### The official opening of Woodbridge Potters' Corner Memorial Park was held on Saturday, October 8.

Its landscaping, plantings interpretation panels, and memorial wall were described by project manager, Peter Leschen, as a beautiful space for both visitors and the local community and a place to enjoy and learn about the fascinating history of the south Channel area.

The idea for the park first arose in 2013 when local resident Bruce Neill offered to donate land next to St Simon and St Jude's church

to the Woodbridge Community Association (WCA) to create the park as a place of historical reference and military commemoration.

The donation was finalised in 2018 with accompanying grants from the Tasmanian Community Fund, Kingborough Council, the DVA 'Saluting Their Service' program and the Teddy Sheean VC Memorial grant program.

These grants, combined with the funds already raised by the WCA, and further support from all levels of government, local community groups, the RSL and individuals fully funded the park.

The event was attended by Minister Nic Street, Mayor Paula Wriedt, local MP Dean Winter, Graham Seabourne of the South East Tasmanian Aboriginal Corporation and some 80 people from the local community.

Peter Leschen said, "The park was very much a community endeavour and the support received over the past nine years was uplifting and indicative of the importance and strength of the south Channel community".

## Kingborough lags behind returned votes

### Local government elections are now compulsory with polls closing on October 25.

A week out from the polls closing, Kingborough has fallen behind the statewide return rate of 43.21 per cent with a return rate of 40.44 per cent. The Tasmanian Electoral Commission (TEC) will be providing impartial assisted voting for electors in Kingborough.

COVID-safe measures will be in place, including the wearing of N95 masks by staff.

30-minute appointments are available at the Council today, Tuesday,

October 18.

Bookings are essential and voters can call the TEC phone system (free call 1800 801 701) or book online at <https://www.tec.tas.gov.au/> and follow the links.

Voters using the service should bring with them their ballot pack delivered in the post.

If the voter does not have their ballot pack, the staff member can assist them in applying for a supplementary ballot pack while they are at the Council.

Once the voting process is complete, the staff member can assist the voter to place their completed postal vote in the ballot box onsite.

If required, there is the option for voters to receive car-side assistance.

Voters are encouraged to go to the office of the Council for which they vote.

Otherwise, they can go to a different Council, but a supplementary ballot pack will not be available.

This service is being offered by the TEC and any enquiries should be directed to the TEC.

# COVID update

**Tasmanians will no longer be required to isolate  
if they test positive for COVID-19 from Friday, 14  
October.**

Just like with other respiratory illnesses, Tasmanians  
who test positive are advised to stay home when they  
are unwell, but there will not be a mandatory requirement  
to isolate.

Rules for close contacts of people who test positive  
for COVID-19 will also no longer be in place.

Tasmanians must continue to register their positive  
rapid antigen test (RAT) results.

Whilst there have been low numbers of reported

cases across the state in recent weeks, Tasmanians are  
encouraged to continue exercising their personal  
responsibility to minimise the risk of spreading COVID-  
19.

Those who test positive for COVID-19 can contact  
their GP, GP Respiratory Clinics or call the  
COVID@homeplus team to discuss care options.

People at high-risk of severe illness should arrange  
urgent access to anti-viral treatments through their GP  
or COVID@homeplus team when they test positive.

# LGBTIQ+ Community Consultation on *Draft Action Plan 2023-25*

Kingborough Council is committed to creating a community that is inclusive, safe, welcoming and respectful for all.

To achieve this, the Council need to make sure they understand our community's experiences, stories and concerns.

Kingborough Mayor, Cr Paula Wriedt said Kingborough Council had been consulting with our lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, intersex and queer (LGBTIQ+) community to better understand local experiences and needs.

"An LGBTIQ+ Working Group was formed to support and guide the engagement process," Cr Wriedt said.

"An online, anonymous survey was also created to

seek information from members of the LGBTIQ+ community, their family, friends, allies, supportive organisations and members of the public.

