olive oil over a high heat. Sauté the chicken breasts in the oil until both sides are browned, approximately 2-minutes per side.

Remove the chicken from the saucepan and set it aside. In the same saucepan add the chopped onions and minced garlic, sauteing until golden.

Stir in the tomatillos, jalapeno, chicken stock, chopped coriander, ground cumin, ground coriander, and cayenne pepper.

Bring to a boil.

Reduce heat, cover the pot and simmer for 15-minutes. When slightly cooled, pure the soup in the pot using a hand blender.

Reheat the pureed soup in the saucepan and adjust the spice levels to taste with tabasco and/or ground cayenne pepper.



Returning land to Aboriginal people

The next step in supporting the return of more land to Aboriginal people is a priority for the Tasmanian Government.

In a media release on June 8, from Tasmanian Minister for Aboriginal Affairs, Roger Jaensch said "The Tasmanian Government recognises that Aboriginal people have a profound and connection to Tasmanian lands and waters.

"Connection to Country, and the responsibility to care for it, is central to Aboriginal culture

"Returning more land to Tasmanian Aboriginal people is a priority for the Tasmanian Government and is a key aspect of our Reset the Relationship

"The review into the model for returning land, which aims to identify the barriers to returning land and explore options to improve the land return process, is an integral step in this process.

"Feedback from consultation undertaken to date has made it clear the current process to return land does not work for all Tasmanian Aboriginal people, and a new approach is necessary if land returns are to play a constructive part in our reconciliation journey with all Aboriginal Tasmanians.

"Today, I am pleased to release the consultation paper A revised model for returning land to Tasmania's Aboriginal people - Consultation Paper' on proposals for change which has taken that feedback into account, and outlines the Government's proposed approaches to amend the Act and return more land to Aboriginal people."

Key amendments proposed in the consultation paper include:

• Extending the scope and intent of the Act to meet community expectations:

• Enabling broader and more inclusive representation

• Simplifying the process for land return by creating a new instrument of transfer for significant parcels of Crown land;

• Expanding provisions for local or regional Aboriginal community organisations to play a role in land management;

· Create transparent processes and clear criteria for proposing and assessing land for return;

 Clarify the role of the Aboriginal Land Council of Tasmania and require reporting of administrative and land management activity.

Importantly, the key role of the Aboriginal Land Council of Tasmania to hold the title of the land and oversee its management on behalf of all Tasmanian Aboriginal people are not intended to change

Written submissions are encouraged by Sunday,

Engagement throughout this process will be ongoing and Tasmanian Government will reach out to and meet with Aboriginal people during this time.

Feedback from this process will inform the drafting of the amending legislation, which will be released in the form of a Draft Exposure Bill for further consultation.

"Tasmanians' priorities are our priorities and my intention is to introduce legislation to Parliament as soon as possible to facilitate the return of more land to Tasmanian Aboriginal people," said Minister Jaensch in the media release.



Have your say on affordable housing

A plan to deliver improved housing services made by Government. housing has taken another significant step forward according to a media release from Minister for State Development, Construction and Housing, Guy Barnett on Tuesday, June 7.

"On 24 February 2022, the Government announced the creation of a new statutory authority, the cornerstone of our 10-year, \$1.5 billion housing package that will deliver 10,000 new homes by 2032 and to create the most cohesive housing and homelessness service in the country," the media release stated.

"The Tasmanian Government is committed to providing opportunities for community involvement in the development and ongoing review of Government policy and legislation.

Written submissions are now invited on the consultation drafts, *Housing Tasmania* Bill 2022 and the *Housing Tasmania* (Consequential Amendments)

"The consultation drafts make a number of changes including establishing a skills-based board for the Housing Authority and providing it with the powers and functions needed to meet the housing commitments

the authority to ensure we meet the needs of vulnerable Tasmanians. "The Housing Authority will consolidate efforts across

Government to increase housing supply, deliver more affordable homes and units, and deliver the stock of houses and the services required by Tasmanians in need.

"It will also have powers and responsibilities to allow it to effectively acquire, develop and manage housing

and urban renewal projects."

The authority will commence at the start of October 2022, subject to the passage of this legislation, and will report directly to the Minister for State Development, Construction and Housing.

The business model for the Authority will ensure it remains a not-for-profit organisation and will include provisions to ensure that Communities Tasmania staff moving to the new authority retain their current

employee conditions. Consultation closes 5pm, Tuesday, July 5, 2022.




