No rate discounts for private developer

A request for rates remission by the developer of a shopping centre in Margate has been denied by Kingborough Council.

Developer Kalis Group had sought a 20-year concession. to a total value of over \$1 million, on Council rates, fees, and charges associated with the development on the Channel Highway in Margate.

The motion to deny the request was moved by Councillor Gideon Cordover, seconded by Councillor Jo Westwood, and the vote was carried 7-1 at an ordinary meeting of Council on Monday, August 1.

Cr Cordover encouraged Council to act in accordance with its organisational values of "accountability, respect, excellence, and inclusiveness"

Councillor Cordover said it would be "inappropriate" for Council to be giving a private developer and businesses a financial free giveaway while denying the same to "direct competition on the same stretch of road".

"That would not be in line with our values of inclusiveness,"

"It would have been an exclusive giveaway to the top end of town.

"Funnelling public money through the Council, by

way of discounts or subsidies to a private developer who is one of the largest private developers in Tasmania. It did not meet the pub test.

"Certainly in the correspondence that I've had, there has been a fundamental opposition to the idea.

"The community isn't up for their money to be spent

"We need to put this request aside, and we need to now acknowledge and embrance this new development."

Cr Paula Wreidt said, "I think that the concern in the community very much is that...for a developer to ask Kingborough Council for over a million dollars, which is what we estimate...and for us to lock in for subsequent Councils to a 20-year agreement is too much.

"I have not had one single ratepayer approach me and say it was a good idea," said Cr Westwood.

"I think it would be highly irresponsible for us to consider supporting such requests."

Councillors voting in favour of denying the request included Cr Paula Wreidt, Cr Jo Westwood, Cr Sue Bastone, Cr Gideon Cordover, Cr Amanda Midgley, Cr Christian Street, and Cr Steve Wass.

Cr David Grace voted against the motion.

Homelessness, no

Homelessness Week may have come to an end, however, there is no end in sight for thousands directly impacted by the growing social crisis.

Anecdotal reports from Kingston Neighbourhood House (KNH) indicate the number of local homeless

Homeless in Kingborough

On Thursday, August 4, KNH Manager David Morse said numerous homeless people were sleeping in cars, and tents in backyards, in the Kingborough municipality.

"We have been providing support to homeless people since the inception of Kingston Neighbourhood House in 1985," noted Mr Morse.

"As a de-identified service, we only become aware of a person's housing situation if they choose to share.

"Currently, there are around six to seven people we provided support to, both directly, and through other community members

"These people are living in cars at car parks and they shift their vehicles, as much as petrol costs allow, to avoid detection, usually returning to their chosen area

"We had people experiencing transitional homelessness due to family violence concerns, reflected in NILS loan applications, until they could secure more suitable

"In the last two months we have received requests for assistance from five people moving to Kingston who do not have accommodation established and are living in tents or couch surfing at people's homes," noted Mr Morse.

"We have also noticed people living in undesirable conditions, for example, being unable to choose whom they live with or accepting short stay rentals or share houses for mothers with children, who have no alternatives.

"People have been resilient and highly adaptive to securing any form of accommodation however it is difficult to plan.

"The number of homeless people is increasing, and KNH is seeing the flow-on effect from cost-of-living increases as people relocate to secure accommodation, often leaving family and friends as they are unable to secure accommodation in their preferred area.

'The demand for affordable housing is seeing some elderly parents welcome back adult children and their families as they struggle to secure housing putting further pressure on pensioners and household budgets

"The demographic is not changing so much as it is growing, mental health concerns, family violence, and financial literacy are all playing parts in reducing the ability of people to secure long-term, affordable and secure accommodation for themselves and their families.

Many policy areas affect housing security

Across the Country, in towns and cities, individuals and families sleep in garages, cars, or on a mattress on the floor with their friends or family.

Everyone has the right to a safe place to call home. But skyrocketing rents put safe and stable accommodation out of reach for more and more people.

Regional rents are now 18 per cent higher than they were before the COVID-19 pandemic, while rents in capital cities have increased 14.7 per cent over the past 12 months.

This is changing the face of homelessness.

Many people who are in work, and have a history of secure housing, now find themselves struggling to pay rent or find affordable rentals.

At Mission Australia we welcome the Federal Government's focus on housing and homelessness.

Their commitment to invest in 30,000 new social and affordable homes will bring relief to many in need, but with 150,000 households on the social housing waiting list, much more is needed.

The Federal Government has also committed to developing a national plan to end homelessness.

This plan must touch on all policy areas that impact housing and homelessness and be resourced to deliver meaningful action.

