Silence on rental crisis

It's Homelessness Week, and with the rental market in Kingborough growing increasingly unaffordable, including for working families, the Kingborough Chronicle sent the following questions to the Premier and Minister for Housing on Monday, July 25.

"Regarding the rental crisis in Tasmania, has the Premier considered the suggested solution for a levy on short-stay rental accommodation, as proposed by David O'Byrne MP?

"Will the Tasmanian Government be giving consideration to Mr O'Byrne's suggested solution for a levy on short-stay rental accommodation to encourage long-term rental properties to stay in the long-term rental market?

"Does the Premier consider there may be a problem if a lobbying firm represents both a private, short-stay accommodation provider and a charity or not-for-profit organisation that provides support for homeless people?

"Given a lobbyist's "success fees" are hidden, could it be the case that a large private organisation is lobbying elected representatives more than a charity or not-for-profit organisation, and tipping the balance of power in

favour of the private organisation's interests?

"Could unseen lobbying be part of the cause of the rental crisis impacting Tasmanian families?

At time of print, there has been no response received from either Premier Rockliff or Minister for Housing, Guy Barnett MP.

Meanwhile, TasCOSS is calling on the Tasmanian Government to take urgent action to address soaring cost of living pressures, as new data from the Australian Bureau of Statistics shows Hobart's Consumer Price Index now sits at 6.5 per cent, well above the national average of 6.1 per cent. In a media release on Thursday, July 28, TasCOSS CEO Ms Adrienne

Picone said according to the data, the cost of housing has increased 8.9 per cent in the past year.

"It is the basic living essentials which have recorded the most significant cost increases in the past year alone, with the cost of food up by 5.3 per cent, transport costs increasing by a staggering 16.7 per cent, petrol a whopping 36.6 per cent and housing up 8.9 per cent," stated Ms Picone.

Environment alarms ringing

Kingborough residents concerned about our environment, including water quality at local beaches, may be interested to hear Tasmania's State of the Environment Report is eight years overdue.

By law, the report is due every five years, however the last report was published over a decade ago, in 2009.

On July 5, the Kingborough Chronicle reported that Kingborough Council was taking steps to intensively test and investigate catchments to build a picture of the local water quality.

Many people and businesses in Kingborough also rely on eco-tourism and the tourism industry in Tasmania.

On July 19, Independent Member for Nelson Meg Webb MLC said, "The legislated required Tasmanian State of the Environment Report risks being listed as endangered or extinct itself, since it has not been sighted since 2009"

"The Act stipulates its release every five years," noted Ms Webb.

"In June, I asked Planning Minister Ferguson when the Report would be released and received a 'yes Minister' style response which would do Sir Humphrey Appleby proud. "Worryingly, Minister Ferguson made it apparent only options regarding

who was responsible for the report's production were expected to be presented to Government by the end of the year.

Switch on at Snug

Channel residents will get the chance to drive an electric car, at a showcase of electric vehicles (EVs) in Snug on Saturday, August 20.

The Snug Electric Vehicle Fair is an initiative of Net Zero Channel, and is supported by the Tasmanian branch of the Australian Electric Vehicle Association (AEVA).

The Net Zero Channel group is focused on reducing carbon emissions in the Channel. 'The Snug Electric Vehicle Fair will feature an expect-

ed 20 electric cars with experts on hand to provide the latest information on the costs of buying and maintaining an EV," noted group member Peter Laud.

"A number of EV owners in the Channel have offered their cars for use on the day.

Topics in a Q&A session will include the number of charging points in Tasmania and the different ranges that vehicles have. AEVA Tasmania vice president Clive Attwater has

been invited as the guest speaker.

Mr Attwater will discuss the cost and lower-emission

environmental benefits of EV ownership.

"Representatives from the Good Car Company, which sells second-hand imported models, will also provide the latest information on State Government help for prospective purchasers," said Peter Laud.

"Sales of electric vehicles in Australia have tripled since 2020, to more than 20,000 last year, and that number is expected to rise with increased availability and the potential for reduced purchase costs

"Net Zero Channel is studying the best way of establishing the area's current carbon footprint among homes and business.

The group aims to monitor improvements over time, electric cars and other cost-effective lifestyle changes are made.

The Net Zero Channel group aims to make the Channel the first carbon-neutral region in Tasmania.

The Fair will take place from 10.30am to 2.30pm at Snug Park, on Beach Road in Snug.

Petrusma resignation

A recount will be conducted to fill a vacancy in Tasmania's House of Assembly, representing the division of Franklin, following the resignation of Jacquie Petrusma on Monday, July 25.

