Exploring our oceans

Kingborough scientists, students and volunteers attended the Australian Antarctic Festival from August 24 to 28.

Among the local scientists, Kingston hydrochemist Pavie Nanthasurasak, demonstrated and discussed the high resolution nutrient analysis used on the CSIRO research vessel (RV) *Investigator*.

The Hydrochemistry facility specializes in the measurement of low-level nutrients, dissolved oxygen, and salinity in our oceanic and coastal waters. Australia's National Science Agency was also represented by Taroona resident and CSIRO's Director of the Australian National Algae Culture Collection, Ian Jameson.

Mr Jameson provided a display from the collection of more than 1000 algae strains.

The Collection is a nationally and internationally significant resource for

scientific research on Australia's microalgal biodiversity, and is focused on environmentally and economically significant microalgae.

The festival included public lectures, and there were talks from various speakers, including the University of Tasmania's Professor Matt King.

Professor King's talk, titled *Antarctic contribution to sea level and what that means for us*, was well attended, with seating at capacity and additional attendees standing.

Kingborough students in attendance during the week-day school's program included Southern Christian College.

A team of live huskies were hugely popular on Sunday, August 28.

And more than 5000 painted penguins were on show, after arriving from 150 schools around Tasmania and around the globe.

Silence on housing conflicts of interest

Questions on housing and potential conflicts of interest remain unanswered by several Kingborough Councillors.

The silence began after a meeting of Council on August 15.

The Councillors were asked three questions, after voting against a motion by Cr Gideon Cordover proposing a report be prepared to consider options and potential wording of a motion with the objective of restricting or disincentivising use of entire homes for short-stay accommodation.

The unanswered questions were about the current rental crisis in Kingborough and whether the Councillors, or their family members, own one or more investment properties.

In an article on August 23 titled *Council blocks action on rental crisis*, the *Kingborough Chronicle* reported that Cr Paula Wriedt, Cr Jo Westwood, Cr Christian Street, and Cr Steve Wass had not provided a response.

The *Kingborough Chronicle* is yet to receive a response to the questions from Crs Westwood, Street, and Wass.

The *Local Government Act 1993* states that a councillor must not participate at any meeting of a council nor vote on any matter where the councillor has a pecuniary interest, or is aware, or ought to be aware that a "close associate" has a pecuniary interest.

Under section 51, a person is a close associate of a councillor or member if that person is:

- a body corporate of which the councillor or member is a director or a member of the governing body; or
- a proprietary company in which the councillor or member is a shareholder; or
- a public company in which the councillor or member is directly or indirectly a substantial shareholder; or
- a beneficiary under a trust or an object of a discretionary trust of which the councillor or member is a trustee; or
- a business partner of the councillor or member; or
- the employer or an employee of the councillor or member; or
- a person from whom the councillor or member has received, or might reasonably be expected to receive, a fee, commission or other reward for providing professional or other services in relation to a matter being dealt with or to be dealt with by the council, council committee, special committee, controlling authority, single authority or joint authority; or
- the spouse or partner of the councillor, member, councillor's son or daughter or member's son or daughter; or
- the son, daughter, brother, sister, mother or father of the councillor or member or of their spouse or partner.

The *Kingborough Chronicle* inspected Kingborough Council's register of Councillor interests on Friday, August 26.

According to the register, no declarations were made by any Councillor in attendance for any matter discussed or voted on at the Kingborough Council meeting held on August 15.

Candidates Forum for October’s Council election

Kingborough Ratepayers Association Inc have provided the following, in preparation for the Local Government Elections.

Compulsory voting, October 3 to 25

Recent amendments to the *Local Government Act 1993* mean that voting in the general local government elections, to be held this year between October 3 to 25, is now compulsory for all electors on the State Electoral Roll.

Everyone on the State Electoral Role is automatically enrolled and required to vote.

Elections, conducted by postal ballot, will be held to fill mayor, deputy mayor and 10 councillor positions at Kingborough Council.

Kingborough Ratepayers Association Inc. urges everyone over 18 years old ensure they are enrolled on the State Electoral Role.

If enrolling for the first time, or if you need to change your enrolment details, contact the Tasmanian Electoral Commission (TEC) on free call 1800 801 701 to request an enrolment form be posted to you.

To be enrolled correctly, your completed enrolment form needs to be received by the TEC before the close of rolls for the election on Thursday, September 8.

Other people who own or occupy land in the municipal area, or are the nominated representatives of a corporate body which owns or occupies land in the municipal area, may also be eligible to enrol, but must lodge an application with the General Manager at Kingborough Council.