"The survey, which was open from July to August 2022, sought perceptions of how inclusive Kingborough is for members of the LGBTIQ+ community, experiences in Kingborough, and experiences with the Kingborough Council.

"A total of 162 people completed the survey.

"We developed the *Draft LGBTIQ+ Engagement Report and Action Plan 2023-25* using the results of this survey.

"Council is now seeking feedback from LGBTIQ+ advocacy groups, schools, cultural and sporting

organisations, health services, resident groups, business representatives and residents of Kingborough on the *Draft Action Plan*."

The consultation will close on October 28, 2022.

The final *LGBTIQ+ Engagement Report and Action Plan 2023-25*, including changes made following consultation, will be presented to Council in November 2022.

# Remembering a community legend

Many around the Huon have been touched by the loss of local Paul Harriss on Sunday, October 2, with those in politics, sports and community groups remembering a “community-minded” man.

Mr Harriss, who was the former Minister for Resources and independent member of the Tasmanian Legislative Council for Huon, was recalled by many as someone who was “passionate about serving his



community” and “a tireless volunteer”.

Premier Jeremy Rockliff extended his condolences to Mr Harriss’ family, calling him “an outstanding local member”.

“Paul was an outstanding local member for over 20 years for both the Huon and Franklin electorates, and his passion for grassroots issues and serving his community was obvious to all, particularly for those working in our vitally important resource-based industries,” the Premier said.

“Having resigned his Upper House seat, he joined the Liberal team at the 2014 election and was an inaugural member of the Hodgman Liberal Government Cabinet, where he served as the Minister for Resources until his retirement in 2016.

“Having worked with Paul for many years both during his time as an independent and as a member of the Liberal Government, I can also say he was a very valued colleague, a friend, and an outstanding person, and I join with the many Tasmanians today who will mourn his passing.”

Those on the opposing side of politics also expressed shock at the loss of Mr Harriss, with Labor members Dean Winter and Anita Dow stating they were saddened to hear of his passing.

“We always knew where he stood on the big issues and he argued his points with passion and resolve,” acting Labor Leader Ms Dow said.

“In 2006, Paul’s support was critical in the Lennox Labor Government delivering the first compensation package for the Aboriginal Stolen Generations through the Stolen Generations of Aboriginal Children Bill.

“It was held up as a model for other jurisdictions to follow.

“He was not just a public advocate for what he believed in, but someone who was a tireless volunteer and community-first operator behind the scenes.

“On behalf of the Labor Party, we send our love to Paul’s family, including Dean Harriss MLC, during this time.”

Labor Member for Franklin Dean Winter highlighted Paul Harriss’s longstanding commitment to the Huon and Channel region.

“There were few in the Huon and Channel area who did not know Paul,” Mr Winter said.

“Fiercely pro-industry and the Huon Valley, Paul was a

formidable political force for 20 years.

“He was one of the first people to reach out to me when I was elected as Mayor of Kingborough.

“He was generous with his time and passionate about the region, even after retirement.”

Another of Mr Harriss’ passions included sport, with his local cricket and football clubs sharing shock at his loss.

The North Huon Cricket Club, losing its founding president in Mr Harriss, stated that “it is difficult to put into words” the time and effort Paul put into four clubs on and off the field: the Ranelagh Cricket Club, Ranelagh Grove Cricket Club, Glen Huon Cricket Club and the North Huon Cricket Club.

“Commencing with the Ranelagh Cricket Club in 1967, it didn’t take long for Paul to make his way up into A Grade, playing alongside his father Geoff,” the North Huon Cricket Club reported on Facebook.

“1973-74 saw the merge of the Ranelagh and Grove Cricket Clubs, with Paul being the central batting figure for most of his period with the club.

“Highlights over this time included the A Grade Premierships in 1975-76, 1977-78, and 1982-83, as well as a club record partnership of 238 with father Geoff in 1974.

“While more renowned with the bat, he was more than adept with his leg spin bowling.

“For his on and off field contributions, Paul was awarded life membership of the Ranelagh Grove Cricket Club.

