# Saunders & Ward celebrates 100 years

Saunders & Ward is a Tasmanian engineering company that has been operating in Hobart since 1922, making it one of the longest continuously running engineering businesses in Australia.

It's still family owned and operated today, spanning three generations.

The company was founded by Bert Saunders, a British engineer working in India on various hydroelectric power schemes at the beginning of the 20th century.

In 1922, Bert and his business partner Victor Ward bought A.B. Buyers Engineers in Montpelier Retreat, Battery Point and founded Saunders & Ward.

Victor retired in 1929, leaving the business in the hands of the Saunders family.

Saunders & Ward has since moved base to Kingston where it has

grown to be a major steel fabrication and general engineering business.

The company has been involved in such projects as the construction of the central staircase at Mona and in conservation projects at Port Arthur Historic Site and the West Coast Wilderness Railway.

Saunders & Ward today is owned by Bert's grandsons, Nick and Jamie.

Nick attributes the company's longevity to the talent and skill of his loyal staff.

"Many of our staff have been with us for many years, and being a family business, we have formed close relationships," he said.

"Under the leadership of Ben Rolliston our General Manger and the Saunders family's guidance we are confident that Saunders & Ward will continue to provide a valuable service to Tasmania's industries." See photos on page 2

# Questions on transit lane

A transit lane for the Southern Outlet was endorsed by the Parliamentary Committee on Public Works on Friday, November 25.

The project is set to commence in 2023.

The Committee's Report represents further support for the project following the endorsement of the Tasmanian Chamber of Commerce and Industry, the Royal Automobile Club of Tasmania and, most recently, the Mayor of Kingborough, Paula Wriedt.

A key choke point on the Greater Hobart network is the Southern Outlet in-bound on weekday morning peaks.

The Southern Outlet transit lane, available for buses, emergency vehicles and multi-occupant private vehicles, will provide the extra lane capacity needed to provide travel time reliability for users.

Minister for Infrastructure and Transport Michael Ferguson said "I have repeatedly said that the Government would minimise property acquisitions for the T3 transit lane on the Southern Outlet, notwithstanding the large number of properties that were compulsorily acquired and demolished in the 1960s to build the link through the suburb of Dynnyrne".

"I was pleased that the Committee was satisfied by the evidence presented by senior officers of my Department before the Parliamentary Committee on Public Works as well as myself to answer questions in relation to the sequencing of the individual projects under the program of works, as well as noise mitigation measures and the construction methodology," Mr Ferguson said.

"The Tasmanian Government is now moving forward with planning for the transit lane as the only solution to ease traffic congestion on the Southern Outlet."

Labor questions the cost of widening the Southern Outlet, a project which is estimated to take 20 months.

Franklin MP Dean Winter says widening the road at Dynnyrne won't work without other congestion-easing measures in place. "An extra lane in one spot will just push the problem closer to the

city," Mr Winter said. "People in the south of the state will pay dearly for this

Government's fixation on a single project that won't work on its own."

Mr Winter pointed out one in 10 Tasmanians now live south of Hobart.

Local bottlenecks such as the Algona Road roundabout in Kingston also need urgent upgrades.

"Whilst we accept that the Committee has finalised their technical approval of the project and cost, I am still of the view that the fifth lane will do little to resolve traffic congestion on the Southern Outlet," Franklin MP David O'Byrne said.

"There's still no coherent plan to deal with the bottleneck at the top of Macquarie and Davey Streets, and public transport services will not resolve this congestion without a network-wide plan.

"The fact that this Minister couldn't even build appropriate shelter at the new \$6 million Huntingfield park and ride facility does not fill me with great confidence that he and his department can deliver the outcomes the community are desperate for."







# Listen up for better hearing






