

Her Majesty

Flags are flying at half-mast around Kingborough, on the passing of Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II, on September 8.

Premier of Tasmania, Jeremy Rockliff MP provided the following media statement on September 9.

"On behalf of the Tasmanian Government and our entire community, I extend my deepest condolences to the Royal Family following the passing of Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II at the age of 96.

"Her Majesty has led a remarkable life of public service across seven decades – the longest-reigning British monarch, Australian sovereign and leader of the Commonwealth of Nations.

"In particular, Her Majesty was a friend to Tasmania and visited our shores on seven occasions, and I know Her Majesty had a very genuine interest in our people and our wonderful State.

"We all appreciated her warmth and kindness.

"Her Majesty was the very personification of selfless service and devotion to duty, and at this time of sadness, I know all Tasmanians will join with me in pausing to reflect on her remarkable life."

On Thursday, September 22 there will be a Public Holiday for the National Day of Mourning for Her Majesty, the Queen.

Voters deserve transparency

Voters deserve to know if Local Government candidates are members of a political party, regardless of whether the candidate has the endorsement or backing of the political party, says State Independent Member for Nelson, Meg Webb MLC.

Ms Webb said while she welcomed the community's appetite for independent representatives, the word 'independent' carries "a clear connotation of being non-party aligned".

"Candidates appropriating that label while clearly being connected to a political party could be seen as misleading to voters," said Ms Webb.

"This issue is another example of our state's opaque truth in political advertising rules, of which there is no mention in the *Local Government Act*

"Voters deserve to know who they're voting for, where they stand on issues of importance, and if they are members of a political party, regardless of whether they are running with the endorsement or backing of their party."

The *Kingborough Chronicle* has been informed by the Tasmanian

Electoral Commission that election advertising material is "not within" the Commission's "jurisdiction".

In relation to material that has the capacity to mislead an elector, Section 197 of the *Electoral Act 2004* (Tas) *Misleading and deceptive electoral matter*, states "a person must not:

- print, publish or distribute, or permit or authorise the printing, publishing or distribution of, any printed electoral matter that is intended to, is likely to or has the capacity to mislead or deceive an elector in or in relation to the recording of his or her vote; or

- publish on the internet, or permit or authorise the publishing on the internet of, any electoral matter that is intended to, is likely to or has the capacity to mislead or deceive an elector in or in relation to the recording of his or her vote; or

- broadcast on radio or television, or permit or authorise the broadcasting on radio or television of, any electoral matter that is intended to, is likely to or has the capacity to mislead or deceive an elector in or in relation to the recording of his or her vote."

The 1975 original Margate Fire Brigade truck was on show for the day too. Jim Mulder, Chief of the Margate Fire Brigade, said the old truck is normally part of the Tasmanian Fire Service museum.

Fern Tree Coordinator Dicky Spalding said the juniors and cadets learn a variety of skills through the training exercises.

"They learn communication skills, navigation, team work, hose skills, first aid, and situational awareness around fires, trucks and trees.

"They learn to look out for themselves and others", said Mr Spalding.

A report on the rental housing crisis

A significant debate at a meeting of Kingborough Council on September 5, has resulted in a first step to address the ongoing rental housing crisis impacting residents in Kingborough.

A motion requiring a report to be prepared for the Council, "assessing the impact of whole-dwelling short-stay visitor accommodation in Kingborough and considering options for ameliorating the housing and rental affordability crisis in the municipality" was carried (5/3).

The motion was moved by Cr Gideon Cordover and seconded Cr Flora Fox.

The five Councillors voting in favour of a report being prepared were Cr Gideon Cordover, Cr Amanda Midgley, Cr Clare Glade-Wright, Cr Flora Fox, and Cr Paula Wriedt.

While the three Councillors who voted against the motion were Cr Steve Wass, Cr Christian Street, and Cr Jo Westwood.

Crs David Grace and Sue Bastone were absent.

It should be noted that page 20 of the *Draft Minutes* incorrectly recorded various details of the motion, including the outcome of the vote.

The full debate, lasting around 40-minutes duration, can be viewed on YouTube.

Housing is a human right

Introducing the motion, Cr Cordover said, "Housing is a human right".

