Stop work action demands start talk action

Teachers, school staff, health workers, firefighters, cleaners, child safety officers and many more workers across Tasmania's public sector walked off the job on Wednesday, 9 November in their continuing campaign to secure improvements to important conditions along with a pay rise that helps workers cope with sky rocketing living costs.

Owing to the number of school staff participating in the action, all Tasmanian Government schools were temporarily closed from 12.15pm on the Wednesday, including those in the Kingborough area. The Australian Education Union said that finals exams for years 11

and 12 students were not affected.

Major rallies were held in Hobart, Launceston, Devonport, and Burnie with smaller meetings on the East Coast, West Coast, Tasman Peninsula, King and Flinders Islands. These were the biggest stop work actions across the public sector since 2018.

"Educators have no choice but to take action against the Rockliff Government's unacceptable neglect of public education," Australian Education Union (AEU) Tasmania President David Genford said.

"Educators are burning out and students are missing out every day because schools and colleges aren't being met with the required resources needed to meet student needs."

In a statement addressing the AEU's concerns, Premiere Jeremy Rockliff who has been locked in negotiations with union representatives since his first state budget said, "Good faith negotiations mean listening and responding, and our government has done that at all levels, with three separate wage offers made to public sector unions since September. "The facts are, our offer provides a three-year agreement with increases to wages of 3.5 per cent in the first year, and 3 per cent each year for the next two years.

"It also addresses feedback from unions around attraction and retention, and improved employment conditions have also been offered to employees, in addition to salary increases and additional cost of living payments over three years."

Unions disagree, saying that they've asked nicely for months and in some cases, for years.

"Public sector workers care deeply about the work they do and the community they serve," Unions Tasmania Secretary Jessica Munday said. "Strike action is a last resort.

"The breadth and depth of workers preparing to take action... should send a strong signal to the Premier that he needs to intervene and end this dispute."

A new Tasmanian Aboriginal tour mumara patrula "Wood for the Fire", was launched this month at Trial Bay by Kingborough Council in conjunction with Performing Lines Tasmania and creator Nunami Sculthrope-Green.

Kingborough Deputy Mayor, Clare Glade-Wright said the tour was very moving and was brilliantly presented by creator Nunami Sculthorpe-Green.

"This is the first and only Aboriginal-authored tour available south of nipaluna/Hobart," Cr Glade-Wright said.

"The tour takes you on a gentle bush walk along the coastline of Trial Bay, while you hear the historical stories of legendary Aboriginal Elders.

"Although the stories shared are often about terrible times in our history, there is also much heart and beauty conveyed about the Aboriginal custodians of this land, their community and practices.

"I totally recommend this tour, although you will have to be quick as tickets are selling out fast.

"The tour is supported by a RANT grant which is focused on building capacity for Tasmanian communities, artists and organisations here in Tasmania.'

Tour creator Nunami Sculthorpe-Green said mumara patrula was a new and exciting journey for her. "I've enjoyed working with Performing Lines TAS and

the Council to share these important stories of our people," Ms Sculthorpe-Green said.

"I applaud Kingborough Council for their initiative and

action when it comes to truth telling and highlighting Tasmanian Aboriginal stories in the municipality.

"As the stories intertwine with the beautiful landscape, I feel they will present a truly unique and touching experience for locals and visitors alike."

Kingborough Mayor Cr Paula Wriedt also commended Nunami on winning Tourism Minister's Young Achiever Award on November 5, saying, "Nunami has developed a fantastic cultural tourism business which is providing great opportunities for community members and tourists to understand the long history of Tasmanian Aboriginal people

"Council has been fortunate to be able to join together with Nunami to bring a new walking tour to Kingborough. "We look forward to working with Nunami into the future."

Senior Producer at Performing Lines TAS, Annette Downs said Performing Lines TAS had produced Nunami's first tour in niplauna.

"We are delighted to have produced and co-commissioned this latest tour with the Kingborough Council," Ms Downs said.

Book your place, swiftly!

Spring is in full swing, which means groups of brightly coloured Swift Parrots are once again gracing our forests for their breeding season.

For a chance to see and learn more about this endangered migratory parrot, Natural Resource Management (NRM) South, in partnership with Inala Nature Tours, are hosting a free public field trip on Bruny Island on November 26. The aim of the event is to raise awareness about the plight of Swift Parrots and the importance of protecting critical habitat.

It is part of a series of community events that have been offered to school groups and the public over the last three years.

