# **Cooked proposal given green light**

The sale of Tassal to multinational giant, Cooke Aquaculture, marks the sale of the last Tasmanian salmon company to foreign buyers. More than 96 per cent of shareholders voted to approve the sale for \$1.2 billion to the Canadian owned business.

The deal will see Cooke given access to Tassal's salmon farms spanning five marine zones, four freshwater hatcheries and four processing facilities in Tasmania, as well as prawn farming and seafood processing businesses in New South Wales and Queensland.

Environment Tasmania echoed the warning from the Global Salmon Farming Resistance and urged the government to heed their warning. They said the long-expected sale of Tassal to Cooke Aquaculture marked

a new concerning era in Tasmania, with all three salmon companies having

been bought out by multinational corporations.

"Tasmania's oceans and coastal waters are unique and support an incredible array of marine life," says Rebecca Howarth, Marine Campaigner for Environment Tasmania.

"Tasmanians rely on these waters for not only recreation but also for many it's their livelihoods.

"We urge the government to take heed of these warnings and put Tasmanians and our precious oceans first.

"Now is the time to be prioritising our ocean's health so it can be enjoyed for future generations.

"Cooke Aquaculture has a terrible track record of environmental non-compliance, seal deaths, fraudulent behaviour and negligence.

"We are feeling incredibly concerned about this latest sale.

"Tasmania's coastal communities and our marine environment deserve better. "We fully support the recommendations of the Tasmanian government upper house inquiry.

"We ask the government which of the recommendations made in the inquiry report will the government be adopting with regards to stricter regulations of the industry in light of this latest sale?"

"The exploitation of Tasmanian ocean resources by global or interstate companies is becoming an increasingly dire problem in the Tasmanian seafood industry."

The State Government and Cooke Aquaculture were contacted for comment.

Historically in Tasmania, each municipality has had its own planning scheme however this is changing and for some property owners, the consequences will be dire, according to local resident Mel O'Keefe. Tasmania is being progressively transitioned to the Tasmanian Planning Scheme (TPS), comprising of the State Planning Provisions (SPP) together with Local Provisions Schedule (LPS), specific to each municipality. As part of the suite of changes, Environmental Living Zone (ELZ) has been discontinued while a new zone, Landscape Conservation Zone (LCZ), has been created – which the State Planning Office has explicitly stated, is not a replacement for ELZ.

The Draft LPS prepared by Kingborough Council proposes widespread rezoning to LCZ, largely property currently zoned ELZ and Rural Living Zone (RLZ).

There are fundamental differences between the zones; LCZ's primary purpose is for the protection, conservation and management of large areas of bushland, whereas ELZ and RLZ's purpose is for residential use in areas with native vegetation cover and other landscape values. Other councils have used LCZ very sparingly, if at all,

as areas of value are identified and protected by Natural Assets and/or Scenic Protection Codes. There has been a fundamental shift from 'how to build'

to 'if you build'. "Alarmingly, some property owners who purchased land with an intention of building a home, may find

themselves unable to build and when council were asked for a guarantee that this situation would not eventuate, it was not provided," said Mel.

"Council is attempting to placate property owners with statements on its website such as "in practical terms, for most people that have properties in the ELZ the assessment pathway process will remain similar" overlooking any changes to RLZ and Low Density Residential properties proposed for LCZ, which will suffer the most losses.

"Furthermore, the approvals pathway is only one of many changes that will adversely impact thousands of Kingborough residents.

"Council has remained silent regarding LCZ having more onerous approvals criteria than ELZ and RLZ. "It has remained silent regarding both the significant reduction of and loss of property rights.

"And it has remained silent regarding the financing challenges4 brought about by vastly increased uncertainty in gaining planning approval, a risk Glamorgan Spring Bay Council acknowledge.

Mayor of Kingborough, Cr Paula Wriedt replied to the concerns

"Kingborough Council has listened to the community and acknowledges that there is significant concern regarding the Landscape Conservation Zone," said Cr

"Council has requested to meet with the Tasmanian Planning Commission to discuss these raised concerns and a potential review of the LCZ in Kingborough.

"The Kingborough Draft LPS was lodged with the Tasmanian Planning Commission in 2019.'

Mel O'Keefe continued explaining the concern over the proposed changes.

"What Council has acknowledged is the devaluation of property and emotive issues are not relevant considerations in its capacity as the planning authority.

"It has also acknowledged in the Land Use Strategy that "LCZ discourages residential uses", however has proposed it for thousands of properties.

"The impacts of Council's proposed widescale application of LCZ are not restricted to property owners; the community at large will suffer an increased bushfire risk.

"Vegetation management is in conflict with LCZ and proposing vast quantities of LCZ will unquestionably result in increased fuel loads.

"This is compounded by climate change and its increased spring rainfall promoting growth coming into the summer bushfire period.

"Our lives, our homes, our communities - they are not expendable.

Community concern has resulted in the creation of the Facebook Group called 'Kingborough Residents Concerned about Landscape Conservation Zoning (LCZ)', garnering over 600 concerned local members (and growing daily) within a few short weeks.