"Sadly, in Tasmania all levels of Government have allowed the right to a warm, safe shelter to be superseded by monied interests who are using housing as a speculative investment vehicle," said Cr Cordover.

"Housing should be a human right and not an investment class.

"For those who want to invest for their retirement, there's stocks, there's shares, there's bonds, there's futures, there's gold, there's even crypto and NFTs.

"You don't necessarily need to make your profits off the backs of young families or retirees trying to find an affordable home to rent.

"Greater Hobart, which includes Kingborough, is overloaded with short-term rental properties, with 6.8 times more as a proportion of the long-term rental market than in Sydney, and 4.5 times more than in Melbourne."

17 people sleeping in tents in Kingston

Cr Glade-Wright reported to the meeting numerous anecdotal indicators of a worsening situation in the municipality, based on information received from Kingston Neighbourhood House on September 5.

"I heard some terrible, terrible news," reported Cr Glade-Wright.

"We have indeed at least 17 people in the Kingston area who are currently sleeping in tents in our municipality.

"It was really heartbreaking to hear that that is happening so close.

"It is known that we are in a housing crisis," continued Cr Glade-Wright.

"When you look at the definition of a "crisis" it is a time of intense difficulty, and a time when a difficult or important decision must be made.

"I appreciate that our planning staff might be busy, or possibly under resourced.

"I'd like to point out, our "Vision" is "Our community is the heart of everything we do".

"Our "Purpose" is "To make Kingborough a great place to live".

"And our "Values" include "Respect and inclusiveness".

"There are 17 people that we know about, and I admit that it is anecdotal, living in tents.

"There are people sleeping in cars, emphasiseed Cr Glade-Wright.

"Dru Point is a place that was pointed out to me that people are sleeping in their cars.

"Apparently there are tents being put up, behind a mound of dirt, at the Kingston golf course.

"And there are families who are going and living with their grandparents.

Up to 10 people living in two-bedroom units

"There are kids and families having to move in with their grandparents, so there are up to 10 people living in two-bedroom units," Continued Cr Glade-Wright.

"It's really, really heartbreaking, and this is happening here.

"I am really unclear at the moment what the role of Local Government is in this issue.

"This motion is requesting a report, that hopefully details a little bit about our role in this issue."

Beyond what we should expect in the 21st Century

Cr Wass expressed, "We have always had homelessness in Kingborough for the last 20 years".

"It has now got to the stage where it is beyond what we should expect in the 21st Century.

"Many people are suffering, not at their fault or their doings, they've just found themselves a victim.

Cr Wass suggested Local Government work together in greater Hobart and in southern Tasmania, and with other levels of government, and suggested State and Federal Governments consider using tax relief to address the issue in the short-term.

"We can take this approach on a uniform level, where local government, State Government and Federal Government can work together.

"We can look at a number of options.

"One of the things that we need to be prepared to do with some of these houses where people are mortgaged to-the-hilt and have had to increase their rental.

"Do we give them a rates relief?" Cr Wass asked.

"That's right, a rates relief, so they can reduce the amount of money, so that other people can move into the house that doesn't have all that much in the way of cash flow.

"Will the Government give a land tax relief?

"That works out to be quite a bit per week."

Cr Wass said, "I'm going to vote against this motion because I think all it's doing is paying lip service, it's not going to resolve the issue for at least six months and probably not going to even resolve the issue then".

"I think there are other options that we should be

addressing, and I've covered those."

Shelter versus employment

Cr Street said the benefits of employment for a person is "equally important" as having shelter.

"My point has always been on this matter, that our housing crisis...is a multi-layered issue, and I don't think it can be boiled down to any one policy or position.

"I won't apologise for taking a broader view of the issue of short-stay accommodation.

"And I won't apologise for taking into consideration this matter...the support that industry provides for hundreds and hundreds of other jobs in our tourism and hospitality sector.

Cr Street said employment was "equally important" as a "roof over a person's head".

"A roof over a person's head is absolutely the most important...but the dignity and benefit of employment is equally important.

"What I simply cannot abide is being told that this is a simple problem, and that short-stay accommodation restrictions are the first and foremost answer."

