

COVID rules to be eased

The Tasmanian Government will gradually step down COVID-19 restrictions in the coming weeks.

In a media release on Wednesday, June 15, Premier of Tasmania and Minister for Health, Jeremy Rockliff MP, announced that from Saturday, June 18, there is no longer a requirement to wear masks in Tasmanian airports, although people are still be required to wear masks while on planes, in line with the national health policy approach.

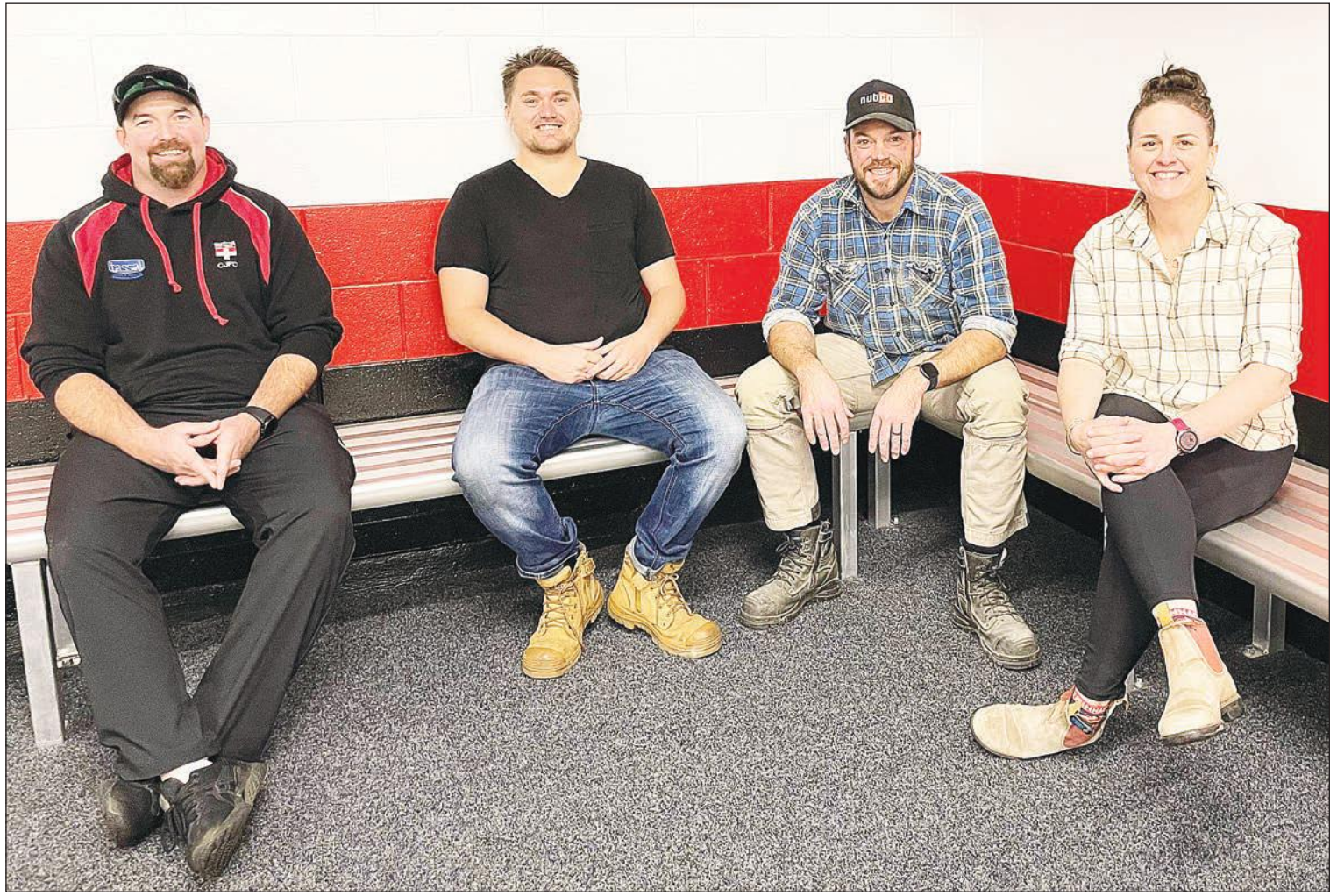
From Saturday, June 25, people will no longer be required to wear face masks on public transport, including the Spirit of Tasmania, and it will no longer be a requirement for masks to be worn in schools, or early childhood education and care centres.

