Input on bypass

Kingborough residents received a letter last week, inviting comments on the State Government's preferred option for duplicating the Kingston Bypass.

On June 24, the Government released its plans for duplicating the bypass, including upgrading the Algona Road roundabout to a "full interchange", with a second roundabout, and a fly over bridge to enable traffic south of Kingston to bypass the roundabouts.

The letter to residents reads:

"The Department of State Growth is looking at ways to improve safety and traffic flow through the Kingston Bypass.

"We are investigating safety and congestion improvements for a 3.5-kilometre section of the Kingston Bypass which includes the intersections with Summersleas Road and the Huon Highway."

In a media release on June 24, Minister for Infrastructure and Transport, Michael Ferguson MP said, the section of road "includes the Algona Road Roundabout and Channel Highway intersection, through to the Groningen Road overpass.

"The Kingston Bypass will continue through to connect with the Channel Highway via an overpass, with roundabouts either side for the bypass on and off ramps, similar to the Summerleas Road/Huon Highway and Hobart Airport interchanges.'

Algona roadworks without a shared path "beggars belief"

The plans have come under fire for not including a shared path. In a media release on June 29, Bicycle Network's Public Affairs Manager Tasmania, Alison Hetherington said, "A safe shared path should be central to the proposed Algona roadworks and not shoved off to some future time"

"It beggars belief that in a \$60 million roadworks project one of the central elements is not a safe shared path to help kids get to school and sport, or their parents get to work and bus stops," commented Ms Hetherington.

"It's not clear in the proposals that have been put out for public comment this week whether the marked "future path" linking Kingston to Huntingfield will be built as part of the \$60 million project.

"It would be a false economy to say that a shared path can't be afforded in this project.

"By making it even more difficult to cross on foot or bike between Kingston and Huntingfield, the Government would potentially push more people into cars and make traffic problems worse.

"We want to see a cycling and walking underpass or overpass built when the ground is being dug up to put in the new roundabout

"Ensuring people don't have to cross busy slip lanes will future-

proof riding and walking in the area for years to come. "Many local trips are just a few kilometres, which should easily be made by bicycle or scooter, but are made more difficult when people have to cross the busy highways that dissect the greater

"The Huon Highway has underpasses to help people walking and riding, and the same access should be implemented for this upgrade.

"We know when governments build more road lanes it encourages more car trips, but if they build safe, separated cycling and walking links at the same time it gives more people more transport choices," Ms Hetherington said.

Kingston Beach water quality results

A comprehensive, water quality testing regime continues along Browns River as high rainfall events, causing flushing of the river, continue to generate poor water quality results at the northern end of Kingston Beach.

Five out of 88 results over a five-year period have produced a 'poor' water quality result, making swimming unadvisable in the vicinity.

In a media release on Tuesday, June 28, Kingborough Deputy Mayor, Jo Westwood said as a result of the Derwent Estuary Program's (DEP) long-term water quality ratings, Kingston Beach North had been classified as 'poor'

"This rating applies only to the northern end of Kingston Beach, more commonly known to locals as Dog Beach, where Browns River flows out," Cr Westwood said.

"The rating has come from five poor results out of 88 samples over the fivevear period. "The 'poor' long-term grading means that swimming is not advised at this

section of the beach. "Council undertakes weekly sampling over the summer season as part of the

DEP Beach Water program. "While we cannot yet point to the exact cause of the results recorded at Kingston

Beach North, we do know that this site is subject to flows from Browns River. "Periods of high rainfall result in a flushing of Browns River where the river

"Many local residents know that Browns River is not suitable for primary contact activities such as swimming.

"Weekly water testing is continuing over the winter months, including at the Browns River catchment, with Council already taking steps to intensively test and investigate catchments to find any sources of contamination.

"Council is prioritising investigation of possible contaminants that may end up in the stormwater network in the Kingston Beach area as well as the inputs higher up the catchment that feed into Whitewater Creek and Browns River.

"We also have a full time Stormwater Investigations Officer to investigate and track contaminations as they occur across Kingborough.

"Since 2019 Council's Stormwater Investigations Officer, in conjunction with TasWater, has investigated and resolved over 100 sewer spills, blockages and leaks across Kingborough.

"The Stormwater Investigations Officer is currently conducting a comprehensive water quality testing regime along Browns River.

"This will build an extensive picture of the water quality, to track any issues to the source as they are happening.

Child safety and cyclists missing on roundabout

Dear Editor,

The State Government's Algona Roundabout Upgrade Project focuses on reducing traffic congestion, and, from the concept design plans, it appears likely to be achieved.

