Kingston's Meals on Wheels team celebrated their recent achievement of 2022's Community Group of the Year award at the Kingston Hub Community Park on Thursday, January 19.

As part of their award, they were supplied a hamper package from Kingborough Council and took a day to gather together, relax and reflect on an accomplished past year.

Coordinator of Kingston Meals on Wheels Alice Howe reflected upon the biggest asset groups like theirs has.

"In brief we could not have achieved such an amazing award without our volunteers", said Alice.

"It is always to the credit of our volunteers who put up with us calling to do extra shifts, the rain, hail and heat to deliver to

clients sometimes even younger than themselves and the satisfaction they have when they complete a successful delivery run where all clients were happy and even some enjoyed a chat.

"Often when volunteers come back and say sorry, I took so long 'Fred' needed a chat today, I don't hesitate in letting them know that's part of the job and chat as long as possible."

Kingston Meals on Wheels has three coordinators to wrangle over forty dedicated volunteers, that work tirelessly throughout the year.

Whilst Meals on Wheels is a social service for their clients, Alice pointed out the benefits the service also provides for its volunteers.

Alice said that it gives the volunteers, "purpose and fulfilment in giving back to the community that works around their

own busy lives".

"I couldn't feel prouder of being part of a wonderful organisation that brings more to people than just what it looks like on the surface.

Discovering lutruwita culture

These school holidays Kingston Library was joined by Nyikina woman Hayley, an Aboriginal Education Worker for several schools in the Channel Region.

Hayley ran a school holiday program of Cultural Activities including Storytime and nature play, a bush foods workshop, kelp craft and basket weaving with Palawa woman Wendy.

The workshops proved to be extremely popular during

the holidays, with over 50 participants in many of them.

Palawa woman Wendy assisted Hayley to teach children and adults traditional Tasmanian Aboriginal basket weaving using flax leaves, whilst learning the cultural significance of the practice in lutruwita/Tasmania.

They also explained about local bush foods native to lutruwita/Tasmania, using identification and recipe books followed by tasting herbs, fruits and vegetables used by palawa people for tens of thousands of years.

"But buses outside of 9-5 and further than Blackmans Bay/Kingston are not regular enough for most and hopeless for those who start work before 8am, or finish after 6pm.

People drive because they have no viable alternative that works for them- not because they want to."

Nick Rainbird reflected on Facebook "Trapped in Kingston yesterday I was thinking how good it would be if you could catch a ferry from the Kingston Beach jetty (that would never get approved in this lifetime) through to Elwick Bay/northern suburbs on such a beautiful day".

Minister Ferguson said that the funding for numerous traffic solutions are still the subject of discussion with the Australian Government, but stated, "the Southern Outlet Transit Lane project recently received parliamentary approval."

Traffic troubles

The recent Tasman Bridge truck rollover has sparked debates over traffic problems in Hobart and surrounding suburbs.

At 2.55pm on Monday, January 16 a truck rolled at the entrance to the Tasman Bridge, triggering hours of delayed traffic.

The driver was injured and taken to the Royal Hobart Hospital, where he was reported to be in a stable condition that same evening.

Acting Premier and Minister for Infrastructure and Transport Michael Ferguson said while this unprecedented traffic incident was extremely unfortunate, he called on all road users to drive safely to avoid problems like this in the future.

"I look forward to advice from crash investigators as to the cause of the crash and want to applaud Tasmania Police and my Department of State Growth staff for the rapid response to keep the disruption as short as possible," he said.

"The ferry services did a superb job responding to the Government's request for extra and extended services at no notice.

"There were double the number of crossings yesterday evening, carrying more than 1100 passengers."

Minister Ferguson said the State Liberal Government is building the infrastructure to incentivise public transport and car-pooling to move more people more quickly.

This includes the new Southern Outlet Transit Lane (including an extra lane through the bottleneck to Macquarie Street), new wide shared pathways on the Tasman Bridge, an expansion of the Derwent Ferry service, as well as the already-completed Kingborough Park and Ride facilities.

Members of the public have raised some doubts on social media.