The Tasmanian Electoral Commission's Commissioner, Andrew Hawkey, said Franklin candidates who were not elected at the 2021 State election have until August 15, to nominate to contest

Ms Petrusma had held ministerial portfolios for Police, Fire and Emergency Management, Parks and Prevention of Family Violence.

Ms Petrusma, who was first elected in 2010 said the

decision to resign was "the right one" for her family In a statement, Ms Petrusma thanked her electorate office staff, ministerial office staff, colleagues, Premier

Jeremy Rockliff and former premiers for "the opportunity to serve in their respective cabinets for nearly six and a half years".

"As a victim-survivor of family and sexual violence responding to and the prevention of family and sexual violence was one of the strongest motivations for me becoming an MP," noted Ms Petrusma.

"I will continue to be a strong advocate and remain very committed to help drive further actions.

Felix Ellis MP has been elevated to the cabinet.

Royal pride at Snug fire brigade

Snug Volunteer Fire Brigade is warm with pride after its latest brush with Royalty.

The volunteers were recently presented with a letter of appreciation from Buckingham Palace, after forming a connection with HRH Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh.

Snug Volunteer Fire Brigade Life Member David Archer and Snug Volunteer Fire Fighter Stephenie Wigg have complied the following story for the community.

Just four weeks after the 1967 bushfires that devastated the Snug community, Prince Philip visited the established Snug Park, a city of tents, huts and caravans housing those who in the Channel community who lost their homes.

Just two days after the event, the plan was made to assist the community with volunteers and contractors from all over the state and the mainland, contributing in the establishment of the temporary housing located where Snug Oval is today.

By the February 18, just eleven days in total, the first family settled into their accommodation.

On the 40th anniversary of the 1967 fires, the Duke of Edinburgh sent a letter of reflection expressing his vivid memories of the destruction, and meeting the affected families during his visit.

In his letter, Prince Phillip sent his well wishes and said he was pleased that the community still commemorates the tragedy.

Following Prince Philip's passing in April 2021, members who were present during his visit sent their sympathies to Queen Elizabeth II and shared their experience of the Royal visit.

Environment report eight years overdue

On the same day, Tuesday, July 19, the Secretary General of the United Nations, Antonio Guterres said that humanity is committing "collective suicide", as extreme heat continued to break records in Europe and North America.

The Kingborough Chronicle asked Premier Rockliff, Environment Minister Jaensch and Planning Minister Ferguson for a response to five questions:

"Why has Tasmania missed two State of the Environment Reports?" asked the Kingborough Chronicle.

"Given the importance of the environment to Tasmania's local community, local businesses, and local economy, and future generations why has this report not been a priority?

"How is it possible that State law (stipulating the reports release every five years) has not been followed? "Who is responsible for the years of delay, and what is the

consequence for those responsible for breaching the law? "When can the public expect to see the report?"

Tasmania's Minister for Environment and Climate Change Roger Jaensch, did not answer the questions, instead, he made mention of a Commonwealth government report released in July.

"I am aware of the release of the national State of the Environment report," stated Minister Jaensch.

"We will take time to fully consider the report."

Minister for Planning, Michael Ferguson MP said the Tasmanian Government is "undertaking a review" of its State of the Environment reporting requirements.

"The Tasmanian State of the Environment sits with the Tasmanian Planning Commission but given its statutory roles and responsibilities it is widely recognised as not the most appropriate authority for this work," Minister Ferguson replied, on July 21.

"The Government is currently undertaking a review of the reporting requirements, the format of the report and the most suitable authority for the work and will include extensive public consultation.

"I understand that a number of Tasmanian Government agencies contributed to the Commonwealth State of Environment report released today.'

On Thursday, July 21, the Kingborough Chronicle asked, 'Can the Premier Rockliff, Minister Jaensch and Minister Ferguson inform us of the date the current review started and where/when it was first mentioned to the public?"

No response has been received at the time of going

Kingston High School 50 Year Anniversary

1972 - 2022

Innovation and camaraderie

As part of the Kingston High School (KHS) 50th anniversary, former staff and students are sharing their stories of the school's history since opening in 1972.

The Bennett family

With two generations of the Bennett family teaching at both KHS sites, the Bennett name has become synonymous with Kingston High over much of its history.

Mathematics teacher, and later assistant principal, Brian Bennett joined the school in

Brian's son John, currently the Grade 8 Team Leader, joined the staff in 2016.

