Rental crisis

Member for Franklin, David O'Byrne is calling on the State Government to introduce a levy on full-time short-stay properties, as the rental market has continued to become increasingly tight and unaffordable for locals, including working families.

"The tightening rental market in Kingborough is growing increasingly unaffordable for many, while the number of short-stay accommodation properties in the region climbs above pre-pandemic levels," wrote David O'Byrne MP in an email to the Kingborough Chronicle on July 19.

"Rental prices in Kingborough have increased by around 50 per cent over the last five years, and has pushed many household budgets to their limit.

"Families right across the state are struggling to get a roof over their head, and Kingborough

"Near-record low rental vacancy rates have been exacerbated by several rental properties moving over to short stay websites like Airbnb, with the latest data indicating that there are approximately 450 of these properties in the Kingborough local government area alone.

"Thousands of Tasmanians with nowhere to go are languishing on near-record social housing wait lists, with wait times for priority applicants surpassing 72 weeks."

Mr O'Byrne said a levy on short stay properties would 'level the playing field' between renters

"It could operate much like other short stay accommodation levies used throughout the world, applied and collected automatically when a booking is made," suggested Mr O'Byrne.

"Revenue from the scheme should be appropriated directly to homelessness and crisis accommodation services.

Questioning bank branch closure

The National Australia Bank has confirmed its Kingston branch is permanently closing on September 29.

Federal Member for Franklin and Federal Minister for Small Business, Julie Collins MP said she is concerned the NAB's decision to close the branch may "impact adversely" upon local customers who are elderly and those who have mobility issues.

"The provision of banking services to regional and rural communities is vital and I hope that with this decision customers who are impacted will be able to continue to access the banking services they rely on from NAB,"

Last edition, the Kingborough Chronicle reported comments from State Member for Franklin, Dean Winter MP regarding local customers, staff, and the bank's recent multi-billion-dollar after-tax profits.

In response, NAB Corporate Affairs' representative Peter Dalton said, "It's important to note that we're working closely with our colleagues on new opportunities, with a commitment to no job losses'

"In addition to this, it's important to note that our branch team are already talking with our customers about their banking requirements and the various alternatives available." Mr Dalton provided a statement attributable to NAB Retail Customer Executive Tasmania, Lara Faithfull.

"Increasingly customers are banking digitally, with more than 94 per cent of customer interactions now taking place over the phone, by video or online," explained Ms Faithfull.

"As more and more customers are choosing to bank online, we're investing in improving our digital platform to make it easier and faster."

When questioned further, Mr Dalton clarified, "The quoted 94 per cent figure is a national number", not specific to Kingston.

"While our physical branch presence in Kingston will no longer be there, we will still be there for our customers, just in different ways," stated Ms Faithfull.

On June 30 the PBAC recommended changes to the PBS eligibility criteria for oral antiviral drugs molnupiravir (Lagevrio®) and nirmatrelvir and ritonavir (Paxlovid®), "in the light of current understanding of the evidence for effectiveness and safety of these medicines, recent PBS utilisation patterns, and the changing epidemiology of COVID-19".

Omicron wave reaches Kingborough

COVID cases reported in Kingborough reached 882 in the week ending July 9, the third highest rate among local government areas in Tasmania.

Kingborough recorded a "high" case rate of 23 cases per 1000 residents.

Huon Valley increased from a "moderate" to "high" case rate, recording 313 cases, equating to 17 cases per

The July 10 Weekly Surveillance Report stated the "new wave" of COVID transmission being observed across Tasmania was due to the Omicron BA.5 sub-lineage.

Weekly case numbers for the state increased by 33 per cent from 7632 to 10,185.

State Health Commander, Kathrine Morgan-Wicks on Wednesday, July 20 said the number of COVID-19 cases has increased throughout winter and the impact on hospitals has been significant.

"There are currently 25 outbreaks in Tasmanian

residential aged care facilities across the State," noted Ms Morgan-Wicks.

"Public Health strongly recommends wearing a mask in all indoor places and on public transport, and in other settings if you can't physically distance.

The "strong recommendations" from Public Health have not prompted the Tasmanian Government to reintroduce mask mandates, however.

'Masks are still required to be worn in all our public hospitals and high-risk settings," noted Ms Morgan-Wicks.

"There are currently 173 COVID-positive patients in Tasmanian public hospitals across the State, with 49 patients being treated specifically for COVID-related illness, with two in ICU.