Postal ballot packs will be delivered to all electors between October 3 and 7.

Candidates Forum at the Hub, October 2

A Candidates Forum will be held at the Kingborough Community Hub on Sunday, October 2, from 2pm to 4pm.

The Forum will provide an opportunity for residents to hear what motivates individual candidates to vie for positions on Council, what they hope to achieve if elected, and whether they agree or not to keeping annual rates increases as low as possible.

The Forum is being organised by a collaboration of ratepayer groups led by Blackmans Bay Community Association, and includes Kingborough Ratepayers Association Inc, Taroona Community Association and Howden Progress Association.

A gold coin entrance fee will be charged to recover some associated costs.

Candidate transparency

The *Kingborough Chronicle* has sought clarification from a candidate seeking election to Local Government, after receiving an announcement via email last week.

In the media release, Liberal Party member Aldo Antolli stated he was an “Independent” candidate, however attached to the email, was a headshot promotional image of former Liberal MP Jacqui Petrusma.

Mr Antolli was this year endorsed as a Liberal Party candidate in the 2022 Huon Legislative Council by-election.

The *Kingborough Chronicle* replied on September 2:

“It is noted you were previously endorsed as a Liberal Party candidate for the 2022 Huon Legislative Council election.

“Can you please inform our readers why you are standing as an Independent candidate, rather than a Liberal Party candidate, in the upcoming Local Government election?”

Mr Antolli responded:

“The Liberal party is not endorsing any candidates in any upcoming local government elections.

“However, it was always my intention to run as an independent as my message is non-political and resonates with all political colours across our electorate,” claimed Mr Antolli.

The *Kingborough Chronicle* replied, seeking clarification:

“There will be a range of issues to vote on in Council.

“To be clear, it is a question about whether you are likely to be voting consistent with party policy or along party lines.

“Are you a member of the Liberal Party?”

In response, Mr Antolli confirmed he is a member of the Liberal Party.

“I am a member of the Liberal party and have values that align and don’t hide that fact on my socials or otherwise,” wrote Mr Antolli.

“I am not being endorsed by any sitting member of Parliament.

“However, in this election as an independant [sic] I will not be voting on party lines.

“In local government there are no party policies, only at State and Federal level,” wrote Mr Antolli.

The *Kingborough Chronicle* sought further clarification from Mr Antolli on Friday, September 2:

“For locals who may wish to challenge the Liberal State Government, could your membership of the Liberal Party make it difficult to represent these locals at Council level, for instance, in the situation where the State Government declared a major project in the municipality and took control of an approval process?”

Mr Antolli responded, “A very good question and the answer is no”.

Event-support grants

Kingborough has two new one-year pilot grants available to support local events.

In a media release on September 1, Mayor of Kingborough, Paula Wriedt, said both grant streams were designed to offer event organisers “the best possible chance of success”.

Grants of up to \$5000 are available for new major events, while grants of up to \$1500 are available for established events.

“After the past two years of a pandemic COVID-19 has dramatically changed the landscape for community events,” Cr Wriedt said.

Grants of up to \$5000 are available for new major events, while grants of up to \$1500 are available for established events.

“It has created a lot of uncertainty for organisers.

“These two new grant streams are designed to alleviate a little of that anxiety for community groups and organisers and provide more confidence for them financially to host community events.

“The grants have two streams, with one supporting established events which have run at-least twice before, and another for new major events in the community,” Cr Wriedt said.

“Our *Established Events Grants* provide funding for events that have the potential to attract at least 200 people in the Kingborough municipality.

“The *New Events Grants* are aiming to support events that have the capacity to attract 500 or more participants in our community.”

The grant streams are open until 6pm on Friday, October 14.

Rent freeze call as impact bites

Meanwhile, Greens Senator for Tasmania, Nick McKim has called for a freeze on rent rises.
"Tasmanian tenants need a rent freeze now," said Senator McKim.
"With more and more people renting long term, we desperately need legislated protections against unfair, arbitrary evictions and skyrocketing rents.
"The rental affordability crisis is devastating household finances and impacting the broader economy.
"Rents are soaring, and wages are stagnating.
"The Greens want a two-year emergency rent freeze

followed by ongoing rent caps and an end to no-grounds evictions.
"We also need decent minimum standards for rental properties, more flexible arrangements for pets, and giving tenants rights to make minor improvements to their homes.
"If the Government is serious about cost-of-living relief, if they're serious about affordable housing, then it's a no-brainer to freeze rent rises."
The Rental Affordability Index has recently rated Greater Hobart as the country's least affordable metropolitan area.
In a speech in Parliament House in Canberra on August 2, Independent Member for Clark, Andrew Wilkie MP outlined various actions needed at all three levels of Government to address the local housing crisis.
According to Mr Wilkie, the actions included a need to address the conversion of long-term rentals to short-stay accommodation.
"At the local government level, we need to free up land, facilitate sensible development applications more efficiently and rein in the conversion of long-term rentals to short-stay holiday accommodation," Mr Wilkie said.