“Paul then moved to the Glen Huon Cricket Club, and again was integral to the development of the club both on and off field.

“Again, Paul was integral to steering Glen Huon to breaking a 65-year drought between A Grade Premierships, with victory in the 1994-95 decider, coincidentally against his former club.”

Mr Harris was a long-standing secretary and treasurer of the Glen Huon Cricket Club, resulting in a second life membership awarded for services to Glen Huon and in 2009, the merging of Ranelagh Grove and Glen Huon into the North Huon Cricket Club saw both his clubs combine, with Mr Harriss taking on the role of president for the new entity.

In his later years, Mr Harriss played alongside both his son Dean and grandson Will and continued promoting the interests of the club.

“Paul was also involved at an Association level for a length of time, holding numerous positions including Chairperson,” the North Huon Cricket Club said.

“On field, Paul scored over 10,000 runs, a club record, and took nearly 300 wickets.

“He finishes his innings a true legend of the North Huon Cricket Club, and indeed the Huon Channel Cricket Association.

“The club’s thoughts go to his family — his legacy will remain with the club for a long time.”

The Huon Channel Cricket Association remembered its former Chair and life member, asking that all clubs commemorate his loss by wearing a black armband at the commencement of the season on October 15 and 16.

The Huonville Lions Football Club was another sporting group to react to Mr Harriss’ passing, with the former player, committee member and tribunal representative called a “massive supporter of the club”.

“His most recent impact on the club has been his general support as a spectator, watching proudly from the sidelines whilst his grandchildren played the sport he loved so much,” the Huonville Lions Football Club reported on Facebook.

“Club President Todd Cordwell couldn’t have said it better when he described him as ‘an all-round genuine good bloke’ who will be missed dearly.”

The Huon Valley PCYC said it was “deeply saddened” by the loss of Mr Harriss, who was a former club president, life member and founding member.

“Paul was approached in 2001 by Jimmy Bell, the only other founding and life member, to come onboard and help behind the scenes to get the PCYC up and running,” a representative of the Huon Valley PCYC stated.

“Paul stuck alongside Jimmy the whole way through the process and opened doors that heavily contributed to the funding we were able to obtain.

“In addition to his 20-year contribution at the PCYC, he has also been involved at many other local clubs.

“The time, effort and love that he has put into the Huon Valley Community is second to none, only too happy to provide advice, assistance and go into battle for what he believes in.

“We are eternally grateful for all that he has done for our little PCYC.

“He will be sorely missed by all.”

# Researcher leads global fishing waste study

Fishing line that could wrap around the Earth 18 times is lost in the world’s oceans every year, according to research by CSIRO, Australia’s national science agency, and the University of Tasmania.

The research estimates that nearly two per cent of commercial fishing gear is lost or discarded every year, where it becomes a major component of global marine plastic pollution.

Denise Hardesty from CSIRO said this research is the most comprehensive examination of quantitative

amounts of abandoned, lost or discarded fishing gear globally to date.

“We found that 14 billion longline hooks, 25 million pots and traps and almost 740,000 km of fishing longlines end up in our oceans through global commercial fishing activities each year,” said Dr Hardesty.

As fishing gear lost at sea has significant economic, environmental and social impacts, this new research will help inform fisheries’ management and policy interventions from local to global scales.

“The data collected to create these estimates came

directly from fishers themselves to inform our understanding of fishing gear losses at source,” said Kelsey Richardson, lead author of the paper, previously at CSIRO and University of Tasmania.

“There have been increases in global fishing effort, as well as improvements in fishing technologies, including better opportunities to mark, track and recover fishing gears,” Dr Richardson said.

This research aligns to CSIRO’s Ending Plastic Waste Mission, which has a goal of an 80 per cent reduction in plastic waste entering the environment by 2030.