Sam Nicholson commented on ABC Radio's Facebook page that "Hobart has grown dramatically since the current street layout was set.

"Yes - reducing dependence on private cars would help," Sam said.

“We are always looking for more volunteers to help with all the different aspects of the garden.

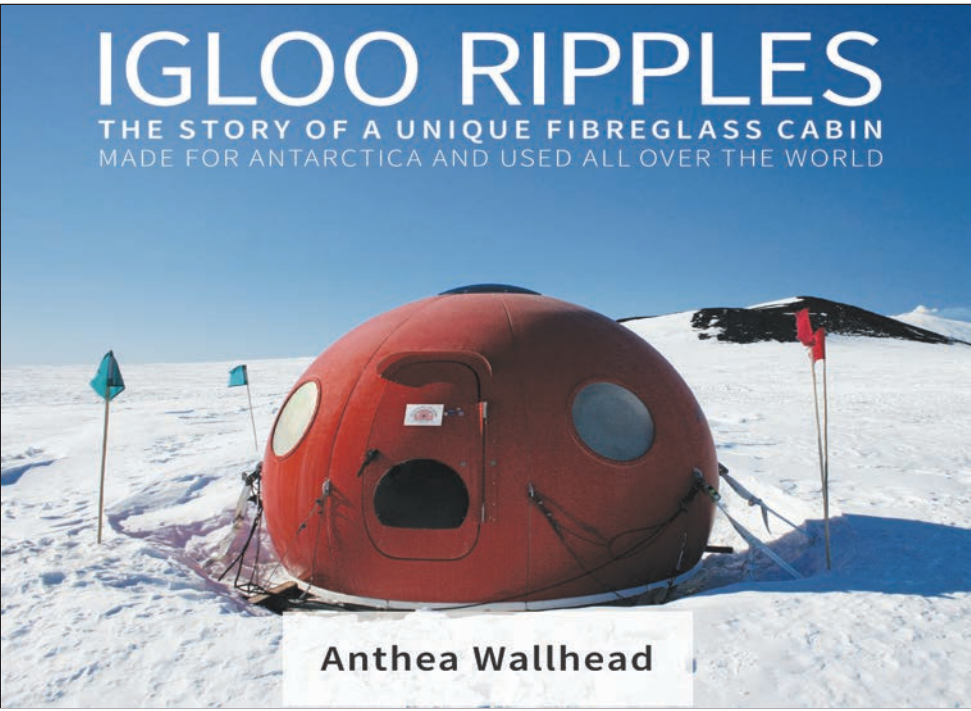
“It’s great to grow lots of veggies but it takes some time to keep up with the watering and picking at this time of year, those are our two big areas of need currently”.

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said that during the January 16 meeting, Council endorsed the Civic Centre Flag Policy, which sets out the process for flying flags.

"Late last year, a fourth flagpole was installed at Council's Civic Centre in Kingston," Cr Wriedt said.

"This means there is now an opportunity to fly community flags, in addition to the Australian Flag, the Tasmanian Flag and the Aboriginal Flag.

"Council is seeking expressions of interest from organisations and individuals who would like to see community flags flown that symbolise and celebrate Kingborough's diverse community and recognise

important community events and dates.

"Flags must be consistent with Council's values and commitment to inclusiveness as outlined in our Strategic Plan.

"Approved flags must be provided by the applicant.

"Expressions of interest close at 5pm on 8 February 2023.

"These expressions of interest will be considered in February and an Annual Community Flag Schedule will be brought back for Council approval.

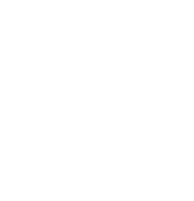

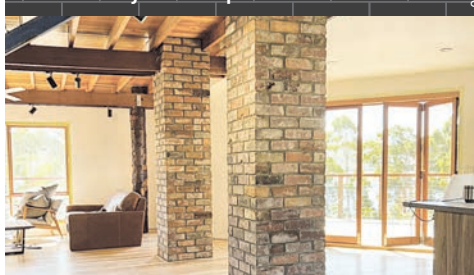