The upgrade will be welcomed by frustrated, Kingborough road users.

However, doesn't reducing traffic congestion also involve providing people with more options for travelling to their destinations without taking their car?

With this in mind, it is very disappointing to see a "future shared path" across the highway listed on the plans, particularly when some of the most frequent and top-voted comments from the first round of consultation were regarding improved pedestrian and

With a \$60-million-plus project that is budgeted to take at least five years to complete, surely, it's a priority that the shared path and cycle access is included in this upgrade, and not a "future project" to be potentially (or possibly not) completed five-plus years in the future.

On behalf of

- the 1500-plus residents of Spring Farm and Whitewater Park Estates without a bus service, that may like to safely walk or ride to the new Metro park and ride:
- the hundreds of children that go to school within Huntingfield, that may wish to safely walk or ride their

bikes to and from school;

- the future 1000-plus residents of the State Government's Huntingfield subdivision, who would like the option to walk or ride to the Kingborough sporting precinct or high school instead of driving; and
- · all Kingborough residents who'd love the opportunity to safely enjoy an off-road, shared path from Kingston CBD to Snug, without having to cross a major road,

I urge the State Government to reconsider and include pedestrian and cycle access provisions in the Algona Roundabout Upgrade Project now.

These provisions should not just remain a "future project" on a set of plans, to be completed (or possibly not) five-plus years in the future.

close for an underpass Highway to

A section of the Huon Highway in Kingston is to be temporarily closed to facilitate the construction of a pedestrian underpass, linking Kingston Park to the Kingston Wetlands.

The closure will run from the traffic lights at the intersection of the Channel Highway and Huon Highway, near the Kingston Hotel, to the Kingston Bypass

In a media release on June 30, Kingborough Council stated the road will be closed for one month, from Saturday, July 9 until August 9.

Mayor of Kingborough, Paula Wriedt said the underpass will open up more connections and create "safer pedestrian movement".

"Council has coordinated this closure to begin at the

start of the school holidays to try and minimize traffic disruption," Cr Wriedt said.

"The alternate option of keeping a single lane open was investigated but would have resulted in three months of traffic disruption rather than four weeks.

"That three months would be significantly more expensive, less safe for construction workers and would have required further excavation that would have impacted upon the root protection zones of the high conservation value trees that we have retained," explained Cr Wriedt.

"This way, though an inconvenience to many traveling to and from Kingston, the time period is significantly shortened, with half the time occurring over the July

"Council will keep the public up to date with the works, through our local papers, via our social media sites as well as communicating alternative travel routes for everyone.

"This upgrade is part of a larger upgrade to the CBD area in Kingston.

"The community have overwhelmingly told Council that they want Kingston to be a dynamic, thriving and connected place with more attractive green spaces and improved links for pedestrians and cyclists.

"The upgrades to our roads, paths and CBD will make sure that Kingston is prepared for new growth, further investment and is an attractive place that people want to stay, shop and access services in."

"Maria Grist and her husband John have been researching the history of kunanyi / Mount Wellington for decades," noted Browns River History Group's president, Rosie Severs.


"Maria will tell the story of their research including the images, maps, and other documentation as well as their fieldwork on the mountain.

The talk is on Monday, July 11, from 3pm to 4pm, in the Library Learning Centre, 8 Hutchins Street in Kingston.





Labor responds to anti-protest Bill

The *Kingborough Chronicle* wrote to local Labor representitives Ella Haddad MP and Dean Winter MP regarding the criticisms of Labor's support of the controversial *Police Offences Amendment* (Workplace Protection) Bill 2022.

Independent Member for Nelson, Meg Webb MLC had confirmed no evidence was presented in Tasmania's Parliament to justify the new laws.

Labor had supported the Government's Bill, while seeking to carve out exemptions for some groups of Tasmanians.

"There have been strong criticisms in relation to the Police Offences Amendment (Workplace Protection) Bill 2022, including criticisms of Labor's support for the Bill, in both the House of Assembly and Legislative Council," wrote the Kingborough Chronicle.

- Australia Institute Tasmania
- Australian Democracy Network

- Independent Member for Clark, Kristie Johnston MP • Tasmanian Greens Member for Clark, Cassy O'Connor MP.'

In a response to the Kingborough Chronicle on June 27, Shadow Attorney General and Member for Clark, Ella Haddad MP, said Labor does not support the anti-protest Bill as it stands and intends to vote against it in the upper house and lower house when the Bill returns in August.

"Let me be very clear on this," Ms Haddad stated. "Labor does not support the anti-protest bill as it stands, and we never have.