Meanwhile, the Aged and Community Care Providers Association (ACCPA) reported on July 16 there had been an "alarming rise" in COIVID outbreaks, with 857 aged care homes managing outbreaks across the nation, representing 31 per cent of aged care homes, and with 120 of homes becoming affected the previous week.

"Already, more than 5200 residents and 2700 staff are infected," reported ACCPA interim CEO Paul Sadler.

"Over 2100 residents have died this year.

"There have been 223 deaths in the past two weeks." In recent days the death toll has continued to increase in southern Tasmania.

Premier and Minister for Health, Jeremy Rockliff confirmed on Saturday, July 23 "a person in their late 70s has passed away in the state's south"

On Sunday July 24, the Premier confirmed "a man in his 80s and a woman in her late 60s have passed away in the state's south".

Yesterday, Monday, July 25, the Premier confirmed two further COVID-related deaths in the state's south, a man in his late 70s and man in his 40s.

"We need to encourage existing rental properties to stay in the rental market, rather than have more properties bleed into the short stay market," continued Mr O'Byrne.

"At the moment, tourists are effectively outbidding renters for scarce housing supply, and it's having an adverse effect on our community

"Some have called for caps on the number of short stay properties or increasing council rates on such properties. "But these approaches would create inequities and distortions in the market by not treating all investors and owners equally.

The Kingborough Chronicle has written to the Premier and Minister for Housing asking if Mr O'Byrne's proposed solution to the rental crisis will be considered by the Tasmanian Government.

The Kingborough Chronicle has also asked the Premier whether he thinks it is a problem if a lobbying firm represents both short-stay accommodation providers and a charity organisation assisting homeless people.

The Kingborough Chronicle shall report the Premier's response next edition.

Lobbying laws missing

Meanwhile, Independent Member for Nelson Meg Webb said last week the Integrity Commission review into Tasmania's lobbying regulation system has exposed it to be one of the weakest and most ineffectual in the nation.

"Currently there are 66 third-party 'hired gun' lobbyists on the Lobbyist Register, but under our passive and opaque system the activities of registered lobbyists are invisible and unaccountable," Ms Webb said.

"Unlike other jurisdictions, Tasmania does not require the public disclosure of which MP was lobbied, by whom, when and on which legislation or policy.

"Our minimalist system also allows in-house lobbyists and others actively lobbying to influence legislation and policy outcomes to go unregistered and unseen."

Ms Webb said necessary reforms include the introduction

of lobbying legislation "with teeth" to ensure compliance, and an expanded regulatory system to include all lobbyists and all MPs

"All Members of Parliament should be covered by the state's lobbying regulation system," Ms Webb said.

"Consideration should be given to including local government councillors under the state's lobbying

'The definition of "lobbyist" and the lobbying regulatory system should be expanded to include in-house and other lobbyists additional to third-party lobbyists.

"Specific legislation should be introduced to empower the Integrity Commission to provide lobbying oversight and compliance measures.

Ms Webb said the payment of lobbying "success fees" should be banned, and lobbyists should be required to provide in an online register, among other things, information on which public officers were lobbied and when, the purpose and substance of the contact, and the desired and intended outcomes from the contact.

LGBTIQ+ community consultation open Kingborough Council has commenced consultation

to improve its understanding of local experiences and needs of the LGBTIQ+ community.

Council aims to learn what else can be done to make the municipality a safer and more inclusive

"We want to know what the LGBTIQ+ community, their family, friends and allies would like to see as far as leadership and support from Council when it comes to making Kingborough more welcoming and inclusive," said Cr Amanda Midgley, Chair of Kingborough Council's LGBTIQ+ working group.

'This working group has representatives from the LGBTIQ+ community and they are helping staff to develop engagement material for consultation.

"Council has also received support from Working It Out, a Tasmanian organisation dedicated to raising

awareness, providing support and advocacy for the Tasmanian LGBTIQ+ communities.

"Recent research conducted by Council, revealed anonymous surveys were the preferred method of

consultation with Kingborough's LGBTIQ+ community. "In response, we have launched our new anonymous survey online to collect information on people's experiences, issues and perceptions of Kingborough in relation to safety, discrimination and inclusiveness.

The information from the survey will be used to produce an LGBTIQ+ Action Plan.

Responses to the survey are welcome from all members of the LGBTIQ+ community, their family, friends, and organisations that support this community.

