First homes at Kings Quarter completed

to owners at Traders in Purple's Kings Quarter development in Kingston, adding much-needed housing stock to the greater Hobart market.

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt and Minister Guy Barnett officially opened this first stage on Wednesday, October 26.

Mr Barnett said, "It is a great example of local government and private sector partnering to identify opportunities and delivering much needed housing developments.

"Private investment is critical to increasing housing supply which is why we want to encourage projects like this that have been master-planned with residents in mind."

The homes, which commenced construction in February 2021, are part of a \$45 million investment in stage one of the total \$300 million multistage community masterplan development.

The remaining 62 homes in the first residential stage of the project

The first 18 of 80 homes have been completed and handed over will be completed progressively, with the entire stage on track to be completed the same time next year.

All 80 homes, both completed and underway, have been sold.

Traders in Purple Chief Executive Officer, Brett Robinson said having residents move in was a huge milestone for the project, which aimed to provide a new benchmark for community developments in

"Despite a challenging construction environment, Traders in Purple is delighted to have completed the first batch of homes at its Kings Quarter development," Mr Robinson said.

"It is highly rewarding to see the first residents moving in and hearing how much they love their new homes.

"We are very proud to have partnered with the Kingborough Council and local businesses to revitalise the site of the old Kingston High School, and to be providing high quality housing into the market.

"The first stage of homes sold out more than 12 months ahead of

schedule, showing the huge demand for housing developments of this type in and around Hobart and highlighting the power of a developer working together with local government to reach solutions that benefit the community.

Mr Robinson said sales of the next stage at Kings Quarter would commence in early 2023, subject to receipt of planning approval.

"This next stage will provide a further 50 dwellings, as well as supporting around 180 jobs both on and off site during the construction phase, with positive flow-on effect to local businesses including suppliers, manufacturers and consultants," Mr Robinson said.

As well as the next residential stage, a planning application will shortly be lodged for a new commercial office building, bringing new employment opportunities to the Kingborough region.

Supporting Tasmanian carers

National Carers Week has just passed but the work of Tasmania's over 80,000 unpaid carers continues.

KJ Darling represents one such unpaid carer, looking after her son Huon (aged four), who has cerebral palsy, with her husband Ben in Bonnet Hill.

Also in the family is daughter Bobbie-Jean (aged 2) and Jasper (aged

KJ and Ben split the responsibilities of taking care of Huon, with KJ tackling administration, liaisons with a variety of allied health professionals and food preparation as just some of her responsibilities.

KJ said that there are "literally hundreds of appointments a year".

In addition to Huon's practical needs like speech, physical and occupational therapy, the Darling family also prioritise helping him 'access the world," KJ said.

Huon attends a mainstream childcare and regularly goes for trips to cafés, down to the beach and to the accessible swing at Kingston Park. Looking after Huon requires constant care, KJ said.

"He needs someone to help him participate in anything."

Whilst National Carers Week represents a time to formally recognise the important contributions Tasmanian carers make to their families and their communities, KJ suggests the government needs to offer more.

"Government relies heavily on undervalued carers, who are often women." KJ said.

"I think they should factor in families' incomes. "If they are not going to compensate carers financially, they should at

least make tax exemptions to accept that at least one of the members of the household can't work. "There should be more considerations to the financial stress."

Wriedt returns as Kingborough Mayor

Paula Wriedt has been re-elected as Kingborough Mayor in the 2022 local government elections.

On first preferences for Mayor, Cr Wriedt held 61.39 per cent of the votes to Cr Mark Richardson's 38.61 per cent.

Cr Wriedt said, "I'm overwhelmed by the endorsement from residents and look forward to continuing to lead our community with kindness.

"It will be exciting new chapter for Kingborough with many new Councillors joining the team."

The recent local government elections, the first with compulsory voting, have been an outstanding success, with the Electoral Commissioner advising the final voter return rate across Tasmania was a massive 84.7 per cent.

Kingborough voters have surpassed this with a return rate of 86.32 per cent.

Cr Clare Glade-Wright has been elected as Deputy Mayor.

