New park and ride services launched

Monday, September 26 marked the official opening of the Park and Ride bus facility in Huntingield to service the Kingborough and Channel commuters travelling to Hobart. In a press release from Michael Ferguson, Minister for Infrastructure and Transport, he said "The Tasmanian Liberal Government is embarking on the most progressive agenda for public transport in decades, investing in a range of initiatives to boost patronage and bust traffic congestion".

"Kingborough residents now have more reason to take the bus with the opening of a new park and ride facility at Huntingfield and the launch of additional express bus services to Hobart.

"The new facility is part of our commitment to offering the people of Hobart's southern suburbs real transport choice in their daily commute under the Southern Projects initiative."

The Huntingfield Park and Ride provides parking for 174 vehicles, including motorcycle and accessible bays.

It also offers undercover seating for 30 passengers, a modern amenities block with baby change facilities and secure storage for 26 bicycles, and a quick drop-off lane.

There will be 33 additional express bus services stopping there every weekday, including the extension of the X08 from Kingston Central, which was launched in January, and a completely new route, the X01.

To mark the launch, the Tasmanian Government is offering free adult Greencards preloaded with a return fare to the first 300 customers who do not have one.

The first 200 new adult concession customers will receive a voucher for a preloaded Greencard, redeemable at any Metro Shop.

Staff will be on hand at Huntingfield between 7am and 9am each day this week to facilitate this offer.

"The new services and modern facilities will work with the other Southern Projects initiatives to keep Hobart moving by providing more transport options," the media release stated.

"These include the Firthside Park and Ride facility, which opened in March.

"The 33 new bus services bring, in total, 70 additional weekday express bus services launched between the southern suburbs and the Hobart CBD under this initiative.

"The next projects under the program include the planned new transit lane for buses, taxis and vehicles with three or more occupants on the Southern Outlet and bus improvements to Macquarie and Davey Streets."

The transit lane will start at Olinda Grove and continue through the interchange with Macquarie and Davey Streets, and then down Macquarie Street as a clearway to provide four lanes of traffic to Molle Street during the morning peak period.

"I have less anxiety living here."

Dear Editor Many of us shop at the major Kingston shopping centres of Channel Court and Kingston Town.

Over the past two years I have often walked the bush land between Calvin School Campus and Kingston Town. A beautiful inner urban bush setting with stunning kunyani views.

A 50-metre section of this bush is usually packed full of plastic bags, wrapping, trolleys, bins and other trash,

up to a depth of about 30 centimetres. Bales, bags and skips of rubbish from the shops is stored outside in the rain, wind and sun.

Rubbish gets blown into the bush daily. Sometimes the plastic is mowed into more tiny pieces.

I contacted Woolworths, the biggest tenant and apparent source of most of the rubbish.

They did one excellent clean up several months ago. Two weeks later the plastic was piling up again. Slowly these truckloads of mostly plastic make their

Kingborough CFLC centre leader Rachael Hawkins has been appointed to oversee the construction phase and the transition to operations.


"It's definitely an exciting phase of the project, as once construction starts, things start to move pretty quickly,' said Mrs Hawkins

"A few of us students worked together to take leadership and make lists of what had to be done."

Many involved in the production commented on the sense of community within the show, and the support they felt from the audience.

The property also has separate staff quarters onsite so Nexus clients can enjoy privacy and independence while having any support they need at hand.

"The clients who have moved into this property all have some good skillsets and need a lower level of support to live independently than those in a traditional group home," Nexus CEO Mark Jessop said.

"We individualise our programs to help build clients" skills around cooking and living their own lives." SAA Trust built the Kingston property to cater for

specific practical and sensory needs, and leases the building to Nexus clients at affordable rental rates. "The home is brand new with larger and wheelchair

friendly bathrooms, strengthened walls, induction cooktops with extra safety measures and less intrusive features such as recessed lights," SAA Trust Executive Officer Ralph Doedens said.

Nexus is passionate about supporting clients to achieve their goals and to be engaged participants in society.

An innovative solution to this is the provision of a Nexus vehicle which remains on-site at the Kingston property at all times, allowing staff to transport clients to wherever they need to be.

"The car might be used to take people to the bus stop, the weekly shop, doctor appointments, or for extra support at planned outings," Nexus Asset and Building Services Coordinator Ellise Harper said.

Federal Housing Minister, Julie Collins MP was in attendance to officiate the opening.

The Trust received a \$6 million Federal Government grant under the Improving Social Housing Outcomes Program, which provided funding for the Kingston house and eight other sites.

The HLT54121 Diploma of Nursing reflects the role of an enrolled nurse working under supervision of a registered nurse.

This qualification covers the application of skills and knowledge required to undertake your role competently and professionally within a variety of health care settings.

Once qualified, students will be eligible to apply to AHPRA for registration as an enrolled nurse.

The 18 months is comprised of face-to-face, online learning, and structured work placement of 12 weeks in total

This course requires full time study including two days per week of face-to-face learning (9am to 3pm), plus the equivalent of three days per week self-directed learning

There are 25 units in this course; 20 compulsory units and five electives.

To achieve this qualification, students are also required to complete a minimum of 400 hours of successful clinical placement in the aged care, acute care, and mental health settings.

Book launches at Woodbridge


Joint book launches and signings will be held in Woodbridge, Saturday, October 8 for three local writers from the Channel.







Dizziness and the loose crystals in your ears

According to the Australian Society of Otolaryngology, Head and Neck Surgery, over 36% of Australians over fifty report some form of dizziness or vertigo. Conditions such as Meniere's Disease and Benign
