Poor swim in Kingston Beach North

The Kingborough Council is investigating possible sources of water contamination after the northern section of Kingston Beach was downgraded to 'poor' quality as part of the Derwent Estuary Program's (DEP) 2021-22 Water Quality Program Annual Report.

ISSUE No. 660

Local councils, the Derwent Estuary Program and Environmental Protection Authority collect water samples from 35 sites throughout the Derwent Estuary each Tuesday from the start of December to the end of March

This program is called the Beach Watch Program and it has been running for over 20 years.

As part of this Beach Water Program, Kingston Beach North has been downgraded from fair to poor quality.

This means swimming for people is not advised in the northern section of Kingston Beach.

Kingston Beach has three regular testing sites which have been broken up into South, Middle and North.

Kingston Beach Middle and South are both still rated as safe for swimming.

Progressive Action Plan formally endorsed

Kingborough Council formally endorsed support for the Kingborough LGBTIQA+ Action Plan 2023-2025 at council's December 5 meeting.

The Action Plan would see \$20,000 allocated over two financial years in order to implement the project's goals of a greater understanding of the experiences and needs of LGBTIQA+ community members, and a safe and equal environment.

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said the council sought to better understand and address the needs of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, intersex, queer/questioning, asexual + (LGBTIQA+) communities through the development of a community working group.

"The LGBTIQA+ Working Group guided consultation and informed development of a Kingborough LGBTIQA+ Action Plan chaired by Cr Midgley with Cr Glade-Wright," Cr Wriedt said.

"The eight-member working group developed a survey which was open to the community between 12 July and 12 August 2022 and received 162 responses.

"Based on the themes arising from the consultation, a draft Kingborough LGBTIQA+ Action Plan 2023-2025 was developed which was endorsed by

Cr Aldo Antolli and Cr Mark Richardson moved against the eventual action plan. Cr Antolli said the Action Plan "affects far more people in the community than just the LGBTIQA+ members, and as such, needed wiser consultation regard-

They (the community) are sceptical about the use of the requested \$20,000 funding given so many other needs in our community are neglected."

Dr Katrena Stephenson, former Director of Environment, Development and Community at Kingborough Council and key authority on the Action Plan remarked on Cr Antolli's comments during council's meeting stating, "the survey was widely distributed and open to all".

"Short term and longer-term actions have been suggested including offering inclusion training to staff and allowing staff to add their pronouns on emails, updating council forms, flying a flag on LGBTIQA+ awareness days and ensuring gender inclusive signage on universal toilets," Dr Stephenson said.

Dr Stephenson commended the council's endorsement of the Action Plan stating "Kingborough Council is taking a human rights approach to ensuring a safe community"

"Sadly, hiding behind a veneer of impartiality and a so called 'barrage of emails' is an increasingly commonly seen pattern of behaviour when it

Cr Antolli said he had been "overwhelmed by positive feedback from the community who commended me for addressing their concerns at council level, speaking up, asking probing questions, as they feel the action plan is too comprehensive and lacked wider community consultation on the matter" Councillor Richardson did not respond to comment.

A pretty flower once considered a beautiful addition to the garden by our parents and grandparents, foxgloves (Digitalis) have become a bit more intrusive.

The colourful flowers are now springing up out in the wild. While not declared a noxious weed in Tasmania, it is certainly an environmental weed.

It is native to Europe, Western Asia, and North Western Africa.

The flowers are tubular in shape, produced on a tall spike, and vary in colour with species, from purple to pink, white, and yellow.

It has medicinal uses but is also very toxic to humans and other animals, and consumption can even lead to death.

I regularly travel from Kingborough to the North West Coast and have seen their widespread invasion throughout Central Plateau where they thrive on the conditions.

The spread of this self-seeding biennial has encroached on our neck of the woods!

There has been a push to have it declared an invasive species.

For those who travel along the Huon Highway, foxgloves may be easily seen in the Sandfly to Vinces Saddle area.

While these are on the road verge, there are others that can be seen within the neighbouring paddocks.

To remove, dig out or hand pull flowering plants, ensuring there is no contact with sap.

Young growth can be spot-sprayed or wiped with There is plenty of information about foxgloves and their

removal to be found online.

Youth survey

Mission Australia's Youth Survey Report 2022 collated the responses of 621 young people aged 15-19 in Tasmania given between April and **August 2022.**

The proportion of young people who were worried about a safe place to stay, spending time away from home, unable to afford bills or who sought help from a charity was higher in Tasmania compared to the national figure.

Over one in 10 (14.1 per cent) young Tasmanian people were worried about having a safe place to stay compared to the national average of 10.4 per cent.

Close to one in 10 (8.9 per cent) young people and their families in Tasmania could not afford bills or car expenses and one in 10 (9.7 per cent) sought help from a charity.

Additionally, the number of young people in Tasmania who report being extremely or very concerned about climate change (30.9 per cent) is significantly higher than the national average of 25.5 per cent.

Mission Australia State Director Mychelle Curran said "Young people have the answers".

"We must listen, ensure young people are included in decision-making processes, and act now so they can access the opportunities and supports they need to

"If Australia builds enough new social and affordable homes and adequately increases income supports like JobSeeker and Youth Allowance, this would go a long way to help families and their children to afford life's essentials and a safe and secure home," Ms Curran


Division 3 had a home game in the Donald Hazell Indoor Centre against the visiting team from the Brighton Bowls Club.