She held 58.25 per cent of the votes to Cr Antolli Aldo's 41.75 per cent. Joining Cr Wriedt and Cr Glade-Wright on the Kingborough Council are Cr Aldo Antolli, Cr Mark Richardson, Cr Kaspar Deane, Cr Gideon Cordover, Cr

Christian Street, Cr Amanda Midgley, Cr Flora Fox and Cr David Bain.

Cr Wriedt said, "I am looking forward to working with them as we start some significant projects linking more of Kingborough together and providing better access across the municipality with new and upgraded tracks, upgraded roads and improved stormwater across the municipality."

"We often hear early childhood education referred to as 'child care' but it involves a lot more than babysitting children until their parents get back from work.


"Early childhood educators are highly trained professionals who deliver a program of play-based learning aimed at very specific learning outcomes.

Rally to raise the age of criminal responsibility

Amnesty Southern Group and Amnesty International Australia (AIA) invite the community to a rally in Hobart, Parliament steps, at 1pm on November 10 to present politicians with the petition to raise the minimum age of criminal responsibility from 10 to 14 years.

It has now been one year since the Legislative Council successfully passed a motion to raise the age of criminal responsibility in Tasmania to 14 years.

Since this motion passed, we have heard many more disturbing details about the treatment of children in Tasmania's justice system including the inquiry into the Ashley Youth Detention Centre.

The government has announced its intention to raise the age of detention to 14 years in 2024, but this will only affect a handful of children.

Raising the age of criminal responsibility will affect many more children, giving them a chance for a better future.

Amnesty International Australia and Change The

Record have recently delivered their Raise the Age petition with over 200,000 signatures to Indigenous Affairs Minister Linda Burney and Attorney General Mark Dreyfus in Canberra.

At the meeting, the Ministers expressed the Federal Government's strong commitment to taking national leadership on this crucial issue.

Amnesty Southern Group requests that attendees bring a used toy or similar symbol of what a child's experience should be to place on the pathway and steps leading to Parliament.

These toys will then be donated to an appropriate children's charity.

Amnesty Southern Group will provide a bus for people who would like to come to the rally but may not have their own transport.

The bus will leave Cygnet bus stop at 11.30am and Huonville bus stop at 12 noon.

It will depart Parliament House at 2.15pm.



324 million.

"For example: do not send personal or financial information to someone who you don't know or trust, do not click hyperlinks in suspicious emails, do not respond to phone calls asking for remote access to your computer,

be wary of unusual requests such as payment in gift cards or Bitcoin, if you doubt someone's claim to be from a major organisation like a government agency, your bank or phone company, hang up and dial the organisation's published number, and if an offer seems too good to be true, it probably is!"

Senator Bilyk encourages anyone who has fallen victim to a scam to report their experience to the Australian Cyber Security Centre at www.cyber.gov.au or call 1300 292 371 (1300 CYBER1).



Funding for new Kingborough trail underpass

The Tasmanian Liberal Government will provide funding to help the Kingborough Council build an underpass for the Whitewater Creek Trail at Summerleas Road to enhance the local walking and cycle path network.

Summerleas Road underpass is a key component of the Whitewater Creek Trail, which has been identified by Hobart City Deal partners as a top priority in the Network

Details of the grant program are currently being finalised, with the Tasmanian Liberal Government's contribution to individual projects to represent up to half

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt recently confirmed her strong support for the additional T3 transit lane on the Southern Outlet.

The Tasmanian Government is also progressing a feasibility study into building a shared use pathway between Huntingfield and Margate.

The pathway was identified in the Channel Highway Corridor Study as an opportunity to promote active forms of transport and improve safety and connectivity.

The Tasmanian Government is working with Kingborough Council to investigate the feasibility of building the pathway.

The proposed route runs south from Algona Road in Huntingfield near the Coffee Creek fire trail in the Peter Murrell Reserve, follows Howden Road and then runs parallel with the Channel Highway to Margate.

There is potential for the pathway to connect with other tracks or pathways along the route and in Margate

There is also an option to link it to the new Huntingfield park and ride facility.


