The reconstruction of Kingston's CBD along the Channel Highway from Hutchins Street to Freeman Street will begin on Tuesday 14 February.

Kingborough Mayor, Paula Wriedt said in 2023 our community would see Kingston's CBD transformed into an inviting destination with improved pedestrian access for all.

"The upgrades will provide improved cycling facilities, create new green areas throughout the CBD and create outdoor dining opportunities for cafes

and restaurants along the main strip," Cr Wriedt said. "Improvements to the Channel Highway will include building a new bus interchange at 40 Channel Highway.

"This will involve demolishing the current building on that site.

"The bus interchange will be located on the corner of Goshawk Way and Channel Highway and will take Hobart bound buses off the highway, freeing up more parking and enhancing the commuting experience for travellers.

"Whilst the bus interchange is being built, a few all-day parking spots will be unavailable in the John Street carpark due to the expanded building site. "The entry and exit points to John Street carpark will also be relocated to

Goshawk Way. "Skipper Lane carpark, located about 4 minutes' walk away, has 152 all day carparking spaces available, which we are confident will be able to absorb any loss in parking from John Street carpark.

"Upgrades to the CBD will also include improving the south bound bus area on Channel Highway.

"A new bus shelter will enhance commuter experiences traveling south. "To speed up overall construction and save costs on the street upgrade, a small section of the Channel Highway, from John Street to Hutchins Street will be closed to traffic at the end of February, for approximately 10 weeks.

"Although traffic will be restricted, pedestrians will have access to all the businesses and services on the Channel Highway during construction.

"Due to the upgraded road network around central Kingston, Council is

confident that traffic disruption will be kept to a minimum.

"Traffic will be able to travel around the CBD via Goshawk Way, John Street and Church Street.

"Whilst the Channel Highway is closed, there will be alternative bus stops opened on Church Street outside and opposite Kingston Primary School, for both inbound and outbound commuters.

"Commuters who want to travel on Metro bus routes 407, 408, 409, 427, 428, 429 and X08 will need to use the inbound and outbound Metro Bus stops on Church Street

"Anyone wishing to travel on a Tassielink Transit to and from Huon Valley or Hobart that catches the bus from Channel Hwy main bus stop will need to relocate to the Church Street bus stops.

"There will be signage placed at all these bus stops, with prior warning for

commuters. "Our aim is to transform Kingston's CBD from a car-centric main road to an attractive and vibrant centre that will attract further investment and provide an engaging urban environment for our residents and visitors.

"Please continue to support all of the businesses along Channel Highway throughout the construction period and be reassured that access to the restaurants, cafes, health practitioners and businesses in the area will remain for pedestrians," urged Mayor Wriedt

Parking is available at Channel Court for shopping, John Street Carpark, and the Skipper Lane Carpark for customers in the Kingston area.

The design agreed by Kingborough Council includes the following features: • More street trees and vegetation

One day before Invasion Day, on the 25 January 2023, Traders in Purple lodged a Development Application with Kingborough Council.

DA-2022-480 puts forward a plan to build a four storey commercial office and retail building in the Kingston Park area.

To the best of my knowledge this DA has received little publicity.

The exception is an article in the 'The Classifieds' on 2 February 2023.

If you are reading this letter in the Kingborough Chronicle on Tuesday February 7, the opportunity to lodge a submission on the DA expires at COB Wednesday February 8. Kingborough residents deserved more time to lodge a submission, but this time is statutory

It cannot be changed.

If 3 or more submissions opposing the DA are received then the matter must go to Councillors for a decision.

Council acts as a Planning Authority in that case.

If the proposed building is built it will dominate the northern end of Kingston Park and the surrounding area.

It will stick out like a sore thumb.



Locals have their say on Kingborough arts

West Winds Community Centre started the year by asking the community what activities and events they'd like to see happening in their local area.

The 2023 community arts and culture program will be shaped by feedback from the 'Creative Channel Connections Community Survey' call out during January and Februarv.

"We're encouraging people to share their views on what activities they think are important to local life,? said Stephanie Shoebridge, Community Arts and Culture Project Officer at West Winds.

"It's early days after the launch of the survey and yet we've had enthusiastic responses from parents, students, staff, volunteers and community members participating.

The survey is still open but the feedback coming in has already revealed a strong interest in 'resilience making' creative workshops, 'living mindfully' and exploring 'arts therapy' opportunities.

"It's showing us more clearly than ever what an essential role the arts play in daily life, confirming the significant and increasing personal value Channel residents place on the impact of the arts, and the ways in which they make our communities stronger and more cohesive," said Stephanie

The current feedback has also revealed a desire for beautifying local communal spaces, invigorating a renewed sense of social connection whilst honouring natural heritage, or 'ecoliteracy'.

Ecoliteracy is the understanding of how to create sustainable human communities.

"Sustainable programming has a strong focus to our efforts here at West Winds," said Stephanie.

"We aim to harness the wealth of talented local creatives, provide support and development to facilitators and inspire the community to work together on events and projects." Musical pursuits have also ranked highly in the survey results so far, with expressive voice, building a shared

community culture of singing and playing together, supporting bands and recordings being suggested. Michael Yates, Manager at West Winds Community

Centre said, "West Winds is actively fostering new support networks as we look ahead to the creative challenges of recovering and rebuilding after lockdowns." If you want to get involved, have input or share your

Consultations over Landscape **Conservation**^{⁻**Zone**}

Kingborough Council will host two information sessions for community members about the proposed Landscape Conservation Zone (LCZ). The LCZ is a planning scheme for the protection,

conservation and management of landscape values. This can be applied to land such as bushland areas, large areas of native vegetation, or areas of important

scenic values Kingborough Mayor Paula Wriedt said the Tasmanian Government is moving all councils to a single Planning Scheme, known as the Tasmanian

Planning Scheme. "In Kingborough, we are moving from 33 existing zones to 30 new zones, and implementing a suite of new codes," Cr Wriedt said.

"One of the new zones which has not existed before is the Landscape Conservation Zone.

"Some Councils have already converted to new Tasmanian Planning Scheme, some are in the process of engaging communities about it and some, like Kingborough, are still busy finalising the zoning and are yet to be given approval by the State Government to start a formal consultation with the community about the proposed changes.

"Although Kingborough has not been given the go ahead to start formal consultation by the State Government, some community members have expressed a need to receive more information about the Landscape Conservation Zone.

"Due to the heightened interest in this zone change, Council wants to provide an opportunity for community members to come and talk to Council's Planners about the new zone and the process going forward. "Two public information sessions have been organ-

ised to discuss the Landscape Conservation Zone. "The first will be at Margate Hall, on Tuesday 21 February from 5.30 to 7.30pm, and the second on Friday 24 February from 12pm to 2pm at the Kingborough Community Hub, Middleton room.

"Individual 15-minute appointments with a Counc Planning Officer can be booked by property owners who think they may be affected by the LCZ.

"If anyone is unable to attend these public sessions, they can contact Council's Customer Service team to make an appointment outside of these dates.

"There will be further consultation at a later date, but these two sessions are being offered now to provide the community with an additional opportunity to talk to our Planning staff.