People with lived experience of homelessness need to be part of it.

This is a real opportunity to shape a future where all of us have a safe home and can thrive.

We can't waste it.

COVID statistics snapshot

According to the Tasmanian Department of Health, COVID-19 Weekly Surveillance Report, dated July 24:

- There were 10 deaths in Tasmania caused or contributed to by COVID-19 in the week ending July 23, and 11 deaths the previous week (ending July 16).
- In Kingborough, there were 725 reported cases of COVID-19 in the week ending July 23, compared with 891 cases during the previous week.
- Kingborough's figures equated to a case rate of 19 notified cases per 1000 people in the week ending July 23, compared with 23 cases per 1000 people the previous
- The number of COVID-19 reinfections per month increased, with around 4.7 per cent of reported cases in July determined to be a reinfection, up from 2.8 per cent of reported cases in June and 1.4 per cent in May.
- Between December 15, 2021 and July 23, 2022, the rate of deaths in reported cases who were unvaccinated was more than double the rate of deaths in reported cases who had received two or more doses of vaccine.

Petition to cap power prices

The Tasmanian Parliament must cap electricity linked to the international gas price due to government prices, as the soaring cost of living hits Kingborough residents, said Dean Winter MP in a media release

The Labor Member for Franklin said, rising electricity prices, one of the biggest hits to the cost of living, is yet to take full effect.

"Electricity bills will be hitting households over the next two months, including the staggering 11.88 per cent price increase, which is an extra \$227 a year for the average household," Mr Winter said.

"We understand that people are hurting from the rising cost of living and we need to take action to keep costs down. "Families are bearing the brunt of this increase cost of living, with interest rates, petrol and groceries large contributing factors.

"It is unacceptable that so many Tasmanians are now facing the choice between heating and eating."

Mr Winter is encouraging locals to sign his petition to the government to cap power prices at a 2.5 per cent

"We proposed that the Parliament cap electricity prices." "It passed very similar legislation in 2018 and we are only asking the Government to support the same plan they implemented with Labor then.

Mr Winter is encouraging locals to sign a petition, calling for a cap on electricity prices, to be tabled in State

The petition can be signed at Mr Winter's electorate office in Channel Court Shopping Centre or online at taslabor.com/stop-the-power-bill-shock/ The Kingborough Chronicle asked the following questions

electricity price paid by Tasmanians? is now sent off-shore; and (b) the price Australians pay for our gas has escalated because the price is now Luncheon. (PS - Carloyn Whitehouse

approval of a new gas-to-LNG export industry in Queensland, without reservation of supply for domestic use?

"Why should Tasmanian electricity bills and Tasmanian taxpayers subsidise foreign-owned, multinational gas exporters, who take (without reservation) mainland Australia-produced gas without paying royalties or taxes?"

Mr Winter responded on August 6, as follows:

"Electricity prices have risen because the Tasmanian government broke its promise to de-link Tasmania from the National Electricity Market," stated Mr Winter.

"They said by de-linking, Tasmanians would save 10 per cent on their bills.

"Instead, we're paying 12 per cent more."

Least affordable rent in Australia

The Rental Affordability Index continues to rate Greater Hobart as "the country's least affordable metropolitan area, with the median rent having increased by 50 per cent since 2016," noted Independent Member for Clark. Andrew Wilkie MP, in a speech delivered in Parliament House, Canberra on Tuesday, August 2

Private rentals no longer an option for many

"Private rentals are no longer an option for many as they are so scarce and unaffordable with Hobart's vacancy rate sitting currently at 0.6 per cent," noted

"And for many of the lucky home-hunters, who are successful and do secure a property, the rent is so high that they face the very real decision of whether to force medical appointments, heating, fuel or even food to afford the rent.

"And with interest rates rising, we can expect rents to increase further as rises are handballed onto tenants.'

Seven-year wait for "priority" public housing

"This dire situation is getting worse, as evidenced by Tasmania's social housing waiting list doubling over the last eight years, with 4453 applicants now queued up and priority applicants waiting on average 67 weeks to be accommodated.

"The situation really is grim and we need a hell of a lot more than band-aid solutions if we are to turn things around," continued Mr Wilkie.

All levels of Government need to act

"For instance at the local government level we need to free up land, facilitate sensible development applications

more efficiently and rein in the conversion of long-term rentals to short-stay holiday accommodation.

"At the state level we need more crisis accommodation, more social housing, more supported accommodation for people with special needs, and rent-to-buy public housing.

"And, of course, at the federal level we need an extension of the National Rental Affordability Scheme, an increase in Commonwealth Rent Assistance, and deep investment property tax reform.