Additionally, from June 36, Tasmania will transition out of the Public Health Emergency Declaration, meaning the requirement to wear face masks in all other remaining settings such as hospitals, aged care facilities, disability providers and correctional facilities will not be mandatory, but will be based on a risk assessment for each setting.

"I can also advise that large cruise ships will once again be welcomed back to our shores, with cruise ship visits to Tasmania anticipated to commence with the next cruise season in October 2022, providing a welcome boost to local businesses and our economy after nearly three years without," said Premier Rockliff.

The easing of restrictions is part of the State Government's public health policy to "live with COVID-19".

Council budgets \$7 million for roads

Kingborough Council has adopted its budget for the 2022/23 financial year at a meeting on Tuesday, June 14.

Kingborough Mayor, Cr Paula Wriedt said due to rising costs of living pressures for community members, Council had kept this year's rate increase to a minimum," Cr Wriedt said.

"The budget is based on a 2.8 per cent general rate rise.

"During public consultation, community members told us that road construction and maintenance was one of the most important roles for Council.

"This year Council has allocated approximately \$7 million for road construction and upgrades across Kingborough.

"For example, there is an allocation of \$1.03 million to upgrade Gemalla Road in Margate and on Bruny Island we have \$624,000 for Lighthouse Road and \$325,000 for Harvey Street.

"Stormwater is also very important to the community and in this year's capital budget over \$2.8 million is provided for stormwater projects in Margate,

Snug, Longley, Sandfly, Blackmans Bay, Taroona, Bruny Island and Kingston.

"Some of the key capital projects ear marked for Taroona include the \$250,000 replacement of the toilet facilities at Taroona Beach as well the \$518,000 stormwater upgrade for Hinsby Road to Illawong Crescent.

"In Blackmans Bay, stormwater upgrades will be carried out at Garnett Street and there will be a \$1.19 million road upgrade of Blowhole Road.

"In Longley, Council will invest \$125,000 on the Reserve public toilet supporting the preservation of the environment and amenity of the area as well as ensuring the site is suitable for families and community gatherings.

"Dog bag dispensers will be replaced across Kingborough to improve the service for dog owners at a cost of \$56,000.

"Public consultation on the budget confirmed that the community wanted to see more off-road cycle trails and walking tracks in Kingborough.

"This year Council will be spending \$2 million on track, reserves and playgrounds upgrades across Kingborough, to improve access and mobility

for community members for example:

- \$837,000 to build the Summerleas Road underpass to Whitewater Creek track;
- \$150,000 for the McKenzie Road track in Leslie Vale;
- \$269,000 for the Twin Ovals to Spring Farm Connector Track and Spring Farm Track to Whitewater Creek tracks; and
- \$330,000 for Gormley Park sporting ground upgrade.

"To improve crossing facilities and pedestrian usage at Kingston Beach, a \$180,000 local area traffic management study and precinct upgrade will be implemented.

"Council thanks the community for providing their feedback through this budget process and looks forward to working towards making Kingborough a connected and well serviced municipality for all to enjoy."

Council body urges code of conduct review

The peak body representing Tasmanian councils is asking the State Government to urgently review the Code of Conduct framework, following an incident at Kingborough Council recently.

Local Government Association of Tasmania (LGAT) President, Australian Local Government Association Vice President and West Tamar Mayor Christina Holmdahl said while the Association does not comment on individual council matters, the Kingborough incident was a stark reminder of the need for promised changes to the Code of Conduct framework to be progressed.

"We are concerned the proposed amendments to the *Local Government Act 1993* hasn't happened yet, despite the Government committing to do so in December last year," Mayor Holmdahl said.

"It is a high priority for the sector as the current code of conduct framework is failing

us," she said.
"The current system spends unnecessary time and resources on dealing with trivial matters, while on the occasions when serious misconduct occurs, the framework fails to sanction the breaches adequately.
"These shortcomings are at the core of the local government sector's concerns over the framework," Mayor Holmdahl said.
"In addition to the Code of Conduct review, LGAT, with the support of the State Government, has recently commissioned a study into workplace health and safety for elected representatives.
"This work is due to conclude in mid-July and will look at the extent of the issues of elected representative bullying and harassment and what support is available to representatives experiencing it in their role on council," Mayor Holmdahl said.