In summing up, Cr Cordover said, "We are here in a crisis, in rental affordability crisis, and a crisis requires urgency".

Council staff accept work agreement

Kingborough Council staff have voted to accept an enterprise agreement (EA), ending the negotiation process.

At a meeting of Council on September 5, General Manager Gary Arnold said, "of the eligible staff, 93 per cent voted, 120 voted yes and 44 voted no and 12 abstained".

"So the staff have voted to accept the EA and we will undertake in the next day or two to get the appropriate paperwork off to Fair Work to complete the matter," stated Mr Arnold.

Early childhood sector strikes

Early childhood educators shut down early in Kingborough on September 7 to take strike action.

The workers joined thousands of educators across Australia to demand reform.

The United Workers Union, Director of Early Education, Helen Gibbons, said the nationwide action shows members are committed to fighting for reform.

“After nearly a decade of inaction from the previous government, the early education sector is in crisis,” said Ms Gibbons.

“There are thousands of staff vacancies across the country and centres are turning away children because they don’t have enough staff.

“United Workers Union members are calling for the Government to work with educators to urgently outline a plan and timeline to deliver on three key priorities:

- Give us a reason to stay, and pay us what we are worth,

- Value early learning as part of the education system, just as important as schools, and
- Put children before profit.

“Early childhood educators perform a vital role in our society and have the respect of the parents and families they support.

“It’s time for the Federal Government to respect educators too.

“Nine per cent of educators say that staffing shortages are impacting the quality of care and education children receive.

A further 99 per cent say that workload and staffing issues are making educators feel burnt out and undervalued.

“Sixty-eight per cent of long day care centres exist to make a profit of a young child’s education.

“Shareholders and private equity come before children.

“Twelve per cent of long day care centres fail to meet minimum standards.

“That’s thousands of children attending over 1750 centres that fail to meet the minimum national benchmark.

“Eighteen per cent of centres operate with a staffing waiver because they can’t find enough qualified staff.

“Out of 8556 long day care centres across Australia, only 37 are rated as excellent,” continued Ms Gibbons.

“This all means that taxpayers are not getting what we pay for.

“Many children not getting the best possible early learning environment and parents are often not able to find appropriate care.

“Educators have had enough.

“The new Federal Government must urgently take concrete steps to address the workforce crisis in early education and reform the sector.”

Responses to questions on housing crisis

The *Kingborough Chronicle* is continuing to publish responses received from Councillors regarding the following three questions asked on August 19.

- What is your short-term solution to the housing crisis in Kingborough? (i.e. in the next 3-12 months)
- If you were to become unexpectedly homeless in the next few weeks, where would you live?
- Does your asset pool, or your family asset pool,

include one or more investment properties (i.e. other than the home you currently reside in)?

Cr Paula Wriedt responded on Wednesday, August 24, as follows:

"In relation to questions two and three, I don't believe that this type of personal information is useful to the debate," said Cr Wriedt.

"Every person's situation is different.

"In response to Cr Cordover's motion to Council asking

for a report to be created to look into restricting Airbnb properties in Kingborough I say,

"There is no quick term fix for the shortage of rental properties, that is not just limited to Kingborough, but throughout many parts of the State.

"As reported by the City of Launceston's Chief Executive Mr Stretton, the main cause of the housing crisis is that supply is outstripping demand.

"Along with the under investment in social housing and increase in population Tasmania as well as many states within Australia is suffering from a housing crisis. "Even mechanisms such as capping whole house short stay accommodation permits or increasing rates for short stay accommodation properties is not an immediate fix.

"A report to LGAT which is to be considered at the September 16 General Meeting, indicates the complexity of this issue and highlights that rate increases for short stay accommodation properties, if moved up to the commercial rate, would only increase rates by around \$10 per week," stated Cr Wriedt.

"This is highly unlikely to fix the supply issue.

"We need a whole of government response to the housing situation, and whilst I commend my colleague for raising the issue with our Council, I recommended at the previous meeting that we request LGAT to lobby the State Government to enact policy levers that enable greater proportions of social and affordable housing to be provided in subdivisions over a certain size.