"The housing crisis is the result of years of flawed policymaking at all levels of government," Mr Wilkie said. "But it can be remedied, and sure needs to be

because access to safe, secure and affordable housing is a fundamental human right.

Hobart City Council investigating higher rates for short-stay properties

"On a positive note though, good on the Hobart City Council which just last night decided to investigate higher rates for homes used as short-stay accommodation," continued Andrew Wilkie MP.

"This is a smart move, especially seeing as Hobart now has, proportionally, seven times more Airbnb's than Sydney, which is patently unsustainable and unacceptable when locals are being forced into the cold."

Holiday market making money

Meanwhile, the Tasmanian Hospitality Association (THA) reported a landmark occupancy rate in June.

It is unknown how many of these short-term rooms were occupied by Tasmanians waiting for long-term rental accommodation to become available.

According to the THA, 72.59 per cent of rooms were booked out in the month of June, "the first time occupancy levels have breached 70 per cent for the start of winter".

"The figure was 12.14 per cent higher than June 2021, and surpassed the previous monthly record (62.15 percent) set three years ago prior to the devastating impacts of the coronavirus pandemic."

"As expected the south (76.56 per cent) led the way for rooms filled, although the north (72.59 per cent) had more than 16.5 per cent growth from the same time last year while the north west (56.22 per cent) was also

up nearly 10 per cent from 12 months ago. RBA needs to hit pause on rate rises

Last week Greens Senator for Tasmania Nick McKim said, "The RBA needs to hit pause".

"Inflation is being driven by supply side shocks and corporate profiteering.

"Jacking up interest rates will not fix these problems. "The RBA needs to be honest about this with the

Australian public. "Monetary policy cannot curb inflation without punishing

workers, renters and new homeowners, none of whom are the cause of the problem. 'They should not increase rates," said Mr McKim.

"And the Treasurer needs to step in and use the levers that the Australian public have given him.

"We need a super profits tax to reign in corporate profiteering and to fund cost-of-living relief.

"Getting rid of negative gearing and capital gains tax would reduce demand in the housing market without affecting mortgage repayments for homeowners.

"And the additional revenue could help fund 1 million new social houses that will provide renters with an affordable and secure alternative to the Hunger Games that is Australia's private rental market.

Beach wheelchairs

A wheelchair storage facility has been installed at Kingston Beach, to house two beach wheelchairs that can be borrowed by members of the community.

Kingborough Council and Kingston Beach Surf Life Saving Club have been improving beach access for wheelchair users in Kingston.

"Last year Council completed an accessible ramp at Kingston Beach, which is located opposite the toilet block on Osbourne Esplanade," noted Kingborough Mayor, Paula Wriedt, who also chairs Council's Disability Inclusion and Access Advisory Committee.

"We were also really pleased that the Kingston Beach Surf Life Saving Club secured funding for two beach wheelchairs that can be borrowed by members of the

a storage locker for the wheelchairs.

The facility is located across the road from the new beach access ramp.

Members of the community living with disability can access the beach wheelchairs, with a locker key available from Kingston Beach Surf Life Saving Club.

"It has a total privilege to witness the joy and freedom the chairs have been giving individuals," said Kingston Beach Surf Life Saving Club's president, Dr Danielle Campbell.

Kingston High School 50 Year Anniversary

Administrative staff: The face of the school

Kingston High School's (KHS) administration staff have always been "the face of the school".

The administrative staff were key to a successful day and are warmly remembered by former teaching staff, who recently described them as "always professional, approachable, helpful and unflappable".

Many memories were shared when former administrative staff members Shirley Gatward (1984-2017), Robyn Barratt (1987-2011), Jenny Vickery (1988-2000), Margaret McIndoe (1999-2015), and Livi Polita (2002-2014) gathered together recently.

Just some of the tasks that this group attended to:

- · Greeting parents and students, beginning with Book Sales Week, usually held late January on hot summer days.
- Welcoming visitors to the school.
- · Supporting staff on a daily basis.
- Directing tradespeople and accepting deliveries.
- Regularly producing school newsletters.
- Attending to various emergencies.
- Banking the school's takings twice each day.
- Managing student attendance and the *Late Book*.
- Communicating with parents if students fell ill

Former School Bursar and (later) Office Business Manager, Robyn Barratt had additional responsibilities managing the school's accounts, supervising the team of school cleaners, maintenance staff, teacher assis-

Robyn's role was also to ensure the security, maintenance, and safety of the school buildings.

Robyn attributes her success to former principal Dennis Meehan, her friend, and mentor, who encouraged her to gain the additional qualifications she needed when she took over the role in 1987.