Are Councillors acting in the community's best interest?

Dear Editor,
I have been trying to understand the incident, during the Kingborough Council meeting on June 6, concerning Cr David Grace.

To me, it seems Cr Grace is asking poignant questions, regarding rates relief sought by a certain commercial party, and receiving highly defensive answers.

When persisting with the line of questioning he was called to task, upsetting Cr Grace to the point of unseemly conduct.

It is recorded that Cr Grace and the Deputy Mayor, Cr Westwood mutually apologised in a break later.

Was the call to task and apology a tactic by the Deputy Mayor?

Did it have the effect of veiling the intended recipient of the rate relief being further discussed openly in Council? This is how I understand what transpired.

Further, from a later radio broadcast on the ABC with Cr Grace on this Council spat, it appears that Cr Grace's problems began when the former Mayor, Dean Winter came to office.

The interview with Cr Grace was cut short due to the start of the ABC news bulletin.

Did this prevent Cr Grace from communicating further contentious information, and possibly the name of the rate relief recipient on air?

Former mayor of Kingborough, the Member for Franklin, Dean Winter MP was also interviewed on TV news.

Mr Winter effectively confirmed Cr Grace was highly disruptive in Council during Mr Winter's curtailed term as mayor.

Further, I understand Cr Westwood was invited by the ABC to reply to the Cr Grace interview and declined.

Perhaps in these circumstances "silence is golden"? The name of the would-be recipient has since been made public by a major newspaper.

However, the recipient is not the concern of my letter. Rather, the situation regarding decision-making by Councillors should be the subject of the highest concern to ratepayers.

What has transpired is, in my opinion, a concerted effort by some Councillors to effectively give a subsidy to a private entity from ratepayer funds and keep the decision as quiet as possible.
Why has it taken a long serving Councillor to vehemently question what appears to be an attempted, veiled decision? And, perhaps, at considerable risk to his position on Council.

This is the second serious dispute involving Cr Grace in council chambers.
After months of what I consider to be an incoherent

Kingborough Council, including some bazaar expenditure in recent times and a tendency to becoming increasingly secretive, it begs the question, in whose interests are Councillors acting?

In the interest of Kingborough ratepayers and transparent government, I believe the Council should be dissolved and subject to the procedures used on the Glenorchy Council by the State Government.

Gynaecological cancer detection fundraising

Locals, Hester van Niekerk and Bev Gibson, have fundraised \$14,000 for gynaecological cancer research, after their friend and work colleague Susan Nolan was diagnosed with ovarian cancer.

Sue, a former Kingborough Councillor and a former CEO of Blackmans Bay Children Services, received a diagnosis of the advanced stage of the condition.

In correspondence with the *Kingborough Chronicle*, Hester noted that Sue has “over a very long period supported many families within our community and further afield”.

After becoming aware of the condition, Sue has been motivated to help raise funds for clinical trials to develop screening tests to detect ovarian cancer in the early stages.

Every day in Australia, 17 women are diagnosed with a gynaecological cancer, according to a national organisation undertaking clinical research on gynaecological cancer.

The Australian and New Zealand Gynaecological Group (ANZGOG) states on its website that more than 6600 Australian women are diagnosed with a gynaecological cancer every year and, sadly, five women die from the disease each day.

While cancer has survival improved by 19 percent over the past 25 years, gynaecological cancer survival, has only improved by 7 per cent.

The statistics tell us that 54 per cent of women with ovarian cancer will not survive five years after diagnosis.

“Cancer has a reasonably high profile in the media,” remarked Susan Nolan.

“However, after being diagnosed with ovarian cancer, I realised that I did not know anything about this type of cancer and did not know of anyone who had it.

“I was diagnosed with Stage 4 cancer.

“The majority of women are diagnosed in the advanced stages (Stages 3 and 4).

“Unfortunately, with this cancer there is no screening test.

“Research is underway to try and develop better screening tests to detect ovarian cancer at the early stages and improve patient outcomes.