Swift Parrots breed only in Tasmania, migrating from the Australian mainland for spring and summer.

Their core breeding areas are in Tasmania's south-east, where they feed exclusively on the nectar of blue gums and black gums. They also depend on nesting hollows found in large,

old trees near to their feeding areas. Through funding from the Australian Government's

National Landcare Program, NRM South have been

working with project partners to protect Swift Parrots. NRM South is examining ways to increase nesting success, identify and protect key breeding habitat and raise community awareness.

Project activities to date include trialling solutions to reduce the impacts of their main predator, the introduced sugar glider, securing conservation covenants with private landholders to protect high value habitat, and annual gum blossom surveys to help predict where Swift Parrots may choose to nest.

The 1,500-acre Inala Private Conservation Reserve on South Bruny Island is well known for reliable sightings of Swift Parrots as it contains large areas of their preferred foraging and breeding habitat.

The property is also home to many other special species, including Forty-spotted Pardalotes, Eastern Quolls, Firetail Finches and Pink Robins.

The field day runs from 9am to 1pm and no previous bird watching experience is necessary.

The Tasmania Fire Service has implemented a new and nationally consistent Australian Fire Danger Rating System (AFDRS) designed to provide clear and accurate information about bushfire risk.

The AFDRS has four rating levels: Moderate, High, Extreme and Catastrophic, with simple actions for the community to take at each level:

Moderate (Green) – Plan and prepare;

High (Yellow) – Be ready to act;

Extreme (Orange) – Take action now to protect life and property; and Catastrophic (Red) – For your survival, leave bushfire

risk areas. This is the most significant change to the fire danger

rating system in more than 50 years. The AFDRS provides ratings that describe the potential level of danger should a bushfire start, based on forecast

weather conditions, vegetation type and fuel. This is a national system and consistent across Australia. No matter where you are, the higher the fire danger, the

more dangerous the conditions. Adoption of the AFDRS was a recommendation from the Royal Commission into National Natural Disaster Arrangements Report.

To enable this initiative, the Tasmanian Government has invested nearly \$1.4 million, which has been matched by the Australian Government.

The system will enable the community to make informed decisions to keep themselves prepared and safe before a hushfire starts.

"Using modern and consistent fire danger ratings, the AFDRS provides action-oriented messaging, designed to empower the community to make informed decisions to be prepared and safe," Tasmanian Fire Service Chief Officer Dermot Barry said.


"We are all aware of the devastating impact fires can have on communities.

"The new AFDRS will be used to communicate the potential risks if a bushfire was to start. "This allows easier decision-making for the community

to keep safe on high fire danger days." Fire Danger Ratings describe the potential level of danger a community could face should a bushfire start.

If there is a bushfire, the Australian Warning System (AWS) provides community advice and information.

Fish health and environmental protection put first

Cooke Aquaculture and the Tasmanian State Government responded to an article in the November 8 edition of the Kingborough Chronicle, concerning the sale of Tassal to multinational giant, Cooke Aquaculture.

In a statement from the Canadian seafood supplier Cooke, sustainability and rigorous standards were at the forefront of their reply to criticism from Environment Tasmania. "Our company and our employees take animal welfare

seriously and our people farm with care," said a spokesperson.

"The aquaculture industry works closely with worldrenowned scientists from academia, government, and the private sector to develop rigorous standards and implement best practices for fish health and environmental protection.

"Environment Tasmania is ignoring the fact that farm-raised salmon is one of the healthiest and most efficient ways to feed the population with a minimal environmental impact and the lowest carbon footprint of any animal protein.

"One would think that Environment Tasmania would support the most environmentally sustainable form of protein production for food.

"Or perhaps they are opposed to all animal farming? "As a family company, we have full confidence in the 1700 employees at Tassal and the hundreds of small and medium size local businesses in the Tasmanian and Australian aquaculture supply chain.

"We are excited to be joining local communities in Tasmania and Australia as a partner in future food production and continuing the implementation of modern aquaculture technologies, science and best practices.'

Asked during a press conference on November 6 whether the State Government had heard the concerns of groups opposed to the Cooke takeover, and what was in place to give Tasmanians confidence that a major international company would show appropriate care to the environment, Minister for State Development Guy Barnett responded.

The weather during the working bee was fine, but the ecent wet weather had taken its toll on the reserve. The culvert under the Nierinna Creek Ford was almost


blocked and needed clearing. The sides of the ford had been damaged by the recent