"I was prompted to do this after looking at the State Government's own *Affordable Housing Strategy (2018-2023)*, this was mentioned but no action has been taken on this to date.

"Housing issues require a state-wide approach and not a piecemeal situation of one Council enacting it over another, thereby resulting in developers choosing one

municipality over a nearby one that has this requirement," continued Cr Wriedt.

"Whatever can be done at a Local Government level needs to be done throughout the sector, not just in one Municipality or City.

"During the debate I articulated clearly why I voted against the motion, for example one Councillor raised the issue of some of our tourism destinations and how they rely on short stay holiday accommodation rentals to accommodate tourists, i.e. Bruny Island and parts of the Channel, and the flow on effects to the local economy as a result of these.

On September 9, Cr Jo Westwood responded to the questions with the following statement.

"I have no conflict of interest in relation to restricting the use of entire homes for short-stay accommodation in Kingborough," stated Cr Westwood.

"The reason I did not support a request for Council staff to prepare a report on this issue is because I don't think a report will do anything constructive to help those in our community struggling to find affordable housing.

"The preparation of a report will take Council's extremely busy planning staff away from core tasks related to the assessment of development applications, which links directly to the construction of new homes and an increase in housing supply.

"I believe this is the most effective lever available to Council at this point in time.

"In my opinion, the best way local government can positively contribute to alleviating housing affordability issues is through measures which increase the supply and availability of housing.

"Addressing affordable housing and homelessness is extremely complex.

"Holding a different view to one of my colleagues on Council does not make me recalcitrant."

Reducing landfill waste, recycling coffee cups

A Food Organics & Garden Organics (FOGO) bin trial in Kingston Beach has proved to be a phenomenal success.

During 2021 Sustainable Living in Kingborough (SLiK) and Eb+Flo at Kingston Beach partnered to trial FOGO bins, with educational signage to collect takeaway coffee cups, rather than using the Council provided recycle and landfill bins.

The venue manager Sheri Upston said, “it’s been an outstanding success!”

SLiK member and Kingborough Councillor Clare Glade-Wright said, “The signage was the key – informing Eb+Flo customers why the compostable takeaway cups must not go into either the recycle or landfill bins.”

“Historically there has been confusion on what could or could not be recycled.

“Not many people understand that putting an item of waste into a recycle bin that can’t be recycled contaminates the contents and means the whole bin goes to landfill.

“After one year of operation Eb+Flo report that their customers “are loving the FOGO bin”. People have become interested and ask about the FOGO bin and what other items can go into the bin.

“Sustainable Living in Kingborough partnered with local café Eb+Flo by securing a council grant to pay for the bin for a year.

“The year has now completed and the feedback we received from Eb+Flo has been outstanding, and we thought it is a great feel-good story for the community,” said Ms Glade-Wright.

“Nearly 3000 compostable coffee cups are served up each week at Eb+Flo, and to see the community responding so well is fantastic.

“It is really encouraging seeing so many of our cafes here in Kingborough switch to a compostable option when it comes to packaging.

“Unfortunately, however, if this packaging gets put in a general waste bin, where it ends up in landfill, this packaging can be more harmful than non-compostable packaging because it becomes anaerobic and causes methane, which is harmful to the atmosphere.

“It is really important that the compostable packaging actually gets composted, by the use of FOGO bins.

“To see the trial of the FOGO bin being so successful gives hope that more FOGO bins can be utilised throughout the community for any putrescible waste.”

A performance improvement direction

A Notice of Performance Improvement Direction was read out at the Kingborough Council meeting on September 5.

The motion was moved by Cr Flora Fox and seconded by Cr Midgley.

Letters from the Minister for Local Government and the Director of Local Government were received at the Kingborough Council meeting, in relation to an incident at a meeting on June 6 involving Cr David Grace.

Cr Grace was absent on September 5.

The advice, provided by the Tasmanian Director of Local Government, Matthew Healy, was read by General Manager, Gary Arnold, as follows:

“Dear Mayor, As you are aware, I have been investigating the potential breach of provisions of the *Local Government Act 1993* and the *Police Offences Act 1935*, associated with the behaviours of Councillor David Grace at the meeting of 6 June 2022.