At that time there were no computers, and administration work was performed on manual typewriters and in account books.

KHS accounts and budgets became computerised in

the early 1990's, and the administrative officers were given electric typewriters and an improved telephone system.

Shirley and Jenny recall initially using Remington typewriters, Gestetner machines, and exercise books before electric typewriters, photocopiers and automatic staple machines were introduced to the school.

Computers improved the working conditions for all! Margaret and Livi were part of the 'computer-age'.

Professional development was required to be undertaken by all staff in order to use the new technology proficiently. Robyn, Shirley and Jenny happily remember the social

events that were held when Dennis Meehan, lan Morgan and Bev Tracey lead the school.

'Progressive Dinners' and other social events that were held at the time brought the whole KHS staff

Jenny recalls in 1990 when the school's Parents and Friends Association took exception to the proposed cuts to the education budget at the time.

The entire school walked down the main street of Kingston to protest about the loss of teaching staff!

The former staff also reflected on the challenges that occurred when the school first moved to its current site.

The office area had not been completed and there were many 'teething' problems with the phone, internet, computer, and keying systems, as well as the heating and ventilation.

However, the school needed to continue to operate, and this group worked hard to meet these challenges! The camaraderie between those at 'the front of the

school' and the teaching staff, remain the highlight. They still meet regularly and enjoy living in the community where they worked and are always pleased to re-connect with former students.

Several of the group have had their own children and grandchildren attend the school, and boast that all have succeeded in their education and later careers due to the excellent teaching and learning.

"Jason was last seen on May 9, 2007, at his home in Middleton where he resided with his partner and children," noted Tasmania Police, in a social media post on August 2.


"There has been no sign of Jason since that date, which is out of character.



Fifty five years ago the Huon Newspaper Company published Kingborough News, a weekly newspaper that circulated from 1967. The below page is taken from Kingborough News, August 11, 1967.

SNUG POULTRY FARM

Back in Business After Destruction

IT is a fine effort on the part of Mr C. F. Pitt, of Snug, one of Tasmania's biagest poultry breeders, to be back in business again, with the help of his son, Charles, after the family had lost their home, 9,000 fowls, and all buildings and equipment in the February fires.

The Pitts bought 1,300 reeding fowls—whites and blacks, from the leading Tarmanian strains at Mynyard and, when they had built a new incubator shed, and prepared the sens they began breeding shed, and prepared the pens, they began breeding

They have obtained new poubators with a capacity for 40,600 eggs, which is ince the pre-fire number. The 1300 hens are pro-nucing an average of 80 dozen eggs a day.

The Pitts are specialis-ing in day-old, eight-weeks old, and point-of-lay pullets, and expect by Christ-mas time to have all ages

By that time also they expect to have completed repairs to the back pens which were partly have which were partly burnt, and to have a total capa-city for 3,000 hens.

Already they are selling day-old and week-old thicks. Some of these are bred by crossing White Leghorn cockerels with Astralorp pullets, and others by crossing Astralorp ockerels with White Legfor pullets, and by means of scientific selection they e building up a new

Scallop Season Opened for Trial Period

The scallop season opened for a trial period in D'Entrecasteaux Channel yesterday. It is being done under a restricted licence system, and about 14 boats will operate.

The experiment will show the state of the mar-ket and what quantity can be disposed of. For some weeks, the Fisheries Division of the Depart-ment of Agriculture has carried out a tagging pro-gramme and has surveyed the beds in their vessel, "Penghana," which is equipped for this work.

It has been found there is a reasonable quantity of marketable scallops of the Doughboy variety, and provided there is a good sale for them the fishing should be profitable.

One of those specialising in the industry said a big quantity would be caught yesterday, and should be on sale in the shops this weekend. The Doughboy is a different species and has had its cycle in the Channel for some years. It is 10 years since there has been any great quantity of them

Since the others have been extinct the Doughboys have come into their own. Tests have shown it is possible the ordinary variety could return soon in ninor quantities.







Sports ground fees

Local little athletics, cricket, soccer, and football clubs met on July 27 to discuss Kingborough Council's new policy on fees for sports ground use.

The meeting's organiser, and vice-president of the Kettering Cricket Club, Kaspar Deane said the meeting was needed, "given the Council's lack of engagement with clubs".

Mr Deane said, "It was clear at the meeting that clubs were united" about concerns regarding affordability.

"The policy will be phased in with the hourly fee rising to \$15 an hour for both seniors and juniors, while phase two of the policy indicates that fees will rise further."

Mr Deane provided the following meeting summary, including comments from other group representatives.