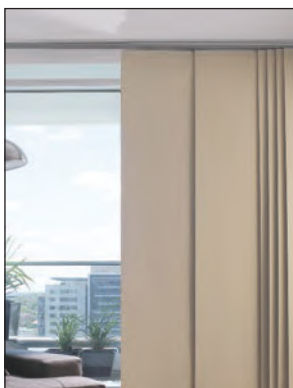

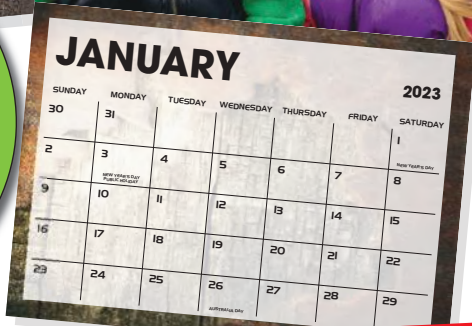

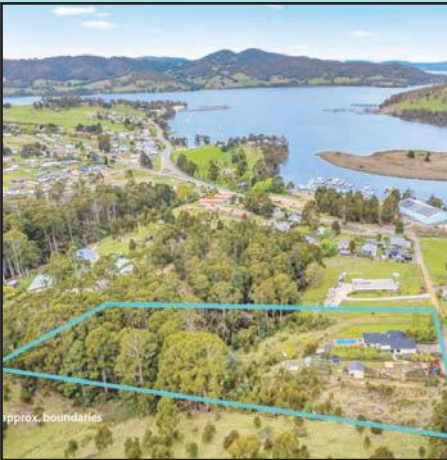

Being an informal society, an Australian garden will often reflect that informality.

The opposite is true of a French garden, not a leaf out of place, and very high maintenance.

Or the much less formal English stately garden, which merges into the wider landscape.

Now think of Paul Hogan's work for Tourism Australia, "throw another shrimp on the barbie."

Inverawe reflects that Hogan influence.

At Inverawe the basic principles of English landscape design are there, combined with Australian informality.

There are the long views, framed by trees.

The features, some of them natural, like Mt Louis, that pull the eye through the landscape.

Winding paths, designed to draw you on.

Lots of seats to sit and drink in the view and little bits of whimsy to amuse, informality being the key element.

A garden should be a home for all the trees, the insects, birds, pademelons and possums.

There was a garden in suburban Sydney on a normal sized block, which the owner had covered in concrete and painted green.

On this he installed pots of plastic flowers.

You won't find anything like that at Inverawe Native Gardens.

## Time to get ready for fishing

With the weather warming up and cray season nearly here it's time to start checking your safety equipment, service your fishing gear and getting your boat ready.

- Flares (check dates).
- EPIRB (check date and AMSA registration).
- Fire extinguishers should be free from rust and give them a tap and shake to ensure dry powder has not settled to the bottom and gone solid. Also check the gauge is still reading in the green.

- Lifejackets.
- It is a requirement that inflatable lifejackets are inspected by a licensed service agent at the intervals specified by the manufacturer. MAST recommends inspection at least every two years.

- Do a radio check and make sure you can transmit and receive.
- Have a look at the condition of the anchor and chain and/or rope.

Safety equipment requirements can be found on the MAST website or call into Franklin Marine and ask the staff.

# A Page from the Past - Kingborough News

Fifty five years ago the Huon Newspaper Company published *Kingborough News*, a weekly newspaper that circulated from 1967. The below page is taken from *Kingborough News*, October 20, 1967.

## Tourist Promotion in Huon-Channel

THE undoubted tourist potentialities of the Huon and Channel will receive a much-deserved boost when the combined efforts of all municipalities result in the publication of a well illustrated and documented booklet on which committees are now working.

Valuable prizes will be won by those successful in presenting the best colour slides and black and white pictures showing the scenic and historical attractions in all these incomparable areas.

The organisation that has been set up is that each municipality in the Huon and Channel has formed a tourist committee, from which 2 delegates have been appointed to the Huon-Channel overall committee.

The present chairman is the Warden of Huon (Mr T. Frankcomb), and the secretary is Mr Graham Knight, the Huon council clerk.

Each year, the various councils will take it in turn to provide the chairman and secretary.

