

Celebrate all Australians

January 26 represents a complicated day for Australians with debates continuing over whether this should be a day to celebrate Australia or whether we should Change the Date.

Councils across Tasmania including the Hobart City Council and Huon Valley Council have recently moved to have their citizenship ceremonies observed on a different day.

Kingborough Council could be soon to follow.

Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said "I appreciate that for our First Nations People that the celebration of Australia Day on 26th January each year is a day of mourning".

"Increasingly non-Indigenous people also seem to be mindful that celebrating colonisation is not appropriate in a caring and inclusive community.

"With the recent changes by the Federal Government in relation to the

timing of citizenship ceremonies, I recently consulted Councillors to seek their feedback," Cr Wriedt said.

"The majority of them believe that we should move our January citizenship ceremony away from 26th January, given that it is no longer mandatory to hold one on that day.

"A report will come to Council in the near future to make a formal decision to move future January citizenship ceremonies to a few days either side of 26 January." Health Care Manager at South East Tasmanian Aboriginal Corporation (SETAC) Jaime Currie believes that the conversation should be bigger than the Invasion Day topic.

"We've seen the councils move on from this date," Jaime said.

"This is part of the truth telling process."

Jaime said that SETAC would like to see more support from local and state

bodies of government in Closing the Gap, a government strategy that seeks to bring the health and life expectancy of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples on par with non-Indigenous Australians.

Jaime acknowledges the support Kingborough Council has offered its Indigenous community but said it can "Always get better".

"Keep us at the table," Jaime said.

"Collaborate in meaningful ways."

Jaime cited land management practices and dual place names as items for Council to consider.

When reached out for comment, Mayor Wriedt said "Kingborough Council will continue to work with SETAC on issues such as dual place names and land management issues".

Show some ramp etiquette

With the summer weather settling in, the queues at Tasmanian boat ramps can be quite long.

Marine and Safety Tasmania (MAST) is urging all Tasmanian boaters and watercraft users to observe boat ramp etiquette ahead of upcoming long weekends from now until Easter.

MAST said they want all boat and watercraft users to observe the simple, but extremely important safety rules.

MAST has received several complaints from around the state about poor ramp etiquette.

There are a number of boat ramp tips to follow to ensure good ramp etiquette:

- Prepare your boat well away from the ramp: load

all your gear; remove tie-down straps; ensure outboard motor locks are off; auxiliary motor up; bung in

- On a double ramp - use one side only
- Ensure your safety gear is handy
- Be patient - not all boaters have the same level of experience


All boaters and personal watercraft users need to observe the five-knot rules around boat ramps, beaches and swimmers.

Another important aspect of boating safety is that everyone needs to be aware of alcohol consumption while boating.

MAST advises to "Go Easy on the Drink" - 0.05 is the limit - and "if you're the skipper, you're responsible."

Remember to be considerate of others both on the water and when getting out of it. Featured is the boat ramp at Dru Point, Margate. (PS)

Merging services

The Tasmania Fire Service (TFS) and the State Emergency Services (SES) will be merged to become the Tasmania Fire and Emergency Service (TFES).

“With the increasing frequency and severity of natural disasters, it is important we take action today to empower our emergency leaders for tomorrow,” said Premier Jeremy Rockliff.

“Merging these two key services recognises the support the more than 5400 volunteers provide in times of crisis and recognises the strength in their existing cohesive and collaborative relationship.”

Premier Rockliff said TFS and SES will still keep their individual identities.

Minister for Police, Fire and Emergency Management Felix Ellis said the Chief Officer of TFS will be elevated to the role of Commissioner of Fire and Emergency Services.

“The Commissioner will report directly to the Minister of the day and will oversee the new Tasmania Fire and Emergency Service,” he said.

“The Director SES will remain in the TFES’ key leadership group.

“The Commissioner will be in charge and will have clear responsibilities and accountability.

“Fire’s key governance body - the State Fire Commission - will be retained and reformed to become the State Fire and Emergency Service Committee.

“This Committee will be legislated and will report to and support the Commissioner of Fire and Emergency Services.

“These reforms will be key parts of the new Fire and Emergency Services Act, which will be legislated later in the year.”

