Sporting common ground

Local cricket, soccer, football and little athletics clubs are planning to meet in Kettering on July 27 to consider Kingborough Council's new policy to charge clubs on an hourly basis for use of sporting grounds in the municipality.

A workshop has been organised among local sporting club members to find common ground and a workable solution to put to Council as an

The Kingborough Chronicle met with the workshop organiser, Kaspar Deane, and Huon Channel Cricket Association's Brooke Lovell last week.

The pair said a nominal seasonal fee on a sliding scale, based on the size of each club, would be more

reasonable than an hourly rate.

There is concern that small clubs will not financially cope with the new fee impostion.

Some sports are also disadvantaged due to the time needed to play a match.

"The vast majority of clubs are united," said

"The issue for us is the fact it's an hourly rate. "Some clubs will have to consider cutting back their time, which means less-active kids.

Kaspar and Brooke said feedback from clubs was there had been a lack of consultation and "we're all concerned" that numerous clubs will not be able to cope with the imposed hourly fee policy.

"We're coming together to find some middle

ground

- "We're happy to work with Council."
- "We've got clubs here that are just junior clubs.
- "The cost is a big issue for young families. "If you lose a few players, you lose a team.
- "As clubs, we're volunteer run.
- "We want to get kids and adults active.
- "There's a social side too.
- "Physical health and mental health have never been more important."

The pair said there were concerns that Council's proposed hourly fee policy would also be a disincentive for expansion plans for clubs, such as those encouraging women's teams.

Killer COVID unrestricted

Tasmania's COVID death toll since 2020 passed 100 last week, and by Sunday, July 17, the figure had climbed to 109. Updates from the office of the Premier and Minister for Health Jeremy

Rockliff have continued to tell a grim tale. Current, known COVID cases in Tasmania on Sunday had surpassed 10,000. Epidemiologist and Greens Member for Franklin, Dr Rosalie Woodruff MP

again urged the Premier to reintroduce mask protections last week. "Tasmania has also recorded 100 people in hospital who have COVID, as new subvariants spread rapidly in the community," noted Dr Woodruff MP

in a statement on Tuesday, July 12. "This is the dire situation the State finds itself in, and Premier Rockliff is responsible for continuing to refuse to implement protections to dampen the severity.

"Hospitalisations are the highest they have ever been in Tasmania, but still the Premier won't reintroduce mask protections.

"Since the borders reopened, the Liberals have always claimed Tasmanians shouldn't worry about rising case numbers, because it is hospitalisations and deaths that are the real metric of concern.

"The Premier promised to act when they did - well, now will the Government finally do something?"

Masks dropped by State Government

The rising statistics have not changed the State Government's hands-off approach to the spread of the virus.

In a statement on Friday, July 15, as Tasmania has recorded 1727 new cases, another life was lost, and the total number of active cases reached 10,229, the Premier continued to wash his Government's hands of regulatory responsibilities, expressing it was a "collective responsibility" to curb the spread of the virus.

"Public Health officials have previously explained that fluctuations in daily case numbers are a part of living with COVID and it remains our collective responsibility to look out for one another by continuing to follow COVID-safe behaviours," stated Premier Rockliff.

Dr Woodruff MP said it is "a despicable irony" the Tasmanian Government has "dropped the mandated mask wearing in facilities for the most vulnerable, as Tasmanians and healthcare workers are groaning under the weight of a massive COVID wave of infections"

"Two-fifths of the Tasmanian population has been infected.

"What advice is Premier Rockliff relying on to say masks should stay off and people remain unprotected?

"The Greens have warned the Government a major winter COVID wave was coming, based on research and reports from other countries, and we have asked question after question in Parliament.

Public Health advice unseen by Parliamentarians

"We have written to the Premier and Health Ministers, along with the Director of Public Health, and received no response," stated Dr Woodruff MP on Tuesday, July 12.

"We even debated a motion in Parliament calling for the Liberals to release the public health advice they have relied upon to drop COVID protections, which they used their numbers to vote down."

National bank is leaving town

The National Australia Bank (NAB) branch in Kingston is set to close on September 29.

This follows a local Bendigo Bank branch closure in 2021, with the premises remaining vacant to date.

On May 5, the NAB announced strong half-yearly results, with a statutory net profit of \$3.55 billion and cash earnings of \$3.48 billion, representing an increase in cash earnings of 4 per cent compared to the same period in 2021.

NAB chief executive Ross McEwan, stated in the Half Yearly ASX announcement, "The execution of our strategy is delivering good results for our customers, colleagues and shareholders".

"We are producing better and faster experiences and

getting the basics right more consistently," he said.

"This has been achieved during a period of increased customer activity across all divisions of the bank, including the fastest growth in business lending since the Global Financial Crisis."

Under the heading Why are we here, the NAB Half Yearly Results Summary states, "To serve customers well and help our communities prosper".

Under another heading, titled How we work, the NAB states, "Excellence for customers".