The overall committee will prepare a pamphlet and will conduct a colour slide and black and white photo competition. These will be judged, and there

will be a prize in each municipality for the winning pictures.

The pictures will be submitted to a board of experts from the Government Tourist Bureau, the Tasmanian Tourist Council, and representatives of the municipalities to select the best to use in the booklet.

The cost of producing the booklet will be met by various sources. The Tasmanian Tourist Department and the Tasmanian tourist council will be asked to contribute, and the booklet will be used to promote tourism in southern districts.

Means of distribution are under consideration, but the booklet will be available from the Government Tourist Bureau and overseas centres.

Each municipality will have a certain number to distribute as they think best, and junior councillors may be asked to assist.

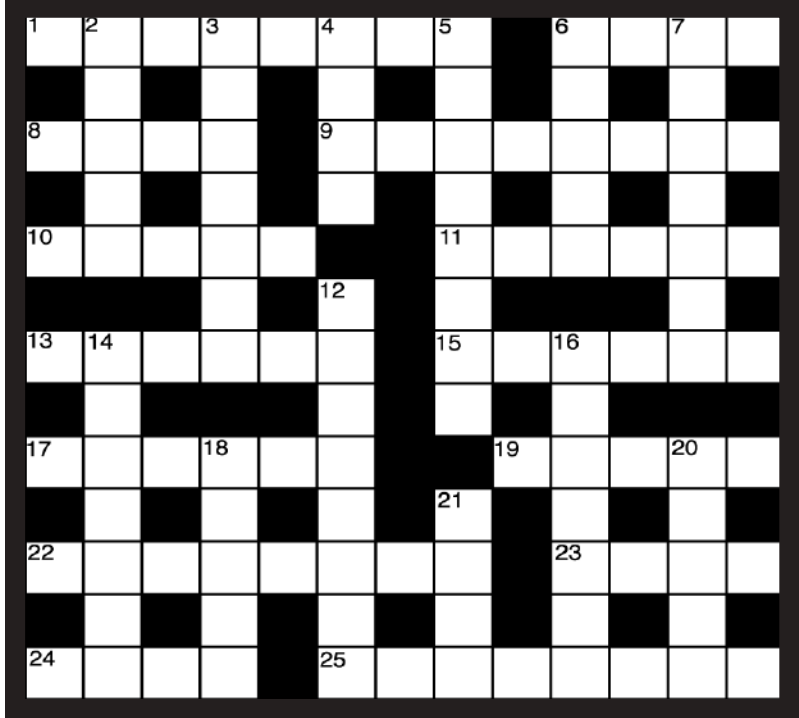

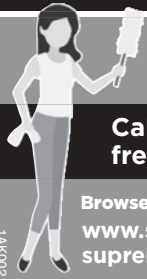

An 18-end game of bowls was conducted in the Donald Hazell Indoor Centre in which all attending bowlers took part.