"Our position on this has been very consistent.

"We support the right to protest, indeed the successes of the labour movement and many others over history have their roots in protest.

"Labor also supports the right for people to be safe at work and we don't support protest action that actively endangers the lives of workers, protesters or the public.

"The Government's Bill has gone too far.

"What this bill does it is says if people wish to protest, it has to be on the Liberal Government's terms.

"Labor tried to amend the Bill in the lower house, but the government rejected our amendments.

"We then did not prevent the Bill progressing to the upper house so we could move our amendments again.

"Our amendments failed again in the upper house because the Government and other MLCs did not support them.

"Without our amendments, Labor will not support the bill so we will be voting against it in the upper house and lower house when it returns in August.

No evidence to justify new laws.

The head of the Tasmanian Government Owned enterprise Sustainable Timber Tasmania, Steve Whiteley, wrote to the Kingborough Chronicle in June, claiming that peaceful protests are "specifically designed to cause discomfort, distress and trauma to people in their workplace".

However, no evidence was received from Mr Whiteley to support his claim.

Part of Mr Whiteley's letter to the editor was published on June 21.

The Kingborough Chronicle requested evidence from Mr Whiteley supporting the claim, however, no reply was received

It is not known whether the head of a Tasmanian Government Owned enterprise has a statutory responsibility to make accurate statements, supported by evidence.

issues and will be prioritising Kingston Beach north.

"Our priority is to keep the community informed in an accountable and transparent

"Council's website will be updated regularly, with weekly water testing results and any relevant new information.

Signs will advise beachgoers that swimming at Dog Beach is not recommended.

"Swimming is still recommended at the middle and southern sections of Kingston Beach.

"Swimming in the Derwent is not recommended for two days after heavy rain (more than 10mm of rain over a 24-hour period).

"Do not swim or allow children to play in or near the vicinity of stormwater outfalls or urban rivulets.

Food relief plan for public input

food-relief organisations have contributed to a draft food relief plan for Tasmania, and public comments are now invited.

The draft Food Relief to Food Resilience Action Plan, June 2022, published by the Department of Communities Tasmania, was developed in partnership with Anglicare Tasmania, Eat Well Tasmania Foodbank Tasmania Hobart City Mission Launceston City Mission, Loaves and Fishes Tasmania, Neighbourhood House Tasmania, Salvation Army, School Food Matters, St Vincent de Paul Society, Tasmanian Social Council of Social Services, and Volunteering Tasmania.

Actions proposed include transport partnerships, local food waste strategies, upscaling capability of Neighbourhood Houses, mapping of supply and demand, and school food pilot programs.

The draft plan proposes:

- To identify opportunities for state-wide food relief distributors to coordinate efforts to deliver freight efficiencies within the food sector, in and around
- A Tasmanian food resilience web-based platform, as a 'one-stop shop' information sharing platform for people in need and organisations involved in the
- To investigate opportunities to better connect state-wide and local food relief providers with the local agricultural, horticulture, and processing industries, to

increase food recovery and redistribution.

- To include the food sector in government-funded volunteering projects.
- A food relief geospatial map, providing a comprehensive dataset on the provision of emergency food relief, including providers, location, and information on supply and demand, overlayed with socio-economic disadvantage data, and data on population density.

The evaluation proposed involves the University of Tasmania and Menzies Institute for Medical Research.

"The Action Plan has been co-designed in partnership between the food relief sector and government," said Minister for Community Services and Development, Nic Street MP, in a media release on June 28.

"It represents a commitment to working collaboratively to achieve the goal of the Food Relief to Food Resilience Strategy 2021 - 2024.

"I recently wrote to Social Services Minister, Amanda Rishworth, requesting that the Commonwealth revisit its funding arrangements for emergency food relief in

"I look forward to meeting with Minister Rishworth to discuss this further.





The history of Landcare in Kingborough

Long-time Kingborough resident and Councillor, Flora Fox has shared the following personal account of the history of Landcare in the municipality, from the 1950s to today. Now in her 35th year on Council, Flora said the

reserves and walking tracks in the local area resulted from the long-term vision of residents and Council

"With their vision, reserves such as Boronia Hill and Tinderbox Hills provide spectacular public open spaces for residents to enjoy," noted Flora.

"Our foreshore walks, from Taroona to Bruny Island are

"Tracks like Whitewater creek provide the best of both worlds, linking rural and suburban areas, connecting homes with schools, shops, and work, though beautiful natural reserves along the river to the sea.

"One of the reasons Kingborough is such a wonderful place to live is because we can walk out the door to get some exercise, with so many magnificent tracks and reserves to choose from.