"The decision by NAB stinks," wrote Dean Winter MP in an email to the Kingborough Chronicle last week in the relation to the closure.

"Another bank has left our area and I will say the same thing as I did last time.

"If we value local customer service, we should support banks that are actually here.

"My thoughts are with the fantastic NAB Kingston staff who have been supporting local people and businesses for many years.'

"In May, NAB announced it said it generated \$3.6 billion of statutory net profit after tax.

"Two months later it's closing our local branch."

The Kingborough Chronicle has requested comment from Federal Member for Franklin, Julie Collins MP, and shall report further.

In a meeting with the Kingborough Chronicle on Wednesday, July 13, member of the crossbench and Member for Franklin, David O'Byrne MP said he also had not been provided a copy of the Public Health advice the Premier claims to be relying on.

Tasmania's critical protection trigger threshold unknown

Meanwhile, the State Government's threshold for re-instating mask projections is unknown.

"Premier Rockliff owes Tasmanians an explanation," said Dr Woodruff MP.

"If it's not hospitalisations or deaths, what is the threshold for implementing critical protections and COVID mitigations?

"There is no humane reason for it to get worse."

Dr Woodruff, said the State's hospitals are under "huge strain from COVID cases, outbreaks and absenteeism".

"We have nurses, for example, working 12-hour shifts, and winter has only just begun."

Hospitals escalated as demand increases

On Wednesday, July 13, the Royal Hobart Hospital moved to Level 3 of its COVID-19 Management Escalation Plan.

The move followed recent Level 3 escalations at hospitals in the State's north.

Acting State Health Commander, Dale Webster said the move followed a recommendation of the Regional Health Emergency Management Team and is "based on the current level of COVID-positive inpatients, hospital demand and increasing level of staff absences impacting general operations"

"A reduced number of elective surgeries will be performed as appropriate, depending on hospital demand.

"The escalation will also potentially have an impact on outpatient services.'

Premier asks for financial aid to continue

While the State Government has abandoned its previous regulatory measures aimed at preventing spread of virus particles, the Premier insisted last week that Commonwealth COVID assistance be maintained.

"With COVID cases and hospitalisations continuing to increase across the country due to the more transmissible BA.4 and BA.5 subvariants, it is vital that both State and Federal Governments continue to offer financial support for testing and isolation," said Premier Rockliff on Thursday, July 14.

"The recent rise in cases is another demonstration that the pandemic is not over yet, and it remains vitally important that people in the community have access to tests, stay home and get tested if they have symptoms, and isolate if they test positive.

"The Tasmanian Liberal Government continues to play our part, with Pandemic Isolation Assistance Grants still available to those impacted."

On Saturday, July 16 at the National Cabinet meeting with the Prime Minister and fellow State and Territory leaders, the Federal Government announcement to reinstate the Pandemic Leave Disaster Payment until September 30, 2022.

Spring Farm Public open space

Kingborough Council is seeking public input on the development of the Public Open Space land in Spring Farm Estate.

The site is located on Spring Farm Road, adjacent to Whitewater Creek in Kingston.

Council's website states "in the past three years, around 600 residential lots have been created in the Spring Farm and Whitewater Park Estate developments".

"The land has a central stand of trees that will be retained as native bushland habitat and left undeveloped except for some additional native plants and grasses.

"The remaining open land will be developed into a play/recreation space for the community.

"Council has provided an allocation of \$200,000 funding to develop this Public Open Space.

"This funding includes design work, consultation and installation of play equipment, pathways, park furniture etc.

"Council has also provided \$269,000 in funding this year to develop a shared use path along Whitewater Creek in Spring Farm Estate to link up with the existing Whitewater Creek track

"The new path will go right past the Spring Farm Play

Council is seeking feedback on elements the public would like to see included in the design for the open space, including "choices about play and exercise equipment,

seating, shelter, walkways, information signs and anything else the community believes is a priority".

Council notes the budget is finite, and construction costs will also guide the design outcome.

Council is seeking feedback via an online survey and input received will be provided to a landscape architect.

Calvin celebrates NAIDOC Week

Staff and students at Calvin Christian School braced the cold winter air on Wednesday morning, July 6, to create a stunning representation of the Aboriginal flag using hundreds of coloured hands.

Calvin Principal, Scott Ambrose said the Sea of Hands was the culmination of significant work by Calvin's Reconciliation Action Plan Committee

"I'm so grateful for the tireless work of the team, which was formed last year and includes Janelle Smith, a palawa woman and a past student of Calvin.

"Their efforts have helped us recognise the significant contribution that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people have made to the Calvin community," he said.

The first Sea of Hands was held in 1997 in front of Parliament House in Canberra, but it is now a symbol of reconciliation and a way for communities all around Australia to engage with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures, histories and issues.

"At Calvin, the Sea of Hands was a symbol of support

for our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students, staff and community during NAIDOC Week

"The hands were cut out by students over the past few weeks, and messages of support for reconciliation were written on many of the hands.

Students have also been participating in NAIDOC Week activities as part of their studies.