Clubs open to grounds fees

One area clubs agreed on was highlighted by Woodbridge Junior Soccer Club president, Elissa Wright.

"We completely understand that fees are unavoidable and necessary in the future, however the lack of consultation and individual club case study here seems very unprepared," said Ms Wright.

Consultation lacking

Lack of consultation by Kingborough Council was another issue raised by all clubs.

Channel United Soccer Club's Nick Dale stated that "the Council didn't really "consult" with the club".

Mr Deane summed up clubs' feelings about the lack

of consultation and how the policy was designed.
"It seems in this case, the Council's idea of policy-making

doesn't involve stakeholders," stated Mr Deane.

"In the Council meeting on May 16, in which Councillors voted in the policy, Council staff acknowledged that they had chosen to come up with the hourly mechanism and figures before talking to clubs."

Hourly fee structure problematic

Dallas Millhouse of Snug Cricket Club said that clubs shared a view that fees should be charged as a fixed seasonal fee as occurs in several other Council areas in Tasmania

Mr Millhouse said that for a small club like Snug Cricket Club, the hourly fees being proposed are simply unaffordable. Mr Millhouse echoed other clubs' views that "a firm seasonal fee structure for all clubs moving forward is what we want to see here".

"Clubs would be more than happy to contribute, so long as it is not over the top."

Participation rates at risk

Fundraising additional fees was a key concern, particularly among junior clubs.

"Being a junior soccer club, we rely entirely on volunteer help and local donations", Ms Wright stated.

Fundraising is one of the main ways of covering costs such as power, lighting and equipment.

With clubs already doing what they can to fundraise, they feel the most likely outcome of a large fee imposition

would be the need to put up registration costs.

Ms Wright said, "we are asking our clubs families to

"With the cost of everything going up right now, we know there is a real risk that putting up registration fees will simply make sport unaffordable for some in the community", Mr Deane said.

"Having a more manageable fixed fee, clubs argue, will not just help them budget with tight finances, but also not be a deterrent for clubs to expand."

No junior concession

Clubs with junior programs are particularly concerned about the lack of fee concession offered by Council.

Of the councils in Tasmania who charge a fee, almost all offer a 50 per cent discount for junior hire.

When Kingborough Council was asked about this during a June 20 Council meeting, the idea was rejected.

The State Government's 'Ticket to Play' scheme offers parents up to two \$100 vouchers towards their registration costs, for children listed on a Health Care card; however, clubs highlight only a small number of children are eligible. Clubs are developing a joint letter to send to Councillors, outlining their collective concerns.

They hope Councillors will meet with them to discuss.

Kingborough Council confirms fees to be implemented

Kingborough Council has confirmed new sports ground user fees are to be implemented incrementally over 5 years, commencing July 1, 2023, at \$5 an hour, and reviewed annually.

In a media release on August 2, Mayor Paula Wriedt said the level of disparity between fees for indoor sports as opposed to outdoor sports was unfair.

"At present someone who plays an indoor sport, for example at the Kingborough Sports Centre, pays a small amount in their registration fees towards the hire of the venue, yet someone who plays outdoors doesn't," Cr Wriedt said.

"This is not an equitable situation.

"Community expectations about the quality of facilities such as outdoor playing surfaces has increased substantially over the years and Council has been absorbing the increasing costs of maintaining these facilities.

"For example, \$1.4million per year is spent on maintaining ovals and sports grounds across Kingborough.

"With rising costs, we need to adopt a similar approach to many other Councils and recoup some expenses.

"We are not aiming for full cost recovery as the fees only represent a small proportion of the cost to the rate payer.

"The charges are also significantly lower than other Councils.

"In contrast Hobart City, Clarence and Glenorchy Councils all charge between \$35 to \$87 an hour for their sporting grounds," noted Cr Wriedt.

"Council wants to make sure that it treats all sports fairly and considers the application of a very small level of cost recovery from clubs that use its sportsgrounds to be appropriate.

"Fees have been kept low with a twelve month lead in time to avoid undue difficulty for sporting clubs.

"Any introduction of extra costs is going to be unpopular, we understand this, but we are trying to balance user fees with general rate payer contributions.

"I understand that the engagement between Council and Sporting Clubs has not been to some club's satisfaction, and we apologise for any misunderstanding this may have caused.

"Council staff are currently communicating with all sporting clubs to make sure that their concerns are heard, and we welcome any contact from them."

Through the State Government's initiative, Ticket to Play, up to \$100 can be provided to anyone on a Health Care or Concession Card to be used for club membership fees for children aged 5 to 18 years.