50 Year Anniversary

1972 - 2022

Patrick Eadington OAM

Patrick Eadington was the first student with a physical disability to attend Kingston High school.

Prior to his arrival in Tasmania in 1987, Patrick, who has cerebral palsy, had attended Sydney Crippled Children's School.

Patrick said the Sydney school had a medical model of teaching children, consequently his days were full of physiotherapy and occupational therapy, with education of lower consideration.

Back then, Patrick and his mother, Jacqui, were told Patrick would never be at the mental level or developmental stage to enter mainstream schooling.

Shortly after arriving in Tasmania, Patrick enrolled at Snug Primary School, where he repeated some grades in order to catch up on the previously missed teaching and learning.

Formative years at Kingston High

In 1990 Patrick enrolled at Kingston High school. Kingston High staff training in working with students with a disability at that time, but Patrick was impressed by the teachers who wanted to know how to support him educationally.

Thus, Patrick and the teachers had to "fumble" their way along on a new path.

Together, Patrick and Kingston High broke new ground, and inclusion "really ignited".

Denis Meehan and Ian Morgan, Principal and Assistant Principal respectively at that time, told Patrick that they were privileged to have him in the school.

Patrick had a group of friends during these years who were staunch supporters.

There was one incident where students in older grades cluttered up the corridor, sticking their legs out and putting their bags all over the floor.

This caused Patrick to have a crash against the wall, after his wheelchair became entangled in the legs.

Mr Meehan and Mr Morgan made a point at the whole school assembly that this was unacceptable, that everyone deserves heartfelt respect.

The speeches resulted in the end of this behaviour. Patrick acknowledges his four years at Kingston High as key formative years for the rest of his life.

As a young man at Newstead College in Launceston, Patrick went snow skiing, abseiling and white-water rafting.

Creatively he has been involved in art, drama and playwriting.

A far cry from the limited expectations of the Sydney Crippled Children years.

Patrick reflects that there are many myths in the community about people with disabilities.

He stresses the importance of understanding beginning in the family, and how the social environment of family is the breeding ground of much understanding.

Remarkable achievements

This year, Patrick was year awarded an Order of Australia Medal for services to people with disabilities.

He has spent his adult life working as a volunteer, a board member, committee member, community representative and educator.

He has worked with city councils, Anglicare, Advocacy Tasmania, NDIS, Premier's Disability Advisory Council, Tasmania and many other organisations.

Over a three-year period, Patrick wrote training modules for the Disability Awareness and Resource Training Certificate 3, for TasTafe, drawing heavily on his experiences, challenges, successes, and dilemmas.

COVID cases down

Case numbers for COVID-19 have continued to trend down in recent weeks.

A recent update from the Premier of Tasmania, Jeremy Rockliff on Wednesday, August 31 reported 269 new cases from previous day and the total number of active cases 1342, with nearly 240,000 Tasmanians recovered from COVID-19.

There are currently 11 people in hospital being treated specifically for COVID and there are two patients in ICU as of August 31.

“Sadly, I can confirm that a man in his late 70s has passed away in the States North-West,” said Premier Rockliff.

“I extend my sincere condolences to the man’s family, friends, and loved ones.

“There have also been two additional deaths recorded in Aged Care facilities from earlier this year (one from March, and one from January), where COVID-19 has now been identified as a cause or a contributing factor.

“While the recent reduction in case numbers is promising, we continue to urge Tasmanians to act to reduce the risk to ourselves and keep others safe from COVID-19.

“The most critical thing that Tasmanians can do to protect themselves from the severe consequences of COVID is to ensure they are up to date with their vaccinations.

“If you haven’t already, make a booking with one of the many providers across the state and get your vaccination as soon as possible,” said Premier Rockliff.

Regional Coastal Strategy

The Southern Tasmanian Councils Authority (STCA) has released a *Regional Strategy for Adapting to a Changing Coastline in Tasmania.*

The strategy has been welcomed by Kingborough Mayor, Paula Wriedt.