According to Mel and the group, the responsible cause of action would be for Council to:

• Request withdrawal of the draft LPS, under S35I(2) of the Land Use Planning and Approvals Act 1993.

 Individually assess all properties that are proposed for down-zoning, including all properties proposed for LCZ, in-line with the criteria set-out in the Tasmanian Planning Commissions 'Guideline 1: Local Provisions Schedule (LSP): zone and code application' acknowledging that in relation to zone application, the Guide states "3.3 The primary objective in applying a zone should be to achieve the one purpose to the greatest extent possible.'

 Advise individual property owners in writing where down-zoning is proposed (including all proposed for LCZ). Resubmit the amended Draft LPS.

# Meriem Daoui wins Tasmania Young Australian of the Year

The 2023 Tasmania Young Australian of the Year was won by Kingston local, humanitarian and marathon runner Meriem Daoui.

Meriem Daoui, a Tasmanian marathon runner and registered nurse, uses her love of running as a platform to do good.

She ran her first marathon at age 16, raising over \$5,000 for displaced Syrians affected by their country's civil war.

Born in Morocco, Meriem relocated to Tasmania at age 10 where she experienced racism and was bullied for wearing a hijab.

Anxiety, depression and eating disorders plagued her teenage years, but the support she received during her adversities inspired her to give back to the community. Now 23, Meriem has also used marathons to raise awareness and funds for childhood cancer research.

She most recently conquered the Everest challenge, running the Point-to-Pinnacle course – also known as the world's hardest half-marathon – every day for one week.

The challenge raised over \$12,000.

In 2021, Meriem was awarded the Australian Peter Norman Humanitarian award for her community and philanthropic efforts.

Nominee for Tasmania's Australian of the Year was Woodbridge Professor Brett McDermott for his tireless efforts as Director of Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service Tasmania.

Kingborough local Amanda French, who is the Founder for Dress for Success Hobart, was nominated as Tasmania's local hero for providing support, guidance, and mentorship to women in need in the Kingston and area community.

The 2023 Tasmania Australian of the Year Awards were announced in the presence of the Honourable Barbara Baker AC, Governor of Tasmania and Jeremy Rockliff, Premier of Tasmania at a ceremony in Hobart on November 4, 2022.

The four Tasmania recipients will join those from the other states and territories for the national awards to be announced on 25 January 2023.



# Upgrade to Kingston's Mountain Bike Park

Kingborough Council will be starting work soon on upgrading the dirt pump track at the Kingborough Mountain Bike Park to asphalt.

Kingborough Mayor, Paula Wriedt said the funding for the track was secured through a State Government 'Improving the Playing Field' Grant.

"Council receives regular requests to upgrade the facilities at the Kingston Mountain Bike Park to bring them up to contemporary standards," Cr Wriedt said.

"Asphalt pump tracks have become very popular within the community over recent years compared to dirt-surface tracks, and they have the added benefit of being easier to maintain.

"After school and on weekends the carpark is often overflowing with families using the facilities, so I know these upgrades will be well received.

"Along with the upgrade to the pump track, Council

will be investing \$65,000 to improve the carpark and cater for an increase in traffic.

"Council has also been successful in securing a \$20,000 Communities Tasmania grant to build a shelter where people can gather protected from the weather.

"One of the most exciting upgrades to the facilities will be a specially built 'wallride'.

"Wallrides are almost vertical surfaces designed to cater for skaters, people using scooters, as well as the biking community.

"The tender for the project was won by Velosolutions who have built around 400 asphalt pump tracks around the world.

"Kingborough residents love our sport, so I am really proud that Council has invested \$7.8 million in this year's budget to maintain our sporting culture."

# New rock lobster rules

From 1 November, the new management plan for the Tasmanian Rock Lobster Fishery will take effect. Set out in the Fisheries (Rock Lobster) Rules 2022, the

new plan details improved compliance and reporting rules for rock lobster fishery users.

In place for the next 10 years, the rules also include changes to increase the sustainability of the rock lobster fishery and were approved after extensive public consultation and engagement with key stakeholders, peak bodies, and fishers.

MP for Industries and Water, Jo Palmer said she, "greatly appreciated the active engagement of commercial, recreational, and Aboriginal fishers in this process.

"The submissions made on the draft rules helped to refine proposals that were put forward during the consultation process".

The most significant change to the previous rules is a new minimum size limit of 120 mm for female rock lobster, which will apply in the North and East Coast for all fishers.

This better reflects regional lobster growth rates and size, while boosting egg production.

Other changes being introduced by the new Rules include: • Mandatory Vessel Monitoring systems in the

commercial rock lobster fleet.

• Changes to transiting and reporting provisions for commercial fishers.

• Group sharing of catch from pots for recreational fishers.

• Allowing recreational fishers to transit between the two size limit zones and transit through the seasonally closed area of the D'Entrecasteaux Channel at the start of the season, provided they make the required transit telephone reports, and

Introducing rules that can require recreational fishers to report details of any rock lobster they take.

Work is also underway on the development of a catch reporting App which will be rolled out for use by all recreational rock lobster fishers on the East Coast for the start of the 2023/24 season.