“It is with these thoughts in mind that two of my work colleagues and friends decided to raise money for ANZGOG.

“Bev and Hester have been running a raffle for the past three months and raised \$14,000.

“My thanks go to both for their hard work and thoughtfulness, to those who supported me in contributing to the sale of tickets, donation of raffle prizes and those who purchased tickets.”

"These are sensible steps forward as we continue to transition to living with COVID-19 and make personal choices regarding COVID protections, and adapt to a more normal way of living.

"However, positive COVID-19 cases will still be required to quarantine for a minimum of seven days, and close contacts of positive cases will still be required to wear face masks in indoor settings when outside the home.

"While cases are trending downwards, it remains our

collective responsibility to look out for one another by continuing to follow COVID-safe behaviours.

"Please continue to practice good hand hygiene, follow social distancing, test when you have symptoms, wear a face mask in vulnerable settings or when around vulnerable people, and stay home when you are unwell.

"And, remember to stay up to date on both your COVID and flu vaccinations, which are currently free for all Tasmanians at GPs, pharmacies and state-run vaccination clinics," Premier Rockliff said.

Channel changeroom upgraded at Snug

The changerooms at Snug Park have recently undergone a major upgrade to level the playing field for local sporting clubs.

"The Snug Park changerooms have been transformed from an outdated old building which catered for male sport only, into a nice clean changeroom facility which caters for players of both male and female sport," stated Dallas Millhouse, President of the Snug Cricket Club and a volunteer worker on the project.

The changerooms are occupied predominantly by the Snug Cricket Club in the summer months, and the Channel Junior Football Club in the winter, but are also used by the Cygnet Football Club including Port Women, and the Kingborough Tigers Junior Football Club, as well as the Seas Scout Regatta which will make its return in 2023.

"Female participation has been growing year on year, and thanks to the Channel Junior Football Club (CJFC) for identifying this during their strategic planning back in 2020 with a need to cater for this growing participation," Dallas said.

"A group consisting of members of both the CJFC and the Snug Cricket Club then got to work coming up with some concept ideas for this project, and other projects around the place.

"With the help of Clubs Tasmania, we were able to apply for a number of grants, large and small to try and chip away at the projects we had in the pipeline, albeit unsuccessful.

"However, the inspiration and guidance from Clubs Tas

spurred the group on to continue campaigning and trying to gain some funding.

"Eventually, we were lucky enough to secure election promises from both the Labor and Liberal parties for the May 2021 State Election.

"Now proudly we can say we now have a fit for purpose, male and female changerooms which cater for all sports and events."

Mr Millhouse expressed thanks to the Kingborough Council and Tasmanian Government for assistance.

Andrew Moore and Clubs Tasmania were also thanked by the Snug and Channel volunteers for their assistance, inspiration, and support from the conception of this project.

The upgrades were assisted by local suppliers and subcontractors from the Kingborough, Channel, Huon and wider southern Tasmanian region.

"And finally thank you to all of the local volunteers who gave up time to work on this project to see it through to completion," Dallas noted.

"It is something for everyone to be proud of.

"We have already seen the first hit out in these rooms with a double header Friday night match on May 27, to a great success.

"The next major event to take advantage of the upgraded changerooms will be on Friday, June 24 with the first female matches for the Southern Storm U17.5 girls taking on Huonville at 6pm, followed by the Port Women taking on Lindisfarne."