Landcare in Kingborough, from the 1950s to now A personal account, by Cr Flora Fox

As a young girl in the late 50's I often walked with my sister through the bush across the hills from Blackmans Bay to Kingston.

There were very few houses behind Blackmans Bay, and we enjoyed the water and mountain views, the wildflowers, and native birds.

We visited the library and shops at Kingston Beach. The only grocery shop in Kingston, near the Kingston

Beach Hall, was owned by the Walton family Hannah Walton was a very progressive lady for her

She donated a house on Windsor Street to the

community, to be used as a cooperative gallery.

Here, local artists and craftspeople could display and sell their paintings and produce.

I joined the Windsor Gallery co-operative in 1980 and took my turn on the committee.

I sold my homegrown pumpkins and potatoes, displayed in my homemade baskets made from garden

The co-operative formed the Kingston Garden Club and we regularly organised flower shows in the Kingston Hall. The original members of the co-operative became less able to manage the gallery, so we decided to sell Windsor

The proceeds were divided between several community causes, but the bulk of the money was donated in trust to Kingborough Council, to be used to acquire land and manage the bushland on Boronia Hill.

In 1994 The Boronia Hill Trust provided seed funding for

a federal grant, which paid for the employment of the Council's first Bushcare Officer.

This enabled Council to prepare the Boronia Hill Reserve Management Plan, the first Council Reserve Management Plan in Tasmania.

Another Windsor Gallery member, Nancy Tringrove, donated a large piece of land on Tinderbox Peninsula to create the Tinderbox Hills Reserve, which has recently expanded along the ridge towards Mount Louis.

The North-West Bay River track will soon provide trails for walkers, horse, and bike riders through native forest along the riverbanks.

This project started in 1988 when I was elected to Council and as farms along the river were being subdivided, I advocated for the creation of riparian reserves

In 1999 Council formally established the North-West Bay River Catchment Committee.

With federal funding, Council employed a project officer to create Australia's first Council Catchment Management Plan, resulting in weed removal and improved community access to the river.

In 1996 many volunteers had evolved into Landcare, Bushcare, and Coastcare groups, from Taroona to Bruny We gathered together regularly for mutual support, and

in 2005 we decided to formalise as the Kingborough Landcare Advisory Group (KLAG) Incorporated

This allowed us to receive and dispense grants for our member groups.

KLAG lobbied local, state, and federal governments for support and funding.

In 2010 KLAG's lobbying resulted in Kingborough Council budgeting for environmental management and employing two weed care officers.

Council's 2022/23 budget includes \$1.3 million for environmental management.

KLAG's Tracks and Trails Forum of 2005 resulted in Council forming a Tracks and Trails Committee.

Subsequently, Council developed a strategy to manage existing trails, new trails, and missing linkages. Council's booklet Kingborough's Tracks, now in its sixth

edition, was initiated by KLAG. It lists 42 tracks, ranging from short, easy strolls to

full-day challenging walks, with some suitable for horses, mountain bikes and dogs. Many of these tracks are maintained by KLAG

members, assisted by Council.

Today Kingborough Council has 24 Landcare groups, more than any other Council in Tasmania.

The Kingborough Landcare Advisory Group held a workshop in June to review achievements over the last 30 years, and to plan for the next 30 years.

Gymnast wins silver in Portugal

has won the silver medal in the Men's Double-Mini at the FIG World Cup in Coimbra, Portugal.

McLeod, 16, the youngest competitor in the field qualified for the final round of competition in third place behind Tiago Romao from Portugal and Gavin Dodd from Canada before performing a personal best to finish in second position behind Romao.

McLeod's performances in Coimbra are record breaking, with McLeod performing a difficulty record for any Tasmanian trampoline gymnast in his final routine, which consisted of two triple somersaults on the double-mini tramp.

The result also marks the first World Cup medal in the history of Tasmanian gymnastics.

State Coach and Trampoline Team Leader, Gymsports Management, Ben Kelly, says the final round of competition was "intense" with most gymnasts opting to compete triple somersaults to secure a spot on the

"Leuca's final score was actually equal with Romao in first place, however, tie-breaking rules within the sport meant McLeod had to settle for silver as Romao won the previous round of competition," noted Mr Kelly.

"Regardless, the experience and result should place McLeod in good stead and with confidence to build towards the next main event.

"McLeod will now focus on the final trial for the World Championship team to travel to Sofia, Bulgaria in November.

"Leuca lives in Deloraine and commutes weekly to Launceston and Hobart for his training regime at the PCYC and State Gymnastics Centre respectively.