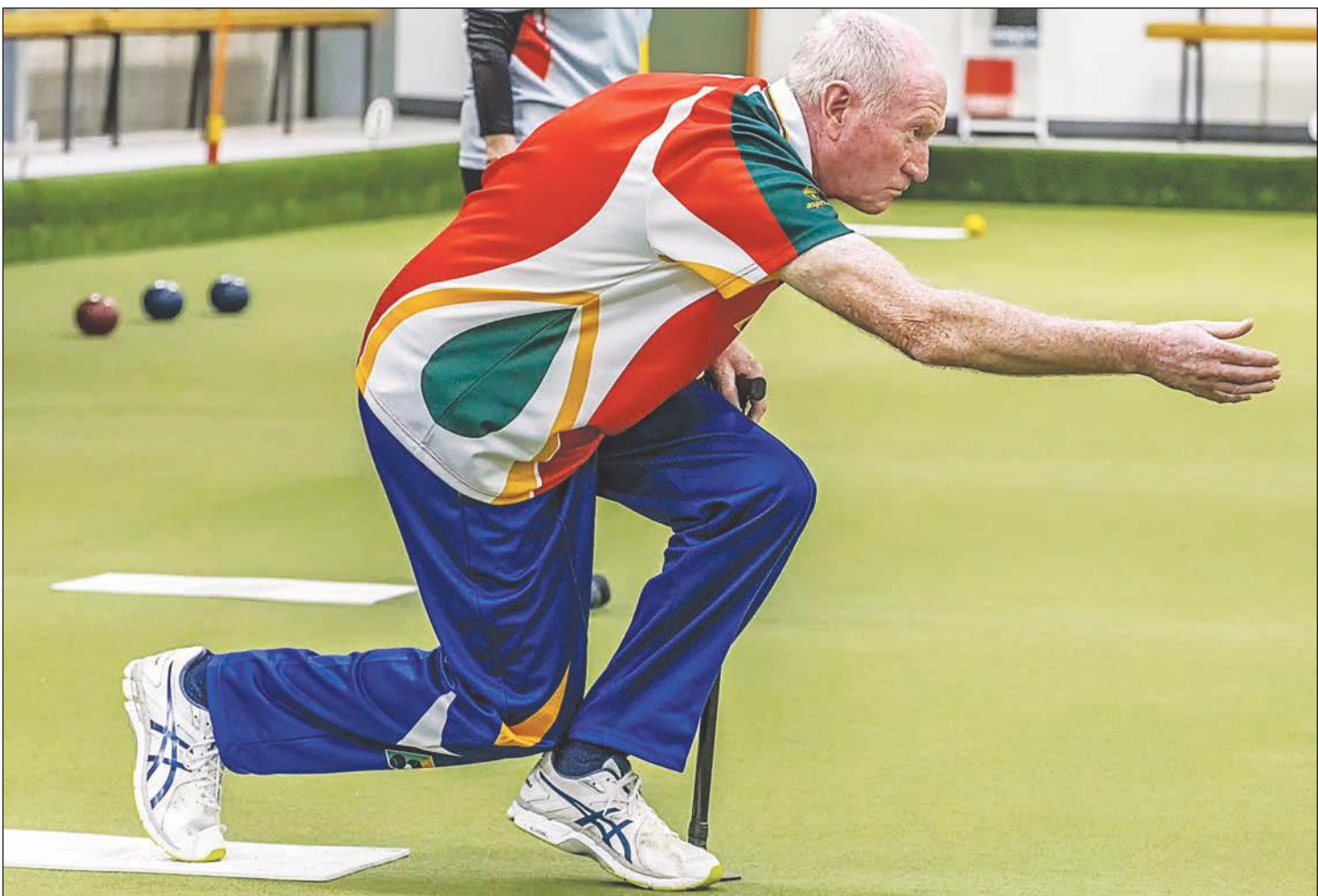
The President of Bowls Tasmania South, Peter Kirby, then officially declared the Bowls Tasmania South 2022/23 Pennant Season open.

Social competition was then organised which the new members enjoyed greatly.



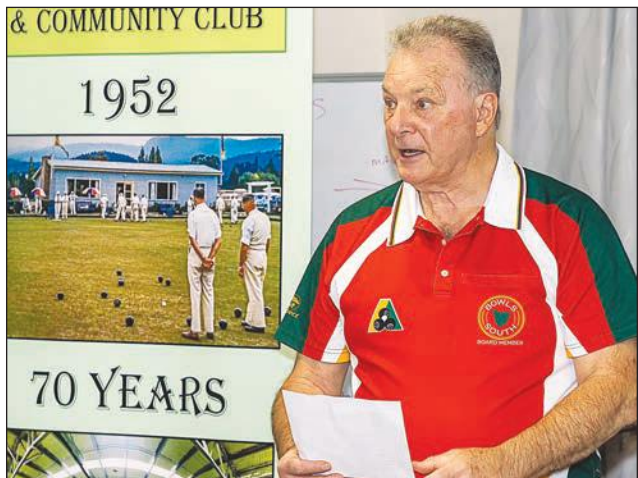