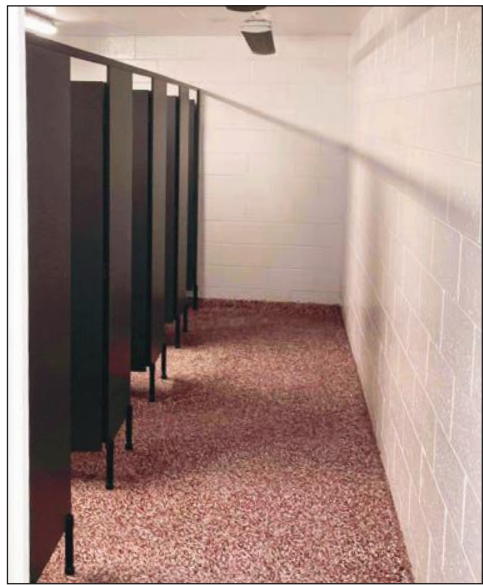

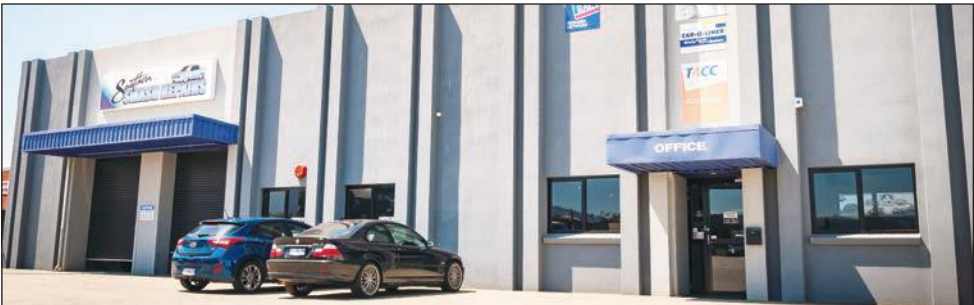

Burn brighter this winter

Kingborough residents are being encouraged to 'Burn Brighter this Winter' to reduce wood smoke pollution.

The Environment Protection Authority (EPA) and local councils are encouraging wood heater owners to burn wood with a flame (Burn Brighter) when loading in new wood, rather than loading wood and shutting down the air intake straight away, which results in higher smoke emissions.

Dr John Innis from the EPA said that air quality monitoring undertaken across Tasmania shows that there is poor air quality in several locations during the winter months.

"On still winter days and nights, smoke tends to linger and build up around towns and suburbs, which is unpleasant, can be a nuisance and can also have negative consequences on our health," Dr Innis stated.

"The amount of smoke coming from a wood heater is dependent on the age and type of heater, but also on how it is operated.

"The good news is that we can burn wood in a way that creates less smoke," explained Dr Innis.

"To reduce smoke, make sure you always burn with a flame (don't let your fire smoulder) after reloading, open the air control and burn your fire on high for 20 minutes, especially before retiring for the night, only burn dry, seasoned wood and make sure the flue is clean."

Community Centres for South Channel

THE requirements of Middleton, Kettering, and other South Channel areas for community centres are receiving the consideration of the Kingborough Commission.

Before this week's meeting of the Commission was a letter from Mr S. C. Charlton, secretary of the Middleton Recreation and Reserves Committee, stating that a well-attended public meeting at Middleton requested the provision of a community centre to replace the hall that had been burnt down. The meeting would like to have a centre to accommodate up to 150

persons, with a meeting room, with heating, where organisations like the C. W.A., local fellowship, and others could meet.

The letter pointed out that the hall that had been destroyed was insured for \$10,500, and there was an unspent amount of \$800.

A community centre of the type outlined would be of great assistance to the district, which was being rehabilitated.

Fishing Industry

DEPARTMENT WILL AID EXPANSION

CO-OPERATION of the Commonwealth Department of Industrial Development and Trade can be counted on in any effort to catch the 10,000 tons of mackerel estimated to be in waters off Tasmania's East Coast so that they can be processed by the Safcol Company at Margate, and elsewhere.

This assurance was given to the "News" this week by the Director of Industrial Development and Trade (Mr J. E. Henshelwood.)

His comment was sought following a statement by the Managing Director of Safcol (Mr R. M. Fowler) at the opening of Safcol's new premises at Margate last week that, if he could get hold of these fish, his company could do the processing and marketing.

Mr Fowler said the Margate canning factory had been designed for a 25 per cent increase in the catch. He mentioned that the assistance given by the Tasmanian Government was something his company had not experienced in any other State, and it might not be too long before the company asked for more. The Premier (Mr Reece)

said: "Even with this progress, we are only on the fringe of what can be done with the fishing industry round the Coast."

The demand for fish in the sea would increase rapidly, not only in the animal category, but in vegetable growth under the sea as well.

The foundation was only being laid today for a very important future for this and all similar types of industry.

Mr Henshelwood, in amplifying his statement about departmental co-operation, said he thought the Government should give serious consideration to assisting to find someone capable of bringing in the mackerel, and in helping the company to get mackerel processing under way.