“I have recently written to Councillor Grace advising him of the outcomes of this investigation.

“The behaviour of Councillor Grace at the Council meeting of June 6 was clearly unacceptable.

“It was aggressive, causing distress and concern for other Councillors and staff at the meeting.

“It was also highly disruptive, leading to a break in the proceedings of the Council in order to re-establish order and regain some sense of constructive control over proceedings.

“Councillor Grace’s behaviour at this meeting, in my opinion, falls short of the statutory obligation of Councillors to work individually and collectively, in the best interests of the community.

“It also directly impacts on the obligation of the Mayor, or Deputy Mayor on this occasion, and the General Manager to maintain a safe workplace, as required by the *Work Health and Safety Act 2012*.

“I believe that I have sufficient evidence to refer this

issue to the Director of Public Prosecutions for prosecution for two, separate offences:

- “Regulation 43 of the *Local Government Meeting Procedures Regulations 2015*, Failure to leave a meeting when suspended; and
- “Section 20 of the *Police Offences Act 1935*, Misbehaviour at a public meeting.

“However, I note that Counsellor Grace has accepted that his behaviour was improper, and that the Minister for Local Government, Nick Street MP, has issued a *Performance Improvement Direction*, requiring, in part, that there is no repeat of this behaviour for at least 12 months.

“On this basis, I consider that there is no public interest in pursuing these charges at this stage.

“A primary objective of both the offences provision of both the *Local Government Act 1993* and the *Police Offences Act 1935* is to discourage aggressive and disruptive behaviour in Council and other public meetings.

“I will reconsider the public interest in pursuing these charges if there is any suggestion that this behaviour is ongoing.

“I appreciate Councillor Grace’s apology to the Council for his behaviour following the incident on 6 June 2022, and his acknowledgement that this behaviour was not acceptable.

“I also recognise his extended period of highly valued service to the Kingborough community as a Councillor for over 22 years.

“I am confident that his positive contribution over time is, and will continue to be, recognised by the Kingborough community.”