Historical NAIDOC Week posters were displayed along the windows of classrooms and students explored the historical context of each poster.

A number of students noted the rich symbolism present on many of the posters, prompting conversations about historical and cultural issues relevant to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders in Australia.



The wrong that is drawing Americans from their rights

Article 3 of the *Universal Declaration of Human* Rights states, "Everyone has the right to life, liberty, and security"

This has not been achieved for all people, especially not in the United States of America.

This is due to the country's gun control laws.

Currently, there is a strong debate on whether gun control laws should be tightened to ensure the safety of Americans, particularly students, and teachers.

From the perspective of a privileged white Australian sheltered from a society with common gun ownership, it is easy to wholeheartedly agree with the need for tougher gun control laws in America.

On May 24, America experienced its second-worst mass school shooting in it's history (ABC News, 2022), at Robb Elementary School in Uvalde, Texas.

Jazmin Cazares, sister to a victim of the shooting, said in an address to lawmakers, "There should be absolutely no reason this murderer could have access to a

Actor Matthew McConaughey shared this view, saying at the White House, "We want safe and secure schools, and we want gun laws that won't make it so easy for the bad guys to get these damn guns".

Opposing views argue that "there is little to no evidence showing that tightening laws on guns will prevent violent crimes and similar shootings'

In looking at different countries and their policies on auns in relation to statistics of mass shootings, there is proof to the contrary.

After the 1996 Port Arthur shooting in Tasmania, gun control laws in Australia were tightened, banning rapid-fire long guns.

In the 18 years prior to the Port Arthur Massacre, Australia recorded 13 mass shootings.

In the 26 years since then, there have been none.

This alone proves that tighter gun laws have a lasting and major impact on violent crimes

There are, however, simpler yet still impactful paths that could be taken.

McConaughey suggested, "We need to restore our American values, and we need responsible gun owner-

"We need background checks.

"We need to raise the minimum age to purchase an

"We need a waiting period for these rifles.

"We need red flag laws and consequences for those who abuse them.

The Editorial board of the New York Times Opinion agrees that action must be taken, saying, "The Second Amendment trumps reasonable efforts to protect public

The gun control laws in America mean that the right to life, liberty, and security is not available to all people This has to change.

As the New York Times Opinion Editorial Board wrote, "any progress on guns in progress worth making".

This is a human right that no one should have to fight for.

Two local artists, inspired by the landscape, culture and history of the Channel and Huon, are exhibiting artworks in July and August.

The art is to be displayed in separate sections of the Schoolhouse Gallery at the Rosny Farm Arts Centre, It is the first solo exhibition for landscape artist Dr Sally

Titled Water and Sky, Sally's display shows a collection of reduction linocuts depicting the Tasmanian land-

One of the artworks, Lost Forests, is an underwater depiction of what was previously an extensive kelp forest in the Actaeon Reef system at the southern entrance to the D'Entrecasteux Channel.

The artwork shows the perspective looking up out of the water towards the Bruny Island lighthouse.

"I was lucky enough to go scuba diving near this kelp forest as a student and was saddened to find that less than five per cent of eastern Tasmania's kelp forests now remain," Dr James remarked.

"I wanted to represent a kelp forest in an artwork to raise awareness of this natural treasure so close to home and to support the work now being done on kelp forest restoration."

Other works feature the unique beauty of landscapes in Kingborough and surrounds, such as coastal rock pools near Boronia Beach in Kingston, and the complex eddies and currents of the North West Bay River near

"As well as visual beauty, I am often inspired by how this landscape supports and enriches the lives of those who live here, something that is so easily taken for aranted

"The artwork Sea Scout Regatta, Snug shows people developing deeper ties to local beauty spots by interacting with them and creating good memories.

A Bite of the Apple is a new series of work by artist Henrietta Manning

The series explores the history of the Tasmanian apple industry and the lives and aspirations of those working in it today.

Using a technique that transfers ink from printed material into gesso, Henrietta has combined historical text and imagery with objects painted from life.

With 40 different apples painted, Henrietta said her ambition to paint all varieties of apples grown in Tasmania has not quite been realised.

"My research has led me in so many fascinating directions, I previously had no idea of the number of apple varieties, or how we risk the loss of many of those heritage apples today," noted Henrietta.

With a heritage apple shed in the Huon as her studio the artist's interest is personal.

"Highlights include meeting wonderful people who remember the early days and being able to incorporate some of those stories into my work, painting inside the old sheds and going behind the scenes of contemporary orchardists' lives," remarked Henrietta.

"One example is a painting of a dress belonging to the Belle of the Ball from the last Apple Festival in 1964.

"Originating in 1952 these festivals were huge community events promoting Tasmanian apples around the world.


Displayed with the artworks will be original tools and memorabilia, including a 1964 Belle of the Ball dress, kindly loaned by Mrs Bronwen Wedd. The exhibition will be open Wednesday to Sunday,

between the hours of 11am and 5pm, from Friday, July 29, until Sunday, August 21.