More than 1800 tonnes of organic waste has been diverted from landfill in only eight months, thanks to locals participating in Kingborough Council's Food Organics and Garden Organics (FOGO) collection service.

The FOGO service was introduced by Council last October.

"With approximately 60 per cent of the average household bin made up of food and garden waste, FOGO has been an important tool in reducing waste to landfill," said Mayor, Paula Wriedt.

"Since October an extra 900 households have joined our fortnightly FOGO service, which converted from green waste to food organics and garden organics.

"This means an extra 400 tonnes of organic waste was diverted from landfill from October 2021

"Diverting organic waste from landfill not only reduces the amount of waste we have to bury, it reduces our community's greenhouse gas emissions

'This equates to saving 1638 carbon dioxide equivalents of greenhouse gas emissions from entering the atmosphere.

"As well as diverting FOGO from landfill, as a community we are reducing the amount of recyclable material we

"Through our dedicated recycling unit, permanently located inside the Council Civic Centre, our Barretta and Bruny Island Waste and Recycling Centres, and our collection services we have diverted over 7000 tonnes of material from being landfilled.

"Our permanent recycling unit at the Civic Centre collects items like batteries, light bulbs, x-rays, coffee pods, small e-waste, toner cartridges and batteries,' noted Cr Wriedt

"Last financial year we diverted over 14 tonnes of paint, 34 tonnes of television and computer e-waste, 27 tonnes of oil, and nearly 760 tonnes of metal, which is fantastic news for our environment.

Plastic-free July

'This month is *Plastic Free July*," said Cr Wriedt.

"Plastic Free Places are helping local businesses to transition away from single use plastics. Council is encouraging food businesses to "get with

the Plastic Free Places Program".

Barretta Waste and Recycling Centre has a dedicated area for recycling fluorescent tubes and light globes, oil, batteries, glass bottles and jars, cardboard, paper, co-mingled (plastic bottles and milk cartons), e-waste, and marine flares.

Bruny Island Recycling Centre has a facility for recycling cardboard, glass, co-mingled paper and plastic, car batteries, cooking oil, aluminium cans, and engine oil (in 20-litre drums).

Tasmania Police have urged motorists to be cautious and to drive to the road conditions after icy, wet weather and snowfalls increased road hazards and risks last week.

"With ice on our roads this morning, which is predicted to continue for the coming days, it's timely for police to remind all motorists of the importance of driving to the conditions and being alert for ice on our roads," stated Inspector Jim Semmens on July 19.

"Winter brings adverse road conditions such as ice, rain and slippery, and it's imperative motorists drive to the conditions to prevent crashes. Safety actions for driving in

adverse weather Drive to the conditions, reducing

- speed to allow plenty of time to stop safely.
- Be aware roads can become slippery from rain, hail, ice, and snow.
- Leave plenty of space between your vehicle and the vehicle ahead; four seconds at least in poor conditions
- the vehicle in front to increase safety. • Don't allow distractions such as
- mobile phones to affect your judgment and reaction times. Pay attention to road warning
- signs about hazardous conditions. Drive with headlights on when visibility is poor.
- Ensure tyres are in good condition and are correctly inflated.
- Ensure the windscreen is free of ice, clean and the demister is working as it should.
- Ensure wiper blades work and are in good condition.

"He painted at the large estates around Longford.
"Enid had a frugal, but very happy family upbringing, in the close-knit, English-style village.

"They rode bikes everywhere, even to Avoca for family

"Enid did very well at school and started nursing in 1940, at the beginning of the Second World War, in Launceston.

"Enid became a Sister of Nursing, an absolute credit to her.
"She rode her bike to Launceston General Hospital, guided by the frost on the side of the roads during blackout restrictions.

"Enid met her husband while nursing, as his sisters were nurses also.

"She met John at Winnaleah, where his family farm was."
The couple farmed at Winnaleah, then Forth before
moving to Devonport to run the Star Theatre milk bar.

"Enid went back to training doing midwifery at Mersey dospital.

"Enid and a group of other nurses then started the first creche in Devonport, which was well respected in the community."

After a few years in Brisbane, the couple moved to Kingborough in 2012 to be near eldest daughter Maxine and son-in-law Graham.

"She used to come here for holidays to visit family in her young days, having many happy memories here," wrote Maxine.

"John passed away at Snug Village in 2016."

Enid has two daughters, four grandchildren, and three great grandchildren.