His department, he said, would be on the lookout for the right organisation to approach with a view to bringing this aspect of the fishing industry to fruition. Someone like the Californian people concerned in the abalone industry would be the type who would be interested.

"From time to time," Mr Henshelwood said, "We are in contact with people in other parts of the world who want to know what fish are to be found in our waters, and we have been doing everything to encourage them."

to see what there is here."

It was mainly through the approach of the State Government to the Commonwealth that the C.S.I. R.O. made the surveys that led to the discovery of the shoals of mackerel, and it was only recently that the organisation had been able to pinpoint something more specific, and regularity of supplies.

Asked how it was known there were 10,000 tons of mackerel available, he said that was only a basic estimate, and there might be 10 times that quantity.

SUCCESSFUL OPENING

Reverting to the opening ceremony of Safcol's new premises at Margate last Friday, it was a most successful event, attended by about 150, including Government Ministers, members of Parliament, senior Government officials, business associates, and representatives of companies connected with the Safcol rebuilding programme.

Col. A. C. L. Dredge, chairman of directors of Safcol, who lives at Port Lincoln in South Australia, said the company regarded it as so important that they brought over the whole board of directors from the headquarters in South Australia.

Safcol was purely a fishermen's organisation.

and for that reason the company understood fishermen's problems better than others engaged in the industry.

It was their policy to employ local staff, and the only importation was the general manager, Mr Viv O'Reilly. He complimented Mr O'Reilly on an excellent job, and said that both he and his wife had now become new Tasmanians.

"We have found that our female staff are very worthwhile and responsible people," he said. "We are pleased to see an amenities block, and hope it may play some part in the social life of Margate."

Many New Buildings Authorised

NEW buildings authorised by the Kingborough Commission for the fortnight ended June 20 totalled \$17,320 in value, and included an amenities block costing \$26,000 at the Lea Camp, Proctors Rd., Kingston, for the Hobart Boy Scouts' Association.

Also included in the list was a shop and dwelling for Mr L. J. Eaton, Huon Highway, Longley at a cost of \$15,540. Mr Eaton's previous shop and home had been destroyed in the fires, and he has since been carrying on in a small metal building. Other buildings include a cool store for O. B.

Cripps and Son at Woodbridge, \$10,000, and additions to the Blackmans Bay State School \$10,000.

Of 12 new dwellings approved, nine are fire replacements, and it was reported that about 120 dwellings were in course of construction out of the 400 destroyed in the municipality.

TAROONA SCOUT HALL

THE First Tarooma Boy Scout Group Committee intends to rebuild the scout hall on the old site.

The secretary (Mrs H. Newton) advised the Kingborough Commission that the tender of Mr D. Hurlingham for \$9,500 had been accepted to carry out the work as soon as negotiations are completed.

As the cost of rebuilding was more than expected, and did not include removal of the old foundations, the association would appreciate some assistance from the Commission as mentioned in previous correspondence.

Conditional Approval for Abalone Factory

PLANS were approved by the Kingborough Commission this week for the building of an abalone processing and canning factory at Margate, adjacent to the Safcol factory, which also will handle abalone.

But members of the Commission were specific that the plans for the new factory were approved only subject to the company complying with the requirements of the Department of Health Services, and making satisfactory arrangements for the disposal of industrial waste.

The new factory is to be built by Gourmet Seafoods

Pty. Ltd., in which the joint partners are O'Connor Brothers, of California, and H. C. Sleigh Ltd. It will occupy about 150 squares of space. The Kingborough Commission agreed some months ago to lease the land to the company.

It was stated at the meeting of the commission this week that the

company expected to begin building in about a week, and that, eventually, it would employ about 20 persons.

It is believed it will export canned abalone mainly to the United States and Europe. Processing and freezing sections probably will be built first, followed by the installation of canning equipment.

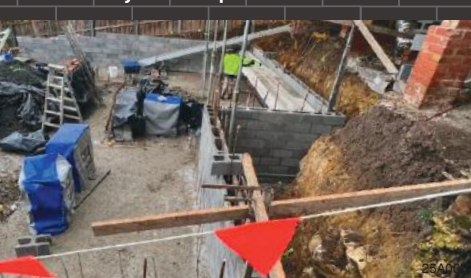