This will provide significant benefits for the tracking of recreational catch and management of the important fishery.

# Standards a towering issue

The State Government has been pressed by Franklin MP David O'Byrne over an ROGS/ABS survey that revealed more than one-in-five public housing properties in Tasmania are not meeting basic standards.

"We've got social housing tenants in our community who are living in properties that are completely overrun by mould", said Mr O'Byrne.

"Almost every day I hear a heartbreaking story from a family in a social housing property that is not maintained, with tenants fighting to get broken windows, leaking gutters, and faulty plumbing fixed.

The survey, which collects a sample of publicly and socially housed tenants, asks for self-reported information on dwelling standards.

In a statement Guy Barnett, Minister for Development, Construction and Housing said "The information in the survey is based on tenants' views, not on property condition assessments.

'The Tasmanian Government is committed to transparency and reports data monthly in the Housing Dashboard, including work orders completed"

MP O'Byrne reiterated his concerns, saying "These tenants do everything they can to get these issues fixed, but they're just told to wait and then wait some more.

.. the Minister claimed the ABS data was 'unreliable' while simultaneously failing to commit to publishing the government's own numbers.'

MP Barnett defended said unreliability, saying "The Tasmanian Government and other jurisdictions are working together to improve the accuracy of ROGS data.

"We recognise that issues requiring maintenance arise from time to time around the state and will continue to deliver quality responsive, routine, vacation and planned maintenance services on the portfolio that we manage across the State.

"We encourage any tenant with a concern to bring it to the attention of their tenancy manager on 1300 665 663.







# **Time to restore Fasmania's waterways**

Independent Member for Nelson Meg Webb called on the Rockliff Liberal Government to listen to the call from Tasmanian communities to adopt Recommendation 3 of the Legislative Council Inquiry into Fin Fish Farming.

"I encourage the Rockliff Government to introduce a plan to reduce farming operations in in-shore sensitive and biodiverse areas," Ms Webb said.

"The Government seems stuck in cheerleader mode for the salmon industry instead of prioritising effective regulation in stewardship of Tasmanian public waterways." Ms Webb said the Legislative Council Inquiry made a

raft of balanced and fair recommendations. "This included Recommendation 3, calling for a plan to reduce farming operations in in-shore sensitive and biodiverse areas.

"Rather than dismiss this sensible recommendation out of hand, the Rockliff Government could take positive opportunities to give it effect.

"The retirement of in-shore leases up for renewal, particularly any not in current use, would demonstrate a responsiveness to community concern and confirm the industry's future lies in off-shore and land-based sites.

Ms Webb said the only path for the salmon industry gaining social licence is to fix mistakes of the past. "Tasmania needs to move away from farming

in-shore areas which would never be considered suitable for industrial farming at the scale we now see. "It's time for the government to champion the restoration of precious areas of Tasmania's public waterways and

the Tasmanian community who value them.





# **TASMANIAN TRAMPOLINISTS LEAPING INTO WORLD CHAMPS**

A record number of Tasmanian gymnasts have been selected to represent Australia at the upcoming 36th FIG World Championships for Trampoline Gymnastics being held in Sofia, Bulgaria beginning November 16. In total, five gymnasts, two coaches and one judge

from Tasmania will represent the country next month at the World Senior Championships.

Seventy-five percent of the Australian men's double-mini team (three out of the four representatives) are members of Kingborough Gymsports and train at the Optus State Training Centre in the south of the state.

"It is always exciting to see any Tasmanian representing the country on a national level, but to have such a large contingent of the squad shows the talent and skill of our local athletes," said Gymnastics Tasmania CEO Sam Brittlebank.

Team members include Matthew French, Leuca McLeod, and Callum O'Sullivan with state coach, Ben Kelly, as head coach and assistant state coach, Alison Morgan making her World Championship coaching debut as assistant Australian coach for double-mini trampoline. Braida Thomas from Queensland is currently making

her final preparations at the Optus State Training Centre with Kelly and Morgan will compete in the women's double-mini event in Bulgaria.

Kelly admits this is a first for Tasmania to have so

many local gymnasts on the team for one apparatus from one program and club, but is not surprised by the selections after the Tasmanian team took the gold medal in the men's double-mini team's event at the recent Australian Gymnastics Championships held on the Gold Coast in May.

Although this is the first World Championships for all three gymnasts, all have had previous World Age Championship experience, with McLeod more recently competing at his first Senior World Cup in Portugal, winning the silver medal.

Tasmanian's in other events include Patrick Schluter who will make his World Championships debut, being the first Tasmanian to represent Australia in the Olympic discipline of Individual Trampoline since Olympic Shadow team member Jack Penny last competed in 2015.

Schluter will also contest the Synchronised division, with two-times Olympic reserve Shaun Swadling from New South Wales.

Jacob Smith will once again return to the World Championship arena competing in the Men's Tumbling event, with Jack Penny being selected to officiate as Australia's tumbling judge.

The World Championships will commence on November 16, with the World Age Championships to commence on November 23.