Brian and John both joined an 'open plan' school, considered innovative and state-of-

An original staff member recently commented that teaching at KHS was "like teaching in a fish-bowl", as so many visiting teachers came to see the school.

In 1974 when Brian started, the school buildings were still being constructed and he remembers at one time having to teach groups in the principal's office!

The highlight for Brian was the camaraderie that existed amongst the comparatively small

One of Brian's greatest pleasures today is running into former students and colleagues and hearing what they are doing with their

Brian taught for 28 years, under four principals, including Syd Eldridge, Dennis Meehan, David Billing, and Helen Gourley.

He recalls seeing the gradual changes that took place over time, including the uniform, the timetabling, and the way student behaviour was managed.

Although canes were permitted in schools in the early years, Brian does not remember them being used at KHS, rather other less-physical methods were used to encourage students to behave appropriately.

Brian remembers once shutting the door firmly behind him to speak sternly to a misbehaving student, then being most embarrassed when he had to call another staff member to help, after the door became jammed and could not be reopened!

Since joining the school in 2016, John too

Teachers now are part of a team that primarily focusses on the teaching, learning and pastoral care of students within a specific year group.

He notes that families are now an integral part of students' progress and are regularly in communication with the school.

As Team Leader, John has close ties with the families of his students in his care, and meets with at least one family daily.

The majority of staff meetings held today are team-based, focusing on issues relating to the teaching and learning for each year

When whole staff meetings are held, they are structured and generally focus on whole school issues.

In contrast, in Brian's early experience the meetings of all staff were frequent, and mainly informal, where any teacher could raise any issue.

Staff were even allowed to smoke during the meetings!

'Activities Week' was a feature of the early school, and for many students and teachers was the year's highlight.

Week-long camps were held in various places, like Maria Island and Coningham, while a range of other activities were offered at the school

For years, Brian and his colleague Carl Boucher took groups of students to the Central Highlands on fishing trips.

These trips were legendary and were enjoyed by all participants.

Brian doubts whether the trips would have happened with today's 'risk management' requirements.

Today, camps are primarily enjoyed by Grade 9 students, with current regulations always adhered to.

Things may have changed over the years, although, like Brian, John enjoys teaching in a school that is well equipped to help prepare students for their years ahead.

Today, KHS has the quality teaching staff and technological support to implement its primary focus; the development of individual learning, giving students the best chance of success in an increasingly uncertain world.

Back to Woodbridge Weekend in August

The Woodbridge Life 2022 celebratory program continues with a weekend of activities on August 13 and 14, inviting people to explore Woodbridge's past and present.

Committee Chair Graham Rae is inviting people to browse the town, where several well-known village landmarks have a Woodbridge story or two to tell.

The landmarks will be open from 10am to 4pm.

At the Woodbridge Community Hall, a *Stories of*

At the Woodbridge Community Hall, a *Stories of Woodbridge* exhibit will present a variety of facts, anecdotes and memorabilia covering 40,175 years.

A feature will be a presentation, recounting the story of 40,000 years of continuing Tasmanian Aboriginal habitation, staged by the South East Tasmanian Aboriginal Corporation.

This will provide an historic contrast with stories from the 175 years of European colonisation.

A few doors along from the Hall, opposite the Post Office, view the colourful history of one of Woodbridge's more imposing heritage buildings, the old Channel Emporium (c 1890).

The Uniting Church Hall (opposite the school) will host a display focusing on the role the School and Marine Discovery Centre have played through the years.

Organiser Pam Nossiter noted that something to look for at this site is a model of the *RV Penghana* which has played such a critical part in the Centre's learning program. Another prominent local site, the West Winds Community

Centre, will be open on the Saturday only.

The West Winds Art Group exhibition has been extended, giving visitors an opportunity to see this marvellous body of local work.

The Anglican Church of St Simon and St Jude will be open on Saturday as part of the History Walk and to showcase its copy of the original King James Bible, presented to the church at the time of its consecration.

This theme continues into the next day, Sunday, August 14. At 9.30am a special service, based on the liturgy in use when the church was founded in 1885, will be led by the Reverend Lesley Borowitzka.

While welcoming everyone to attend, Church Warden Mark Harrison also encourages attendees to enter into the spirit of the occasion by wearing period costume.

After the service, the church will remain open for a series of local history discussions in which a number of residents will speak on topics special to Woodbridge.

History Walk

For those who want to see more, a short history walk will be on offer, taking in the late Victorian gothic ambience of the village.

It is an opportunity to learn more about the built heritage dating back to the late 19th century and lesser-known landmarks such as the 163-year-old cemetery.

Don't leave pets in pain