“Here in Kingborough we have one of the longest coastlines in the state, which stretches a stunning and unique 336 kilometres,” Cr Wriedt said.

“Coastal changes are a reality and are already affecting our beautiful municipality.

“Council has just recently completed a community discussion on the erosion issues happening at Tinderbox Beach.

“This engagement activity raised future management options for Tinderbox Beach and sought to bring the residents and local users of the area along in the journey of decision making.

“The discussion shared a geomorphological assessment

prepared by Dr Chris Sharples and discussed future management options with the participants, including managed retreat, sandbagging and rock revetment options.

“Unfortunately, adapting to a changing coastline in Tasmania is not something that will just happen.

“This Regional Coastal Strategy is very important for developing consistent risk management processes and principles for all Councils.

“The document covers coastal values, public safety through to private property, the role of Councils and how they manage their coastlines.

“This is a new frontier for Councils, though with climate change and rising sea levels, it is an area that requires more and more tools and consistent process in its management,” said Cr Wriedt.

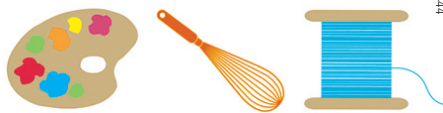
The strategy was produced via the STCA’s climate change program, the Regional Climate Change Initiative.

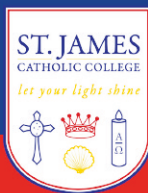

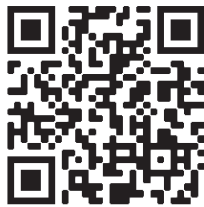

New SES flood warning system

The AWS was adopted by Tasmania for bushfires in September 2021.

Following the adoption for flood emergencies, there are plans to adopt the AWS for storm emergencies from 2023.

Like the AWS for other emergencies, the Tasmania SES Flood Warning System consists of three ascending warning levels: Advice (yellow); Watch and Act (orange); and Emergency Warning (red).

The warnings are presented in triangles, with a house in the centre and flood levels underneath.

These warning triangles will be issued with a set of call-to-actions specific to the emergency event.

The SES flood warnings will be issued on the new version of TasALERT.com which is the Tasmanian Government's official emergency warning and information website.

The warnings will also be published on TasALERT and Tasmania SES social media channels and broadcast on ABC Radio.

The Tasmania SES Flood Warning System complements the flood warnings and flood watches issued by the Bureau of Meteorology (BOM).

Tasmania SES will take the BOM warnings as a key consideration when deciding to issue an SES flood warning, as well as other information such as flood modelling, local knowledge, flood history, operational information, and inputs from councils.

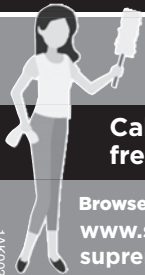

"The topic for the talk is fascinating," said Browns River History Group's Rosie Severs.

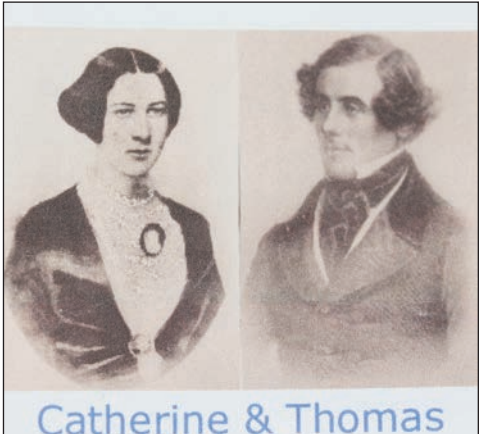

He returned to the SFL in 2021 to the face-off between Cygnet and Huonville for the premiership with Huonville, having defeated Cygnet the previous year.

Cygnet prevailed! Some players have moved variously between the SFL and TSL clubs in the intervening years since 2014. More than a dozen Huon based players pull on the Tigers' jersey this year.

While four Tigers made the TSL *Team of the Year*, two were from the Huon.

Both players were recognised in the TSL Awards 2022.

Kieran Lovell was co Runner Up in the Alastair Lynch Medal for Best and Fairest while Jordan Lane was winner of the Matthew Richardson Medal for the Best Young Player.

The Tigers have had an outstanding season to be second on the TSL Ladder, their highest achievement.

The Tigers played Launceston in the TSL semi-finals at Windsor Park on Saturday, September 3.

Unfortunately, the Blues were victorious 19.149.133 to 6.6.42.

The Tigers will play Clarence, who defeated Lauderdale in their semi-final, at Twin Ovals on Saturday, September 10.