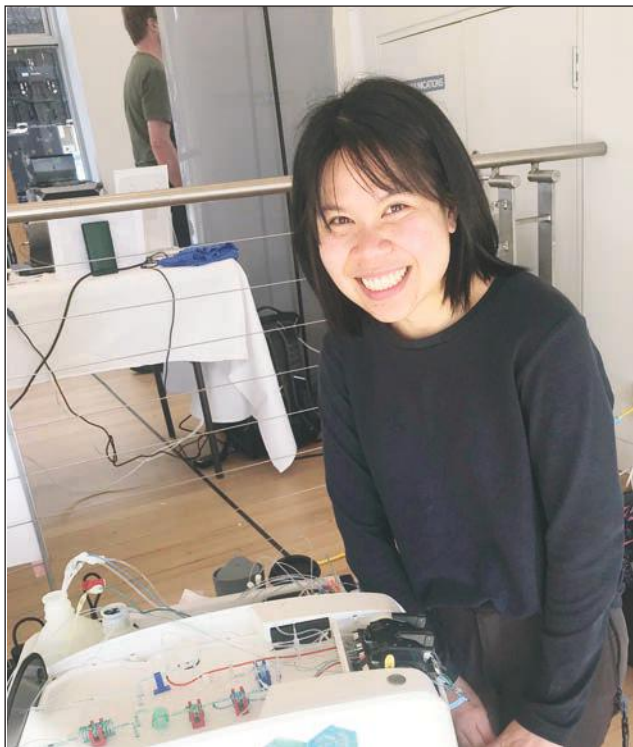

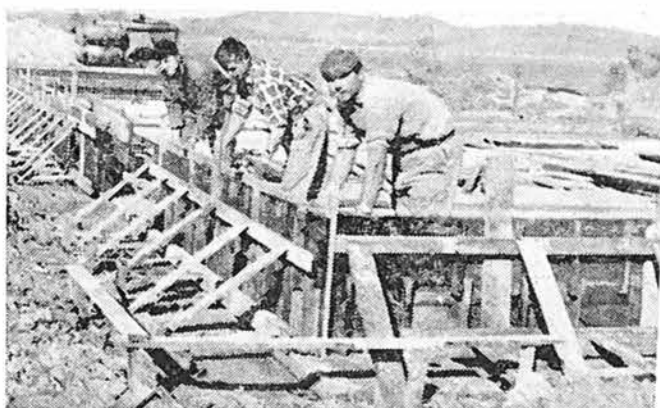

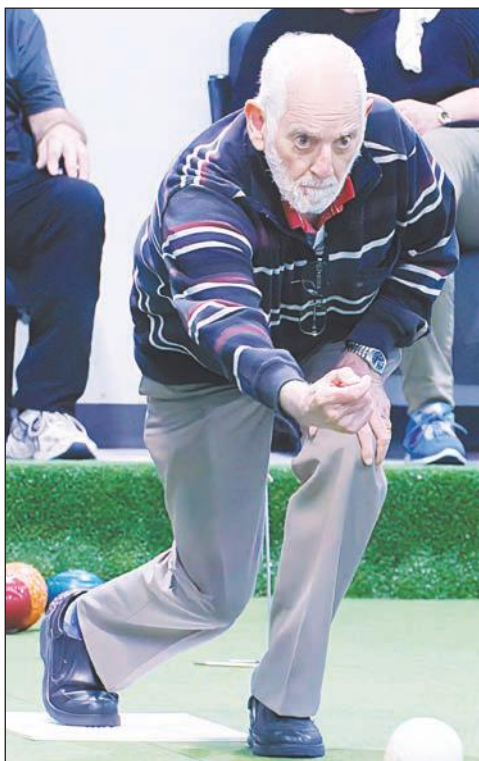

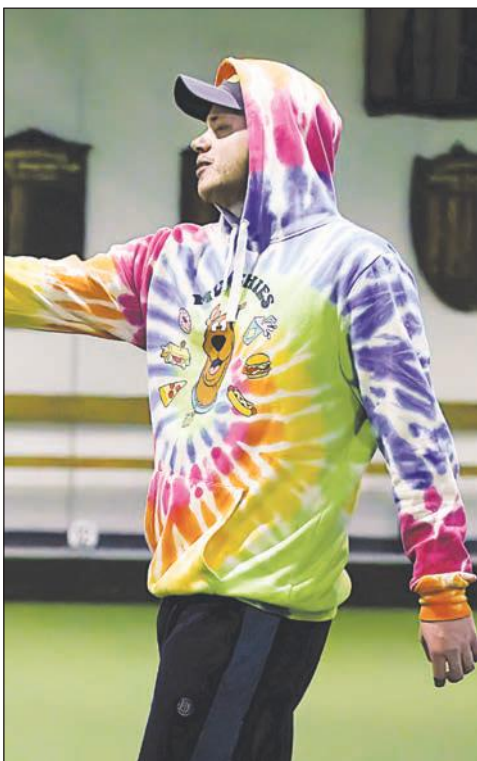

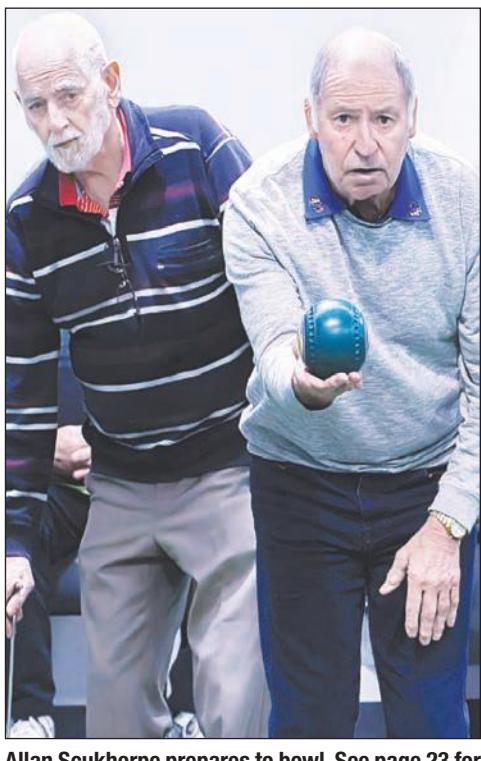