Motorcycle crash on Sandfly Road

Police and emergency services were called to a single vehicle motorbike crash on Sandfly Road, Margate on Wednesday, January 25.

The 37-year-old rider was travelling along Sandfly Road and failed to negotiate a turn before becoming airborne and landing in a ditch.

The man was transported to the Royal Hobart Hospital in a serious condition.

Inspector Jim Semmens from Southern District Support Services said that while investigations are continuing, police believe excessive speed was a contributing factor.

“We are asking motorists to not take any risks while traveling on our roads - we need to make sure everyone gets where they’re going safely,” said Inspector Semmens.

“Always remember the ‘fatal five’: speeding, seatbelts, drink and drug driving, inattention, and fatigue”.



Wheelhouse - A haven for self-directed learners

A newly created learning centre will help Kingborough and Huon Valley teens reach for the stars.

Wheelhouse, a non-profit organisation based in Lower Longley aims to assist students to delve into their interests and develop skills via their own unique learning styles.

Their approach is self-directed learning (SDL).

SDL allows young people to have autonomy in their education.

This can be a welcome relief for those who have big dreams but little time or support to follow them.

It can also benefit young people who are struggling with mental health issues, learning difficulties or disengagement in school.

Co-founder Marion Thomas remarked that when a well-supported approach to SDL is undertaken, many benefits are evident for the students.

"These include a passion for life-long learning, stress relief, advanced thinking skills and sophisticated social skills," said Marion.

"Picture a teenager waking up keen to learn every day, and because of that enthusiasm they absorb knowledge and develop skills more easily than when they are coerced.

"When students have the opportunity to follow their interests, their learning becomes intrinsically motivated.

"In conventional schooling, it is often extrinsically motivated, with young people competing for high grades and positive feedback."

So, if SDL appeals to your family, how do you access it?

A few schools in Tasmania offer this approach via Big Picture Learning, and some alternative institutions, such as Indie Schools, make SDL a key feature of their offerings.

It is also a popular pedagogy among home educators.

As of April 2023, it can be accessed in a non-institutional setting via Wheelhouse - a self-directed learning centre for teens.

At Wheelhouse, young people have the freedom to

explore their interests via the centre's creative and academic resources.

They can also relax in the home-like environment, pick and choose from a wide variety of workshops and tutorials, and connect with mentors in the wider community.

Wheelhouse is all about following passions, real-world learning and good mental health.

It can also help lead young people to higher education such as university, if that is their desire.


Marion stated that she and other co-founder Mel Storey, "have a vision to create a space where teens can believe in themselves and have the confidence to step off the well-trodden path to find what brings them to life."

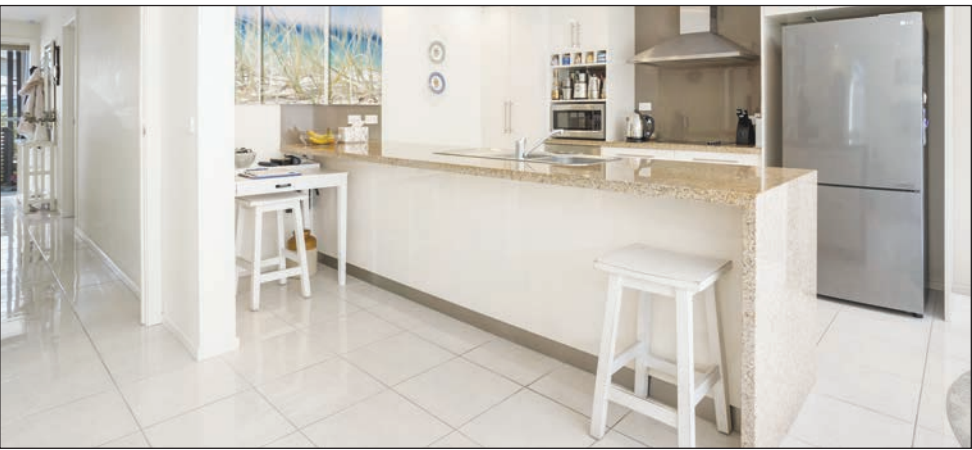
